## PURDUE HOSTS NORTHWESTERN & ILLINOIS FOR FIRST BIG TEN HOME WEEKEND

- After playing its first three Big Ten games on the road and splitting the Nebraska-Iowa weekend, the Boilermakers return home to host Northwestern and Illinois for the first two of their five home conference games this season. Purdue is slated to play five of its eight remaining Big Ten games at the Boilermaker Soccer Complex, where the team has compiled a 5-1-1 record this fall.
- The Boilermakers enter the weekend riding an eight-game win streak against Northwestern dating back to 2005. That represents not only Purdue's longest active win streak against any opponent, but also the longest in the history of the program. Previously, the Boilers posted seven-game win streaks against Indiana (2000-04), Minnesota (2001-07) and Ohio State (2005-08). Purdue has outscored Northwestern 18-4 during the streak.
- The home team has dominated the annual Purdue-Illinois series. The Boilermakers are 4-0-2 all-time against the Fighting Illini in West Lafayette but 0-8 vs Illinois in Champaign-Urbana. The Illini have not visited West Lafayette since 2009.

## SCORING STREAK AT SEVEN CONSECUTIVE GAMES

- Purdue has scored a goal in seven consecutive games, the team's longest single-season streak since the 2009 team found the back of the net in its first 12 games. The Boilermakers also had a seven-game scoring streak from the end of 2010 (final six games) through the 2011 season opener.
- Six different players have scored goals during the seven-game streak, helping Purdue record 15 goals in the seven games and outscore the opposition, 15-8. The Boilermakers have recorded multiple goals in six of the seven games.
- Purdue has been shutout only once (Aug. 29 vs. Butler) in its first 11 games of the season. The Boilers were blanked four times in their first 11 games of 2011.

## NIEWOIT'S GOLDEN GOAL LIFTS BOILERS TO OVERTIME WIN AT NEBRASKA

- **Taylor Niewoit** headed in a **Jordan Frick** corner kick in the opening minute of the second overtime period, lifting Purdue to a 2-1 victory at Nebraska Sept. 21. The Boilermakers posted their second overtime win of the year while playing 90-plus minutes for the fifth time this season. It was Purdue's first overtime win on the road since November 2009 at Indiana. The five overtime games are the most since the 2009 team played in six.
- Nebraska scored in the 25th minute and the Boilers trailed at the half for the first time this season. But **Alex Hairston** equalized in the 51st minute with her third goal of the season and team-best ninth career. Niewoit joined Hairston as active Purdue players with an overtime goal on their college résumés. Hairston scored the golden goal in the Aug. 19 OT win against Eastern Illinois.
- Defensively, goalkeeper **Clara Kridler** made a career-high nine saves, the most by a Purdue 'keeper since Carianne Betts stopped 10 shots in an October 2010 loss at Michigan. Kridler enters the week leading the Big Ten with 47 saves.
- The Boilermakers posted their first win against Nebraska since 2005 and their first victory in three all-time meetings in Lincoln.

## PURDUE SCORES FIRST IN SEVEN OF FIRST NINE GAMES

- The Boilermakers scored first in seven of their first nine games this season. They did not score first in the Aug. 24 overtime loss at Louisville and the 1-0 home loss to Butler on Aug. 29. And with two of Purdue's first three losses coming in overtime, the team did not trail very frequently during that stretch. The Boilers have trailed for only 37 minutes and 36 seconds of game action of the 865 minutes they have played in their first nine games. That calculates out to only 4.4 percent of the total minutes they've played.
- However, the Nebraska-Iowa road trip turned out to be a different sort of weekend. Both opponents scored first and the Boilers trailed at halftime of both games, marking the first time this season that had happened. Purdue trailed for 26 minutes at Nebraska before **Alex Hairston** equalized in the 51st minute and the team went on to win in overtime. At Iowa, **Hadley Stuart** scored a second-half equalizer but the Boilers were behind for 71 minutes of the game. So Purdue trailed for 97 of the 191 minutes of the Nebraska-Iowa road trip but still managed to get a weekend split.
- For the season, the Boilers have now been behind for 135 of the 1056 minutes they have played, trailing for only 12.8 percent of actual game action.

