- BOILERS HEAD TO HAPPY VALLEY FOR WEEKEND SERIES WITH PENN STATE -

For the first of its back-to-back weekend series on the road, Purdue baseball heads out on its longest trip of the Big Ten Conference season for a three-game set at Penn State.

First pitch is set for 6:30 p.m. Friday, 5 p.m. Saturday and 1 p.m. Sunday. Saturday's game is scheduled to be televised live on the Big Ten Network. The Nittany Lions' home facility, Medlar Field, is also home to the State College Spikes – the Pittsburgh Pirates' affiliate in the New York-Penn League – during the summer.

Purdue and Penn State have been two of the more consistent teams in the league over the first half of the season. The Nittany Lions have lost back-to-back games only once all season, while the Boilers' lone losing streak was a three-game skid in mid-March that featured a defeat at the hands of top-ranked Vanderbilt.

Purdue has won nine of the last 11 meetings with PSU thanks in part to a three-game sweep in West Lafayette last season. During head coach **Doug Schrieber's** 13-year tenure, the Boilers' 28 wins against Penn State represents the most against any Big Ten rival. The Nittany Lions have posted only two series victories (2003 and 2007) against a Schreiber-led Purdue team.

The two teams enter the weekend sharing the Big Ten lead with 18 home runs apiece. But PSU has been much more strikeout prone, going down on strikes 70 more times (243 vs. 173) than the Boilers despite playing three fewer games. The Purdue pitching staff leads the league with 253 strikeouts.

On the mound, Penn State leads the Big Ten with a .244 batting average against while ranking second with a 3.08 team ERA. The Nittany Lions have surrendered a league-low five home runs. With Purdue continuing to lead the Big Ten in team batting average (.316) and most every other notable offensive categories, the collective strengths of the two teams could make for a weekend of entertaining lengthy at-bats.

Penn State won each of its first two series of Big Ten play, taking two-of-three from both Illinois and Northwestern. The Nittany Lions opened a 10-game homestand Wednesday with a 5-4 victory against common opponent Pittsburgh. Both Purdue and PSU also lost to Notre Dame at the season-opening BIG EAST-Big Ten Challenge.

The Boilermakers won the first two games of their current 10-game road stretch earlier this week. Big innings have carried the team's offense over the last six games. Purdue has scored 43 runs while posting a 5-1 record, but 32 of those runs have been scored in just seven innings. The Boilermakers have scored at least four runs in an inning once in each of the last six games.

Cameron Perkins enters the weekend riding a career-best 15-game hitting streak, the longest by a Purdue player since Brandon Haveman hit safely in the final 20 games of the 2009 season. Perkins is batting .419 during his streak and is off to a 13-for-23 start in Big Ten play. He has recorded multiple hits in each of his last five games, equaling out to a 12-for-21 stretch. The sophomore enters the weekend ranked among the Big Ten's top five in batting average (.382), home runs (4) and RBIs (31).

Penn State features two of the conference's top sluggers. Third baseman Jordan Steranka leads the league with six homers and 38 RBIs while ranking second to **Stephen Talbott** with 33 runs scored. Designated hitter Mario Eramo has connected for five home runs but is batting just .212 due to in part to a league-high 39 strikeouts.

Purdue experimented with new defensive alignments this week in the wake of the season-ending leg injury suffered by first baseman Ryan Bridges in the finale of the Michigan series. **Kevin Plawecki** started at first base for the first time as a Boilermaker Wednesday at IPFW, but finished the game behind the plate. **David Blount, Sean McHugh** and Perkins can also play the position. **Angelo Cianfrocco** is expected to

remain the designated hitter when he's in the lineup. The sophomore has played in three of the last five games since returning from a shoulder injury on April 8.

The Purdue weekend rotation was at full strength for the first time since the spring break trip during the series win against Michigan. And it also marked the

first time this year that Matt Morgan, Brad Schreiber and Joe Haase – who have emerged as the team's most consistent starters – were able to start three games consecutively. All three put together a quality start and gave the Boilers a chance to win against the Wolverines.

Penn State's pitching staff is led by game one starter Steven Hill and closer Ryan Ignas. Hill ranks among the Big Ten's top five in ERA (2.20), batting average against (.227) and strikeouts (38). Ignas pitches to contact (12 Ks in 25 1/3 innings) but has recorded five saves. He has finished a game in 14 of his 15 appearances.

