THE SCENE SETTER

▶ The No. 17-ranked Purdue Boilermakers look to start the stretch run on a high note as Northwestern visits Mackey Arena on Tuesday night for the only meeting between the two squads. The contest will tip off at 7 p.m. ET with **Dave Revsine** and **Stephen Bardo** providing expert commentary on BTN while **Daniel Kuehner** will produce the game. On the radio dial, legendary broadcasters **Larry Clisby**, **Rob Blackman** and **Ralph Taylor** will do the same on the Purdue Radio Network with **Wes Scott** producing. Live stats will be available on StatBroadcast.com and as always, in-game updates will be provided on the Purdue Basketball Twitter account (@BoilerBall).

THE BOILERMAKER NOTEBOOK

▶ The Purdue basketball program has won at least 20 games in 23 of the last 37 seasons, including in eight of **Matt Painter's** 11 seasons.

▶ Purdue is 41-19 since the start of last season, including 28-4 in Mackey Arena.

▶ Purdue ranks in the nation's top 30 in defensive rebounds per game (3rd), rebound margin (5th), rebounds per game (5th), total rebounds (5th), scoring margin (9th), field goal percentage defense (10th), assists per game (12th), scoring defense (16th), 3-point percentage defense (28th), assist-to-turnover ratio (30th) and free throw percentage (30th). Last year's team ranked in the top 30 of one national statistical category (blocked shots).

▶ It took 26 games, but someone finally outrebounded Purdue as Michigan grabbed more caroms than Purdue, 39-35, on Saturday. The margin knocked Purdue to fifth nationally in rebound margin (+10.8).

▶ The Boilermakers are 14-1 at home with the lone loss coming to the current No. 4-ranked team in the country, Iowa, on Jan. 2.

▶ Purdue has won 34 straight games when attempting more free throws than its opponent.

▶ Purdue's bench is outscoring its opponents' bench by an 828 to 391 margin this year, an average of 16.8 points per game.

▶ Purdue has shot at least 50.0 percent from 3-point range in three of the last four games (.583 vs. Nebraska; .500 vs. Michigan State; .500 vs. Michigan).

▶ Purdue has been outscored in the paint in each of the last two games (28-26 by Michigan State; 24-22 by Michigan).

▶ Purdue is 12-0 when even or outscoring opponents in "points off turnovers". The Boilermakers are 8-6 when trailing in "points off turnovers", including 4-5 in Big Ten play.

■ ABOUT THE WILDCATS

- Northwestern enters Tuesday's contest with a 17-9 overall record and a 5-8 Big Ten record. The Wildcats are coming off a thrilling 58-56 victory over Illinois on Saturday night.
- The Wildcats opened the year with a 13-1 record, but are just 4-8 since, with wins over Minnesota (twice), Wisconsin and Illinois.
- Guards **Tre Demps** (14.8 PPG) and **Bryant McIntosh** (14.3 PPG, 6.7 APG) lead the Wildcats' attack, which is averaging just 64.4 points per game in Big Ten play. McIntosh is second in the league in assists behind **Denzel Valentine**.
- Northwestern is 24th nationally in turnovers per game (10.7) and 14th in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.51).

■ SERIES HISTORY

- Purdue owns a 124-46 record all-time against Northwestern, but has won just two of the last five meetings.
- Purdue's 124 wins against the Wildcats are the most against a single opponent in school history. Indiana is next at 115.
- The Boilermakers have scored at least 60 points in six straight meetings against Northwestern and in 16-of-18 games under Painter.
- The Boilermakers are 38-5 against Northwestern at Mackey Arena

■ THE LAST TIME OUT

- Michigan ended the game on an 11-0 run over the final 2:50 of the contest and handed the Boilermakers a 61-56 setback on Saturday at the Crisler Center.
- Purdue shot just 15-of-41 (.366) from inside the 3-point line and was just 8-of-14 (.571) from the free throw line.
- Purdue was also outrebounded by the Wolverines, 39-35. It marked the first time this year that Purdue was outrebounded. Purdue outrebounded Michigan by eight rebounds (36-28) in the first meeting.
- Michigan shot just 36.4 percent from the field, the lowest field goal percentage for an opponent in a win over Purdue since Eastern Michigan shot 30.9 percent in a 47-44 Eagles' win on Dec. 8, 2012.
- Caleb Swanigan** scored 14 points, the most he has scored in Big Ten play this year. He went 6-of-9 from the field. The rest of the team went 15-of-44 (.341) from the floor.

