- AROUND THE HORN -

• Purdue is in search of its first Big Ten series victory since March 2013 when it swept Penn State in Central Pennsylvania.
• The Boilermakers have lost 24 straight games against ranked teams dating back to June 2012. Purdue's last win against a ranked foe was at UCLA in May 2012 when it scored 10 runs in the ninth inning to overcome a 10-5 deficit.
• The Boilers have lost 11 straight Big Ten games since winning their conference opener vs. Rutgers. Purdue has scored just 25 runs during the Big Ten losing streak (2.3 per game).
• Purdue has only played Maryland once before. The Terrapins handed the 2012 Big Ten championship team its first loss of the season at East Carolina's Keith LeClair Classic. Current Michigan head coach Erik Bakich was the UMD skipper at the time. **Brandon Krieg** pinch hit as the only active player for either team to see action in the game.
• **Kyle Johnson** shares the Big Ten lead in walks (27) with UMD's Brandon Lowe.

- Kept Purdue in the game early at No. 12 Illinois, with 2 of the 3 runs he was charged with scoring after he left the game in the 5th.
- Was deserving of a win vs. No. 24 Iowa after giving up just one earned run over 6-plus innings in quality start, but Hawkeyes rallied for 8 runs vs. the Purdue bullpen.
- Put together his best start as a Boiler in win vs. NIU, striking out career-high six over 7 innings; gave up just five hits & 1 earned run.
- Worked 1-2-3 frames in 1st & 4th innings at ASU, but couldn't come up with shutdown frames after Boilers scored multiple runs in 2nd & 3rd.
- Retired 10 consecutive batters & surrendered only 5 singles in strong outing (5 1/3 IP of 2-run ball) vs. Sam Houston State.
- Started Big Ten series finales vs. Penn State, Michigan State and Michigan in 2014 as a transfer from Parkland CC in Champaign, Ill.
- Worked five shutout innings versus PSU to help lead Purdue to its only shutout win of 2014.
- Worked four innings of scoreless relief in the 16-inning marathon with Southern Illinois.
- Helped Central Catholic win three straight IHSAA Class A state championships & an 81-20 record from 2009-11.
- Two-time small school area player of the year in basketball.

- Did not give up a legit hit vs. NIU until the 6th inning after retiring 13 of the first 14 batters he faced; did not issue a walk over 6 innings.
- Had not allowed an extra-base hit in 16 innings pitched this season until Oklahoma went homer-double-homer against him in bottom 3rd.
- Shined vs Bakersfield, retiring 15 of 16 batters during one stretch en route to 7 shutout innings of 3-hit ball.
- Helped lead Purdue to game 3 win at Western Carolina by striking out 4 while going 9-up, 9-down his first time through the lineup.
- Enjoyed a strong summer in Midwest Collegiate League, where he was named an All-Star & pitched 8 innings of 3-hit ball in a playoff win that sent his DuPage County Hounds to league championship series.
- Took the mound in each of the first 6 weekends as a freshman.

- Earned his first career Big Ten win with seven innings of three-hit ball Michigan (April 2014).
- No. 4 LSU did not score while he was on the mound in first start of 2014.
- Earned the win vs. Butler March 1 with 5 2/3 shutout innings, inducing three inning-ending ground ball double plays.
- True walk-on has been a part of the program since the fall of 2011 but redshirted in 2012 after not making the official 35-man roster.
- Worked 4 1/3 innings of scoreless two-hit relief in his team debut, a 2013 midweek game vs. Indiana State.
- Performance vs. ISU earned helped earn him four midweek starts, including shutout win vs. UIC.
- Helped Carroll High School win back-to-back 4A IHSAA state titles and was the winning pitcher in 2011 title game; all-conference & all-area honoree went 12-1 to tie the CHS wins record as a senior.

HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Currently in his 17th season as the leader of the program, Schreiber is the program's all-time leader in overall wins and Big Ten wins. He eclipsed Dave Alexander's record for games coached (792 over 14 seasons) during the second weekend of the 2013 season. Schreiber played for Alexander at Purdue from 1983-86.

