EXHIBITION GAME 02: Things to Know

• The Purdue men's basketball team closes out its exhibition season on Friday, Nov. 7, when Carroll College (Mont.) visits for a 7 PM (ET) tipoff in Mackey Arena. Tickets are available on PurdueSports.com or by calling 1-800-49SPORT.

• The Boilermakers are coming off an 89-52 victory over California (Pa.) in last Sunday's preseason opener. After trailing 7-2 in the early moments, the Boilermakers rattled off a 33-2 run to take control of the contest. Purdue shot 54.0 percent from the field, had 22 assists on 34 field goals and outrebounded the Vulcans, 49-37, for the contest, outscoring the Vulcans, 52-18, in the paint.

• **A.J. Hammons** and **Isaac Haas** combined for 25 points, nine rebounds and seven blocks while going 12-of-14 from the field (11-of-11 inside the three-point line) in a dominating performance. **Rapheal Davis** added 11 points and **Bryson Scott** scored 10 points with four assists in the rout.

• Purdue had 10 players dish out assists, including five players with at least two helpers. Nine players scored at least five points. The highly-regarded freshman class combined for 30 points, 17 rebounds and nine assists and shot 13-of-25 (.520) from the field in 86 minutes. The class did account for eight of Purdue's 10 turnovers.

Previewing Carroll College

• Located in Helena, Montana, Carroll College comes to Indiana to play three games in three days and give head coach **Carson Cunningham** a homecoming of sorts. Cunningham excelled at Purdue from 1999-01, totaling 886 career points and 318 assists while earning Academic All-America honors in 2001.

• After posting a 9-19 record in his first season, Cunningham has the Saints off to a strong start in 2014-15, bolting out to a 4-1 record and boasting a high-powered offense. The Saints are averaging 80.8 points per game and shooting 49.8 percent from the field. Four players are shooting over 60.0 percent from the field and the Saints are connecting on 73.6 percent of their free throws. Carroll led NAIA in free throw percentage a year ago (.792).

• Sophomore guard **Zach Taylor** paces Carroll, averaging 18.2 points per game while shooting 88.2 percent (30-of-34) from the free throw line. Freshman **Oliver Carr** averages 15.0 points per game, while shooting 61.5 percent (32-of-52) from the field.

• Carroll will continue their Indiana trip with games at Purdue-North Central (Saturday) and Purdue-Northwest (Sunday), before returning to Montana.

■ Recapping California (Pa.)

- The win over California (Pa.) was the largest margin of victory in an exhibition opener during the Painter era and the second largest exhibition win under Painter (biggest win was against Newberry on November 3, 2012; 109-68).
- Purdue went on a 33-2 run over 10-plus minutes in the first half to turn a 7-2 deficit into a 35-9 lead midway through the first half.
- Purdue held California (Pa.) to 52 points, marking the 16th time in the last 17 exhibition games that Purdue has held its opponent under 70 points. The lone time it didn't was last year's opener against UIndy (73).
- Purdue's 54.0 percent shooting from the field was its third-best percentage in an exhibition game under Painter.
- California (Pa.) shot just 28.8 percent from the field, the third-lowest percentage against a Painter-coached team in exhibition play.
- Purdue's 10 turnovers were the second fewest in an exhibition game under Painter (Saginaw Valley State on Nov. 8, 2007 -- 9).
- Purdue recorded assists on 22 of its 34 made field goals (.647). Last year, Purdue assisted on just 51.0 percent of its field goals.
- Ten different players recorded assists and four players had at least three assists.
- Five different players hit three-pointers. Last year, Purdue had just two games where five players hit trifectas.
- Purdue's freshmen accounted for 30 points, 17 rebounds and nine assists and shot 13-of-25 (.520) from the field.
- **Isaac Haas** went 5-of-5 from the field, the most field goals made without a miss in an exhibition game in the Painter era.
- Purdue's starting five accounted for just one turnover in 87 minutes.

■ Exhibition Dominance

- The Boilermakers own a 59-7 (.894) record all-time against exhibition foes, having won 24 straight games.
- Since 1991-92, Purdue is 45-3 (.938) in exhibition games and 22-0 all-time against collegiate teams in exhibition games. All told, Purdue has won 24 straight exhibition games.
- Under **Matt Painter**, Purdue is 19-0 in exhibition games, winning by an average of 24.3 points per game (461 points in 19 games).

P NUMBERS TO KNOW**19-0**Purdue is 19-0 under head coach **Matt Painter** in exhibition games, winning by an average of 24.3 points per game.**25,9,7**Purdue's two 7-footers, **A.J. Hammons** and **Isaac Haas**, combined for 25 points, nine rebounds and seven blocks vs. Cal (Pa.). They went 12-of-14 from the field.**37**

Margin of victory in the exhibition opener against California (Pa.) on Sunday -- the largest margin in an exhibition opener since the 1994-95 season.

