HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Currently in his 17th season as the leader of the program, Schreiber is the program's all-time leader in overall wins and Big Ten wins. He eclipsed Dave Alexander's record for games coached (792 over 14 seasons) during the second weekend of the 2013 season. Schreiber played for Alexander at Purdue from 1983-86.

Purdue unveiled its new Alexander Field stadium and facilities during the 2012-13 school year, but the first two seasons at the new ballpark turned out to be rebuilding years for the Boilermakers after losing 15 seniors and three junior MLB draftees from the 2012 Big Ten championship team. As of July 2014, 10 members of the 2012 championship team had signed with MLB organizations at some point in their post-college careers.

In the five seasons between 2008 and 2012, Purdue went 172-110 overall (.610) and 75-51 in Big Ten play (.595). Both records represented the best marks in the league. The Boilermakers were the only conference team to qualify for the Big Ten Tournament each of those five seasons, the longest such streak in program history. Purdue has won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in eight of its nine appearances under Schreiber.

After playing six NCAA Regional qualifiers throughout the season, including four opponents that were among the 16 Regional hosts, Purdue's strength of schedule in 2014 ranked among the Top 25 nationally for much of the year, including as high as No. 2 in the country for much of non-conference play. The Boilermakers' eight extra-inning affairs were the most in Schreiber's tenure as well as the most in the Big Ten. Purdue also played in 17 one-run games, but managed just a 5-12 record in those contests.

During its historic 2012 season, Purdue won a program-record 45 games, captured a pair of Big Ten titles, earned the right to host an NCAA Regional and closed out Lambert Field in thrilling fashion. Schreiber was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year after leading the Boilers to the most wins by a Big Ten team since 2008. He won his 400th and program-record 408th career games at Lambert in the spring of 2012. His 408th victory as the leader of the program, April 15 in the finale of a series sweep of Illinois, made him Purdue's all-time wins leader.

The Boilermakers began the 2012 season 14-1, won 10 consecutive games twice, posted their 20th win before April 1 for the first time, reached the 30-win mark at the earliest date (April 20) in program history and won their first Big Ten title since 1909.

Headlined by Kevin Plawecki's selection 35th overall by the New York Mets, Purdue had a program-record seven players picked in the 2012 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. Juniors Plawecki, Cameron Perkins and Nick Wittgren were each selected in the first 10 rounds to give the Boilers three players drafted in the first 300 picks for the first time. Six times since 2006 multiple Boilers have been selected in the same draft. Highlighted by Big Ten Player and Pitcher of the Year honors for Plawecki and Joe Haase, Purdue had a program-high eight all-conference honorees in 2012.

Schreiber has coached 62 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 22 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the MLB First-Year Player Draft on 32 occasions.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including first all-time in walks (132), tied for first in games played (226), sixth in runs scored (159) and tied for eight in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

– BOILERS OKLAHOMA BOUND FOR THE FIRST TIME SINCE 2000 –

Purdue travels to the state of Oklahoma for the first time since 2000 this weekend for a three-game series against the last of its five first-time opponents on the 2015 schedule, the Sooners of the University of Oklahoma.

In April of 2000, head coach **Doug Schreiber's** second year, Purdue (4-7 in 2015) was swept in a three-game series at Oklahoma State, dropping one-run affairs in the final two games. The non-conference series was played the final weekend of April in part because the Big Ten schedule only featured seven conference weekends despite there being an even number of 10 teams in the league. Fast forward 15 years later and the Big Ten features 13 baseball programs and Oklahoma (10-5 in 2015) remains a part of a Big 12 Conference that features nine baseball programs.

Schreiber coached his 100th game as the leader of the Boilermakers that weekend in Stillwater. He'll coach his 900th career game at Purdue Friday in Norman. The former Boilermaker second baseman broke the all-time wins record in 2012 and the games coached benchmark early in the 2013 campaign.

Six of Purdue's last seven games have been played against first-time opponent entering this season. The Boilers have gone 3-3 in those six games and were three outs away from another victory this past Saturday against CSU Bakersfield. **Matt Frawley's** seven shutout innings of three-hit ball in Phoenix marked the first time a Purdue pitcher worked at least seven scoreless frames in an outing since Lance Breedlove went 7 1/3 to lead the Boilers to a shut-out win vs. Indiana at the 2012 Big Ten Tournament. But after its last two victories went final on game-ending double plays, Purdue could not prevent Bakersfield from scoring four in the top of the ninth thanks to a five straight hits to begin the inning.