Purdue unveiled its new Alexander Field stadium and facilities during the 2012-13 school year, but the first two seasons at the new ballpark turned out to be rebuilding years for the Boilermakers after losing 15 seniors and three junior MLB draftees from the 2012 Big Ten championship team. As of July 2014, 10 members of the 2012 championship team had signed with MLB organizations at some point in their post-college careers.

In the five seasons between 2008 and 2012, Purdue went 172-110 overall (.610) and 75-51 in Big Ten play (.595). Both records represented the best marks in the league. The Boilermakers were the only conference team to qualify for the Big Ten Tournament each of those five seasons, the longest such streak in program history. Purdue has won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in eight of its nine appearances under Schreiber.

After playing six NCAA Regional qualifiers throughout the season, including four opponents that were among the 16 Regional hosts, Purdue's strength of schedule in 2014 ranked among the Top 25 nationally for much of the year, including as high as No. 2 in the country for much of non-conference play. The Boilermakers' eight extra-inning affairs were the most in Schreiber's tenure as well as the most in the Big Ten. Purdue also played in 17 one-run games, but managed just a 5-12 record in those contests.

During its historic 2012 season, Purdue won a program-record 45 games, captured a pair of Big Ten titles, earned the right to host an NCAA Regional and closed out Lambert Field in thrilling fashion. Schreiber was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year after leading the Boilers to the most wins by a Big Ten team since 2008. He won his 400th and program-record 408th career games at Lambert in the spring of 2012. His 408th victory as the leader of the program, April 15 in the finale of a series sweep of Illinois, made him Purdue's all-time wins leader.

The Boilermakers began the 2012 season 14-1, won 10 consecutive games twice, posted their 20th win before April 1 for the first time, reached the 30-win mark at the earliest date (April 20) in program history and won their first Big Ten title since 1909.

Headlined by Kevin Plawecki's selection 35th overall by the New York Mets, Purdue had a program-record seven players picked in the 2012 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. Juniors Plawecki, Cameron Perkins and Nick Wittgren were each selected in the first 10 rounds to give the Boilers three players drafted in the first 300 picks for the first time. Six times since 2006 multiple Boilers have been selected in the same draft. Highlighted by Big Ten Player and Pitcher of the Year honors for Plawecki and Joe Haase, Purdue had a program-high eight all-conference honorees in 2012.

Schreiber has coached 62 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 22 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the MLB First-Year Player Draft on 32 occasions.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including first all-time in walks (132), tied for first in games played (226), sixth in runs scored (159) and tied for eight in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

- BOILERMAKERS HOST MARYLAND FOR THE FIRST TIME -

Purdue hosts Big Ten newcomer and 20th-ranked Maryland for its third weekend series of the month against a Top 25 conference rival.

The reworked schedule features a Friday doubleheader at 4 p.m. and a Sunday series finale at noon. Game two of the series was moved to Friday night due to rain and thunderstorms in the forecast for Saturday.

Purdue will welcome back a large group of alumni this weekend and they will be recognized during the nightcap Friday. Former Boilermakers going all the way back to the 1950s are expected to be in attendance.

The Terrapins have been nationally ranked all season after winning the Columbia, S.C. Regional of the NCAA Tournament last season. Maryland is led by Brandon Lowe, the Big Ten leader in home runs (9), walks (27) and slugging percentage (.624), and Mike Shawaryn, the league leader in wins (9) and strikeouts (82). Shawaryn has won nine of his 10 starts and struck out 20 more batters than any other Big Ten pitcher. He was one of four Big Ten pitchers named to the College Baseball Hall of Fame's Pitcher of the Year watch list Thursday.

Coincidentally, both players have compiled many of their impressive statistics while playing in the friendly confines of Bob "Turtle" Smith Stadium, where the dimensions are 320 to left field, 380 to center and 325 to right field. The Terps have played 19 of their 40 games in College Park this season and just wrapped up a home-heavy stretch in which they played 13 of their 15 games at home from April 1-22. Maryland posted an 8-7 record during that 15-game stretch, dropping its final three games. Since blowing out Iowa, 10-1, in the April 10 opener of key Big Ten series, the Terps have scored just 21 runs in their last eight games. And nine of those 21 runs came in a game two win against Cal State Fullerton last weekend.

