GAME NOTES

- This is the 40th season in Purdue Women's Basketball history. The Boilermakers are 778-415 all-time, including a 409-128 record at home.
- Purdue is 192-96 under head coach Sharon Versyp, who is in her ninth season with the Boilermakers. She has a career record of 309-161.
- Purdue is 363-185 all-time in Big Ten Conference play, including a 209-65 mark in Mackey Arena.
- Versyp is 90-50 at Purdue in conference play and 99-57 for her career in Big Ten action.
- Purdue is 211-127 in January, including a 118-42 record at home. The Boilermakers are 8-6 all-time on Jan. 15, including a 7-4 record in Mackey Arena.
- Purdue is 20-19 all-time in the 17th game of the season, its worst record in any game through the season.
- The Boilermakers are now 50-21 all-time against teams from Wisconsin, including a 47-18 mark against the Badgers.
- Purdue is 499-188 when playing in its home state of Indiana.
- The loss snaps a four-game win streak against Wisconsin, marking their first win over Purdue since Jan. 13, 2011, and the Badgers' first win in West Lafayette since Dec. 30, 2010.
- Purdue's loss is its third straight, and second at Mackey Arena in conference play.
- The Boilermakers shot just 31.4 percent from the field (22-70), including 27 percent in the second half (10-37) and 23.8 percent from behind the arc (5-21).
- The Boilermakers outrebounded Wisconsin, 45-42, including a season-high 21 offensive boards, but only converted 12 second-chance points.
- Purdue falls to 0-7 this season when trailing at halftime.
- Wisconsin made 44.8 percent from the floor (26-58). The Boilermakers are 1-7 when their opponents break the 40-percent mark.

GAME PERFORMANCES/INDIVIDUAL HIGHS

- Whitney Bays turned in her eighth straight double-double and 11th of the season, finishing with 18 points, 10 rebounds, four blocks and four steals.
- Ashley Morrissette had 13 points and a career-high nine assists.
- Liza Clemons was just shy of a double-double with eight points and nine rebounds.
