#### **BOILERMAKERS SET FOR BIG ROAD TRIP TO UPPER MIDWEST**

- · Currently alone in first place in the Big Ten as the only remaining unbeaten team in league play, Purdue visits Wisconsin and Minnesota this weekend for the biggest road trip in recent program history. The Boilermakers are off to their best start to Big Ten play since the 2007 team was also 4-0-1 on the way to a 6-0-1 start.
- Purdue defeated both Illinois and Northwestern in shutout fashion last weekend, improving to a combined 15-2-3 (.825) at home all-time against the league's Land of Lincoln teams. The Boilermakers are 6-1 at home this year and play three of their final four regular-season games at home beginning Oct. 12.
- · Purdue enters its Wisconsin-Minnesota trip riding a shutout streak of 265 consecutive minutes, its longest streak in Big Ten play since 2013 (333 minutes). The Boilermakers have posted consecutive shutouts three times this year and their six shutouts are the program's most since 2009.

#### PURDUE AMONG THE MOST IMPROVED NATIONALLY

· While scoring 13 more goals than they did a year ago, the Boilermakers have already won five more games than they did in 2016. One more victory would allow Purdue to match its biggest win improvement (+6 from 2006 to 2007) in program history and also give the Boilermakers their first 10-win season since 2009 (12-6-3).

· Entering the weekend, Purdue is second nationally with a plus-.527 improvement in winning percentage. Only two other teams have already won more than five games than last season.

#### WILLIAMS LEADING BIG TEN IN POINTS, GAME-WINNING GOALS

· Maddy Williams leads the Big Ten with 26 points. With nine goals and eight assists, she has had a direct impact on 17 of Purdue's 28 goals (61 percent). Her five game-winning goals one shy of the team's single-season record, are also tops in the league. The senior is also ranked among the top five nationally in points, assists and game-winning goals.

· Williams assisted on Sarah Griffith's goal at Indiana for her 90th career point, tying the program record held by Lauren Ses-

selmann. She then broke the record with her game-winning goal in the 1-0 victory vs. Illinois. Williams eclipsed Alex Hairston's all-time assists in the Michigan State win and now has 26 for her career.

#### HASE, LUCE SWEEP BIG TEN WEEKLY AWARDS

- Purdue was rewarded for its shutout wins vs. Illinois and Northwestern with a sweep of the Big Ten weekly awards by Kylie Hase and Katie Luce. Hase was recognized as the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week and Freshman of the Week. Luce was honored as the 2014 Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week. Since Freshman 2011 of the Week was added to the league's weekly awards 2011 program in 2009, this marks only the second time that the Boilermakers have swept the three weekly honors. They also accomplished the feat in August 2009 after a big win at No. 6 Texas A&M.
- · Hase was selected as the Freshman of the Week for the second time this year, becoming the first newcomer in the Big Ten to earn the honor twice in 2017. She's the first player since Michigan's Ani Sarkisian in September 2014 to win Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week and Freshman of the Week at the same time. Luce is Purdue's first Defensive Player of the Week since Carianne Betts in September 2010.
- Hase scored both goals in the win over Northwestern,

posting the first multi-goal game by a Purdue freshman since 2014 and first in Big Ten play since October 2011. She has accounted for all three goals in the Boilermakers' two biggest wins of the conference season, scoring the game-winners vs. Michigan and Northwestern.

#### **CONSISTENT STARTING LINEUP**

- The Boilermakers have used the same starting lineup in 11 of their first 12 games. Ten different players have started all 12 games. A year ago, 19 different Purdue players started at least once and only two players - Vanessa Korolas and Hannah Mussallem - started every game.
- The Boilermakers have already easily surpassed last year's win & goal totals thanks to an impact freshman class. Six freshmen are starting for Purdue this season - Katie Luce, Sarah Clark, Maya Lambert, Kylie Hase, Sarah Griffith and Hannah Melchiorre. Their classmates Katie Stephens and Alyssa Lum have also played in all 12 games and rank 1-2 among the reserves in minutes

#### **SCORED IN 14 STRAIGHT GAMES**

- The Boilermakers are second in the Big Ten with 28 goals and are the only conference team that has not been shut out this season. Six different Boilermakers have scored multiple goals this year. That's the team's most multi-goal scorers since the 2013 team also had six.
- · Purdue has scored in 14 straight games dating back to the penultimate game of the 2016 campaign. That's the fourth-longest streak 2013 in program history. The Boilermakers are also currently riding an 11game scoring streak at Folk Field dating back to October 2016.
- Purdue goal differential last year was minus-18. Through 12 games this season, it's plus-18, good for a 36-goal swing. In program history, the greatest improvement in goal differential was a 41-goal swing from

2006 (+12) to 2007 (+53). While the 2007 team's goal differential record may never been broken, this year's team could challenge the 2003 Boilermakers (+21) for the second-best mark in program history.