However, with Shawaryn leading the way, Maryland has won its first game of every weekend but one. UNC Wilmington went on to sweep UMD after scoring six times in 4 2/3 innings against Shawaryn in the series opener. Tyler Stiles had been the Terps' Saturday starter in recent weeks but was hit by a line drive off the bat of the first hitter of the game last weekend and had to leave the game. Relief ace Robert Galligan is scheduled to take Stiles spot in the rotation this weekend, making his first start of the season.

Purdue and Maryland have played just once before. The Boilers' 2012 Big Ten Championship team suffered its first loss of the season at the hands of the Terps at East Carolina's Keith LeClair Classic tournament during the second weekend of the season. Current Michigan head coach Erik Bakich was the skipper of Maryland at the time. Brandon Krieg is the only active player for either team to see action in that game, making his collegiate debut that night. However, three alumni expected to be in attendance this weekend saw against UMD in 2012.

Kyle Johnson shares the Big Ten lead in walks with Maryland's Lowe, who has batted leadoff for much of the season. Purdue also features the conference leader in hit by pitch in freshman Harry Shipley (14). However, it is Maryland's hitters that have been plunked the most in the league overall (59) this year.

Shipley has now batted leadoff in each of the last 15 games, reaching base safely at least once in all but one game during that stretch. The freshman has reached safely in 13 of his 26 opportunities to lead off an inning while hitting first in the lineup.

The doubleheader Friday means that seven of Purdue's first 11 weekends this season will have featured a twinbill. Maryland has played five doubleheaders this season, including each of its first three Big Ten weekends (vs. Minnesota, at Michigan and vs. Nebraska).

BOILERMAKERS SET TO HOST ANOTHER BIG TEN NEWCOMER

- Purdue will look to snap its 11-game losing streak in Big Ten play as it hosts Maryland for the first time in program history this weekend. The Boilermakers also welcomed fellow Big Ten newcomer Rutgers to Alexander Field this year. The 11-game Big Ten losing streak is Purdue's longest since dropping 12 in a row in 1977.
- Hosting Iowa and playing at Illinois for three years in a row did not go well for the Boilers over the first half of April. After getting swept by both of the Big Ten's current co-leaders, Purdue fell to 1-8 against both Iowa and Illinois dating back to 2013. A sweep at the hands of Michigan kept the Boilers without a series win in Ann Arbor since 1993, their longest active drought at any Big Ten rival.
- With Iowa and Illinois both nationally ranked, Purdue played a Top 25 team in consecutive weekends for the first time since February 2013 (Louisville and Mississippi State). However, both of those were tournaments. The Boilers had not played standard weekend series against back-to-back ranked teams since March 2006 at North Carolina and Missouri. The 2000 campaign marked the last time Purdue played two ranked Big Ten teams (Illinois and Minnesota) in the same season. With Maryland and Nebraska also in the Top 30 and on the horizon, nationally ranked opponents could become a regular feature to the schedule through mid-May.
- The Boilers are 4-10 in the month of April, winning midweek games against IPFW (two), Indiana State and Ball State. The victory at ISU April 7 was Purdue's first in Terre Haute since 2006. The Boilers have scored 39 runs in their four midweek wins this month and 28 runs in their 10 April losses. It has remained a feast or famine stretch for Purdue offensively over the last 27 games (since March 14). In the Boilers' last eight wins, they've scored 83 runs (10.4 per game). But in their last 19 losses they've managed just 44 runs (2.3 per game).