■ PURDUE BASKETBALL HISTORY

- Purdue is in its 118th season of basketball, owning a 1,732-992 (.636) all-time record. The Boilermakers rank 19th all-time in victories (1,732) and their 63.6 winning percentage is 20th all-time.
- Purdue has had just two head coaches, **Gene Keady** and **Matt Painter**, since the start of the 1980-81 season, a span of 35 years.
- Since the **Ray Eddy** era began in 1950, Purdue has had just six head coaches in 66 years and just eight head coaches in the last 99 years.
- Purdue owns a 587-136 (.812) record at Mackey Arena, now in its 48th year as the home of Purdue basketball.

■ NEAR THE TOPS IN THE COUNTRY

- Purdue's 14 homecourt wins are tied for the fourth most for any program in America. The school record for most wins in Mackey Arena are 16 (2010-11, 2007-08, 2006-07).

- Purdue has won five straight home games, which is the third-longest home win streak in the Big Ten (Iowa - 15; Indiana - 14).

■ BOILERMAKERS HOT AT HOME

- Purdue saw its 15-game home winning streak come to an end on Jan. 2, 2016, against Iowa. It marked Purdue's first loss since a 69-60 setback to Maryland on Jan. 10, 2015. The 15-game homecourt winning streak was tied for the sixth-longest streak in Mackey Arena.

- However, Purdue has won 21 of its last 22 games at home, the lone loss being to Iowa (Jan. 2, 2016). Since the start of last year, Purdue is 28-4 at Mackey Arena.
- Of Purdue's 14 wins at home, 13 of them have been by at least 11 points. The lone victory not decided by 11 points was last Tuesday night's overtime thriller against Michigan State (82-81).
- Purdue has now won at least 12 home games for 10 straight years.

■ VANQUISHING A TOP-10 FOE

- With Purdue's 82-81 overtime win over Michigan State last Tuesday night, the Boilermakers defeated their first top-10 opponent since Feb. 20, 2011, a 76-63 win over Ohio State.
- The victory snapped a 17-game losing streak against top-10 foes.
- Purdue is 10-28 against top-10 teams under **Matt Painter**.

■ LOUD NOISES

- Mackey Arena is widely considered one of the loudest arenas in America and when **Rapheal Davis** hit his fifth 3-pointer of the first half to give Purdue a 30-14 lead on the Spartans, the decibel level in Mackey Arena hit 118 dB, about the same as a turbo-fan aircraft at takeoff from 200 feet.
- It's the second-loudest recorded level in Mackey Arena history. Bear in mind, we have only been doing this the last six years.

■ SENIOR LEADERS

- Purdue's four seniors of **A.J. Hammons**, **Rapheal Davis**, **Johnny Hill** and **Stephen Toyra** know they are entering the stretch run of their careers and are playing like they need to.
- In the win over Michigan State, the group scored 49 of Purdue's 82 points and had 21 of Purdue's 42 rebounds.
- Over the last five games, the group is averaging 34.6 points per game, and as a group when it scores 21 or more points, the Boilermakers are 16-1 (loss to Maryland -- 26 points).
- When at least two of the four members score in double-figures, the Boilermakers are 7-0 this year.

■ LOSING HALFTIME LEADS

- Purdue is 17-4 this year when leading at halftime, but is just 6-4 in Big Ten play when leading after 20 minutes, losing leads to Iowa (+17), Iowa (+2), Maryland (+3) and Michigan (+4).
- Since the start of last year, Purdue is 33-10 when leading at halftime, including just 12-8 against Big Ten opposition when leading at the break.

■ OVERCOMING HALFTIME DEFICITS

• However, since the start of last year, Purdue is 9-6 when trailing at halftime, having rallied for wins over Vanderbilt and Ohio State this year when trailing at the break. The Boilermakers also own a win over Wisconsin on the road this year when tied at the break.

■ BIG-GAME NUMBERS

• **A.J. Hammons** scored 19 points with 13 rebounds, eight blocked shots and three assists in the win over Michigan State. He became just the third player nationally since 2010-11 to reach those marks.