After turning nine double plays over the course of the Feb. 26 doubleheader against Gonzaga, the Boilers once again lead the Big Ten in twin killings turned. Since the beginning of the 2012 Big Ten championship season, Purdue has now finished off eight wins with a notable game-ending double play. The victories at Illinois (1-2-3 DP) and at Illinois State (L5-3 DP) in 2104 ended in similar fashion as the wins vs. Sam Houston State (1-6-3 DP) and Gonzaga (L6-4 DP) this year.

The Boilermakers did the majority of their scoring in the first three innings during their four games in Phoenix. Of the 16 runs scored last weekend, only six were scored after the third inning. Purdue had a timely three-run insurance rally in the seventh inning vs. Bakersfield, but it proved to be only enough to get the game to extras.

Oklahoma won the Big 12 Tournament and an NCAA Regional at Virginia Tech in 2013. Coincidentally, OU's hired Va. Tech's Pete Hughes as its new head coach after Sonny Golloway left the Sooners for Auburn following the 2013 season. Oklahoma did not qualify for the NCAA Tournament last season for the first time since 2007. The Sooners last went to the College World Series in 2010 and were the national championships are recently as 1994. They were picked fifth in the Big 12's preseason coaches poll this year.

Oklahoma spent back-to-back weekends in the desert recently, playing nearly half of the Pac-12 (Arizona State, Washington State, Washington, Oregon State and Utah) in the state of Arizona and then a four-game series with BYU in Las Vegas. After compiling a 6-3 record in those games, the Sooners thumped Arkansas-Little Rock at home on Tuesday, 22-0. They're headed out to Honolulu next weekend for a four-game series at Hawaii before opening Big 12 play with a three-game set in Norman with Texas Tech.

While OU has yet to play a traditional three-game weekend series this season, it has had three pitchers emerge as its top starters. Jake Elliott (1.45 ERA, 17 Ks) and Jeffrey Curran (1.88 ERA, 1 XBH allowed in 14 1/3 IP) both sport ERAs below 2.00 and Alec Hansen leads the team with 24 strikeouts in 15 innings pitched. Sheldon Neuse (3-for-3, 5 RBI) and Craig Aikin (6-for-7, 6 RBI) both had big days at the plate Tuesday vs. UALR and have been among the team leaders offensively while hitting in the top half of the lineup. Kolbey Carpenter (.333, 4 HR, 11, 8 BB) is also off to a hot start.

Games against Missouri and West Virginia in 2010 featured past and present Big 12 teams, respectively, but Purdue has not played a series at a current Big 12 squad since opening the 2008 season at Baylor.

The Boilermakers are scheduled to host Northern Illinois at home next weekend.

BOILERMAKERS TRAVEL TO STATE OF OKLAHOMA FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 2000

• Purdue begins the month of March with a series at first-time opponent Oklahoma, visiting the Sooner State for the first since an April 2000 series at Oklahoma State. Head coach **Doug Schreiber** will coach his 900th career game as the leader of the Boilermakers Friday. Purdue has not played a current member of the Big 12 since losing to West Virginia at the 2010 Big East/Big Ten Challenge in Clearwater, Fla. The Mountaineers were a member of the Big East at the time. Missouri was a member of the Big 12 when the Boilers played a two-game midweek series in Columbia in March 2010. A season-opening series at Baylor in 2008 marked the last time Purdue played a series at a current member of the Big 12.

• In the first-ever trip to the state of Arizona last weekend, the Boilers won their opener at the Phoenix Muni Classic by defeating Gonzaga, 5-3. But Purdue was outscored 33-11 the rest of the weekend to finish the tournament 1-3. The Boilers took a 4-0 lead into the ninth inning against CSU Bakersfield in their final game in Phoenix but were unable to close out it, losing in 11 innings.

• Purdue went 2-2 at the Kleberg Bank College Classic Corpus Christi, Texas, the weekend of Feb. 20-22. The Boilers swept a doubleheader against three-time defending Southland Conference champion and 2015 preseason favorite Sam Houston State in thrilling fashion Feb. 21, winning both games in their final at-bat. **Michael Vilardo** recorded the game-winning RBI in each game on a sacrifice fly. Purdue lost to Missouri, 1-0, in its final game of the weekend. It was the Boilers' first 1-0 loss since the 2011 season finale against Minnesota at the Big Ten Tournament. The Tigers escaped a bases-loaded jam in the sixth inning by turning an unconventional 5-2-3-2 triple play.