PURDUE TIED FOR THE BIG TEN LEAD IN DOUBLE PLAYS TURNED

- The Boilers enter the weekend tied for the Big Ten lead in double plays turned (44). Penn State has turned also turned 44 in 36 games. Purdue has turned multiple double plays in a game 12 times this year, including five against Gonzaga (Feb. 26) and four against Butler (March 28). Shortstop **Harry Shipley** has contributed to 30 of the 44 double plays (68 percent) and second baseman **Cody Strong** has been a part of 26 of the 44 (59 percent). Purdue also led the Big Ten in double plays turned last season (54 in 50 games).
- Individually, Shipley leads the Big Ten in defensive assists (142) while starting every game at shortstop. **Kyle Wood** (365) is tops in putouts. Catcher **Jack Picchiotti** has thrown out a league-leading 15 base stealers.

BRYANT SHINES IN MIDWEEK SHUTOUT OF BALL STATE

- **Shane Bryant** struck out a career-high nine over eight innings of five-hit ball, leading Purdue to its second shutout victory of the season, 6-0, against Ball State April 22. It was the longest outing of the season by a Boilermaker.
- Bryant's nine strikeouts were the most by a Purdue pitcher Brad Schreiber also fanned nine in March 2013 at Penn State. He became the first Purdue pitcher to work at least eight scoreless innings in an outing since Joe Haase pitched a complete-game shutout against Michigan in May 2012. Bryant is the first Boiler to work at least eight innings without issuing a base on balls since **Gavin Downs** did not walk a batter in his complete game vs. Ohio State in April of last season.
- In the 2-0 home-opening win against Valparaiso March 18, it was Bryant that earned the victory with 5 1/3 scoreless innings. He has compiled a 1.61 ERA and struck out 21 over 22 1/3 innings pitched at Alexander Field this season.

APRIL PROVING TO BE HOME RUN FRIENDLY

- In 14 games this month, Purdue hitters have already connected for more home runs (13) they did in the first 27 games of the season (10). Unfortunately for the Boilers, the additional long balls have not led to more wins. Eleven of the Purdue's 13 home runs this month have been solo shots, continuing on a season-long trend in which 18 of the team's 23 homers have come with the bases empty. **Alec Olund** (three), **Kyle Wood** (three), **Brandon Krieg** (two) and **Jordan Lewis** (two) have all hit multiple home runs in April, headlining the group of seven Boilers that have gone deep this month. **Brett Carlson**, **Kyle Johnson** and **Jack Picchiotti** have also homered in April.
- Wood homered in games two and three of the Iowa series, going deep in consecutive games for the second time in his career. He also accomplished the feat in April 2013 in a home win vs. Illinois-Chicago and a road loss at Michigan State. He joined **Jack Picchiotti** as Boilers to homer in consecutive games this season. Wood also hit his first home run at Alexander Field in nearly a year, his last being on April 8, 2014, vs. Louisville.

SHIPLEY EXCELLING IN LEADOFF ROLE

- After batting ninth in each of the first 26 games of the season, **Harry Shipley** moved to the leadoff spot for the final game of March and has excelled in that role since. The freshman enters the weekend having reached base safely in 10 consecutive games, hitting safely in the last six. The freshman has reached base safely in 14 of the 15 games in which he has batted leadoff, compiling a .478 on-base percentage over that stretch thanks in part to 15 free passes (9 walks, 6 HBP). He has reached base safely to begin an inning in 13 of his 26 chances over the last 15 games and 9 of 18 chances during his 10-game reached safely streak.
- Shipley was hit by a pitch for the 14th time this season in the April 22nd win against Ball State, tying **Kyle Wood's** Purdue freshman record from 2013. The shortstop leads the Big Ten in HBPs this season.

TIMELY HITTING NON-EXISTENT IN BIG TEN PLAY

- Over the last three weekends, Purdue is 14-for-78 (.179) with runners in scoring position and 12-for-81 (.148) with two outs. During the Big Ten season as a whole, the Boilers have managed just a .202 average with RISP and .148 clip with two outs, recording just six of their 33 RBI with two outs.
- Purdue out homered Iowa (3-0) and Michigan (3-1) in both series but still got swept twice. The three roundtrippers against Iowa were the Boilers' only extra-base hits of the series. Thirty of Iowa's 36 hits over the course of the weekend were singles, but the Hawkeyes were successful with the base-hit approach. For the series, Iowa was 19-for-44 with runners in scoring position and 14-for-38 with two outs. Conversely, Purdue was 6-for-23 with runners in scoring position and 4-for-27 with two outs. Michigan out hit the Boilers, 43-22, and had 12 extra-base hits in the series, including nine doubles.
- Illinois flipped the script a bit in Champaign and swept the series thanks in part to nine extra-base hits. The Illini only had a 26-25 edge in total hits but still outscored the Boilers, 17-7, over the three games. Purdue was just 3-for-28 with runners in scoring position in the series and did not record a two-out RBI.