Penn State's campus figures to be a festive place this weekend with the annual Blue & White Weekend taking place.

HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Entering his 13th year as the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber has posted a 343-328 overall record and a 176-168 Big Ten mark through his first 12 seasons. His overall win total ranks second in Purdue history, while his conference victories stand alone in first. In 2007, Schreiber became the third head coach in Purdue baseball history to surpass the 500-games mark as the Boilermakers' head man. Dave Alexander, whom Schreiber played for from 1983 to 1986, owns the record for most games coached at Purdue with 792 over 14 seasons, while Joe Sexson guided the Boilermakers for 527 games over 18 years.

The 2010 season saw the Boilermakers post 33 victories, the program's most since 2000. Purdue navigated a hotly-contested Big Ten race that saw all six league tournament-qualifying teams finish within three games of first place. The Boilermakers reached the Big Ten Tourney for the eighth time under Schreiber, including six of the last seven seasons. Purdue eliminated Northwestern and Indiana from the 2010 tournament before bowing out. The Boilers have won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in seven of their eight appearances under Schreiber.

The 2010 Boilermakers posted new school records for hits (636) and runs per game (7.2) at the plate and led the Big Ten in strikeouts (435) and batting average against (.276) on the mound. Purdue went 15-6 at home and 9-2 in midweek action, compiling a 32-18 mark after opening the season 1-6.

Individually, Matt Bischoff was honored as a First Team All-Big Ten starting pitcher and newcomers Kevin Plawecki, Cameron Perkins and Brad Schreiber were recognized for standout freshman seasons. Bischoff led the Big Ten with 10 wins and 95 strikeouts and in the process became the first player in program history to be a four-time All-Big Ten honoree. He established new single-season and career strikeout marks in his final season as a Boilermaker. Bischoff and fellow pitcher Kevin Cahill were both selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Schreiber has coached 48 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 16 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft on 23 occasions. One of Schreiber's Boilermakers has led the Big Ten in hitting in four out of the last six years.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha, finishing as regional runners-up to Auburn.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boiler-makers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including top-six ranking in four categories. Schreiber ranks first all-time in walks (132), fourth in runs scored (159), tied for third in games played (220) and tied for sixth in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

PURDUE CONTINUES ROAD STRETCH WITH SERIES AT PENN STATE

- Purdue opened its current 10-game road stretch with by rallying late for midweek wins against Ball State and IPFW this week. The Boilermakers scored four times with two outs in the ninth inning Tuesday in Muncie, overcoming a one-run deficit. Purdue also scored four times in the eighth inning Wednesday against IPFW in a game that was played at Parkview Field in downtown Fort Wayne.
- Barrett Serrato and Payton Bieker delivered consecutive two-run singles with two down and Purdue down by a run Tuesday at Ball State. Wednesday, Eric Charles singled home the gametying run with the bases loaded and Kevin Plawecki put the Boilers ahead to stay with a two-run single.
- Sunday, Purdue was five outs away from its first series sweep of Michigan since 1993. But a pair of errors in the eighth inning helped the Wolverines score four times and tie the game. The Boilermakers did not score the rest of the game after posting a five-run second inning.
- Purdue shutout Michigan in the series opener behind a combined 14 strikeouts, a season-high total, from **Matt Morgan** (8) and **Nick Wittgren** (6). The Boilers took the middle game of the series thanks to a four-run seventh inning, posting their first series victory against Michigan since 2004.

LEAGUE-LEADING BOILERS; HIT BY PITCH PILING UP

- Purdue enters the weekend leading the Big Ten in 16 notable statistical categories, including nearly every significant offensive category. The Boilermakers are also among the Top 30 nationally in seven categories.
- Purdue leads the Big Ten in hit by pitch by a wide margin. The Boilers have been hit by a pitch 65 times, averaging nearly two hit batsmen per contest. Purdue batters have been hit by a pitch nearly twice as often as second-place Ohio State (34). Meanwhile, the Boiler pitchers have plunked only 25 opposing batters, the second fewest in the league.
- At least one Purdue batter has been hit by a pitch in 31 of the first 33 games, the lone exceptions being the middle game of the Tennessee-Martin (March 12) and Minnesota (April 2) series. The Boilermakers have been

hit five times in a game on four occasions, winning three of the four games. The lone loss came in the home opener to Illinois State (March 22).