#### WILLIAMS REPEATS AS BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK; HASE HONORED

- · For their leading-role contributions in Purdue's sweep of its conference-opening road trip in Michigan, Maddy Williams and Kylie Hase were honored as the Big Ten Offensive Player and Freshman of the Week. Williams is the league's first player to repeat as the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week since Ohio State's Tiffany Cameron in October 2012.
- · Williams tied program records with three assists and seven points in the 6-2 blowout at Michigan State. Hase scored the game-winner in the 1-0 victory at Michigan. The 2005 season marked the last time a Boilermaker won Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week twice in the same season. Purdue's last Big Ten Freshman of the Week was in 2014.

#### SCORED SIX TO CRUSH THE SPARTANS

- The Boilermakers' six goals in their win at Michigan State were their most ever in a Big Ten road game. They scored at least three goals in both halves for only the second time in program history, also accomplishing the feat in an October 2011 win vs. Indiana. They also had a two-goal lead at halftime in a road game for the second time this year, also accomplishing the feat in the win at Louisville.
- Purdue snapped a seven-game (0-6-1) winless drought against MSU, posting its first win in the series since 2008. It was the program's first victory in East Lansing since 2007.
- The Boilermakers also scored six times in the Indiana State win. They have two wins with at least six goals in the same season for the first time ever.
- · Purdue rallied to win after conceding the game's first goal for the first time since last year's overtime victory vs. Cincinnati. The

Boilermakers rallied to win on the road after going down 1-0 for the first time since October 2015 at Maryland.

#### **SCORED FIRST IN FIRST EIGHT GAMES**

- The Boilermakers scored first in their first eight games of the season. After also scoring first in the finale of the 2016 campaign, Purdue's nine-game streak ranked as the longest in program history. The 2009 and 2015 teams scored first in their first six games. The 2002 and 2006 teams also posted six-game streaks in which they scored first.
- · Michigan State scored in the third minute to end Purdue's streak. Lexy Warner's goal, scored just 123 seconds after the opening kickoff, was the earliest goal conceded by the Boilermakers since October 2013 vs. Minnesota (55 seconds).
- The Boilermakers also scored in the first half of their first seven games, registering goals in the opening 10 minutes of a match three times. For the season, Purdue has held the lead for 645 of the 1100 minutes (59 percent) while trailing for just 56 minutes (5 percent).

#### HASE'S LATE GOAL LIFTS BOILERMAKERS TO FIRST-EVER WIN IN ANN ARBOR

- Kylie Hase scored in the 83rd minute to propel Purdue to a 1-0 win at Michigan in the Sept.14 Big Ten opener for YEAR both teams. The goal lifted the Boilermakers to their firstever victory in Ann Arbor and their first 1-0 Big Ten win 2015 on the road since September 2013 at Ohio State (10th in program history). It was the first goal Michigan allowed at 2000 Annette Kent home in 450 minutes this year.
- The win marked the 11th time that Purdue opened conference play with a shutout. Ten of those 11 games were shutout victories. The Boilermakers went on to sweep its Michigan-Michigan State trip, beating both teams in the same year for only the second time ever (2005).
- · Hase became the first Purdue freshman to score the
- game-winner in a 1-0 Big Ten road victory. She joined teammate Hannah Mussallem among the five freshmen in program history to account for the Boilermakers' first goal of the Big Ten season.

#### PURDUE POSTS LONG SHUTOUT STREAK

- The Boilermakers won three straight games in shutout fashion for YEAR the first time since midway through the 2013 campaign. Purdue's shutout streak was snapped at 358 consecutive minutes when Louisville scored in the 87th minute. The streak ranked as the sixth longest
- The Boilermakers came within four minutes of recording four or 2017 more consecutive shutouts for only the fifth time in program history.

The 2007 team, which won 20 games while conceding only 12 goals, accomplished the feat twice and was the last to do so.

#### TWELVE WINS UNDER ROFF WHEN GIVING UP A GOAL

 Including the preseason victory vs. Iowa State this year. Purdue has found a way to win 12 times when conceding a goal under third-year head coach Drew Roff. Seven of those victories have come in 2-1 fashion. Overall, the Boilermakers are 12-22-2 (.361) when conceding at least one goal under Roff (including preseason). From 2012 to 2014, Purdue was 9-32-5 (.250) when surrendering a goal.