■ Series With the Fighting Saints

- This will be the first meeting between the two schools on Friday night, and marks just the sixth game against a school from the "Big Sky State".
- The Boilermakers are 4-1 against schools from the state, owning a 2-0 series lead against Montana and a 2-1 advantage against Montana State.
- Just one of the five meetings have come in the last 50 years, an 84-66 win over Montana on Jan. 4, 2003. Current assistant video coordinator **Kenneth Lowe** had nine points, six assists and two assists in the contest.
- The lone loss against a team from the state of Montana came in the 1930 season, a 38-35 loss to Montana State. Current radio play-by-play announcer **Larry Clisby** remembers the game vividly.

■ Welcome Back, Dr. Cunningham

- Carroll (Mont.) head coach **Carson Cunningham** is bringing his team back to the arena where he started 75 games from 1999 to 2001.
- Cunningham was a three-year starter for the Boilermakers from 1999-01, where he played in 96 career games and helped Purdue to a 62-38 record and a spot in the Sweet 16 (1999), the Elite Eight (2000) and NIT Tournament (2001).
- He scored 886 career points and his 318 assists are the 16th most in school history (3.31 apg / 12th all-time). His 82.3 percent free throw percentage is ninth on the career charts.

■ Freshmen Perform Well in Exhibition Opener

- With **Vince Edwards** getting the starting nod last Sunday against California (Pa.), it marked the fifth straight game and 11th time in 19 exhibition games during the **Matt Painter** era that a freshman earned a nod in an exhibition game.
- With Edwards helping out, the freshman class combined for 30 points, 17 rebounds and nine assists and shot 13-of-25 from the field.

■ Sharing and Taking Care of the Rock

- Purdue showed that it may be a much-different team than last year in last Sunday's exhibition opener, as it dished out 22 assists on 34 made field goals, while committing just 10 turnovers.
- Purdue had 10 different players dish out assists and four players recorded at least three assists.

■ Seniors on the Roster

- The 2014-15 edition of the Purdue men's basketball team has just two seniors listed on its preseason roster, but if the past is any indication, senior experience doesn't mean much towards success.
- However, just one player, **Neal Beshears**, was on the team last year as **Jon Ochteus** joined the team in early October.
- Since 1972-73, Purdue has had five previous seasons where the Boilermakers had just one senior returning from the previous season (2007-08, 2000-01, 1998-99, 1996-97 and 1992-93).
- In four of the five previous seasons, Purdue reached the NCAA Tournament, including a Sweet 16 appearance in 1998-99. The other year (2000-01), the Boilermakers reached the NIT Tournament.
- Purdue has reached the postseason in all five seasons (since 1972-73) that it had just one senior on the roster.

■ Free Throws a Point of Emphasis

- Head coach **Matt Painter** knew that to be better this year, the Boilermakers MUST be better from the free throw line. Early indications show they will be.
- In the two preseason scrimmages, the Boilermakers connected on 82-of-110 (.745) free throws, including a remarkable 23-of-29 (.793) from their two 7-foot centers (Hammons and Haas).
- However, the Boilermakers then resorted to last year's ways in the exhibition opener, making just 14-of-26 (.538) of their free throw attempts including 0-of-5 from Hammons and Haas.

■ Tracking the Returnees

- Purdue returns three starters from last year's team that went 15-17 overall. The three starters (Hammons, Smotherman, Stephens) combined for 57 starts among them while **Rapheal Davis** (15) and **Bryson Scott** (2) added 17 starts between them for a total of 74 starts returning.
- The 74 returning starts from the previous year are the fourth fewest for a Painter-coached squad at Purdue. The only years that had fewer returning starts were 2012-13 (53), 2007-08 (59) and 2006-07 (55).
- This marks the fourth time under Painter that the team returns fewer than 75 starts from the previous year. The combined record of those three squads is 63-38 with a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances (2007, 2008).

■ The Sultan of Swat

• A.J. Hammons knows what is ahead of him and that the success of Purdue basketball rests largely on his wide shoulders. If the preseason is any indication, the Boilers may be in good hands.

• Hammons has had an outstanding preseason and is Purdue's leading returning scorer (10.8 ppg), rebounder (7.4 rpg) and shot blocker (3.1 bpg).
• Hammons needs just 12 blocked shots to move into a third-place tie with Russell Cross (1981-83; 175) on the Purdue career rejections list.

• Hammons has had five games (in 65 career games) where he has recorded six or more blocked shots. By comparison, Joe Barry Carroll had eight games of six or more blocks in 123 contests.