## TOPPIN-HERBERT MAKES FIRST CAREER START; 16 BOILERS HAVE NOW STARTED IN 2012

- The injury bug has hit Purdue as of late. With **Mollie Kuramoto** already out for the season due to a knee injury suffered in the spring, the Boilers were also without four other players with starting experience – **Shae Desmond**, **Emma Lancaster**, **Marta Lynch** and **Jessica Warren** – in the Sept. 23 loss at Iowa. **Soraya Toppin-Herbert** stepped in and made her first collegiate start in the Iowa game, becoming the 16th Boiler to start this season. Sixteen of the 22 players that have seen action this year have started at least once. Purdue had 17 players make at least one start last season.
- The Boilermakers have had to use eight different starting lineups in their first 11 games. The Evansville, West Virginia and Central Michigan games marked the only time Purdue had the same starting lineup in at least three consecutive games.
- **Jordan Frick**, **Alex Hairston**, **Clara Kridler**, **Kim Love** and **Hadley Stuart** represent the five Boilers that have started each of the first 11 games. **Chinyelu Asher** (7 starts), **Melissa Casella** (7 starts) and **Taylor Niewoit** (9 starts) have also played in all 11 games.

## PAWLIK SCORES IN HER BIG TEN DEBUT

- **Jordan Pawlik** leads the team with seven goals, scoring in four of the first seven games she has played in for Purdue this season. She accounted for the team's lone goal in the Big Ten opener at Michigan State, scoring in her Big Ten debut. The junior transfer from Louisville joined **Alex Hairston** (2011), **Jessica Stellohorn** (2007), **Jessica Okorofao** (2005), **Annette Kent** (2000) and **Kate Queen** (1999) as Boilers to score in their first Big Ten games.
- Pawlik has already exceeded her goal total in her two seasons at Louisville. She scored four times in 39 games (35 starts) for the Cardinals from 2010-11.
- Pawlik enters the week ranked fifth in the Big Ten with seven goals. Among the Top 10 goal scorers in the conference, Pawlik has played in the fewest number of games.

## PURDUE POSTS 3-1-1 MARK DURING FIVE-GAME HOMESTAND

- The Boilermakers closed out their season-long five-game homestand with a 3-1-1 record after shutting out Central Michigan, 2-0, Sept. 12. Purdue posted each of its three victories during the homestand in shutout fashion. The homestand was originally slated to be six games in length but it was shortened by one game after the Sept. 7 match against Milwaukee was postponed due to storms and lightning. It was the third longest homestand in program history.

## HAIRSTON SETS UP SEVEN GOALS IN FOUR GAMES

- **Alex Hairston** posted three consecutive multi-assist efforts during the five-game homestand, setting up six of Purdue's eight goals in the games against Tennessee-Martin, Evansville and West Virginia. She also assisted on Purdue's first goal in the homestand finale against Central Michigan.
- Hairston is the first player in program history with three multi-assist games in the same season, much less accomplishing the feat in three consecutive games. In the process, she became one of five Boilers all-time with three career multi-assist efforts, tying a program record. **Shauna Stapleton** (2007) was the last Purdue player to record back-to-back multi-assist games. **Annette Kent** (2003) and **Kelly Haxton** (2003) also accomplished the feat.
- Hairston also joined **Kellie Phillips** (2008 and 2010) as the only players in program history to register an assist in four consecutive games.
- Hairston's right-to-left crosses led to goals by **Chinyelu Asher** and **Hadley Stuart**, scored just over six minutes apart, versus UTM. Hairston then assisted on the first two goals of **Jordan Pawlik's** hat trick versus Evansville. In the draw with WVU, she setup goals by Stuart and Pawlik. She capped the stretch with an assist on **Taylor Niewoit's** game-winner against Central Michigan.
- Hairston enters the week leading the Big Ten with seven assists. She is one of five active Purdue players with a multi-assist effort on their college résumés.

