# HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Currently in his 16th season as the leader of the program, Schreiber is the program's all-time leader in overall wins and Big Ten wins. He eclipsed Dave Alexander's record for games coached (792 over 14 seasons) during the second weekend of the 2013 season. Schreiber played for Alexander at Purdue from 1983-86.

Purdue unveiled its new Alexander Field stadium and facilities during the 2012-13 school year, but the inaugural season at the new ballpark turned out to be a rebuilding year for the Boilermakers after losing 15 seniors and three junior MLB draftees from the 2012 Big Ten championship team.

In the five seasons between 2008 and 2012, Purdue went 172-110 overall (.610) and 75-51 in Big Ten play (.595). Both records represented the best marks in the league. The Boilermakers were the only conference team to qualify for the Big Ten Tournament each of those five seasons, the longest such streak in program history. Purdue has won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in eight of its nine appearances under Schreiber.

During its historic 2012 season, Purdue won a program-record 45 games, captured a pair of Big Ten titles, earned the right to host an NCAA Regional and closed out Lambert Field in thrilling fashion. Schreiber was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year after leading the Boilers to the most wins by a Big Ten team since 2008. He won his 400th and program-record 408th career games at Lambert in the spring of 2012. His 408th victory as the leader of the program, April 15 in the finale of a series sweep of Illinois, made him Purdue's all-time wins leader.

The Boilermakers began the 2012 season 14-1, won 10 consecutive games twice, posted their 20th win before April 1 for the first time, reached the 30-win mark at the earliest date (April 20) in program history and won their first Big Ten title since 1909. In its 16 games during the final year at Lambert, Purdue won three times in walkoff fashion and locked up the Big Ten title May 12 in front of a large group of program alumni.

Headlined by Kevin Plawecki's selection 35th overall by the New York Mets, Purdue had a program-record seven players picked in the 2012 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. Juniors Plawecki, Cameron Perkins and Nick Wittgren were each selected in the first 10 rounds to give the Boilers three players drafted in the first 300 picks for the first time. Highlighted by Big Ten Player and Pitcher of the Year honors for Plawecki and Joe Haase, Purdue had a program-high eight all-conference honorees in 2012.

Purdue's 37 overall wins in 2011 tied the program's previous single-season record and were the most in the Big Ten. Despite being picked eighth in the preseason coaches' poll, the Boilers finished third in the league with a 14-10 conference record, just one game shy of first. Purdue finished second in the Big Ten standings under Schreiber in 2001, 2005 and 2008.

Schreiber has coached 62 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 22 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft on 30 occasions. One of Schreiber's Boilermakers has led the Big Ten in hitting in four out of the last nine years.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha, finishing as regional runners-up to Auburn.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including first all-time in walks (132), tied for first in games played (226), sixth in runs scored (159) and tied for eight in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

#### - BOILERMAKERS OPEN 2014 WITH SERIES AT TENNESSEE -

Purdue baseball begins its 2014 campaign with the first of six consecutive southbound road trips, opening its new season with a three-game weekend series at the University of Tennessee.

The Boilermakers were originally scheduled to play four games this weekend, including two against Nebraska-Omaha. But UNO opted Thursday to cancel its travel plans and not participate in the three-team mini tournament. Purdue and Tennessee are now scheduled to play a single game Saturday at 3 p.m. and a doubleheader Sunday at noon.

This weekend marks the Boilers' first visit to Lindsey Nelson Stadium in Knoxville since winning a midweek game there on the 2003 spring break trip. During Doug Schreiber's 16-year tenure as head coach, Purdue also opened new seasons in the state of Tennessee in 1999, 2000 and 2004.

Tennessee represents the first test on what will be a challenging 2014 schedule for the Boilers. The opponents on this year's schedule compiled a combined record of 622-453 (.579) last season. UNO was to be the first of six preseason conference favorities on Purdue's schedule. The Mavericks won the Summit League regular-season title last year but were ineligible for the postseason as a reclassifying university from Division II to Division I status.

Tennessee figures to be an improved team again under third-year head coach Dave Serrano, who led both UC Irvine (2007) and Cal State Fullerton (2009) to the College World Series before returning to Knoxville. He previously served as the Volunteers' pitching coach from 1995-96. The Boilermakers are expected to face Serrano's son, right-handed freshman Kyle Serrano, Sunday.

Meanwhile, Purdue aims for a bounce back season that can make the frustrating 2013 campaign seem like an abnormality. A five-year run of success that had seen the Boilers be the most consistent team in the Big Ten did not extend into what was a rebuilding season in 2013. The challenge now is for Purdue's large sophomore class to lead the way in transforming last season's experience and opportunity (via extended playing time) into more team success this year. With redshirt seasons now making **Gavin Downs**, **Connor Podkul**, **Kyle Upp** and **Kyle Wood** part of the already large class that arrived on campus in the fall of 2012, Purdue's 14-player sophomore class serves as the core of the team. Upperclassmen like **Sean McHugh**, **Conner Hudnall** and **Brandon Krieg** will need to lead the way as well. And every successful team has a few newcomers contribute.

