### SETTING THE SCENE

- The 11th-ranked Purdue women enter the championships looking to defend their 2017 title. The women have three outdoor titles - 1987, 1999 and 2017.
- The Purdue men enter the meet ranked 30th in the country. The Boilermakers have the only program in the Big Ten to have both the men's and women's teams ranked in the top 30 nationally.
- The women's 4x400m relay team looks for an elusive outdoor conference title. The Boilermakers have won the last three indoor conference titles in the event, but have not won the outdoor 4x400m title since 2001. **Chloe Abbott, Symon Black, Jahneya Mitchell** and **Brianna Thomas** make up the probable lineup for the Purdue team. The Boilermakers lead the conference with the nation's No. 2 time this year.
- Devynne Charlton, Savannah Carson, Janae' Moffitt and Sekayi Bracey return to Big Ten Championship action after missing the indoor season. Charlton and Carson did not have indoor eligibility, while Moffitt and Bracey were out with injuries. Combined, the four have scored 104.25 career points at Big Ten Outdoor meets.

### WOMEN AT B1G OUTDOORS UNDER GREENE

- Head coach Lonnie Greene has morphed the women's program into a perennial contender in the Big Ten since his first championships in 2013.

**BIG TEN'S BEST FIELD ATHLETES**

- The Purdue women have won 47 outdoor Big Ten championships in field events, the most of any school in the conference.
- Just one member on the current roster has an outdoor field event title - Savannah Carson in the long jump.
- Minnesota is second in the conference in women's field event champions with 45.
- Purdue looks to add to the total this year. The Boilermakers have individuals in the top three in the conference in the long jump, high jump, discus.
- Janae' Moffitt is the conference leader in the high jump. The two-time indoor winner is looking to become Purdue's first outdoor champ since 2000.

the 100m and 200m dashes in 2014. Mostert is currently a running back and kick returner for the San Francisco 49ers of the NFL.

- Other big name two-sport stars for the Boilermakers include Jacques Reeves, a two-time Big Ten champion and NFL cornerback, Cris Dishman, a Big Ten champion and NFL cornerback, and Rod Woodson, a four-year Big Ten champion and NFL Hall-of-Famer.

**THRONE OF THROWERS**

- Purdue track & field has historically been ruled by the throws.
- While other events have caught up, the Boilermakers, past and present, are still among the nation's, and world's, most dominant in the throws.

**»This Year Collegiately**

- Junior Sarah Loesch added her name to the long list of indoor first team All-American throwers earlier this year. She placed seventh in the weight throw, earning the Purdue women their eighth first team All-America honor in an indoor throwing event since 1998.
- Sophomore Ashmon Lucas is the national leader in the discus. He broke the school record in San Diego earlier this year.
- Senior Micaela Hazlewood broke the school record in the women's discus with a win at the Drake Relays this season. She 11th in the country.
- Redshirt freshman Jalil Brewer broke Purdue's freshman record in the shot put indoors. Outdoors, he is second in school history among freshmen. He ranks 18th in the country overall and is fourth among freshmen.

**»Alumni International Success This Year**

- Recent alums Chukwuebuka Enekwechi and Dani (Bunch) Hill, who have both earned Big Ten Athlete of the Year honors, competed at the indoor World Championships this year.
- Hill qualified after winning the U.S. Indoor Championships in the shot put, while Enekwechi qualified for Nigeria.
- Enekwechi also competed at the Gold Coast Commonwealth Games in Australia. There, he earned the silver medal.
- This year, Enekwechi ranks sixth in the world.

**»Recent Olympic Success**

- The Boilermakers have had at least one thrower compete in the Olympics Games since the 2004 games.
- Nedzad Mulabegovic competed in the shot put for Croatia in 2004, 2008 and 2012.
- Kara (Patterson) Winger is the U.S. record holder in the javelin. She has competed in the last three

### 4X100M RELAY LOOKING FOR FOUR-PEAT

- The Purdue women have won three straight 4x100m relay conference titles after not winning one in the first 33 years of conference championships.
- The Boilermakers enter the meet with the top time in the conference.
- The Boilermakers are looking to become the first team in the conference to win four in a row in the event since Indiana did so from 2000 to 2003.
- Illinois is the only other school to win at least four in a row in the event.