SCHREIBER TOPS IN THE BIG TEN IN STRIKEOUTS & BATTING AVERAGE AGAINST

- Brad Schreiber enters the weekend leading the Big Ten with 45 strikeouts in 42 innings pitched. He's also tops in the conference with a .219 batting average against, giving up only 34 hits in his first seven starts. And by issuing only 11 walks, he has compiled an equal number of strikeouts as hits and walks (45) combined.
- Schreiber has struck out at least seven in five of first seven starts, including a career-high eighth in his March 20 start at Tennessee Tech. He put together a collegiate quality start (5+ IP, 4 ER or fewer) every time out. He missed his April 2 start at Minnesota due to strep throat.

MILLER & TALBOTT ALSO LEADING THE LEAGUE

• David Miller and Stephen Talbott also enter the weekend leading the Big Ten in a statistical category. Miller is tops in the league with 20 walks, drawing 12 since the start of conference play on April 1. Talbott leads the Big Ten with 34 runs scored. He's one of five Boilermakers to rank among the Top 10. Talbott has scored a run in 22 of the 33 games this season, highlighted by a streak of eight consecutive games with at least one run scored from Feb. 26-March 8.

PERKINS RIDING 15-GAME HITTING STREAK

- Cameron Perkins enters the weekend riding a career-best 15-game hitting streak, the longest by a Purdue player since Brandon Haveman hit safely in the final 20 games of the 2009 season. He has hit safely in 30 of the 32 games he has played this season and reached base safely in all 32. Dating back to last year, he has reached base safely in 39 consecutive games.
- Perkins is off to a 13-for-23 start in Big Ten play. He has recorded multiple hits in each of the last five games, equaling out to a 12-for-21 stretch. The sophomore enters the weekend ranked among the Big Ten's top five in batting average (.382), home runs (4) and RBIs (31), leading Purdue in all three Triple Crown categories.
- Perkins' 15-Game Streak: .419 (26-for-62), 7 XBH, 2 HR, 12 RBI, 13 R, .486 OBP, 6 SB

WITTGREN SAVES THREE STRAIGHT, FOUR IN A WEEK

- Closer **Nick Wittgren** was a busy man over a seven-day in early April (6-12), earning a save in three straight Purdue wins and four times over a stretch of five games. Wittgren closed out wins at Butler, vs. Michigan (twice) and at Ball State. He only had to retire one batter to finish off the wins against Butler and Michigan (game two). But he worked three scoreless innings, striking out a career-high six, to wrap up the series-opening shutout of Michigan.
- Wittgren worked 4 2/3 innings of one-hit scoreless relief en route to earning the four saves in a week's time. He retired 14 of the 16 batters he faced, giving up a single against Michigan and hitting a batter at Ball State.

PURDUE SCORES FIRST EARLY AND OFTEN

- Purdue has scored first in 26 of its first 33 games this season (including the first 12 in a row) thanks in part to a 79-18 scoring edge in the first two innings of a game. The early offense has been the primary reason that the Boilers have failed to hold the lead at some point only four times in their first 33 games: March 15 at No. 1 Vanderbilt, March 22 vs. Illinois State and games one and three of the Minnesota series (April 1-2).
- · Because the Boilermakers have scored first so often, they've also trailed very infrequently early this year. Purdue did not trail in the first seven games of its eight-game win streak (from Feb. 27-March 12), a streak of 61 consecutive innings. For Consecutive Leading: 29 the season, the Boilers have held the lead for 169 of the 293 innings (58 percent) they've played.
- The Purdue pitching staff did not give up a run in the first inning until game No. 13 on March 12. The Boilermakers have batted first in 25 of the first 33 games.

RECORD SEVEN PURDUE PLAYERS EARN BIG TEN WEEKLY HONORS

- Cameron Perkins (Player, April 11) and Joe Haase (Pitcher, April 4) were the lastest Boilermakers to win their first career Big Ten weekly awards. Perkins was recognized after posting multiple hits in all three games of the Michigan series (April 8-10). Haase was honored for his complete-game shutout of Minnesota April 2 at Target Field. Purdue has had seven different weekly honorees, garnering at least one award following seven of the first eight weekends of the year.
- Since the Big Ten began recognizing Players and Pitchers of the Week in 1990, the seven different Boilermakers honored this year represents a new program high. Previously, Purdue had four honorees in 1997 and 2006. And with Matt Morgan winning Pitcher of the Week twice, the eight weekly honors are also a new team benchmark. The Boilermakers won five weekly awards in 2003 and 2006. Brad Schreiber has also been named Pitcher of the Week and teammates Barrett Serrato, Angelo Cianfrocco and Tyler Spillner have been honored as the league's top player over a seven-day stretch.