■ INSIDE THE NUMBERS

- Purdue has scored 70 or more points in eight of its last 11 games and in 18-of-26 games this year (16-2 record). When scoring 69 points or fewer, Purdue is 4-4.
- Purdue is now 9-1 on the season when making nine or more 3-pointers. When making eight or fewer, Purdue is 11-4.
- In games that Purdue shoots 25.0 percent or less from 3-point range, the Boilermakers are 4-1 (wins over Lehigh, New Mexico, Vanderbilt and Ohio State).
- Purdue is 5-2 this year when being outscored in the paint. Last year's team went 0-4.
- In games played on weekends, Purdue is just 7-6. In games played on weekdays, the Boilermakers are 13-0.
- Purdue has trailed by double-digits in just four games this year (Butler, Illinois, Iowa, Maryland).
- Three of Purdue's six losses have come to teams ranked in the top 10 (two to Iowa, one to Maryland).
- Seventeen of Purdue's 20 wins this year have been decided by at least 11 points (61-55 win over Wisconsin on Dec. 29; 68-64 win over Minnesota on Jan. 27; 82-81 win over Michigan State on Feb. 9).
- Twenty of Purdue's 26 games this year have been decided by at least 11 points (Iowa, Butler, Wisconsin, Minnesota, Michigan St., Michigan).
- Purdue has had just one game this year decided by a single possession (82-81 vs. Michigan State on Feb. 9).
- Purdue's bench has outscored the opposing bench in 24-of-26 games (Ohio State, Michigan State).

■ WINNING / LOSING NUMBERS

- Purdue is 13-0 when winning or tied in the "points off turnovers" battle; the Boilermakers are 7-6 when losing the "points off turnovers" battle.
- Purdue is 13-2 when having a run of 10 points or longer (losses to Iowa, Maryland); Purdue is 7-4 when not having a 10-point run.
- Purdue is 7-0 when the sophomore class combines for at least 40 points, 13-6 when it does not.
- Purdue is 16-1 when the senior class combines for at least 21 points; 4-5 when it scores 20 or fewer points.
- Purdue is now 4-1 when making four or fewer 3-pointers with a loss to Maryland.
- Purdue is 6-0 when attempting 26 or more 3-pointers this year (North Carolina A&T, Vermont, Florida, Pittsburgh, Howard, Rutgers).

► ROAD WARRIORS

• Since the start of the 2007-08 season in "true" road games, Purdue owns a 45-47 record, the fourth-most wins in the Big Ten during that span. Only four teams (Wisconsin, Michigan State, Ohio State, Purdue) have won at least 40.0 percent of their road games during that span.

- The four-member group owns a 2.27 assist-to-turnover ratio (218:96).
- In games that at least two of the four sophomores score in double-digits, the Boilermakers are 8-1 (loss to Iowa). When zero sophomores score in double-digits, Purdue is 4-3.

■ **ON THE GLASS**

- Purdue ranks fifth nationally in rebound margin. The Boilermakers outrebounded the top rebound margin team in America last Tuesday night against Michigan State (42-39).

■ **CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD**

- Purdue was outrebounded for the first time this season on Saturday as Michigan outrebounded Purdue 39-35.
- Over the last three games, Purdue has been outrebounded by one total rebound (Maryland EVEN, Michigan State +3, Michigan -4).
- The Boilermakers have held nine of their 13 Big Ten opponents to single-digit offensive rebounds (Iowa 11, Ohio State 10, Michigan State 16, Michigan 11). Six of the last 10 opponents had five or fewer offensive rebounds (Illinois, Penn State, Rutgers, Iowa, Minnesota, Maryland).
- Purdue's +10.8 rebound margin is over 3.0 rebounds per game more than the current school record (+7.6 in 1969-70).

■ **SEEING DOUBLE**

- Purdue has already recorded 17 double-doubles through 26 games, the most during the **Matt Painter** era. The 17 double-doubles are the most for the Boilermakers' program since the 1997-98 season (18).
- Four different players have recorded double-doubles this year.
- The school record for most double-doubles in a season is 32 (1973-74).