### BLACK IN 400M HURDLES

- Senior Symone Black has won two 400-meter hurdles Big Ten titles.
- She enters the meet with the conference lead. If she can repeat as champion, she will be just the third woman in conference history to win three 400m hurdles titles.
- Sybil Perry won three in 1984, 1986 and 1987 to become the first Boilermaker to win three.

### WOMEN'S LONG JUMP DOMINANCE

- The Boilermakers have won five of the last eight and six of the last 11 women's titles in the long jump.
- Savannah Carson was the winner last year and she returns this year looking to defend her title. She is third in the conference.
- Freshman Zhane Smith is fourth in the conference in the event and broke Purdue's freshman record in the event at Louisville earlier this year.

### ATHLETES OF THE WEEK

- The women won seven Big Ten Athlete of the Week awards during the outdoor season while the men won one.
- Symone Black was the Track Athlete of the Week twice with honors on March 21 and April 11.
- Brionna Thomas also had two Track Athlete of the Week honors with one April 4 and the other May 2.

**DRAKE RELAYS DOMINANCE**

- Purdue won seven events between the men and women on the final day, while the Boilermaker women won their first Hy-Vee Cup with 31 points.
- Purdue also became the first school to win the Drake Relays women's 4x100, 4x200 and 4x400 relays since Nebraska claimed the trifecta in 1992.
- The Boilermaker women win their third-straight 4x200 Drake Relays title, as the quartet of Yakira Love, Chloe Abbott, Brionna Thomas and Savannah Roberson finished in a school-record time of 1:32.24. That time is the fastest time in the 4x200 at Drake since Texas Southern set the meet record in 1:31.96.
- Moments after the women won their race, the Purdue men followed suit. The Boilermakers ran away from the field to win the men's 4x200 in 1:24.50. Freshman Jordan Hollis handled the anchor duties as Purdue picked up its second victory in the event, the first coming in 2013.
- In the women's 100 hurdles, Savannah Roberson added to Purdue's Relays Flag collection thanks to a time of 13.20 seconds.
- Purdue completed the high hurdles sweep as Justin Veteto beat Iowa's Chris Douglas at the line to help the Boilermakers become the first program to sweep the events at the Drake Relays. Veteto finished in 13.91, while Douglas crossed in 13.92 and OSU's DaJuan Seward placed third in 13.94.
- Janae' Moffitt also helped Purdue sweep the high jump at Drake as Moffitt cleared 5-10 ¾, becoming the first school to sweep the high jump at Drake since Auburn did so in 2011.
- Purdue ended the day with a win in the women's 4x100m and 4x400m relays, including a meet record of 3:28.42 in the 4x400 as the quartet of Chloe Abbott, Brionna Thomas, Symone Black and Jahneya Mitchell also broke the Purdue school record in the event.
- Micaela Hazlewood won the discus, holding off a strong field.
- Rahman Minor won the men's high jump, just the third Boilermaker to win the event at the meet.
- Brionna Thomas won the women's 200-meter dash title.
- The women won the 1,600m sprint medley relay.
- Devynne Charlton and Symone Black were in the special sections of the 100m hurdles and 400m hurdles, respectively. Charlton had a lead on the world-class field before tripping over a hurdle late. Black finished seventh in her 400m hurdles race with a time that would have run away with the university section.

**CHARLTON AT WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS**

- Senior Devynne Charlton has competed at three World Championship events for the Bahamas.
- She made the finals in the 60-meter hurdles earlier this year, before she finished eighth.
- Last summer, she placed 13th in the world in the 100-meter hurdles. She also ran a leg of the 4x100-meter relay team with Boilermaker Carmiesha Cox, who wrapped up her collegiate eligibility indoors.