HAASE'S COMPLETE GAME, PERKINS' HOMERS HIGHLIGHT SERIES AT TARGET FIELD

- Joe Haase worked his first career complete-game shutout and Cameron Perkins went deep twice to highlight Purdue's Big Ten-opening series at Minnesota (April 1-2), which was played at Target Field.
- Perkins hit both of his home runs to left field, connecting for a solo shot to lead off the seventh inning of game one and hitting a three-run shot in the third inning of game two. It marked the second time this season he has homered in back-to-back games. He finished the series 6-for-12 with five RBIs. Stephen Talbott was also a productive 6-for-11 with three RBIs and three runs scored while making some solid defensive plays in left field.

HAASE POSTS SCORELESS-INNINGS STREAK

- Thanks in part to a complete-game shutout in his first career Big Ten start, Joe Haase was able to record a consecutive scoreless-innings streak of 14 over four appearances. It was snapped when Michigan scored in the first inning of the April 10 series finale. But the Wolverines managed to score just the one run against the junior, allowing the junior to compile an ERA of 0.43 while striking out 21 over his last 21 innings pitched.
- · Before Michigan snapped the scoreless-innings streak, top-ranked Vanderbilt (March 15) had been the last team to score against Haase. But the Commodores didn't score while Haase was actually on the mound in the fourth, fifth and sixth innings (an inherited runner scored against the bullpen in the sixth). Thus, it was a streak of 17 consecutive innings since a team had scored while Haase was literally on the mound. His ERA has dropped from 4.79 to 2.86 during his scoreless-innings streak.

- · Haase has pitched in 10 games this year, making six starts. Coincidentally, he's been on the mound in some of Purdue's biggest games of the year so far. His finest performance came on the big stage of Target Field in the Big Ten-opening series at Minnesota, striking out a career-high seven in his first collegiate complete-game shutout. He scattered seven singles and did not give up a hit after the sixth inning.
- The junior pitched in relief in the wins against nationally-ranked Connecticut and Pittsburgh at the season-opening BIG EAST-Big Ten Challenge. Haase led Purdue to another win against a nationally-ranked team when he beat Louisville with 8 2/3 innings of solid work in the March 8 midweek opener. He started the game against top-ranked Vanderbilt on the spring break trip, as well as the home opener against Illinois State.

TALBOTT STILL A PERFECT BASE THIEF

- Purdue has been active on the base paths for much of the season, successfully stealing at least one base in 26 of the first 33 games. Eleven Boilermakers have swiped at least one base but **Stephen Talbott** leads the way at a perfect 14-for-14. The sophomore is also a perfect 19-for-19 in his career.
- Talbott enters the weekend leading the Big Ten with 34 runs scored. He did not batter any higher than eighth in the lineup until getting a chance to leadoff in the finale of the Tennessee Tech series (March 20). But for the season he has batted eighth or ninth in 26 of the 32 games he has started.
- Talbott was the only Boiler that hit safely in all eight games of the spring break trip, finishing the road trip through Tennessee with a team-best .406 batting average. He finished a home run shy of the cycle in the March 12 win at Tennessee-Martin.
- TALBOTT ON SPRING BREAK: .406 (13-for-32), 5 2B, 3B, 4 RBI, 9 R, 2 HBP, 4 SB

PLAWECKI AMONG THE BIG TEN'S TOUGHEST TO K

- Kevin Plawecki ranks second on the team with a .350 batting average and has emerged as one of the toughest players to strikeout in the Big Ten. He has whiffed only seven times in 123 at-bats (151 plate appearances) to rank third in the Big Ten and 34th nationally in toughest to K entering the week. The sophomore has fanned just once every 17.8 at-bats (and once every 21.6 plate appearances). For his college career, he has gone down on strikes only 18 times in 327 at-bats (380 plate appearances).
- PLAWECKI IN MARCH: .393 (24-for-61), 4 2B, 9 RBI, 13 R, 4 BB, 8 HBP, .479 OBP