10 EXTRA-INNING GAMES SINCE ST. PATRICK'S DAY 2014

• After blowing a four-run lead in the ninth inning en route to losing to CSU Bakersfield in 11 on Feb. 28, 10 of Purdue's last 47 games (21 percent) dating back to St. Patrick's Day 2014 have gone to extra innings. The Boilers' eight extra-innings games last year were the most during **Doug Schreiber's** 17-year tenure as head coach and believed to be the most in program history overall. Purdue is 4-6 in the 10 extra-innings game, including 1-1 this year.

FRAWLEY STELLAR IN START VERSUS BAKERSFIELD

• **Matt Frawley** surrendered only three singles and one walk over seven shutout innings, striking out five and putting together the finest outing of the young season by a Purdue pitcher in the Feb. 28 loss to CSU Bakersfield in Phoenix. He worked three 1-2-3 innings and retired 15 of 16 batters from the second through seventh innings. His strikeout and innings pitched totals were career highs as a Boilermaker. It marked the first time a Purdue pitcher worked at least seven shutout innings in an outing since Lance Breedlove led the way to a 3-0 win against Indiana at the 2012 Big Ten Tournament with 7 1/3 shutout innings.

• Bakersfield opened the ninth inning with five consecutive hits to rally for four runs and tie the game. Purdue was fortunate to get the game to extra innings after CSUB had the go-ahead run on third base with no outs. **Alex Lyons** got out of the jam thanks in part to an inexplicable suicide squeeze attempt with an 0-2 count on the batter with one out in the inning. However, the game marked the first time the Boilers suffered a loss after taking the lead into the ninth since the finale of last season's series at Minnesota when they gave up a three-run lead.

FIVE DOUBLEHEADERS IN GAME ONE WIN, NINE FOR THE DAY VERSUS GONZAGA

• Purdue tied a program record with five double plays in the game one win en route to finishing the Feb. 26 doubleheader vs. Gonzaga with nine twin killings. The five double plays were the most since the Boilers' turned four in a March 2012 win at Murray State. Gonzaga helped give Purdue a pair DPs in the game one win after an illegal slide into second base as the Boilers went for a 3-6-1 twin killings. An inning later, a runner tried to score from second base on a sac fly to right center after **Kyle Johnson** slipped while making the catch. But he quickly flipped the ball to **Jeff Evak**, who hit cutoff man **Cody Strong** and Purdue completed the F8-942 put out at the plate.

• Undoubtedly the most exciting double play of the nine was the game-ending line drive to **Harry Shipley** at shortstop. Gonzaga had the bases loaded with one out and Purdue was clinging to a 5-3 lead, but the Boilers successfully doubled off the runner at second base for the final out. It marked the second time this season that Purdue has won on a game-ending double play. Since the start of the 2012 season, the Boilers have turned a game-ending double play with a lead of three runs or fewer eight times.

• Purdue turned 54 double plays in 2014 to lead the Big Ten. The Boilermakers have already turned 15 in 11 games this season, the most in the conference entering the weekend. Purdue is also ranks first in the league by throwing out nine base stealers (9-of-20). **Jack Picchiotti** is one of 13 catchers nationally with at least five caught stealings to his credit.

KRIEG'S REACHED BASE SAFELY STREAK SNAPPED AT 26

• **Brandon Krieg** hit safely in each of the first seven games this season, extending his reached base safely streak to 26 consecutive games dating back to 2014. It ranked as the 13th longest active streak in the country when it was snapped Feb. 26 in game one of the doubleheader with Gonzaga. He had hit safely in 20 of the 26 games and overtook **Kyle Wood's** 24-game run last year for the longest reached base streak by an active Boiler. Cameron Perkins reached base safely in 50 consecutive games in 2011.

• Even with the streak snapped, Krieg is still off to a much better start at the plate than a year ago. Through 11 games last season he was 3-for-38. But he batted .325 from April 15 through the end of the season in 2014 and has hit safely in nine of the first 11 games this year.

