## PURDUE LOOKS TO WIN BACK GOLDEN BOOT IN SEASON FINALE AT INDIANA

• The Boilermakers close out their 2015 season with their first trip to Bloomington since 2012. They'll look to win back the Golden Boot traveling trophy, which Indiana has had possession of since 2012. The 2012 loss in Bloomington ended Purdue's 15-game unbeaten streak in the series.

Coincidentally, two of the Hoosiers' three victories this season came in West Lafayette at the Boilermaker Challenge Cup (Aug. 28-30). Six of IU's eight home games this season have ended in draws. In the event of a draw Wednesday, Indiana retains the Golden Boot. Virginia Tech and Ohio State are the only visiting teams to win in Bloomington this year.

• A victory Wednesday would give Purdue its first winning record since the 2009 team was 12-6-2.

## BOILERMAKERS ELIMINATED FROM BIG TEN TOURNAMENT CONTENTION

• Purdue's overtime loss at Michigan coupled with Michigan State's victory vs. Indiana last weekend eliminated the Boilermakers from Big Ten Tournament contention. Purdue was able to keep the Wolverines off the scoreboard for 90 minutes after they had entered the night 8-1 at home this season. But a breakaway goal in the 92nd minute dealt the Boilermakers' their second overtime loss of the season and first in Big Ten play since the 2012 conference opener at Michigan State. The 2012 season also marked the last time Purdue suffered a pair of overtime defeats in the same season. Three of the Boilermakers' last four games have gone to overtime. They had a draw, win and loss in those three extended affairs.

## IMPROVEMENT DEMONSTRATED AMDIST MORE COMPETITIVE CAMPAIGN

• Purdue legitimately had a chance to win in 15 of its first 17 regular-season games this season. Early deficits to Seattle (L, 2-0) and Minnesota (L, 3-1) led to the only games in which the Boilermakers lost by multiple goals. They've lost only three times in 1-0 fashion after suffering six such defeats a year ago. Last season, Purdue lost three times by multiple goals and was shut out nine times.

• The eight teams to defeat the Boilermakers this season have all gone on to enjoy strong seasons. Missouri (9-4-4), Seattle (12-2-3), Northwestern (12-4-2), Minnesota (11-4-3), Wisconsin (11-4-3), Ohio State (9-5-3), Penn State (12-3-2) and Michigan (11-5-2) are a combined 87-31-22 (.700 winning percentage) and have all built strong NCAA Tournament résumés. Missouri is tied for first place in the Southeastern Conference and Seattle is also atop the Western Athletic Conference standings.

## LEINERT & NELLAMS LEAD PURDUE TO OVERTIME WIN AT MARYLAND

• **Hannah Leinert** and **Makaela Nellams** each scored a goal and helped set up another, Nellams scoring on a penalty kick in double overtime to propel Purdue a 2-1 victory at Maryland on Sunday.

• After missing the Oct. 15 loss to No. 9 Penn State due to injury, Leinert scored an equalizer in the 59th minute and was later taken down inside the penalty area at the top of the 108th minute to create the penalty-kick opportunity. Nellams converted on her second PK of the season in as many tries for her fourth career goal and second at Maryland in as many years.

• Nellams joined **Erika Arkans** as active Boilermakers to score an overtime winner, Arkans doing so in the team's last OT victory in September 2014 at Northwestern. Jessica Baumhoff (2002 at Oakland) is the only Purdue player to score a golden goal on a penalty kick. The Boilermakers have won an overtime game on the road each of the last four years, three of those victories coming in Big Ten play.

## PURDUE VICTORIOUS AFTER CONCEDED FIRST GOAL FOR FIRST TIME IN 2015

• The Oct. 18 win at Maryland was the Boilermakers' first on the road in Big Ten play this season. Purdue had been 0-5 when conceding the first goal, as it did at Maryland. But the goals by **Hannah Leinert** and **Makaela Nellams** allowed Purdue to rally for a little payback after UMD overcame an early goal by the visiting side in a 2-1 final last season in College Park.