INJURY UPDATES; RAMER PROVIDES TRUE RELIEF

- Purdue lost **Ryan Bridges** for the remainder of the season when he broke the tibia in his right leg on a play at first base in the April 10 series finale against Michigan. Bridges had started 24 of the first 31 games at first base, including 19 in a row. He landed awkwardly on his leg after colliding with the Michigan first baseman near the bag while trying to beat out a sacrifice bunt. The U-M player had jumped in the air to try to catch a wild throw and came down on top of Bridges.
- The March 11 series-opening win at Tennessee-Martin also came at a steep price for Purdue. Starting pitcher **Matt Morgan** and **Angelo Cianfrocco** both left the game early with injuries and were sidelined for the rest of the month. Morgan struggled with his control due to a finger injury and Cianfrocco reinjured his right shoulder while hitting a foul ball.
- Morgan returned to the rotation for the Big Ten-opening series at Minnesota (April 1-2), pitching into the fifth inning. Cianfrocco returned to the lineup for the Michigan series (April 8-10) but has been limited to a designated hitter role.
- Morgan's injury forced him from the game with one out in the third inning of the series opener at UT Martin. **Robert Ramer** picked up the slack out of the bullpen, working five innings of one-run relief to earn the victory. He struck out a career-high five while matching the longest outing of his career. Ramer went on to start the series openers at Tennessee Tech and Bradley, again working five solid innings. He earned the win at Tech but settled for a no decision against Bradley.

SPILLNER SURGES THROUGH MARCH

- Tyler Spillner was Purdue's hottest hitter in the month of March, ending the month riding a career-best nine-game hitting streak (which he extended to 10 before it was snapped) and hitting safely in 13 of the final 14 games of the month total. He batted over .400 for the month even though he went 0-for-7 in the Lipscomb series the first weekend of March.
- The junior entered the month batting .276 and saw his average dip to .222 after the Lipscomb weekend. But the Purdue leadoff man batted .472 (25-for-53) over the final 13 games of March. He leads the team with 15 extra-base hits, recording 11 during his 10-game hit streak. He has also posted eight multi-hit efforts during his streak.

SCHREIBER CONSISTENT IN HIS FIRST SIX STARTS

- Brad Schreiber has emerged as Purdue's most consistent starting pitcher this season. He has pitched at least five innings in each of his first seven starts and gone at least six in six of the seven. The sophomore took a no-hitter into the sixth inning of his Feb. 27 win at Morehead State and earned Big Ten Pitcher of the Week honors for six innings of shutout ball in his March 27 win against Bradley. He has left the game with the lead in five of his first seven starts, all but his start against Tennessee Tech (March 20) and Michigan (April 9). Purdue rallied to win both games.
- By winning each of his first three starts, Schreiber became the first Purdue weekend starter to open the season 3-0 since Jay Buente in 2006. Buente won three of his first four starts as the team's No. 1 arm, the lone no decision coming in a Purdue win at nationally-ranked North Carolina.

SIX RELIEVERS ALREADY WITH AT LEAST ONE SAVE

- The Purdue bullpen has continued to backup the starting pitchers with solid relief work. Six pitchers have teamed up for Purdue's conference-leading 13 saves. **Nick Wittgren** has closed out seven wins and pitched in relief a team-high 15 times. **Lance Breedlove, Calvin Gunter, Blake Mascarello, Pat Gannon** and Sean Collins have also earned saves while recording the final out of a game.
- Wittgren's most impressive outing came in the Feb. 20 win against Pittsburgh. He slammed the door on a potential Pitt rally with the bases loaded and one out in the seventh inning. He entered the game with the Boilers clinging to a one-run lead in the seventh and struck out

the No. 4 and 5 hitters in the Pitt lineup to leave the bases loaded. After a 1-2-3 eighth inning, the Panthers posted back-to-back two-out hits against the sophomore right-hander in the ninth. But he again retired the Pitt cleanup hitter to close out the victory.

- Mascarello backed up Breedlove with 3 2/3 scoreless innings of relief in game two of the Lipscomb series.
- Gannon struck out a career-high seven and pitched over four leadoff singles while closing out the March 18 series-opening win at Tennessee Tech.
- Collins struck out four of the seven batters he faced to earn a save in the April 13 win versus IPFW in downtown Fort Wayne.
- Seven different pitchers had at least one save last season as Purdue totaled 14 as a team, none having more than three saves.