## FOUR SHUTOUT WINS IN THE FIRST EIGHT GAMES

- With four of the Boilers' first five wins coming in shutout fashion, Purdue has already exceeded its 2011 total for team shutouts. After **Clara Kridler** went the distance in the Aug. 31 win against Tennessee-Martin, she was one of three Purdue goalkeepers to see action in the next game against Evansville, another shutout victory. In the process, Purdue recorded its first set of consecutive clean-sheet efforts since September 2010 (vs. Wisconsin and Northwestern). With that Wisconsin game ending in a scoreless draw, the Boilers had not won back-to-back games in shutout fashion since October 2009.
- The 2007 season marked the last time Purdue recorded four shutouts in its first eight games. The 2000, 2002, 2003, 2004 and 2006 teams also had four shutout victories in their first eight games of the year.
- Purdue surrendered only three goals in 470 minutes of action (0.57 GAA) during the five-game homestand. For the season, the Boilers have given up only four goals in 666 minutes (0.54 GAA) at home overall in 2012. Two of those four goals were scored by West Virginia in the 2-2 draw on Sept. 9. The Mountaineers' first goal of the game, scored in the 53rd minute, ended Purdue's shutout streak at 255 consecutive minutes.

## INJURY FORCES WARREN TO LEAVE FIELD FOR FIRST TIME IN 2012

- An ankle injury in the eighth minute of the Sept. 12 win against Central Michigan forced **Jessica Warren** to leave the field for the first time this season and has sidelined Purdue's senior captain since. She had gone the distance at center back in each of the first seven games of the season. Last season, Warren went the distance in seven of the first eight games.
- Purdue went on to not only defeat a quality CMU team, but also won in shutout fashion. **Marta Lynch** moved to center back and **Makaela Nellams** joined **Jordan Frick**, **Kim Love** and Lynch on the back row. Starting midfielder **Emma Lancaster** was also injured late in the CMU game and missed the Big Ten opener at Michigan State.
- Love is now the only Boiler that has gone the distance in each of the first 11 games. The freshman has been a consistent performer at center back.

## BOILERS SETTLE FOR DRAW AFTER WVU'S LATE EQUALIZER

- West Virginia scored in the 88th minute Sept. 9 at the Varsity Soccer Complex to tie the game in an eventual 2-2 draw. Purdue held the lead twice and had a chance to go up 3-1 on a penalty kick opportunity in the 64th minute, but the WVU goalkeeper made a nice save on **Jordan Pawlik's** PK shot attempt.
- Even though WVU was able to score late to tie the game, Purdue goalkeeper **Clara Kridler** played her finest game of the season in the draw. She finished with seven saves, one shy of her career high, highlighted by a stopping a number of 1-v-1 chances, both early and late in the game.
- The Purdue-WVU draw marked the second year in a row that the Boilers have played in a 2-2 tie at the Varsity Soccer Complex. Purdue and Cal State Northridge also finished deadlocked at 2-2 exactly one year ago to the day. Previously, high-scoring draws had been a rare occurrence. Prior to last year's game with CSUN, the Boilers had not played in a draw in which four goals were scored since August 2003 against Eastern Michigan.

## PAWLIK'S HAT TRICK HIGHLIGHTS RAINY DAY WIN

• All four goals in the Sept. 2 win against Evansville were scored by Purdue players named Jordan, highlighted by a hat trick from **Jordan Pawlik**. After Pawlik's natural hat trick had given the Boilers a 3-0 lead early in the second half, **Jordan Frick** recorded her second career goal to cap the scoring.

• Pawlik's hat trick was only the fourth in program history, tying a program record for goals in a game. But it was also the fourth hat trick at the Varsity Soccer Complex in less than a calendar year's time. Purdue's Kellie Phillips (Oct. 13), Nebraska's Morgan Marlborough (Sept. 23) and Michigan's Nkem Ezurike (Oct. 16) also scored three goals in a game at the VSC last season. Of the four hat tricks in program history, only Courtney Coppedge also scored three goals in consecutive fashion to account for the other natural hat trick in the record book.

