BOILERMAKERS HOST MARYLAND WITH CHANCE TO QUALIFY FOR BIG TEN TOURNEY

• Purdue needs just one standings point via a win or draw in Wednesday's regular-season finale vs. Maryland to qualify for the Big Ten Tournament.

• The Boilermakers are in position to qualify for the Big Ten Tournament for the first time since 2008. The event was not held in 2009 and 2010. A win Wednesday would give Purdue its first 10-win season since 2009 (12-6-3, 5-3-2 B1G), which was also the last year the program finished over .500 in conference play. That's another possibility for this season's team.

• But it was the conference-opening win at Michigan, Purdue's first-ever victory in Ann Arbor, which has given the Boilermakers some margin for error Wednesday. Purdue and Nebraska are tied for seventh place in the standings with 14 points. The Wolverines (12) are two points back in ninth place. However, the Boilermakers would win both head-to-head and three-way tiebreakers involving Michigan. Iowa is still alive as well with 11 points, but needs Purdue (or Nebraska) to lose Wednesday to have hope.

WILLIAMS SCORES 36TH CAREER GOAL TO ESTABLISH NEW RECORD

• **Maddy Williams** tied and eclipsed Purdue's all-time goals record (35) with a multi-goal effort in the Oct. 20 draw at Penn State. She has now established new career records for goals (36), assists (26), points (98), shots (275) and multi-goal games (8) this fall. One more goal will give her 100 career points.

• Williams assisted on **Sarah Griffith's** goal Sept. 23 at Indiana for her 90th career point, tying the program record held by Lauren Sesselmann. She then broke the record with her game-winning goal in the 1-0 victory vs. Illinois on Sept. 28. Williams eclipsed Alex Hairston's all-time assists mark in the Sept. 17 win at Michigan State.

EXCELLENT STREAKS AT HOME

• Purdue has scored in 13 straight home games dating back to last season. That's tied for the second-longest streak in program history. The Boilermakers have a chance to score in every home game this year for the first time since 2003. The 2002 team was the only other squad to accomplish the feat. Remarkably, Purdue scored in 26 straight home games from October 2001 through September 2004.

• The Boilermakers have a plus-11 goal differential at home this season thanks in part to a program-record five straight shutouts at Folk Field from Aug. 27 through Oct. 1. The team-record shutout streak at home was snapped at 470 consecutive minutes when Nebraska scored in the 19th minute of the Oct. 12 game at Folk Field. Though not consecutively, Purdue also had at least five shutouts at home in 2000, 2002, 2004, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2012. The 2007 team set the program record with 10 clean sheets at home.

YOHN TIES CAREER-HIGH WITH NINE SAVES IN DRAW AT PENN STATE

• Goalkeeper **Erika Yohn** matched her career high with nine saves while making her first start of the season (26th career). On a night in which the Boilermakers were out shot 23-4, the senior helped Purdue earn a standings point against the Nittany Lions for the first time since 2003. It was the team's first positive result ever against PSU in Central Pennsylvania.

• Yohn also made nine saves at No. 4 West Virginia last season in her homecoming game to her native Morgantown, W.Va.

WILLIAMS NAMED BIG TEN OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK FOR THIRD TIME IN 2017

• **Maddy Williams'** record-breaking goal as part of the first individual multi-goal effort posted against No. 9 Penn State this season earned Purdue's all-time scoring leader her third Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week award of the season.

• Williams is the league's first player since PSU's Maya Hayes in 2013 to win Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week three times in the same season. Williams is the first Boilermaker to accomplish the feat and her four career Offensive Player of the Week awards matches Jessica Okoroafo's program record. Former goalkeeper Lauren Mason was a six-time Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week winner during her career.

• Williams has joined Lauren Sesselmann, the program's career points leader entering the season, as the only Purdue players with three multi-goal games in a season. Sesselmann accomplished the feat in 2005 and also had a multi-goal game at Penn State that year.

