- The No. 19-ranked Purdue men's basketball team wraps its three-game in five-day stretch to begin the 2017-18 season with a trip to Marguette for the 2017 version of the Gavitt Games. Tip is scheduled for 8:30 p.m. ET from the Harris BMO Bradley Center in Milwaukee.
- The game will be televised by FS1 with **Brian** Anderson and Stephen Bardo on the call. On the radio waves, Larry Clisby and Rob Blackman will handle the call on the Purdue Radio Network
- · Live stats will be provided on PurdueSports. com and fans can receive in-game updates via Twitter at @BoilerBall, or on the Purdue Sports App.
- Purdue is looking to start 3-0 for the ninth time in the 13-year era of Matt Painter. Purdue last began a season 3-0 during the 2015-16 campaign, en route to an 11-0 start. · Following the trip to Marquette, Purdue will host Fairfield on Saturday before heading to the Bahamas for the Battle 4 Atlantis.

- · Purdue's offense clicked at a high rate during its two-game opening weekend homestand averaging 108.0 points while shooting 59.8 percent from the field en route to a 2-0 mark.
- Purdue scored 100 points in back-to-back games for the first time since Feb. 1974, when it tallied 105 points in the opener against SIU-Edwardsville and 111 against Chicago State.
- Purdue's 111 points were the most for the program since scoring 118 against Florida A&M on Dec. 22, 1997, and the 17th most in a game in school history.
- The 69-point margin of victory over Chicago State is the most in the modern era and the second most in school history behind a 106-point (112-6) win over Indiana State on Jan. 10, 1911.
- Purdue also shot over 59.0 percent in consecutive games for the first time since Dec. 1994.
- Six players are averaging in double-figures through two games, led by Carsen Edwards (20.5).

▶ Bunches of Points

- Purdue is averaging 108.0 points per game through two games, scoring at least 100 points in consecutive games for the first time since Dec. 1974.
- Purdue has scored at least 50 points in all four halves this season.
- The 105 points against SIU-Edwardsville were the fourth most in a season opener in school history and the seventh most by a team on opening night (among Division I teams).
- Purdue's 111 points against Chicago State were the 17th most in a game in school history and the most since Dec. 22, 1997, against Florida A&M (118).
- Purdue's 111 points against Chicago State are tied for the secondmost nationally this year (Virginia Tech 132 vs. the Citadel).
- Purdue's 59 points in the first half against Chicago State were the fourth most in a half during the **Matt Painter** era.

▶ Adding to the Record Books

- The 69-point margin of victory against Chicago State was the second largest in school history (106 points vs. Indiana State on Jan. 10, 1911) and largest margin in the modern era ... it was the largest margin of victory in Mackey Arena history ... Purdue's 31-point (59-28) halftime lead was the 13th-largest margin in school history.
- Chicago State's 21.5 percent shooting from the field was the secondlowest percentage by an opponent in school history ... Chicago State's 9.4 second-half field goal percentage (3-of-32) was the secondlowest percentage in a half by an opponent in school history ... Chicago State's 14 second-half points tied for the fourth fewest in a half in school history.

▶ Most Consecutive Weeks in AP Rankings

- By being ranked in the AP preseason poll, Purdue has been ranked in 40 consecutive polls, the sixth-longest active current streak in the country.

▶These Kids are Alright

- Purdue freshmen Matt Haarms and Nojel Eastern made their anticipated debuts in strong fashion over the weekend.
- In 75 combined minutes, the duo has scored 32 points with 21 rebounds, 11 assists and six blocked shots while going 12-of-17 (.706) from the field.

▶ Some Numbers to Know

- Purdue is now 29-4 when **Ryan Cline** has two assists in a game.
- P.J. Thompson has had one or fewer turnovers in 87-of-102 games.
- Dakota Mathias has had at least two 3-pointers in 50-of-106 career games. He has at least four 3-pointers in nine of them.
- Purdue is 20-3 when **Carsen Edwards** gets the starting nod and 16-3 when he scores 10 or more points.
- Ryan Cline needs 12 3-pointers to become the fourth active player with 100 or more career 3-pointers.

▶ Automatic From the Field

Since the start of last year, Grady Eifert is 14-of-17 from the field. He
went 4-of-4 from the field against SIU-Edwardsville, 4-of-6 against
Chicago State and was 6-of-7 from the field a year ago.

