PURDUE SET FOR 12TH EDITION OF FOUR-TEAM BOILERMAKER CHALLENGE

• After a one-year hiatus, the annual four-team Boilermaker Challenge Cup returns to the Varsity Soccer Complex this weekend. Purdue continues its eight-game homestand, welcoming Cal State Northridge, Dayton and Kansas to campus. The Boilers will host Northridge Friday evening after Dayton and Kansas square off in the first game of the weekend. Friday's winners and losers will play Sunday. An Offensive MVP, Defensive MVP and All-Tournament Team will be recognized after Sunday's 1:30 p.m. game.

• Purdue has won the Boilermaker Challenge Cup in six of the first 11 seasons in which it has hosted the event. The Boilers won three of the first four tournaments from 1999-2002 as well as back-to-back titles in 2008 and 2009, compiling a 16-4-2 all-time record.

• Purdue did not host the Boilermaker Challenge Cup in 2010 for the first time since the program's inaugural 1998 campaign. Instead, the Boilers participated in tournaments at Cal State Fullerton and Colorado.

FRESHMEN TEAM UP FOR GAME-WINNER IN PURDUE'S FIRST HOME NIGHT GAME

• Freshmen **Alex Hairston** and **Chinyelu Asher** teamed up for the only goal in Purdue's 1-0 win against Colorado Sept. 2 in the first-ever night game at the Varsity Soccer Complex. Asher tallied her first collegiate assist, helping the Boilers maintain possession and eventually setting up Hairston's second goal of the season.

• Hairston has now scored the game-winning goal in each of Purdue's first two victories this year, both 1-0 wins. In the process, she has joined **Alexis Tryba** (2008) and **Jessica Okoroafo** (2005) as the only players in program history to account for the game-winning goal in the first two victories of their freshman seasons.

• Okoroafo went on to score the game-winner in each of the first three victories of her freshman campaign. And the 2008 season featured a freshman accounting for the game-winner in each of Purdue's first six victories. After Tryba scored the decisive goal in wins against Eastern Illinois and Oregon, **Lauren Montenegro** did likewise versus Illinois State in win No. 3. Tryba had another game-winner in the Boilers' next victory, making each of her first three collegiate goals game-winners.

WARREN SCORES FIRST GOAL OUTSIDE OF BIG TEN PLAY

• **Jessica Warren** gave Purdue a halftime lead in the overtime loss to USC, connecting on a free kick about five minutes before the break. It was her sixth career goal, but first outside of Big Ten play. As her fifth career goal at the Varsity Soccer Complex, she is second among active players for most goals at home. **Kellie Phillips** (7), **Lauren Montenegro** (5) and **Alexis Tryba** (5) have also scored at least five times at the Varsity Soccer Complex.

• USC won the Illini/Boilermaker Cup after defeating both Illinois and Purdue during the Big Ten-Pac-12 weekend challenge, which also featured Colorado. **Alex Hairston**, **Mollie Kuramoto** and **Clara Kridler** represented Purdue on the all-tournament team.

• The Boilermakers had a season-high nine corners in their first overtime loss since falling to nationally-ranked Texas A&M in September 2010 at the Varsity Soccer Complex. Purdue also enjoyed its first halftime lead of the season in the loss to USC.

STUART HITS THE POST TWICE IN THE SECOND HALF VERSUS USC

• Purdue held a 1-0 lead on USC at the time but it was still a frustrating stretch early in the second half for **Hadley Stuart**. The sophomore hit the post twice, first the right and then the left, a little over three minutes apart. Her first scoring chance hit the right post in the 52nd minute. The rebound led to an opportunity for **Alex Hairston**, but the USC goalkeeper was able to make the save. Then in the 55th minute, USC's 'keeper was able to deflect Stuart's shot attempt off the left post, leading to a Purdue corner kick.

PROGRAM-LONG HOMESTAND CONTINUES

• After playing three of its first four games on the road, Purdue will be home for four consecutive weekends in September. The Boilermakers will welcome nine opponents to the Varsity Soccer Complex during their program-long eight-game September homestand, beginning with the first-ever night game at the Varsity Soccer Complex Sept. 2 against Colorado. The Sept. 23 match against Nebraska will be Purdue's first game (across all sports) against the Huskers as Big Ten rivals. Colorado, USC and Cal State Northridge will be making their first-ever trips to West Lafayette during the homestand.

• Previously, the longest homestand in program history was seven consecutive games in 2007. The Boilermakers won all seven games, including six in shutout fashion, on their way to posting an 11-game win streak and a program-best 20 overall wins that season.