• The Boilermakers won a game after conceding the first goal for the first time since September 2014 at Marshall. It was their first win in Big Ten play after going down 1-0 since a September 2012 overtime victory at Nebraska.

## LOVE RIDING CONSECUTIVE MINUTES STREAK

• Center back **Kim Love** is the only Boilermaker that has played all 1,581 minutes of the season so far and has logged 2,327 consecutive minutes dating back to the final six minutes of the Sept. 26, 2014, game against Minnesota. Love (52) also continues to sport the longest active consecutive games started streak on the team. She has started all 71 games in which she has played for Purdue. Previously, Love played every minute of the 2012 season (1,797) and also logged 1,472 consecutive minutes as a sophomore in 2013.

• **Mikayla Lasky** played every minute (1,764) last year and logged 3,225 consecutive minutes from September 2013 through the first half of the 2015 season opener. She missed three games due to injury during the season-opening homestand, ending her consecutive games started streak at 36. **Megan Kaser** was pressed into duty at center back for the first time as a Boilermaker and went the distance in all three games Lasky missed. Lasky returned to the starting lineup in time for the Montana Cup (Sept. 11-13) and also started the Big Ten opener against Northwestern, but was sidelined again until Oct. 11 vs. Rutgers. **Dannah Williams** has taken over at center back during Big Ten play.

• Fellow defender **Vanessa Korolas** ranks second on the team with four assists and is also second in minutes played (1,422). She has started all 36 games since the start of the 2014 season.

## BOILERMAKERS LOOKING TO END POST-SEPTEMBER STRUGGLES

• From 2000 to 2009, Purdue won 10-plus games for 10 consecutive seasons. Part of the reason the Boilers have not won more than eight games since 2009 is their struggles after the calendar flips to October. Since the beginning of the 2012 season, Purdue has won only four games in October or November (two in 2013, two this season). Furthermore, the Boilers had not won a game after Oct. 7 since 2011 until beating Maryland in overtime on Oct. 18 this year. The 2011 team was responsible for three of Purdue's eight October wins since the start of 2010.

• While it is true that the schedule gets tougher as Big Ten play heats up in October, the Boilers have actually held their own in conference play in September. Since 2010, Purdue is 8-13-3 (.396) in September Big Ten games, accounting for half of its point-producing results in conference action the last six years (16-45-5 B1G overall, .280). Ultimately, to have a successful season, the Boilers will have to find a way to win games consistently after Sept. 30 at some point.

## LASKY SCORES MEMORABLE GOAL IN 2-1 LOSS TO #9 PENN STATE

• **Mikayla Lasky's** goal early in the second half gave Purdue the lead for just under 10 minutes, but No. 9 Penn State scored the game's final two goals to rally past the Boilmakers 2-1 Oct. 15. Lasky finished off a nifty free-kick sequence in the 49th minute for her first goal since September 2013. It was her first career goal in Big Ten play and gave Purdue its first lead against the Nittany Lions since 2010, the last time it scored at home against Penn State. The goal ended PSU's shutout streak at 381 consecutive minutes as the first goal it had conceded since the first half of a Sept. 27 win at Iowa.

• Assists from **Andrea Petrina** and **Kim Love** set up Lasky's goal. Petrina served a free kick from midfield into the right side of the 18-yard box. Love won the ball with a mid-air header, redirecting the ball left to a wide-open Lasky in front of the net for a quick one-touch volley with her right foot.

• Purdue squared off with a Penn State team that was ranked in the top 10 of the NSCAA poll for the fourth year in a row and ninth time in the series overall. The loss kept the Boilmakers winless against nationally ranked opponents since a September 2009 win at Texas A&M.

## FIRST SCORELESS DRAW SINCE 2010

• **Jordan Ginther** made five saves in her first action in nearly a month, leading Purdue to a scoreless draw with No. 23 Rutgers in the Senior Day game Oct. 11. The result was the Boilers' first scoreless draw since the September 2010 Big Ten opener against Wisconsin, and their first shutout of any kind in conference play since blanking Northwestern 1-0 in October 2013. Ginther earned her third career solo shutout and was part of a clean-sheet effort for the sixth time overall.