• Penn State had not conceded a goal at home since its season opener vs. BYU. The Boilermakers also became the first Big Ten team to score multiple goals against PSU this year.

• Williams' first goal snapped a pair of long shutout streaks for the Nittany Lions. As the first goal PSU had conceded in October, it ended an overall shutout streak at 422 consecutive minutes. Penn State's shutout streak at home was snapped at 604 consecutive minutes.

• Purdue equaled the number of goals PSU had conceded in its first nine Big Ten games of the season combined. The Boilermakers scored twice vs. the Nittany Lions for the first time since 2005, which was also the last year they took PSU to overtime.

WILLIAMS THE FIRST BOILERMAKER WITH A PAIR OF 10-GOAL SEASONS

• **Maddy Williams** scored her team-leading 10th goal of the season on a penalty kick early in the second half of the Oct. 12 game vs. Nebraska. She's the first player in program history with a pair of 10-goal seasons in her career. She also scored 10 as a freshman in 2013. She's 4-for-5 on penalty kicks in her career.

• Williams leads the Big Ten with five game-winning goals and 32 points. She also ranks second with 12 goals and eight assists. With 12 goals and the eight helpers, she has had a direct impact on 20 of Purdue's 34 goals (59 percent). Williams is now just one goal, one game-winning goal and two points shy of the program's single-season records in all three categories. The senior is also ranked among the top 10 nationally in points and game-winning goals.

CONSISTENT STARTING LINEUP

• The Boilermakers have used the same starting lineup in 14 of their 17 games. Eight different players have started all 16 games. A year ago, 19 different Purdue players started at least once and only two players – **Vanessa Korolas** and **Hannah Mussallem** – started every game.

• The Boilermakers have already easily surpassed last year's win & goal totals thanks to an impact freshman class. Six freshmen are starting for Purdue this season – **Katie Luce**, **Sarah Clark**, **Maya Lambert**, **Kylie Hase**, **Sarah Griffith** and **Hannah Melchiorre**. Tough she was replaced by Erika Yohn in time for the Oct. 20 game vs. Penn State, Luce had been only the third freshman goalkeeper to be a full-time starter for the Boilermakers. Meanwhile, Lambert, Hase and Melchiorre have started every game.

• Hase ranks third on the team with five goals, the most by a Purdue freshman since 2014. Melchiorre is second on the team with six goals, the most by a freshman since 2013.

PURDUE DROPS OVERTIME HEARTBREAKER VERSUS NEBRASKA

• Oct. 12 at Folk Field, the Boilermakers overcame a two-goal deficit for the first time since a September 2011 draw vs. Cal State Northridge. Goals by **Maddy Williams** and **Andrea Petrina** helped Purdue extended the game into overtime, but Nebraska scored the golden goal in the 97th minute just moments after the Boilermakers thought they had been victorious in 3-2 fashion.

• Only 30 seconds earlier on the game clock, **Kylie Hase's** header off a **Sarah Clark** free kick had bounced over the Nebraska goalkeeper and into the net. But the linesman on the east sideline raised his flag after the ball went into the net, signaling an offside that negated the would-be game-winner as the Purdue players rushed the field. After the game, the officials declined to say who specifically was offside for the Boilermakers.

MUCH-IMPROVED PURDUE

• While scoring 19 more goals than they did a year ago, the Boilermakers have already won five more games than they did in 2016. One more victory would allow Purdue to match its biggest win improvement (+6 from 2006 to 2007) in program history and also give the Boilermakers their first 10-win season since 2009 (12-6-3).

SCORED IN 15 STRAIGHT GAMES

• Purdue is second in the Big Ten with 34 goals. Six different Boilermakers have scored multiple goals this year. That's the team's most multi-goal scorers since the 2013 team also had six.

• Purdue was the last Big Ten team to be shut out this year. Its streak of 15 consecutive games with a goal, which dated back to the penultimate game of 2016, was snapped in a 2-0 loss at Minnesota on Oct. 8. It matched the second-longest streak in program history.