• Pawlik had missed the first two games of the team's six-game homestand due to an injury sustained in practice on Aug. 26. She now leads the team with six goals, five coming as part of multi-goal efforts. Lore-dana Riveroso and Parrissa Eyorokon (2007) were the last Boilers to have at least two multiple-goal games in the same season.

• The Boilermakers had 13 corner kick opportunities in the Evansville win, the team's highest total since recording 16 in a 2009 win versus Evansville.

## LOVE NAMED BIG TEN FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

• **Kim Love** was selected as the Big Ten Freshman of the Week after going the distance at center back as the Boilers surrendered only one goal in their three games the week of Aug. 27-Sept. 2.

• Purdue held Butler without a corner kick opportunity Aug. 29 in a frustrating 1-0 loss. The lone goal of the night was scored on a second-half penalty kick. Love then helped the Boilers post shutouts in weekend victories against Tennessee-Martin and Evansville. It was Purdue's first set of consecutive shutouts since September 2010. Purdue allowed only 13 shots on goal in the three games.

• Love joins **Alex Hairston**, **Chinyelu Asher** and **Jessica Warren** as active Purdue players to win Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors. She is one four Purdue freshmen to start at least once (along with **Melissa Casella**, **Emma Lancaster** and **Makaela Nellams**) and is among the nine that have seen action this season. Love is also one of six players on the team overall that have started each of the first nine games of 2012.

## WILD NIGHT AT LOUISVILLE ENDS IN OVERTIME LOSS

• In a wild game that featured seven goals, a power outage and two brief delays due to darkness, Louisville scored in the 102nd minute of double overtime to defeat Purdue, 4-3, Aug. 24.

• The game marked only the second time in program history the Boilers have scored three goals in a loss. A September 2002 overtime win at Oakland (4-3) and an October 1999 loss to Iowa (6-3) represent the two previous games in program history that saw both teams score at least three goals. The Boilermakers have now been involved in a game that has featured seven-plus goals 16 times, compiling a 10-6 record in those games.

• Louisville opened the scoring in the fifth minute and tallied a late equalizer in the 86th minute. Purdue held the lead for 22 minutes on the night but could not make **Chinyelu Asher's** late goal in the 83rd minute, which broke a 2-2 tie, holdup.

## TWO GOALS IN SCHOOL-RECORD TIME ON BACK-TO-BACK FRIDAYS

• Four of Purdue's first six goals this season were scored in a grand total of 93 seconds of actual game action. That's because on consecutive Fridays, the Boilers scored twice in less than a minute. In her Aug. 24 return to Louisville, where she played in 2010 and 2011 before transferring to Purdue, **Jordan Pawlik** scored twice in a span of 45 seconds to help the Boilers overcome an early 1-0 deficit. **Hadley Stuart** helped setup both goals. The 45 seconds elapsed represents the smallest amount of time between goals in program history.

• A week earlier, **Alex Hairston** and Stuart scored 48 seconds apart in the second half to help Purdue defeat Toledo in shutout fashion in a season opener for the second year in a row. Coincidentally, Pawlik assisted on both scores.

• The previous program record for the smallest amount of time between two goals both scored by Purdue was 55 seconds. Shauna Stapleton and Parrissa Eyorokon scored back-to-back in a November 2007 blow-out win against Indiana.

• Pawlik and Stuart represent the only active Boilers with a multi-goal and a multi-assist effort on their college résumés. Pawlik has accomplished the feat in only three games at Purdue.

## HAIRSTON'S GOLDEN GOAL LIFTS PURDUE TO FIRST OVERTIME WIN SINCE 2009

• **Alex Hairston** scored in the 106th minute of double overtime to propel Purdue to an overtime win against Eastern Illinois Aug. 22. It was the Boilers' first overtime win since November 2009, the regular-season finale against Iowa. Purdue had gone 0-4-4 in its eight games longer than 90 minutes since. All eight overtime affairs had been at home.

• An own goal was the difference in Purdue's last overtime win. Sylvia Forbes' golden goal four days earlier in an overtime victory at Indiana was the last of its kind credited to a Purdue player.