▶ Returning to the Scene

- Purdue has very fond memories of the Harris BMO Bradley Center, winning a pair of games in last year's NCAA Tournament to advance to the Sweet 16. The Boilermakers defeated Vermont 80-70, and Iowa State by an 80-76 margin.
- The Boilermakers shot a combined 62-of-124 (.500) from the field and 17-of-46 (.370) from 3-point range. Purdue also had 43 assists against 20 turnovers in the two games.
- Vincent Edwards averaged 21.0 points and 7.5 rebounds per game in the two contests.

Twin Towers

• Purdue is one-of-seven teams with a pair of 7-footers on its roster. It is the only team in America with two players 7-2 or taller.

November Reign

- Purdue has dominated the opposition at home during the month of November, going 42-2 (.955) under head coach Matt Painter. The lone setbacks were on Nov. 9, 2012, to Bucknell (70-65), and Nov. 14, 2017, to defending national champion Villanova (79-76). Ironically, Villanova's head coach Jay Wright graduated from Bucknell.
- Going back further, Purdue is 77-8 (.906) all-time at Mackey Arena during the month of November.
- Painter owns a 58-15 (.795) record during the month of November.

▶ Big Margins at Home

• Purdue has won nine straight home games by an average of 25.2 points per game with all of them coming by double-digits. Its closest games during the streak was 11 points twice (Wisconsin, Indiana).

Boilers Hot at Home

- Purdue will enter next weekend's Fairfield game having won nine straight games at Mackey Arena, the sixth-longest streak during the Painter era.
- With eight non-conference home games on the slate, an undefeated non-conference schedule will give Purdue 15 straight home wins, which would be the fifth-longest home winning streak in Mackey Arena history.

▶ Automatic Victory

- With the win over SIU-Edwardsville, Purdue has now won 88 straight games when scoring 90 or more points, dating to Nov. 24, 1987, against Iowa State (L, 104-96).
- Entering the game with Marquette, it will have been 10,948 days since Purdue lost when scoring 90 points.
- The average price of gas the last time Purdue lost when scoring 90 points was \$0.96 and Ronald Reagan was the President. The price of a stamp was 22 cents.

- The Boilermakers were 17-1 in 2016-17 at home, recording the most home wins in a season in school history.
- Purdue has won over 80.0 percent of its games at the facility, amassing over 600 wins (608-138) in 50th season of play at Mackey Arena.
- Since the 1978-79 season, Purdue has won at least 12 home games in 30-of-39 seasons, including in 11 straight years.
- Purdue owns a 282-37 (.884) against non-conference foes at Mackey Arena and a 326-101 (.763) mark against Big Ten opposition.
- Purdue has sold out Mackey Arena in 367-of-746 games at Mackey Arena, filling the arena 49.2 percent of the time.

- With a trio of Sweet 16 appearances, nine NCAA Tournament berths, Big Ten regular-season and tournament titles and an international gold meda on his résumé, 13th-year head coach Matt Painter is widely regarded as one of the brightest minds in all of college basketball.
- Painter affirmed his long-term commitment to Purdue in March of 2011, agreeing to a new eight-year contract that will keep him in West Lafayette through at least the 2018-19 season. He then followed that up in August of 2016, signing a three-year extension good through the 2021-22 year.
- Painter has averaged over 22 wins per season during his tenure at the helm of the Purdue program, including at least 25 victories in six seasons.
- Painter's tenure has seen Purdue basketball restore its status among the upper echelon of college basketball programs. The last 10 years have seen six 25-win seasons and eight NCAA Tournament berths, three Sweet 16 appearances, two regular-season Big Ten titles and a Big Ten Tournament crown.
- The three winningest classes in program history are the classes of 2011, 2012 and 2010, respectively, and five of the 10 winningest individual players Purdue has ever seen have come from the Painter ranks. Success, however, didn't happen overnight.
- Painter officially became the 18th head men's basketball coach in Purdue history on April 1, 2005, and immediately set about laying the groundwork for a dramatic reversal in the program's fortunes.
- The Boilermakers were at their best during the 2009 postseason run, rattling off double-digit victories over Penn State and Illinois to reach the Big Ten Tournament final, where they dispatched Ohio State, 65-61, to earn the first conference tournament crown in program history.
- Painter has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year three times, earning the consensus award in 2008 and 2011, and winning the coaches' vote in 2010. He is one of only six men to win the award more at least three times since its inception in 1974.
- Painter has seen a total of 26 players earn a combined 49 Academic All-Big Ten honors during his tenure as head coach. Painter has also mentored a pair of Academic All-Americans in E'Twaun Moore (2010) and Caleb Swanigan (2017)