• Purdue's goal differential last year was minus-18. Through 16 games this season, it's plus-13, good for a 31-goal swing. In program history, the greatest improvement in goal differential was a 41-goal swing from 2006 (+12) to 2007 (+53). While the 2007 team's goal differential record may never be broken, this year's team is challenging the 2003 Boilermakers (+21) for the second-best mark in program history.

PURDUE POSTS TWO LONG SHUTOUT STREAKS

• The Boilermakers have recorded a pair of shutout streaks longer than 300 minutes this year. As part of its three straight shutouts vs. Indiana State, DePaul and Dayton, Purdue's first streak was 358 consecutive minutes. It was snapped in the 87th minute at Louisville (Sept. 8). The three straight shutouts were a program first since 2013.

• With 85 scoreless minutes in the 1-1 draw at Indiana coupled with the consecutive shutout wins vs. Illinois and Northwestern (Sept. 28-Oct. 1), the Boilermakers posted another streak of 307 consecutive minutes.

This year marks the third time in program history, joining 2002 and 2007, as the only seasons in which Purdue posted a pair of 300-minute shutout streaks.

HASE, LUCE SWEEP BIG TEN WEEKLY AWARDS

• Purdue was rewarded for its shutout wins vs. Illinois and Northwestern (Sept. 28-Oct. 1) with a sweep of the Big Ten weekly awards by **Kylie Hase** and **Katie Luce**. Hase was recognized as the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week and Freshman of the Week. Luce was honored as the Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week. Since Freshman of the Week was added to the league's weekly awards program in 2009, this marks only the second time that the Boilermakers have swept the three weekly honors. They also accomplished the feat in August 2009 after a big win at No. 6 Texas A&M.

• Hase was selected as the Freshman of the Week for the second time this year, becoming the first newcomer in the Big Ten to earn the honor twice in 2017. She was the first player since Michigan's Ani Sarkisian in September 2014 to win Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week and Freshman of the Week at the same time. Luce was Purdue's first Defensive Player of the Week since Carianne Betts in September 2010.

• Hase scored both goals in the win over Northwestern, posting the first multi-goal game by a Purdue freshman since 2014 and first in Big Ten play since October 2011. She has accounted for all three goals in the Boilermakers' two biggest wins of the conference season, scoring the game-winners vs. Michigan and Northwestern.

SCORED FIRST IN FIRST EIGHT GAMES

• The Boilermakers scored first in their first eight games of the season. After also scoring first in the finale of the 2016 campaign, Purdue's nine-game streak ranked as the longest in program history. The 2009 and 2015 teams scored first in their first six games. The 2002 and 2006 teams also posted six-game streaks in which they scored first.

• Michigan State scored in the third minute to end Purdue's streak. Lexy Warner's goal, scored just 123 seconds after the opening kickoff, was the earliest goal conceded by the Boilermakers since October 2013 vs. Minnesota (55 seconds).

• The Boilermakers also scored in the first half of their first seven games, registering goals in the opening 10 minutes of a match three times. For the season, Purdue has held the lead for 646 of the 1467 minutes (44 percent).

SCORED SIX TO CRUSH THE SPARTANS

• The Boilermakers' six goals in their win at Michigan State were their most ever in a Big Ten road game. They scored at least three goals in both halves for only the second time in program history, also accomplishing the feat in an October 2011 win vs. Indiana. They also had a two-goal lead at halftime in a road game for the second time this year, also accomplishing the feat in the win at Louisville.

• Purdue snapped a seven-game (0-6-1) winless drought against MSU, posting its first win in the series since 2008. It was the program's first victory in East Lansing since 2007.

• The Boilermakers also scored six times in the Indiana State win. They have two wins with at least six goals in the same season for the first time ever.

• Purdue rallied to win after conceding the game's first goal for the first time since last year's overtime victory vs. Cincinnati.

The Boilermakers rallied to win on the road after going down 1-0 for the first time since October 2015 at Maryland.