• Ginther and the Purdue defense successfully defended 11 Rutgers corner kicks. Defenders **Vanessa Korolas**, **Kim Love**, **Makaela Nellams** and **Dannah Williams** along with midfielder **Melissa Casella** all went the distance in front of Ginther, who saw action for the first time since starting the Sept. 13 game against Seattle at the Montana Cup. **Mikayla Lasky** returned to the lineup for the first time since the Sept. 18 Big Ten opener against Northwestern and freshman **Hannah Mussallem** made her first regular-season start as a Boilmaker.

## EARLY & LATE GOALS BEGINNING TO ADD UP

• The Boilmakers have scored in the first 10 minutes of a game five times and the final 10 minutes of a game six times (excluding the overtime win at Maryland). Not surprisingly, Purdue is 4-0 when scoring in the first 10 minutes this season, with two of those five early goals coming in the win vs. Montana.

• Meanwhile, the six goals in the final 10 minutes of regulation are already tied for the second most in program history. **Nicole Robertson** (89th minute), **Dagny Olson** (85th) and **Hannah Leinert** (85th) accounted for the dramatic game winners in victories vs. Xavier, Baylor and Nebraska, respectively.

## ARKANS SCORES IN CONSECUTIVE GAMES

• **Erika Arkans** moved into the starting lineup for the first time this season in time for the Oct. 2 home win vs. Nebraska. She went on to account for Purdue's first goal in both the Nebraska and Ohio State games, joining **Maddy Williams** (three straight games) and **Hannah Leinert** as Boilmakers to score in consecutive games this year. Arkans' goal against Nebraska was her first at home since scoring twice in the Aug. 31, 2014 victory vs. SIU Edwardsville.

## LEINERT NAMED BIG TEN OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

• **Hannah Leinert** was named the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week after recording the game-winning goal as well as an assist in the Oct. 2 win vs. Nebraska. She scored the game winner in the 85th minute after earlier making a great field-reversing pass to set up **Erika Arkans'** first-half goal that gave the Boilers a halftime lead.

• Leinert is the first Boilmaker to claim Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week since **Maddy Williams** in October 2013. Coincidentally, Leinert has accomplished the rare feat of being named Player of the Week in two different conferences. While playing for Illinois State, she was selected as the Missouri Valley Conference Offensive Player of the Week after the opening weekend of both the 2013 and 2014 seasons.

• Leinert recorded a goal and an assist in the same game for the second time this season. Purdue is 6-0 when she has scored this year. The junior has recorded a point in eight of the 11 games in which the Boilers have scored a goal in the traditional run of play. She accounted for the latest game winner in a Big Ten game (excluding overtime wins) since Felicia Schroeder scored in the 89th minute of the 2008 Big Ten opener against Northwestern. The win against Nebraska was Purdue's first against the Huskers at home since September 2005.

## PURDUE DEFEATS ILLINOIS TO SPLIT BIG TEN-OPENING WEEKEND

• One streak was extended and another came to an end as the Boilers split home games with Illinois and Northwestern during the conference-opening weekend. A 3-1 win Sept. 20 kept Purdue unbeaten (6-0-3) all-time at home against Illinois. But the Boilers' 11-game win streak vs. Northwestern, the longest in program history against any opponent, was snapped in a 1-0 loss Sept. 18. Purdue had not lost to Northwestern since 2004.

• Freshman **Hannah Mussallem** recorded her first collegiate goal to open the scoring in the Illinois win, joining **Melissa Casella** as Boilermakers to score their first goals this season. Seniors **Kate Fowee** (2011 vs. Wisconsin) and **Makaela Nellams** (2014 vs. Ohio State) also scored their first goals in Big Ten games. **Andrea Petrina** and **Hannah Leinert** accounted for their first goals in Big Ten play in the victory vs. Illinois as well.