PURDUE SUFFERS FIRST LOSS WHEN TRYBA SCORES

• The Boilermakers took an early lead in the Aug. 28 loss at Missouri when **Alexis Tryba** scored her eighth career goal in the 21st minute off a nice pass from **Alex Hairston**. But after Missouri responded with three unanswered goals and went on to win, 4-2, the Boilers suffered their first-ever loss when Tryba scored. With four of her eight goals proving to be game-winners, she has supplied the game-deciding score with half of her goals.

BLACHA SCORES IN HER FIRST TWO STARTS

- **Kaitlyn Blacha** finished off a corner kick chance in the second half at Missouri for her second career goal. The senior was in the starting lineup for the first time this season in the Aug. 28 loss in Columbia. Coincidentally, she scored goals in each of her first two collegiate starts. Last season against Penn State, Blacha received her first opportunity to start and scored only 21 seconds after kickoff.
- Blacha started the Sept. 2 win against Colorado but did not account for a goal.

STARTING STREAKS END FOR THREE SENIORS

- Fifteen different players have received an opportunity to start in Purdue's first six games of the season. But more telling, the Boilers have utilized four different starting lineups in each of their first six games. Only seven players – **Shae Desmond, Jordan Frick, Alex Hairston, Kellie Phillips, Brookley Rogers, Jessica Warren** and goalkeeper **Clara Kridler** – have started each of the first six matches. In comparison, seven players started all 20 games in 2010.
- Seniors **Katie Leinert, Lauren Montenegro** and **Alexis Tryba** were among those seven players that started every game of 2010. All three players have come off the bench at least once early this season. In fact, Montenegro did not start for the first time in her Purdue career Aug. 26 against Oregon State. She still logged 71 minutes in the loss, playing the entire second half. But it ended Montenegro's team-long streak of 65 consecutive games started dating back to 2008.

BACK-TO-BACK SHUTOUT LOSSES SNAP GAMES WITH A GOAL STREAKS

- Purdue was kept off the scoreboard in back-to-back loss, Aug. 21 at No. 13 West Virginia and Aug. 26 versus No. 24 Oregon State. The Boilermakers finally ended a shutout streak of 230 consecutive minutes with **Alexis Tryba's** first-half goal at Missouri.
- The loss at WVU was Purdue's first shutout since Oct. 2, 2010 at Michigan State. That snapped a streak of seven consecutive games with a goal, the Boilers' longest streak since scoring in the first 12 games of the 2009 season.
- Purdue had not been blanked at home since playing Wisconsin to a scoreless draw in the 2010 Big Ten opener. The Boilermakers' last shutout loss at the Varsity Soccer Complex was in the 2010 season opener, an overtime defeat at the hands of Toledo.
- Purdue's 30 consecutive games with at least one goal is one of the more impressive records in program history. The Boilermakers scored in the final 13 games of 2002 and the first 17 games of 2003. The 17-game run in 2003 represents the longest single-season streak in program history.

HAIRSTON NETS GAME-WINNER IN 1ST GAME

- Freshman **Alex Hairston** played the hero in the season-opening 1-0 win at Toledo, scoring the lone goal of the match in the 61st minute off an assist from **Lauren Montenegro**. Hairston joined **Rachael Kimack** (2010 vs. Morehead State) as current Boilers to score in their first collegiate games.
- More importantly, Hairston is believed to be the first player in program history to pull off the unique trifecta of a freshman scoring Purdue's first goal of the year in her first collegiate game, and that goal proving to be a game-winner. Lauren Sessellmann (2001) and Kristin Hetzel (2004) also scored game-winners in the season openers of their freshman seasons, but those goals were not the first of the year for Purdue.
- Among active players, **Kellie Phillips** also scored the Boilers' first goal of the year as a freshman. And **Alexis Tryba** had the first game-winner of a season as a freshman. Both players accomplished the feats in the 2008 victory against Eastern Illinois, which was Purdue's second game of the year.

PURDUE AMONG NATIONAL LEADERS IN NEWCOMERS

- The Boilermakers have 12 freshmen and 13 total newcomers on the 2011 roster, a total that is believed to be the most in the Big Ten. Purdue's 12 freshmen also ranks fourth nationally. The list to the right was compiled by Alex Edwards of South Carolina Upstate.
- All 11 newcomers that have dressed for games this year have now seen action for Purdue. **Alex Hairston** has started each of the first six games. Taylor Niewoit and **Chinyelu Asher** have also played in each of the first six matches. Niewoit started at Toledo and Asher against USC. Transfer **Laura McCalla** started at West Virginia and versus Oregon State but has been sidelined since the OSU game.
- Freshmen **Anna Thyen** (**Kaitlyn Blacha** at Missouri) and Asher (Hairston vs. Colorado) have assisted on goals early this year.