WOOD STILL ROLLING ALONG

- **Kyle Wood's** season really took off when he enjoyed a monster weekend at Oklahoma (9-for-11, 3 XBH, 7 RBI) the weekend of March 6-8 to garner Big Ten Player of the Week honors. He's batting .305 with nine extra-base hits and 16 RBI in the 27 games since then. The junior reached base safely in each of the first 10 Big Ten games this year and had a 16-game reached safely streak in league play that dated back to last season. The streak was snapped in game two at Michigan. He has also had a 10-game overall hitting streak but it ended in game one in Ann Arbor.
- Wood is making a bid to become the first Boilermaker since 2007 (Ryne White) to win the team triple crown. Last year, he overtook Sean McHugh for the team lead in batting average during the final weekend to deny McHugh the team triple crown.
- **Jack Picchiotti**, **Kyle Johnson** and **Brandon Krieg** all saw notable reached base safely streaks end during the Illinois series. Picchiotti had been on base in 14 straight Big Ten games dating back to last season. Johnson (14) and Krieg (11) had their double-figure reached base safely streaks in all games end in game two at Illinois.

OLUND POSTS FIRST MULTI-HOMER GAME BY A PURDUE FRESHMAN SINCE 2010

- Purdue's first multi-homer game since May 2013 (Sean McHugh) came from an unlikely source. Batting ninth in the lineup in only his fourth start of the season, **Alec Olund** connected for a pair of solo home runs to left field in the April 1 home win vs. IPFW. It was the first multi-homer game by a Purdue freshman since April 2010 (Cameron Perkins), making it the first of the BBCOR bat era (2011-present).
- Olund also made starts against Iowa and Indiana State, but was injured in the fourth inning of the ISU win while trying to make a diving catch on the warning track in right field. He missed the Illinois series with a separated shoulder but was able to return to the lineup for the April 15 win vs. IPFW, going 2-for-3 with a double, walk and three runs scored. He enters the weekend having started six straight games.
- There have been only two multi-homer games in the first 49 regular-season games at Alexander Field. However, with 14 homers in the first 14 games this season, home runs are up. There were only 16 long balls hit in the 35 games at the first two years of the new ballpark.
- **Kyle Johnson** walked four times in the April 1 win vs. IPFW, becoming the first Boiler to draw four walks in a game since **Cody Strong** in April 2013. Prior to Strong in 2013, a Purdue player had not walked four times since February 2009.

BIG EIGHTH INNINGS FOR AND AGAINST; FIFTH INNING PROVING COSTLY

• Over the first week of April, eighth-inning rallies proved to be the difference in a pair of Purdue's games. April 4, Iowa scored eight times in the top of the eighth to overcome the Boilers' 4-2 lead entering the frame. It marked the second time in a week's time that the opposition put up an eight spot at Alexander Field after Butler also did it in the sixth inning of the nightcap of the March 28 doubleheader.

• April 7 in Terre Haute, Purdue scored five times in the eighth inning to extend its lead from 5-4 to 10-4 en route to winning the game 10-6. It matched the Boilers' biggest rally of the season; they also scored five times in an inning against Northern Illinois (twice) and Oklahoma.

• The fifth inning has been very unkind to Purdue this season, getting outscored 47-14 in baseball's middle frame. The minus-33 run differential is by far the Boilers' worst of any inning this year. For the season, Purdue has a minus-65 run differential. Nearly half of that negative differential has come from the fifth inning.