PLAWECKI NAMED TO JOHNNY BENCH AWARD WATCH LIST

- Sophomore catcher **Kevin Plawecki** has been named to the initial watch list for the Johnny Bench Award, which honors the nation's top Division I catcher. Forty-two catchers appeared on the initial watch list, which will be updated periodically until a list of semifinalists is unveiled May 19.
- Plawecki was a Freshman All-American in 2010 and is among the Big Ten's top prospects for the 2012 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. He has batted cleanup in every game he has started this season and proved to be Purdue's toughest player to strikeout, going down on strikes only seven times in his first 151 plate appearances.

EIGHT-RUN NINTH INNING LIFTS PURDUE TO RUBBER GAME WIN AT TENN. TECH

- Purdue baseball scored eight times in the ninth inning to break open a tie game and defeat Tennessee Tech, 12-4, in the March 20 rubber game of the weekend series and finale of the eight-game spring break trip. The team's biggest rally since scoring nine times in a March 26, 2010, home win against Chicago State gave Purdue its fifth consecutive victorious weekend to begin the season.
- Kevin Plawecki tied a program single-game record with the first five-hit effort by a Boilermaker since April 2009. He singled five times and was hit by a pitch with the bases loaded in the ninth inning.
- Stephen Talbott knocked in the go-ahead run in the ninth with a squeeze bunt that he beat out for a hit. Andrew Dixon scored the go-ahead tally after opening the inning with a base hit. Dixon later delivered a three-run triple in his second at-bat of the frame. David Miller also had two hits in the inning.

WALK-OFF LOSS SNAPS WIN STREAK; BOILERS VERSUS TOP-RANKED VANDY

- Purdue's eight-game win streak from Feb. 27-March 12 ended in dramatic fashion in the series finale at Tennessee-Martin. The Boilermakers carried a four-run lead into the bottom of the ninth inning and were two outs away from completing a three-game sweep. But the Skyhawks hit a pair of home runs in the ninth inning, including a walk-off two-run blast. It was Purdue's second walk-off loss of the season.
- March 15, the Boilers were shutout for the first time since April 2009 in a loss at top-ranked Vanderbilt (NCBWA poll). It marked the first time that Purdue played a team ranked No. 1 in the country since getting swept in a 2005 series at Texas.

McHUGH GOES DEEP FOR HIS FIRST COLLEGIATE HIT

• Freshman **Sean McHugh** made his first start for Purdue in the March 16 loss at Belmont and took advantage of the opportunity with a 2-for-3 showing. He was also hit by a pitch and scored twice. But the highlight of the day came in his first at-bat when he went deep to left field for his first collegiate hit. The two-run homer game Purdue a 3-0 lead in the second inning. McHugh also hit the first home run of the season (and so far only long ball) at Lambert Field, connecting for a solo blast to left field in the March 23 win against Wabash.

SPILLNER & CHARLES GO DEEP IN HOMER-HEAVY SERIES FINALE

- After no home runs were hit in the first two games of the Purdue-UT Martin series (March 11-13), both teams went deep three times in the finale. **Tyler Spillner** and **Eric Charles** both connected for homers, Spillner leading off the game with a long ball for the second time in his career. Charles, meanwhile, posted his first career multi-homer game with a solo shot and two-run blast. He joined **Angelo Cianfrocco** as Boilers with a multi-homer game this season and **Cameron Perkins**, **Kevin Plawecki** and **Stephen Talbott** as active Purdue players to accomplish the feat in their careers.
- Spillner and Charles had also gone deep at Tennessee-Martin's Skyhawk Field as freshmen in 2009. Charles has now hit three of his five career home runs and Spillner two of his five career long balls in Martin, Tenn.

BIG HITS FROM DIXON & SERRATO IN COMEBACK WIN

- Purdue posted its first true comeback win of the season March 12, scoring in each of the final five innings highlighted by a two-run ninth to defeat Tennessee-Martin, 8-7. The Boilermakers trailed for much of the game after giving up a first-inning run for the first time this season.
- Andrew Dixon and Barrett Serrato came through with keys hits late in the game. Dixon singled with two outs in each of his final two at-bats, driving in the game-tying run in the sixth and eighth innings. Later with one out, the bases loaded and Purdue trailing by a run, Serrato singled home the game-tying run. The Boilers went ahead moments later when Ryan Bridges drove in the go-ahead run with a sacrifice fly to left field.

BEST START SINCE 1993

• Purdue won its sixth straight game March 8 at No. 20 Louisville, posting its third win against a nationally-ranked opponent from the BIG EAST Conference this year. After winning each of the first two games of the Tennessee-Martin series, Purdue opened the year with an 11-2 mark. That represented the program's best start since the 1993 team was also 11-2. The 1993 Boilermakers began the year 16-2 on their way to posting a 36-win campaign.