WILLIAMS REPEATS AS BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK; HASE HONORED

• For their leading-role contributions in Purdue's sweep of its conference-opening road trip in Michigan, **Maddy Williams** and **Kylie Hase** were honored as the Big Ten Offensive Player and Freshman of the Week. Williams was the league's first player to repeat as the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week since Ohio State's Tiffany Cameron in October 2012.

• Williams tied program records with three assists and seven points in the 6-2 blowout at Michigan State. Hase scored the game-winner in the 1-0 victory at Michigan. The 2005 season marked the last time a Boilermaker won Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week twice in the same season. Purdue's last Big Ten Freshman of the Week was in 2014.

TWELVE WINS UNDER ROFF WHEN GIVING UP A GOAL

• Including the preseason victory vs. Iowa State this year, Purdue has found a way to win 12 times when conceding a goal under third-year head coach **Drew Roff**. Seven of those victories have come in 2-1 fashion. Overall, the Boilermakers are 12-26-3 (.329) when conceding at least one goal under Roff (including preseason). From 2012 to 2014, Purdue was 9-32-5 (.250) when surrendering a goal.

HASE'S LATE GOAL LIFTS BOILERMAKERS TO FIRST-EVER WIN IN ANN ARBOR

• **Kylie Hase** scored in the 83rd minute to propel Purdue to a 1-0 win at Michigan in the Sept. 14 Big Ten opener for both teams. The goal lifted the Boilermakers to their first-ever victory in Ann Arbor and their first 1-0 Big Ten win on the road since September 2013 at Ohio State (10th in program history). It was the first goal Michigan allowed at home in 450 minutes this year.

• The win marked the 11th time that Purdue opened conference play with a shutout. Ten of those 11 games were shutout victories. The Boilermakers went on to sweep its Michigan-Michigan State trip, beating both teams in the same year for only the second time ever (2005).

• Hase became the first Purdue freshman to ever score a game-winner in a 1-0 Big Ten road victory. She joined teammate **Hannah Mussallem** among the five freshmen in program history to account for the Boilermakers' first goal of the Big Ten season.

WILLIAMS ECLIPSES PURDUE ASSISTS RECORD; SCORES GAME-WINNER IN 3 STRAIGHT

• With her eight assists this season, **Maddy Williams** has established a new Purdue all-time record with 26 career helpers. She broke a record held by former teammate Alex Hairston. Williams has had a direct impact on 60 goals during her Purdue career, which is now also the most in team history.

• By scoring the game-winning goal in the victories vs. DePaul, Dayton and Louisville, Williams became the first Boilermaker since Shauna Stapleton in 2007 to account for the decisive score in three consecutive contests.

MULTI-GOAL DUOS

• Purdue has scored six goals in a game twice in the same season for the first time ever. **Andrea Petrina** has recorded a multi-goal game in both of the big wins. But she wasn't alone. **Hannah Mussallem** also scored twice in the Indiana State win and **Maddy Williams** had a pair of goals in the Michigan State victory. It marks the first time in program history dual multi-goal efforts in the same game have happened twice in a season. Petrina joins all-time goals leader Jessica Okoroafo as the only Boilermakers to be on the list twice.

• In the Indiana State win, the Boilermakers scored five goals in a half for the first time since a November 2007 win vs. Indiana. That win also marked the last time since two Boilermakers each scored twice in the same half, a feat accomplished by Petrina and Mussallem vs. ISU.

WILLIAMS' HAT TRICK LEADS TO BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

• **Maddy Williams**' hat trick in the win at Louisville earned the senior her second career Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week honor. She posted the fifth hat trick in program history, tying the Boilermakers' record for goals in a game. She scored three minutes and six seconds apart in the first half. The third score of the natural hat trick was also her 30th career goal and 10th career game winner.

• Williams was also named the Big Ten's Offensive Player of the Week in October 2013 after she scored the lone goal in consecutive 1-0 wins vs. Illinois and Northwestern. She joins Jessica Okoroafo (4) and Parrissa Eyorokon (2) as Boilermakers to win Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week multiple times during their careers.