VILARDO, PICCHIOTTI & GIBBS PLAY THE HEROES IN WILD DOUBLEHEADER SWEEP OF SHSU

• Purdue scored twice in the bottom of the 12th inning to rally for a 4-3 victory against Sam Houston State in the first game of a neutral-site doubleheader in Corpus Christi Feb. 21. **Alec Olund** scored the game-winning run as pinch runner on **Michael Vilardo's** sacrifice fly to right center field. Vilardo joined **Kyle Wood** and **Brandon Krieg** as active Boilers with a game-winning RBI in a walk-off victory.

• In the nightcap of the doubleheader, Purdue overcame deficits of 3-0 and 7-2 to win 9-7 after scoring three times in the top of the ninth inning. Vilardo again delivered the go-ahead run with a sacrifice fly. **Cody Strong** led off the final inning of both games with a base hit against SHSU closer Ryan Brinley, who suffered both losses after giving up a combined five runs. Brinley entered the day having not allowed a run in his 27 innings of relief for SHSU dating back to 2014.

• **Jack Picchiotti** drove in the game-tying run in both games of the doubleheader. He came through with a pinch-hit, two-out RBI single in the seventh inning of game one. In the nightcap, he also singled home the tying run and later scored the go-ahead tally on Vilardo's sac fly. **Daniel Sander's** pinch hit double plated the game-tying run in the 12th inning of game one. It was Sander's first hit as a Boilermaker.

• Of the 21 innings played in the SHSU doubleheader, Purdue only held the lead in the final inning of both games. The Boilers had not swept a doubleheader since April 2012 vs. Illinois. **Matt Gibbs** earned the victory in both games of the twinbill after retiring seven of the nine batters he faced over three scoreless innings of relief. He induced and started a game-ending double play in the nightcap and became the first Purdue pitcher since Chris Toneguzzi in April 2006 to earn the victory in consecutive games. Krieg, Vilardo and Wood joined Gibbs on the All-Tournament Team.

• The five-run deficit (7-2) the Boilers overcame in game two marked their largest comeback since scoring 10 times in the ninth inning at UCLA in May 2012 to rally back from a 10-5 hole entering the frame. However, Purdue's last win after trailing in the ninth inning was a May 2012 victory against Indiana State, 2-1 in 10 innings, in the final game at Lambert Field. A May 2005 doubleheader sweep of Iowa at Lambert is believed to be the last time Purdue won two games on the same day in its final at-bat.

STRONG OUTINGS FROM HAAN, McELROY & BRYANT IN CORPUS CHRISTI

• While **Matt Gibbs** garnered All-Tournament Team honors after earning the win in both games of the Sam Houston State doubleheaders, he was just one of a number of Purdue pitchers that strong outings in South Texas.

• As the starting pitcher in game one vs. SHSU, **Brett Haan** escaped a bases loaded jam in the first inning and went on to retire 10 consecutive batters. Both runs he was charged with scored after he left the mound in the sixth with the game still scoreless. **Tim McElroy** retired nine of the 10 batters he faced in game one vs. SHSU to help get the game into extra innings. The lefty also pitched an inning of scoreless relief Sunday against Missouri.

• **Shane Bryant** allowed a pair of inherited runners to score in game one vs. SHSU, but closed the weekend with four innings of two-hit relief, retiring 11 of the 13 batters he faced. The righthander retired the first seven batters he faced while working 1-2-3 innings in the sixth and seventh, Purdue's first 1-2-3 frames of the game.

PICCHIOTTI & EVAK'S CARRY OVER REACHED SAFELY STREAKS END

• Like **Brandon Krieg**, **Jack Picchiotti** entered 2015 riding a notable 19-game reached base safely streak. Picchiotti had reached base safely in the final 19 games of 2014 season in which he started, but that streak came to an end at 20 in game two of the Western Carolina series. It dated back to April 5, 2014, and the nightcap of a doubleheader vs. Penn State.

• **Jeff Evak's** 10-game reached safely streak that spanned the final seven games of 2014 and the first three this year ended in the Feb. 20 loss to Texas A&M-Corpus Christi. **Michael Vilardo's** nine-game reached base safely streak is now the longest on the team.