#### WILLIAMS ECLIPSES PURDUE ASSISTS RECORD; SCORES GAME-WINNER IN 3 STRAIGHT

- · With her eight assists this season, Maddy Williams has established a new Purdue all-time record with 26 career helpers. She broke a record held by former teammate Alex Hairston. Williams has had a direct impact on 59 goals during her Purdue career, which is now also the most in team history.
- · By scoring the game-winning goal in the victories vs. DePaul, Dayton and Louisville, Williams became the first Boilermaker since Shauna Stapleton in 2007 to account for the decisive score in three consecutive contests. Her four game winners are already good for fourth most in a season at Purdue.

#### PURDUE BLOWS OUT INDIANA STATE WITH MOST GOALS SINCE 2011

- The Boilermakers scored five times in a span of 25 minutes in the second half to turn a one-goal lead into a 6-0 victory vs. Indiana State on Aug. 27. The six goals were YEAR the team's most since 2011. Sarah Griffith scored in the sixth minute to give Purdue an early lead sixth minute to give Purdue an early lead.
- · With Hannah Mussallem, Andrea Petrina and Kylie Hase also scoring in the ISU win, it marked the first time since a 2013 win vs. Dartmouth that four Boilermakers 2017 scored in the same game. Purdue duplicated the feat in its 2017 win at Michigan State.
- The 2013 season also marked the last time six different players scored over Purdue's first three games, a feat accomplished this year after Hannah Melchiorre and Mad-
- dy Williams scored goals during the season-opening weekend.
- Goalkeepers Katie Luce and Erika Yohn teamed up for Purdue's first combined shutout since September 2015 vs. Evansville.

#### FRESHMEN SCORE FIRST OFFICIAL GOALS IN SAME GAME

· Although Sarah Griffith scored in both preseason wins, her goal vs. Indiana State became her first official tally. With she and Kylie Hase both recording their first goals in the victory, it marked the first time two freshmen scored their first goals in the same game since an August 2014 win vs. Ohio (Erika Arkans, Nicole Robertson), Including the two preseason wins, a freshman scored Purdue's first goal in each of the first five games this year.

#### SET UP TWO GOALS IN THE SAME HALF

· Hannah Melchiorre set up goals by Andrea Petrina and Kylie Hase in the Indiana State win, becoming the first Boilermaker to assist on a pair of goals in a half since a September 2015 win at Montana. Maddy Williams would later duplicate the feat in the first half of the Michigan State win. An August 2014 win vs. SIU Edwardsville marked the last time two Purdue players had multiple assists in the same game, a feat accomplished by Melchiorre and Williams vs. ISU.

#### MELCHIORRE THE FIRST FRESHMAN TO SCORE IN FIRST TWO GAMES

- Hannah Melchiorre accounted for Purdue's first goal of both games during the season-opening weekend. In the process, she became the first freshman in program history to score in each of the PLAYER first two games of a season. Classmate Sarah Griffith did likewise Hannah Melchiorre in both of Purdue's preseason wins, but as exhibition games those goals don't count toward Griffith's career total.
- Maddy Williams (2015) remains the only Boilermaker to ever Jessica Okoroafo score in each of the first three games of a season.
- · Melchiorre is Purdue's first freshman to account for the Boilermakers' first goal of a season since Erika Arkans in 2014. However, Alex Hairston (in 2011) was the last Purdue freshman to score the team's first goal of a new campaign in a season opener.

#### LUCE ONLY THE THIRD FRESHMAN KEEPER TO BE FULL-TIME STARTER

· Katie Luce started in goal and played all 180 minutes of the season-opening weekend. She is only Purdue's third freshman to start a season opener at goalkeeper. Jocelyn Cavalier in the inaugural 1998 campaign and Lauren Mason in 2003 are the only other Boilermakers to earn the honor. They're also the only other goalkeepers to be full-time starters as freshmen.

#### SIX WINS VERSUS 10-WIN TEAMS FROM 2016

· Including the preseason, the Boilermakers have already posted six wins against teams that won at least 10 games in 2016. Notre Dame (13-3-5), Iowa State (10-8-1), Kent State (15-3-2), DePaul (10-6-3), Michigan (10-5-5) and Northwestern (16-3-4) were a combined 74-28-20 (.689) a year ago. Purdue nearly had another victory against a 10-win team from 2016, but Loyola Marymount (11-5-3) rallied to steal the game 2-1 on Aug. 21 at Folk Field.