• Among active players nationally, Hammons ranks 11th in career blocked shots, but is fourth among juniors.

■ Protecting The Rim

• Purdue's 168 blocked shots were the second most in a season in school history, while its 5.3 blocked shots per game average was the highest mark in school history. Purdue led the conference in blocked shots per game for the first time during the Matt Painter era.

■ Boilers' Defense Struggles

• Meanwhile, the Purdue defense struggled allowing 71.7 points per game, the highest average for opponents since the 1997-98 season (72.3 points per game). Purdue allowed opponents to reach 70 points in 19 games, posting a 6-13 record when opponents reached that mark. Purdue was 9-4 when holding foes to 69 or fewer points.

■ Glass-Cleaners

• Purdue led the Big Ten in offensive rebounds per game in all contests (13.9) and conference games only (13.6). The 13.9 offensive rebounds per game were the most for a season during the Painter era.

• Purdue's plus-3.5 rebound margin was good for fourth in the Big Ten, its highest finish in the Big Ten during the Painter era. The plus-3.5 rebound margin was the second-best total during the Matt Painter era.

• In league play only, Purdue boasted a plus-4.9 margin, good for second in the league.

■ Protecting the Rock

• It may have appeared that Purdue struggled with turnovers last season, but actually Purdue finished with its sixth-fewest turnovers in school history (393) and sixth-lowest turnover average (12.3 per game).

■ Oteus Prime Ready For Primetime

• The Boilermakers received big news in early October when Colorado State transfer Jon Oteus announced he will be attend Purdue and be eligible immediately via the NCAA's graduate-student transfer rule.

• Oteus, who will seek his master's degree in the school of technology, averaged 13.4 points, 4.7 rebounds and 2.3 assists per game at Colorado State, while starting all 32 games.

• Oteus averaged over 20.0 points per game against ranked opposition, scoring 27 points against Gonzaga and 24 against San Diego State. Over the last 13 games of the season, Oteus averaged 16.6 points per game.

• The most-telling statistic of Oteus' game is his ability to get to the free throw line. Oteus had seven games where he attempted at least 10 free throws. Last year, Purdue's team had just 10 such instances.

■ Freshmen Getting The Nod in Openers

• During Matt Painter's previous nine years, 10 freshmen have started the season opener, including current member Kendall Stephens.

• That is a far cry from previous regimes, where in the previous 33 years before Painter (from 1972-73 season when freshmen became eligible), just five freshmen started the season opener.

■ This Year's Freshmen Look Ready

• This year's freshman class looks ready to contribute for the Purdue men's basketball team if the preseason scrimmages are any indication.

• Four of the five players scored in double figures in the team's second scrimmage, and the lone rookie that didn't, P.J. Thompson, tallied eight points and five assists.

Turnovers The Difference In Winning and Losing

- In the four years from 2009 to 2012 that Purdue made the NCAA Tournament, the Boilermakers' yearly NCAA ranking in turnover margin were 24th, 4th, 14th and 9th, an average placing of 12.8. In the last two years, the Boilermakers ranked 257th and 230th, an average ranking of 238.5.
- From 2007 to 2012, Purdue never ranked lower than third (once in 2007) and led the Big Ten in 2008, 2010 and 2012 in turnover margin. In the last two years, Purdue has ranked 12th and 11th, respectively.
- From 2008 to 2012, Purdue ranked 53rd, 17th, 15th, ninth and first in turnovers per game, an average national ranking of 19th. Over the last two years, Purdue has ranked 116th and 178th, an average of 147th.

Sophomores Coming Off Big Rookie Campaigns

- This year's sophomore class is coming off a strong rookie campaign and has hopes of helping return the Boilermakers to the NCAA Tournament.
- The group scored 726 points (22.7 points per game) a year ago, the sixth most by a freshman class in school history. All three players reached some sort of accolades during the year.
- **Kendall Stephens** earned All-Big Ten Freshman team accolades after making 64 three-pointers, the second most by a freshman in school history.
- **Basil Smotherman** shot 58.0 percent from the field, the third-best percentage by a freshman in school history (min. 100 attempts).
- **Bryson Scott** became the first Boilermaker freshman in school history to be named Big Ten Freshman of the Week twice.

Dialing Long Distance

- Sophomore **Kendall Stephens** ended last season second on the school's freshman three-pointers made list with 64, leading all Big Ten freshmen. He earned All-Big Ten Freshman team accolades after averaging 8.0 points per game, and now that he is 100 percent healthy, Stephens could be ready to break out in 2014-15.
- However, Stephens accounts for 64 of the team's 80 returning three-pointers made from a year ago. Just one other returning player, **Rapheal Davis** (9), made more than six three-pointers in 2013-14. All told, the

program returns just 90 career three-pointers made.