PURDUE PITCHERS STRIKE OUT 15 IN GAME THREE WIN AT WCU

• **Matt Frawley** (5), **Kyle Wood** (7) and **Joe Eichmann** (3) teamed up to strike out 15 Western Carolina batters as Purdue won game three of the series in Cullowhee, 9-5. It ranked as the third-highest strikeout total in program history and the most since the Boilers fanned 16 in a March 2010 victory at Ohio. Frawley struck out four his first time through the lineup. Wood struck out seven of the 15 batters he faced, striking out the side in the sixth and seventh innings. Eichmann struck out WCU's 2-3-4 hitters in order after giving up a leadoff walk and a batter reaching on an error to open the ninth inning. The senior earned his first career save.

• Wood's career-high strikeout total was the most by a Purdue pitcher since Jordan Minch and Connor Podkul both fanned seven as starters last season. However, they pitched at least six innings each time. Wood racked up his seven Ks in only three innings. **Matt Gibbs** and **Tim McElroy** both struck out six in a relief appearance last season, but Wood's seven Ks were the most by a Purdue reliever since Pat Gannon had seven over four innings in a March 2011 win at Tennessee Tech.

• Overall, Purdue pitchers have been more aggressive in the strike zone than what they demonstrated for much of last season. The Boilers have recorded 73 strikeouts vs. 37 walks (a 1.97 K/BB ratio) over the first 11 games. A year ago, the pitching staff had only 17 more strikeouts (243) than walks (226), a 1.08 K/BB ratio.

FINDING A WAY TO WIN MORE CLOSE GAMES

• Purdue was 9-16 in games decided by two runs or fewer last season. Ten of the 17 one-run games came in Big Ten play. Additionally, eight of those 25 close games were extra-innings affairs, Purdue going 3-5 in games longer than nine innings. The Boilermakers' eight extra-inning affairs were the most in the Big Ten during the regular season and the 17 one-run games ranked second in the league behind only Illinois (18).

• A better showing in close games coupled with a less-daunting pre-Big Ten schedule would seem to go hand in hand in helping Purdue have a better season this year. With six starting position players and almost the entire bullpen back from last year, numerous Boilers have experienced the ups and downs of numerous nail biters as well as playing six NCAA Regional qualifiers in 2014.

• Conversely, staying out of big innings early in games would also help Purdue's cause. The Boilers were outscored 53-7 in the first inning during the 2014 campaign, leading to many early deficits the offense was not equipped to overcome after scoring four or more runs in an inning only twice in 50 games.

SUMMER LEAGUE SUCCESS

• **Kyle Johnson** (Peninsula Pilots, Coastal Plain League) and **Kyle Wood** (Lakeshore Chinooks, Northwoods League) helped their summer league teams win league championships in the summer of 2014. They were the starting designated hitters in the two games their teams won in the finals round of the playoffs to clinch the league titles. Johnson was in the starting lineup for all six games Peninsula won in the playoffs and did not play in any of the three losses. Wood's team was named the nation's top summer league team by Perfect Game USA.

• **Jeff Evak** and **Matt Frawley** were named all-stars in the Midwest Collegiate League. **Brian Ghiselli** pitched in the Great Lakes League All-Star Game.

RUBBER GAME STRUGGLES

• Purdue did not win a weekend series in 2014 due in part to an 0-6 record in rubber games. Four times the Boilers won the opener of the series, but ended up losing two-of-three. Purdue has lost nine straight weekend rubber games dating back to May 2012. The Boilermakers have not won a weekend series after losing the opener since May 2009 at Michigan State. In the years since, on 11 occasions Purdue has won the opener of a traditional three-game set but failed to win the series. Nine of those 11 series have been in Big Ten play.

BEST IN THE BIG TEN FROM 2008-2012; THIRD BEST IN LEAGUE PLAY FROM 2000-2012

• After a program-best five consecutive Big Ten Tournament berths from 2008-12, Purdue has failed to qualify for the Big Ten Tournament the last two years. With the tournament field remaining at eight teams this year, the Boilers are looking to avoid their first three-year streak of not qualifying since 1988-92 (when it was only a four-team field). Purdue was a Big Ten-best 172-110 overall (.610) and 75-51 in league play (.595) from 2008-12. But the program has managed just a 30-71 overall mark (.297) the last two years.

• From 2000-2012, the Boilermakers were 197-168 (.539) in Big Ten play. Only Minnesota (220-140, .611) and Ohio State (211-152, .581) were better.