**Jordan Minch**, Wood and Podkul are expected to start on the mound for the Boilers. Back from Tommy John Surgery, Podkul is set to make his first appearance on the mound for Purdue since the final day of the 2012 regular season.

Saturday, Tennessee will also have a pitcher on the mound fresh off elbow surgery. Rather than redshirting in 2013, Andrew Lee opted to remain an active part of the roster as a position player. He was the Vols' first freshman to bat cleanup on opening day since 1990, but finished the year with a .187 batting average. As a high school senior in Morristown, Tenn., he posted a 0.28 ERA and 90 strikeouts in 50 innings.

Five newcomers started and seven saw action in Purdue's 2013 season opener. **Kyle Johnson**, **Jack Picchiotti**, Hudnall and Wood are expected to be back in there again as another new season begins. Current sophomores **Jack Amaro** and **Cody Strong** would prove they deserved more playing time later in the season. How much a lineup, rotation and bullpen changes throughout the course of the season is tied to the success and health of the team. Past Purdue teams like the 2008 Boilers proved that in-season improvement can lead to results even if success doesn't come

immediately against a challenging pre-conference schedule.

After facing a left-handed starting pitcher in 11 of their final 12 games of the 2013, Purdue is expected to see three right-handers this weekend in Knoxville. Purdue will be in search of its first win against a Southeastern Conference team since March 2012 at Auburn.

This season marks the first time since 2008 that Purdue will not be opening at the Big East/Big Ten Challenge in the Clearwater-St. Petersburg area of Florida's Gulf Coast. Next weekend the Boilers will play a three-game series at Conference USA preseason favorite Rice, marking their first trip to Texas since a 2009 series at Texas State.

#### **BOILERMAKERS OPEN NEW SEASON IN TENNESSEE**

- Purdue get its 2014 season underway on Valentine's Day in Knoxville, Tenn., participating in a three-team tournament hosted by the University of Tennessee. The Boilermakers' first two games of the season will be against defending Summit League champion Nebraska-Omaha before taking on the host Volunteers twice as well.
- This year marks the first time since 2008 that the Boilers will not be opening at the Big East/ Big Ten Challenge in the Clearwater-St. Petersburg area of Florida's Gulf Coast. Purdue's 2008 team opened with a three-game series at Baylor. The Boilermakers will be visiting Lindsey Nelson Stadium in Knoxville for the first time since posting a midweek win there on the 2003 spring break trip. During Doug Schreiber's 16-year tenure as head coach, Purdue also opened its new season in the state of Tennessee in 1999, 2000 and 2004.

#### McHUGH, MINCH & WOOD AMONG BIG TEN PLAYERS TO WATCH

- For the Boilermakers to have a bounce back season and return to the winning ways that saw the program qualify for five consecutive Big Ten Tournaments from 2008-12, Sean McHugh, Jordan Minch and Kyle Wood will likely have to be among the team's top contributors. They were Purdue's highlighted trio among the Big Ten Players to Watch this year.
- · Last season, the trio accounted for the team leaders in batting average, hits, RBI and slugging percentage (McHugh); strikeouts, wins and games started (Minch); and home runs and runs scored (Wood). All three have experienced a summer playing for the Yarmouth-Dennis Red Sox in the prestigious Cape Cod League. McHugh spent the summer of 2012 on the Cape while Minch and Wood were teammates there last summer.

#### MCHUGH BACK AS PURDUE'S LONE FOUR-YEAR SENIOR, JOINED BY BROTHER

 Purdue has only three seniors on its 2014 roster, its RECENT SETS OF BROTHERS WHO WERE fewest since also having three in 2011. Sean McHugh looks to close out his career on a high note as the program's only current four-year letter-winner. He was part of some of the most dramatic moments of the 2012 Rig of some of the most dramatic moments of the 2012 Big Matt: 2007-10, Kyle: 2010-13 Ten championship season, including delivering the goahead single in the 10-run ninth inning rally at UCLA and the game-tying pinch hit home run with two outs in the Rico & Jose Rossy ninth inning of the final game at Lambert Field.

· McHugh moved to third base for the first time as a Boilermaker last year. The Kansas City-area native went on to win team MVP honors after starting 50 of the 51 games, leading the team with a .298 average, 59 hits, nine doubles, 31 RBI and a .434 slug-

ging percentage. He's expected to see action at the hot corner and behind the plate this year. McHugh's younger brother Matthew is now part of the team as well. Sean and Matthew McHugh are the third set of brothers to be teammates at the same time under head coach Doug Schreiber, who also played with two sets of brothers at Purdue in the mid-1980s. Matthew McHugh is expected to see action as a corner infielder and relief pitcher. The McHughs' parents, Peter and Pam, along with their brother P.J. are also Purdue alumni.