PLAWECKI FINALLY HELD HITLESS

- Kevin Plawecki managed to record at least one hit in each of the first 11 games of the season in which he played. The longest hit streak of the sophomore's Purdue came to an end with an 0-for-5 showing in the middle game of the Tennessee-Martin series March 12. The 11-game run represents the Boilers' longest single-season hit streak so far this year.
- PLAWECKI'S 11-GAME STREAK: .383 (18-for-47), 3 2B, 8 RBI, 11 R, 3 BB, 3 HBP, .453 OBP

MORE NOTABLES ON LOUISVILLE WIN

- Although the teams played only twice from 1999-10, Purdue managed to post its first win against Louisville since 1998 March 8. In the process of wining 6-4, the Boilermakers snapped a pair of notable U of L streaks.
- Purdue was the first team to score more than four runs against the Cardinals this year. The Louisville pitching staff entered the game with a 1.47 team ERA.
- The Boilermakers snapped Louisville's 11-game win streak against Big Ten Conference teams dating back to 2009. The Cardinals won all three of their games at the season-opening BIG EAST-Big Ten Challenge and were 23-2 against Big Ten opponents since 2006.

MORGAN GOES THE DISTANCE, HAASE PITCHES INTO THE NINTH

- Matt Morgan kept Lipscomb off the scoreboard entirely with his three-hit, complete-game shutout in Purdue's 1-0 win on March 4. It was the senior's first career complete-game shutout and second complete game overall, earning him Big Ten Pitcher of the Week honors for the second time this season.
- Joe Haase finished one out shy of also pitching a complete game in the March 8 win at Louisville, but was still impressive with 8 2/3 innings of four-run ball. He did not issue a walk. At that point in the season, it was the longest outing of the junior's career by more than four innings.
- Morgan was honored for the third time in his career after striking out 10 in Purdue's first 1-0 win since 2007. While registering his third career game with 10 or more strikeouts, he struck out at least one batter in eight of his nine innings. His five 1-2-3 frames were highlighted by a ninth inning in which he retired the heart of the Lipscomb lineup in order. He needed only 108 pitches to go the distance in a game that was played in one hour and 51 minutes.

ANOTHER NO-HIT BID INTO THE SIXTH

- Lance Breedlove carried a no-hitter into the sixth inning of his first start as a Boilermaker, helping Purdue win game one of the march 6 doubleheader at Lipscomb. The right-hander gave up a leadoff single in the sixth but still managed to earn his first win as a member of the program with 5 1/3 innings of three-run ball.
- It marked the second Sunday in a row that a Purdue pitcher carried a no-hitter into the sixth inning. **Brad Schreiber** did likewise Feb. 27 at Morehead State before it was broken up by a two-out hit.

PERKINS' HITTING STREAK SNAPPED AT 14

- Cameron Perkins' career-best 14-game hitting streak dating back to the final four games of the 2010 season was snapped in the March 8 win at Louisville. The 14-game run matched Eric Charles for the longest streak by an active Boilermaker. Charles hit safely in 14 straight games in 2009 on his way to earning Freshman All-American honors.
- Perkins extended his hitting streak in his final at-bat of the March 4 win at Lipscomb, delivering the big hit of the 1-0 victory with a two-out, run-scoring single in the eighth inning to plate **Stephen Talbott** from second base. He also delivered a clutch bases-clearing, two-out double that put Purdue ahead in the ninth inning of game two of the Morehead State series. The sophomore came back the next day and connected for a two-run homer to center field in both games of the doubleheader.

Opening in 2012 The New Northwest Baseball Facility Construction to Begin Spring of 2011 Stadium to be located near the intersection of McCormick & Cherry on the northwest side of campus

The 2011 season will be Purdue's last at Lambert Field. The new northwest baseball facility is set to open for the 2012 home opener. The \$21 million baseball stadium, to be financed with athletics department funds, could eventually seat up to 2,500 spectators in the first phase of improvements to the Northwest Athletics Complex that includes the adjacent soccer facility. The intercollegiate baseball stadium will replace the existing 1,100-seat Lambert Field, which has been the team's home since 1965. Purdue will close out Lambert Field this year with an eight-game homestand from May 11-21, highlighted by Big Ten Conference series against Illinois and Iowa.