■ **BALANCED ATTACK**

- Purdue has five players averaging between 9.5 and 14.5 points, led by **A.J. Hammons** at 14.5 points per game.
- Purdue has five players averaging at least 3.9 rebounds per game.
- Purdue has six players averaging between 1.9 and 3.1 assists per game and three more players averaging at least 1.0 assists per game.
- Purdue has six players with at least 20 3-point field goals for just the second time in school history (2000-01; 6).

■ **DEFENSE LIVES HERE**

- The Boilermakers have held 21 of a possible 25 opponents under their pregame scoring average. Michigan was held 16.0 points below its scoring average on Saturday (61 points; averaged 77.0 PPG).
- The Boilermakers are 16th in the country in scoring defense (63.6) and 10th in field goal percentage defense (.381).
- Purdue is seventh in Ken Pomeroy's adjusted defensive efficiency, fourth in effective field goal percentage defense and 11th in 2-point pct. defense (.414).
- Purdue has held 16-of-26 opponents to 69 or fewer points, posting a 15-1 record when doing so (loss to Michigan on Saturday).
- Purdue has forced 11 shot clock violations already this year, one year after forcing 19 in 34 games.

■ **ON FIRE FROM THE LINE**

- Purdue ranks 28th nationally in free throw percentage, a significant improvement over the last four years where the Boilermakers ranked 275th (2012), 291st (2013), 261st (2014) and 213th (2015).
- Purdue has won 34 straight games when shooting more free throws than its opponent, including 16 times this year.
- Four of Purdue's 10 rotation players are shooting above 80.0 percent from the free throw line.

■ **BETTER FROM THE LINE**

- Purdue has had eight games this year where it has made 80.0 percent or better from the free throw line. Last year's team had just four games all season of 80 percent or better.
- Over the last three games, Purdue is just 32-of-50 (.640) from the free throw line. The Boilermakers have shot 60.0 percent or less from the free throw line in two of the last three games (Maryland, Michigan).
- The school record for free throw percentage in a season is 78.2 percent during the 1968-69 season. This year's average (.742) ranks fifth.

■ **MAY I ASSIST YOU WITH THAT?**

- Purdue ranks 12th nationally in assists per game (17.5) despite not having a player in the Big Ten's top 15 in assists per game. **Vince Edwards** leads the team in assists (3.1).
- The Boilermakers rank in the top 10 nationally thanks to six players averaging between 1.9 and 3.1 assists per game and three more averaging 1.0 assists per game.
- The Boilermakers' assist average of 17.5 per game would rank as the seventh-best average in school history and the best since the 1997-98 team averaged 18.9 assists per game.
- Purdue's current assist-to-turnover ratio of 1.41 (454:323) ranks as the fifth-best ratio in school history (1.58; 1985) and is 29th nationally.
- In addition, Purdue ranks 11th nationally in assist rate (A / FGM) at 63.9 percent.
- The Boilermakers have dished out 20 or more assists eight different times this year, including twice in Big Ten play (Michigan, Nebraska).

■ **DIALING LONG DISTANCE**

- Purdue has made at least 10 3-pointers in seven games this year, the most since having 10 games of double-digit 3-pointers in the 2011-12 season.
- Purdue's 58.3 percent shooting from long distance against Nebraska was its best percentage since March 20, 2013, vs. Western Illinois (.636; 7-of-11 3Ps).
- In Purdue's wins, the Boilermakers have shot 37.1 percent from 3-point range. In the five losses, Purdue has shot just 31.0 percent.

■ **HOT FROM DEEP**

- Over the last four games, Purdue is 24-of-65 (.369) from long distance. However, that includes a 3-of-25 (.120) performance against Maryland.
- If you throw that game out, Purdue is 21-of-40 (.525) from long distance in games against Nebraska, Michigan State and Michigan.

■ **NOT WAITING FOR THE WEEKEND**

- In games played on Saturday and Sunday this year, Purdue is just 7-6. In games played on weekdays, the Boilermakers are 13-0.

