## THE SCENE SETTER

- The highly-ranked Purdue men's basketball team hosts Southern Indiana on Tuesday, Nov. 1, for its lone exhibition contest of the season.
- Tip is scheduled for 7:05 p.m. ET, and will be streamed online on BTN2Go.com as part of the BTN+ package. Purdue students **Mike Folta** and **Connor Hoke** on the call.
- On the radio call, veteran broadcaster **Larry Clisby**, entering his 34th season, will provide play-by-play commentary, while **Rob Blackman** and **Ralph Taylor** will provide expert commentary. **Wes Scott** will serve as producer. Coverage begins one hour before tip with the Purdue Basketball tipoff show on the Purdue Sports Network.
- Live stats will be provided via StatBroadcast.com while Twitter and Instagram updates will be provided on the official Purdue Basketball accounts (@BoilerBall).

## THE BOILERMAKER NOTEBOOK

- Hopes are high for the Boilermakers as they enter the 2016-17 season. Purdue is ranked 15 in the preseason USA Today Coaches poll, and is ranked as high as No. 9 in preseason publications (Blue Ribbon Magazine).
- Purdue returns three starters and eight letterwinners off last year's team that posted a 26-9 record and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the second straight year.
- Purdue recorded a 17-1 mark at home a year ago (lone loss to Iowa) and carries an eight-game winning streak (19th-longest streak in America; 2nd in Big Ten).
- Purdue has also won nine straight home games against non-conference opponents.
- Leading the way for Purdue figures to be what **Jon Rothstein** calls the "best 3-4-5 attack in college basketball in **Vincent Edwards**, **Caleb Swanigan** and **Isaac Haas**". All three players are up for the position awards by the Basketball Hall of Fame as Edwards is up for the Erving Award, Swanigan for the Malone Award and Haas for the Abdul-Jabbar Award.

- Edwards returns for his junior season after 11.3 points, 5.4 rebounds and 2.9 assists as a 6-8 forward. He is 1-of-2 active players (Oregon's **Dillon Brooks**) to have amassed 675 points, 325 rebounds, 175 assists and 75 made 3-pointers by the end of his sophomore season.
- After flirting with the NBA Draft, Swanigan comes back for his sophomore season after averaging 10.2 points and 8.3 rebounds per game. He became the first Purdue player since at least 1990-91 (all games) to lead the Big Ten in rebounding. His 8.3 average was sixth best by a Big Ten freshman since the 1993-94 season.
- With the departure of **A.J. Hammons**, Haas steps into a more-prominent role after averaging 9.8 points in just 14.3 minutes per game while shooting 59.4 percent. He led the Big Ten in points / 40 minutes (27.4).
- Key returnees in the backcourt include **Dakota Mathias**, **P.J. Thompson** and **Ryan Cline**, as well as newcomers **Carsen Edwards** and **Spike Albrecht**.

### EXHIBITION SUCCESS

- The Boilermakers own a 61-7 (.897) record all-time against exhibition foes having won 26 straight games.
- Since 1991-92, Purdue is 47-3 (.940) in exhibition games and 24-0 all-time against collegiate teams in exhibition games.
- Under **Matt Painter**, Purdue is 21-0 in exhibition games, winning by an average of 26.2 points per game (551 points in 21 games).
- In nine of the 11 seasons that Purdue won its exhibition opener by 30 or more points, Purdue reached the NCAA Tournament at the end of the season, including last year.

- Purdue will enter the 2016-17 season having been ranked in 19 consecutive polls by the Associated Press, before the preseason poll comes out. It's the 11th-longest active current streak in the country.

- Southern Indiana head coach **Rodney Watson** was an assistant coach under Purdue head coach **Matt Painter** during the 2003-04 season at Southern Illinois University. The Salukis posted a 25-5 record, winning the Missouri Valley Conference with a 17-1 record.

### PAINTER GAINS THREE-YEAR CONTRACT EXTENSION

- In August, head coach **Matt Painter** signed a three-year contract extension that will keep him at Purdue through the 2021-22 season. He previously had signed an eight-year deal on March 30, 2011, that kept him on at Purdue through the 2018-19 season.

**#BOILERNOTES**

- Purdue has won seven straight games in the ACC / Big Ten Challenge, the second-longest winning streak in event history (Duke - 10; 1999-08). Five of the seven wins have come by at least 11 points.
- Purdue had a player (**Caleb Swanigan**) lead the league in rebounding (all games) for the first time since the Big Ten started tracking rebounds in all games before the 1989-90 season.
- Purdue led the Big Ten (conf. games only) in rebound margin (+10.1) for the first time since the league started keeping the record before the 1973-74 season. Purdue's +10.1 margin tied for the fifth-best mark in league history.