- Painter is hoping that incoming freshmen **Dakota Mathias**, **Vince Edwards** and **P.J. Thompson** will be able to strengthen the team's perimeter attack as all three players enter their collegiate careers regarded as strong perimeter shooters.
- The Boilermakers are hoping they can contribute immediately. Over the last two seasons, Purdue has made just 321 three-pointers in the 66 games played (4.86 per game), the fewest in a two-year span since 2005 and 2006 (288 three-pointers). From 2007-12, Purdue made 1,422 three-pointers in 209 games (6.80 per game).
- Over the last two years, Purdue is 321-of-991 (.324) from three-point range. From 2007-12, Purdue was 1,422-of-3,983 (.357) from long distance.

Have We Met Before?

- Purdue will face four first-time opponents this year in Grambling, IU-PUI, Gardner-Webb and Arkansas State, but if past records against the respective leagues mean anything, Purdue can expect success.
- Against the four respective leagues (Big South, SWAC, Summit, Sun Belt), Purdue is a combined 28-0 entering the 2014-15 season.

Big Margins In Season Openers

- Purdue has won by at least 25 points in six of **Matt Painter's** nine season openers, including by a modern-day school-record 62 points against Northern Illinois to tip off the 2011-12 season. In each of those six seasons they won their opener by 25 points or more, the Boilermakers advanced to the NCAA Tournament.
- Going even further back, in the last 11 occurrences that Purdue won its season opener by at least 25 points, the Boilermakers made the NCAA Tournament.

- Purdue started 13 different starting lineups in 2013-14 after starting 11 the previous year.
- Since the start of the 2012-13 season, **Matt Painter** has started 24 different starting combinations in 66 games.
- In each of the previous six years (2008-13), Purdue ranked in the nation's top 99 in assist:turnover ratio; last year, Purdue was 145th.
- Almost 50.0 percent (1,100-of-2,312) of Purdue's scoring last year was in the paint.
- Last year, opponents scored at least 70 points in six of the last seven, 10 of the last 13 outings and in 19 of 32 games overall.
- Purdue held 21 of a possible 31 opponents under their scoring averages entering the game.
- Purdue held 20 of a possible 31 opponents under their pregame field goal percentages.
- Purdue was 11-15 last year when outscoring foes in second-chance points, 4-2 when it didn't.
- Purdue was 12-4 last year when outscoring opponents in points off turnovers, 3-13 when it didn't.
- Purdue owns an eight-game home non-conference winning streak and is 67-5 (.931) under Painter at home vs. non-conference foes.

• With a pair of Sweet 16 appearances, six NCAA Tournament berths, Big Ten regular-season and tournament titles and an international gold medal on his résumé, 10th-year head coach Matt Painter is widely regarded as one of the brightest minds in all of college basketball.

• Painter affirmed his long-term commitment to Purdue in March of 2011, agreeing to a new eight-year contract that will keep him in West Lafayette through at least the 2018-19 season.

• Painter has averaged over 21 wins per season during his tenure at the helm of the Purdue program, including at least 20 victories in six of those seasons.

• Painter's tenure has seen Purdue basketball restore its status among the upper echelon of college basketball programs. The last eight years have seen six 20-win seasons and NCAA Tournament berths, two Sweet 16 appearances, a regular-season Big Ten title and a Big Ten Tournament crown.

• The three winningest classes in program history are the classes of 2011, 2012 and 2010, respectively, and five of the 10 winningest individual players Purdue has ever seen have come from the Painter ranks. Success, however, didn't happen overnight.

• Painter officially became the 18th head men's basketball coach in Purdue history on April 1, 2005, and immediately set about laying the groundwork for a dramatic reversal in the program's fortunes.

• The Boilermakers were at their best during the 2009 postseason run, rattling off double-digit victories over Penn State and Illinois to reach the Big Ten Tournament final, where they dispatched Ohio State, 65-61, to earn the first conference tournament crown in program history.

• Painter has also resurrected Mackey Arena as one of the country's best home-court advantages, piling up a 123-28 (.815) record at home over the last nine seasons, including a remarkable 67-5 (.931) record against non-conference opponents.

• Painter has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year three times in the last six seasons, earning the consensus award in 2008 and 2011, and winning the coaches' vote in 2010. He is one of only six men to win the award more at least three times since its inception in 1974.

• Painter has seen a total of 21 players earn a combined 38 Academic All-Big Ten honors during his tenure as head coach. Painter has also mentored an Academic All-American, as Moore earned second-team honors during the 2009-10 season.

• In addition, the program has received the NCAA Public Recognition Award for posting a multi-year academic progress rate among the top 10 percent. Purdue has had an APR of at least .985 in each of the last three years, one of two schools in the Big Ten that can stake that claim (Michigan).