• Freshman **Dannah Williams** made her first start at center back vs. Illinois after seeing action primarily as a defensive midfielder. **Christa Szalach** moved into the starting lineup in the midfield, making her first start of the season. Goalkeeper **Erika Yohn** matched her season high with six saves in the Illinois victory.

## NEW BOILERMAKER SOCCER COMPLEX ATTENDANCE RECORD ESTABLISHED

• Purdue closed out its Big Ten-opening weekend with a 3-1 victory vs. Illinois in front of a Boilermaker Soccer Complex record crowd of 1,488 on youth soccer day in which the Greater Lafayette Regional Soccer Alliance/Boilers FC club team brought hundreds of fans to the field. The previous Soccer Complex attendance record of 1,318 was established two years ago on GLRSA day vs. Wisconsin. Last season's GLRSA day crowd of 1,305 vs. Ohio State came up just short of the previous record.

## LEINERT'S EIGHTH CAREER MULTI-GOAL GAME THE DIFFERENCE VS. MONTANA

• **Hannah Leinert** scored twice in the first half of Purdue's 3-1 win at Montana Sept. 11. It was her first multi-goal game as a Boilermaker but the eighth of her college career after she posted seven in her two years at Illinois State. Leinert also scored the game winner in the Sept. 4 win vs. Evansville. In the process, she became the first Purdue player to account for a game-winning goal in consecutive games since **Maddy Williams** in October 2013.

• Leinert scored her sixth career goal against Evansville only two and half minutes after the opening kickoff. At ISU, she scored five of her 27 goals against the Purple Aces after the two teams met twice both years. Purdue closed its season-opening homestand with a 4-1 record and five victories overall including the Aug. 14 exhibition win vs. Miami (Ohio) that marked the beginning of the extended home stretch. The Boilermakers have still not conceded a goal in four all-time meetings with Evansville. Purdue also did not surrender a corner kick for the second time this season.

## CONCEDING QUICK EQUALIZER BURNS BOILERS IN OVERTIME LOSS

• Missouri defeated Purdue in overtime Aug. 30 to deny the home side a share of the Boilermaker Challenge Cup title for the first time since 2009. The Boilermakers led the game twice thanks to goals from **Andrea Petrina** and **Melissa Casella**, but Mizzou equalized only 15 seconds after Casella's go-ahead goal in the 84th minute and went on to hand Purdue its first overtime loss since September 2012 at Michigan State and its first at home since the 2011 Boilermaker Challenge Cup vs. Kansas.

• The 15 seconds between goals in the Missouri loss represented the shortest amount of time between goals for and against in program history. Eight times since 2000, a Purdue game has featured goals for each side less than a minute apart. The Boilermakers have compiled a 5-2-1 record in those games, both losses coming in contests in which the opposition recorded the quick answer.

## WILLIAMS THE FASTEST TO 20 CAREER GOALS

• With a goal in the third minute of the Aug. 28 win vs. Baylor, it didn't take **Maddy Williams** long to record her fifth goal of the year and become the first Boilermaker to score in each of the first three games of a new season.

• Williams' August goal-scoring rampage – during which she scored 10, including the five in the two preseason exhibition games – featured four goals during the season-opening weekend. She scored twice in both the wins against Ohio and Xavier, and in the process reached the 20-goal mark for her collegiate career. The junior accomplished a number of feats with her big opening weekend, most notably becoming the fastest player in program history to reach 20 career goals. She was also the fastest to hit the 15-goal benchmark when she did so in September 2014.

• Williams joined Lauren Sesselmann (2005) as the only players in program history to record multi-goal efforts in consecutive games. Only two other Boilers (Kellie Phillips and Jordan Pawlik) ever accounted for four goals over two games, both posting hat tricks in one of the games. Versus Ohio, Williams became the first player to ever account for both of Purdue's first two goals of a new season and her four goals over the first two games were another program high. Finally, she joined Jessica Okoroafo (2009), Alex Hairston (2012) and Mollie Kuramoto (2013) as the only Boilers to ever score in each of the first two games of a new season.