- Nationally, Purdue ranked in the top 60 in 13-of-17 statistical categories last year. The Boilermakers had their highest placings of the **Matt Painter** era in scoring offense (59th), scoring margin (10th), field goal percentage (37th), field goal percentage defense (10th), free throw percentage (30th), rebound margin (3rd), assists per game (7th) and personal fouls (48th).
- Purdue's 26 wins were the sixth most in a season in school history, and the Boilermakers are 1-of-3 Big Ten teams to receive a Big Ten Tournament double-bye in each of the last two seasons (Purdue, Michigan State, Maryland).
- Purdue went 17-1 at home, setting a school record for most home victories. Since the start of Big Ten play in 2014-15, Purdue has won 25 of its last 27 home games, with the lone losses coming to Maryland and Iowa.
- Purdue opened the season with 11 straight victories and its 17-3 start through 20 games was its third-best 20-game start in school history. The 11 victories to start the season were the fifth most to start a season without a loss in school history.
- Purdue's scoring margin of 12.7 points per game ranked third in school history, while its 77.9 points per game on offense was the third-highest average of the shot clock era (1986-87 season).
- Purdue had six players last year with at least 30 3-pointers for the first time in school history. Five of the players return this year.
- With **A.J. Hammons** winning the Big Ten's Defensive Player of the Year honors, the Purdue program has won a league-best nine Defensive Player of the Year honors, including seven of the last 14 honors and two straight.

**THE NATION'S BEST FRONTLINE?**

- Purdue has a chance to lay claim to the nation's best frontline as it is one of three schools to have players named to the Erving (small forward), Malone (power forward) and Abdul-Jabbar (center) awards.

**SPANISH SUCCESS**

- In early August, Purdue spent 10 days in Spain as part of its NCAA-allowed international, cultural trip that can occur every four years. The Boilermakers spent time in Madrid, Toledo, Valencia and Barcelona and came away with a 4-0 record.
- Leading the way was sophomore **Caleb Swanigan**, who averaged 18.5 points, 10.8 rebounds and 2.8 assists while shooting 59.1 percent (26-of-44) from the field. Swanigan, who set a Purdue freshman record with eight double-doubles a year ago, had three double-doubles in four games.
- Freshman **Carsen Edwards** turned heads by averaging 16.3 points and 2.3 assists while shooting 64.9 percent (24-of-37) from the field and 56.3 percent (9-of-16) from long distance. Edwards scored 25 points in the third game of the trip and scored 65 points in 76 minutes (34.2 points / 40 minutes).
- **Isaac Haas** also had a strong trip, averaging 13.5 points and 6.8 rebounds. Haas shot 68.6 percent (24-of-35) from the field.
- **P.J. Thompson** had an outstanding tour, averaging 10.8 points and 4.3 assists per game. Thompson made 68.8 percent (11-of-16) from deep.
- Purdue's four leading scorers on the trip (Swanigan, C. Edwards, Haas and Thompson) shot a combined 88-of-137 (.642) from the field. The rest of the team shot 54-of-141 (.383) from the field.
- Purdue outscored its foes by an average of 26.3 points per game, averaging 95.3 points per game during its four-game Spanish trip.

► **Record at Purdue:** 238-134 (.640) / 12th year | **Career Record:** 263-139 (.654) / 13th year

- With a pair of Sweet 16 appearances, eight NCAA Tournament berths, Big Ten regular-season and tournament titles and an international gold medal on his résumé, 12th-year head coach Matt Painter is widely regarded as one of the brightest minds in all of college basketball.
- Painter affirmed his long-term commitment to Purdue in March of 2011, agreeing to a new eight-year contract that will keep him in West Lafayette through at least the 2018-19 season. He then followed that up in August of 2016, signing a three-year extension good through the 2021-22 year.
- Painter has averaged over 21 wins per season during his tenure at the helm of the Purdue program, including at least 20 victories in eight seasons.
- Painter's tenure has seen Purdue basketball restore its status among the upper echelon of college basketball programs. The last eight years have seen six 20-win seasons and NCAA Tournament berths, two Sweet 16 appearances, a regular-season Big Ten title and a Big Ten Tournament crown.
- The three winningest classes in program history are the classes of 2011, 2012 and 2010, respectively, and five of the 10 winningest individual players Purdue has ever seen have come from the Painter ranks. Success, however, didn't happen overnight.
- Painter officially became the 18th head men's basketball coach in Purdue history on April 1, 2005, and immediately set about laying the groundwork for a dramatic reversal in the program's fortunes.
- The Boilermakers were at their best during the 2009 postseason run, rattling off double-digit victories over Penn State and Illinois to reach the Big Ten Tournament final, where they dispatched Ohio State, 65-61, to earn the first conference tournament crown in program history.
- Painter has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year three times in the last six seasons, earning the consensus award in 2008 and 2011, and winning the coaches' vote in 2010. He is one of only six men to win the award more than once since its inception in 1974.
- Painter has seen a total of 24 players earn a combined 44 Academic All-Big Ten honors during his tenure as head coach. Painter has also mentored an Academic All-American, as Moore earned second-team honors during the 2009-10 season.