PICCHIOTTI'S MARCH POWER SURGE

• **Jack Picchiotti** reached base safely in 11 straight games in March, hitting safely in eight of the first nine. He was 12-for-38 with seven free passes and 11 RBI during that stretch. Seven of the 12 hits went for extra bases, highlighted by home runs against Valparaiso and Rutgers. The long ball against Rutgers was a grand slam, Purdue's second in a four-game stretch. He became the first Boiler to homer in consecutive games since Sean McHugh in March 2014 at Southern Illinois. However, Picchiotti was the first Boilermaker to do so in consecutive games at Alexander Field in the ballpark's brief three-year history.

• **PICCHIOTTI'S 11-GAME REACHED SAFELY STREAK (MARCH 14-28): .316, 7 XBH, 3 HR, 11 RBI, 11 R, 5 BB**

BOILERMAKERS SNAP RUBBER GAME LOSING STREAK, BUT LOSE 2-OF-3 TO RUTGERS

• Not only did Purdue's 23-5 win vs. Northern Illinois March 15 snap a 10-game losing streak in weekend series rubber games, it also allowed the Boilers to win a series after losing the opener for the first time since May 2009 at Michigan State. Purdue's last rubber game win had been in April 2012 at Nebraska.

• However, the rubber game demons rose up again in the March 22 loss to Rutgers. The Scarlet Knights took games two and three to win the series after the Boilers won the opener, 9-5. Purdue has lost nine straight rubber games in Big Ten play dating to May 2012. Going back to the opening weekend of conference play in 2010, the Boilers have won the first game of a weekend but lost the series 10 times in Big Ten play. It has happened 13 times overall since the beginning of the 2010 season. During that stretch, the Boilers only won the middle game of a series three times after losing the opener.

SHIPLEY IMPRESSES DEFENSIVELY DURING 14-GAME ERRORLESS STREAK AT SHORTSTOP

• Shortstop **Harry Shipley** and center fielder **Kyle Johnson** are the only Boilers that have started every game at the same position this season. Shipley has done it as a freshman thanks in part to his steady play at the most important defensive position. He has committed 10 errors in 216 defensive chances. His 14-game errorless streak ended March 21 in the middle game of the Rutgers series (March 21). It was his first error since game two of the Sam Houston State doubleheader on Feb. 21. During his 14-game streak without an error he handled 74 defensive chances cleanly. He enters the weekend leading the Big Ten with 142 defensive assists.

• Shipley has been involved in all four game-ending double plays this season. **Cody Strong** and Shipley teamed up on both game-ending line drive double plays, with the tying run aboard both times. Those closed out victories against Gonzaga (Feb. 26) and Valparaiso (March 18). Shipley also made a nice diving stop behind second base to start a game-ending 6-4-3 double play in the March 20 victory vs. Rutgers. Dating back to the start of the 2012 season, Purdue has closed out nine wins on notable game-ending double plays. That total includes games in which the potential tying run was at least in the on-deck circle at the time of the twin killing.

SNIDANKO'S GRAND SLAM, SEVEN RBI HIGHLIGHT BLOWOUT WIN VERSUS NIU

• Purdue scored multiple runs in seven consecutive innings to slug its way to a 23-5 rubber game win vs. Northern Illinois March 15. Despite not entering the game until the sixth inning, **Ted Snidanko** finished the day with a career-high seven RBI and just a single shy of the cycle. He connected for a grand slam in the sixth inning as Purdue posted its second five-run frame of the game. It was the first slam by a Boilermaker since Sean McHugh at Michigan in May 2013 and he became the first Purdue player with seven RBI in a game since Josh Estill in April 2013.

• Snidanko nearly hit two grand slams. He tripled off the fence in left center with the bases loaded in his third at-bat. The sophomore entered the day with one extra-base hit and no RBI in 27 games as a Boilermaker.

• Purdue recorded 20 runs and 20 hits for the first time since wins against Illinois-Chicago in March (hits) and April (runs) of 2013. But the 23 runs Sunday were the most since beating Indiana, 25-8, in April 2006 in Bloomington and the 24 hits were Purdue's most since racking up a program-record 30 in a March 2012 victory at Murray State.