■ TURNING IT OVER

- Purdue has had an issue with turnovers in its losses coming to Butler, Iowa (twice) and Illinois. If the Boilermakers can solve those issues, a special season could be on the horizon.
- In Purdue's six losses, the Boilermakers have had 83 turnovers, resulting in 111 points. The losses have come by a combined 55 points.
- Purdue had 18 (Butler), 14 (Iowa), 16 (Illinois), 17 (Iowa) and nine (Maryland, Michigan) turnovers during its six losses.
- Purdue has been outscored by 53 points in the "points off turnovers" category in those six games, clearly making a huge difference.
- Purdue has won the turnover battle just five times this year (Vermont, IUPUI, Howard, Rutgers, Ohio State).
- When Purdue has 15 or fewer turnovers, the Boilermakers are 16-3 with the losses coming to Iowa in the first meeting (14), Maryland (9) and Michigan (9). When 16 or more turnovers, Purdue is 4-3 (wins over Incarnate Word, New Mexico, Wisconsin and Michigan State).

■ ASSISTING WITH THE BEST

- Purdue has several players boasting impressive assist-to-turnover ratio this year.
- P.J. Thompson** leads the way with a 71:11 (6.45) assist-to-turnover ratio, a ratio that would smash the school record of 3.12, set by **Mack Gadis** in 1986.
- Thompson's ratio is the best in the country for a player averaging at least 20.0 minutes per game (Stephen F. Austin's **Trey Pinkney**; 77:14 -- 5.50).
- Dakota Mathias** owns a 3.31 ratio (53:16), a number that would rank second in the single-season assist-to-turnover ratio chart.
- Ryan Cline** owns a 4.63 (37:8) ratio, a number that would rank first on the Purdue freshman list. Cline likely won't have enough assists (min. 75) to qualify for the single-season chart.
- The three of them have combined for a 161:35 (4.60) ratio between them in 1,413 minutes. The trio averages a turnover every 40.4 minutes.

■ SHOW A LITTLE CLASS

- In the classroom, the Boilermakers had an outstanding fall semester, registering a cumulative 3.04 GPA as a team. Eleven players boasted semester GPAs of 3.00 or better during the fall.

■ LET'S GO FOR A RUN

- Purdue has had 77 runs this year of 7-0 or longer, compared to just 29 for its opponents.
- Purdue has had 23 runs of 10-0 or longer, compared to just five for its opponents (Iowa -- 13-0 run; Illinois -- 10-0 run; Iowa -- 11-0 run; Michigan State -- 11-0 run; Michigan -- 11-0 run).

• With a pair of Sweet 16 appearances, six NCAA Tournament berths, Big Ten regular-season and tournament titles and an international gold medal on his résumé, 11th-year head coach Matt Painter is widely regarded as one of the brightest minds in all of college basketball.

• Painter affirmed his long-term commitment to Purdue in March of 2011, agreeing to a new eight-year contract that will keep him in West Lafayette through at least the 2018-19 season.

• Painter has averaged over 21 wins per season during his tenure at the helm of the Purdue program, including at least 20 victories in six of those seasons.

• Painter's tenure has seen Purdue basketball restore its status among the upper echelon of college basketball programs. The last eight years have seen six 20-win seasons and NCAA Tournament berths, two Sweet 16 appearances, a regular-season Big Ten title and a Big Ten Tournament crown.

• The three winningest classes in program history are the classes of 2011, 2012 and 2010, respectively, and five of the 10 winningest individual players Purdue has ever seen have come from the Painter ranks. Success, however, didn't happen overnight.

• Painter officially became the 18th head men's basketball coach in Purdue history on April 1, 2005, and immediately set about laying the groundwork for a dramatic reversal in the program's fortunes.

• The Boilermakers were at their best during the 2009 postseason run, rattling off double-digit victories over Penn State and Illinois to reach the Big Ten Tournament final, where they dispatched Ohio State, 65-61, to earn the first conference tournament crown in program history.

• Painter has also resurrected Mackey Arena as one of the country's best home-court advantages, piling up a 151-32 (.825) record at home over the last 11 seasons, including a remarkable 82-7 (.921) record against non-conference opponents.

• Painter has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year three times in the last six seasons, earning the consensus award in 2008 and 2011, and winning the coaches' vote in 2010. He is one of only six men to win the award more at least three times since its inception in 1974.

• Painter has seen a total of 21 players earn a combined 40 Academic All-Big Ten honors during his tenure as head coach. Painter has also mentored an Academic All-American, as Moore earned second-team honors during the 2009-10 season.