## **BIG SOPHOMORE CLASS SHOULD BE KEY TO SUCCESS**

- · Following the 2012 Big Ten championship season, the Boilermakers graduated a 15-player senior class and also lost three juniors who were selected in the first nine rounds of the MLB Draft. A large freshman class replaced many of those players in 2013 and Purdue ranked among the national leaders with 13 freshmen and 17 total new players. A year later, sophomores dominate the Boilers' roster.
- · After redshirt seasons for Gavin Downs, Connor Podkul, Kyle Upp and Kyle Wood, Purdue now has 14 sophomores on its 2014 roster. Of those 14 sophomores, Kyle Johnson, Jack Picchiotti, Cody Strong and Wood were all regulars in the lineup a year ago. Sophomores Jordan Minch, Downs, Podkul and Wood project as key starting pitchers for Purdue this season. Eddie De LaRiva, Patrick Kenney, Mike Lutz and Tim McElroy teamed up to make a combined 71 relief appearances as freshmen. If most of the sophomore class can enjoy better seasons after getting a chance to play a lot as freshmen, Purdue should see its overall record improve.
- Minch (63 strikeouts, 81 1/3 innings and 14 games started), Lutz (25 appearances) and Wood (14 hit by pitch) all set new Purdue freshman records in 2013.

#### HAVE TO WIN MORE AT HOME

- Purdue struggled in its inaugural season at Alexander Field. The Boilermakers' 17-34 overall record was brought down in part by a 5-14 home mark. Purdue ended up having a better winning percentage in true road games (.346) than at home (.263). A 1-11 home mark in Big Ten play was almost inconceivable after the Boilers had been below .500 overall at home only twice in Doug Schreiber's first 15 seasons (10-11 in 2002 and 8-10 in 2007).
- The five home wins last season were Purdue's fewest since going 2-12 at Lambert in 1975.

#### WOOD IN SELECT COMPANY NATIONALLY AS TWO-WAY STARTER

- For the second year in a row, **Kyle Wood** begins the season as a projected starter in the regular lineup and the weekend rotation. Some quick research compiled by Northern Illinois revealed there are approximately 28 players around the country expected to be full-time two-way players as starters in the lineup and weekend rotation. Wood was the lone Big Ten player on the list. A year ago, he became the first Boiler since 2003 to bat in the lineup in the same game in which he was the starting pitcher.
- Wood was a constant in the middle of the lineup in 2013, but only made seven starts on the mound after a forearm strain limited him to a designated hitter role for much of the first half of the season. He returned to the rotation in time for the Nebraska series in mid-April and started a game on the mound in each of the final six weekends. The Chicagoland-area native led the team with five home runs and 32 runs scored in 2013.

#### PODKUL RETURNS TO ACTIVE ROSTER

- Connor Podkul returns to the active roster this season after missing 2013 following Tommy John Surgery. The right-hander will look to return to the form that earned him a spot in the Boilers' weekend rotation during the 2012 Big Ten championship season. Purdue went 6-3 in his nine starts in 2012 and Podkul led the way in key victories against Missouri State, Louisville, Northwestern, Illinois and Nebraska. The MSU and Louisville (6 no-hit innings) wins were great résumé boosters for the Boilers in the first two months of the season.
- After joining the weekend rotation in time for the first weekend of April, Podkul struck out a season-high six in a quality start at Northwestern and worked 6 1/3 innings of two-hit ball as Purdue completed a sweep of defending Big Ten champ Illinois. But his most memorable performance (Win, 5 1/3 IP, 3 R) of the season may have been in the rubber game win at Nebraska in front of large crowd of Husker faithful.
- Podkul struggled down the stretch in 2012 and did not pitch more than four innings in any of his final four starts. He did not pitch in the Big Ten Tournament or NCAA Regional that Purdue hosted in Gary, Ind.

## **HUDNALL'S REACHED SAFELY STREAK IN GAMES STARTED**

- **Conner Hudnall** finished his junior season having reached base safely in the final 27 games of the year in which he started. He hit safely in 17 consecutive games in which he started during the reached-safely streak, which carries over into 2014. The outfielder hit safely in all three games of the Northwestern, Illinois and Michigan State series.
- Hudnall delivered arguably the biggest hit of the 2013 season when he came through with a bases-clearing double with two outs to cap Purdue's four-run rally in the ninth inning of the series finale at Michigan. It turned out to be the Boilers' final win of the year. Hudnall finished the season as the team leader with nine doubles and six outfield assists.
- Cody Strong also posted a 19-game streak in which he reached base safely from March 23 through May 8 of the 2013 season. He led the team with a .436 on-base percentage in 2013 thanks in part to 25 free passes (19 walks, 6 HBP). Strong's .492 on-base percentage in Big Ten play would have led the league but he fell six plate appearances shy of the minimum to qualify.

#### JOHNSON'S IMPRESSIVE TURNAROUND CARRIED OVER TO SUMMER ALL-STAR HONORS

- Kyle Johnson entered the Penn State series the final weekend of March last season batting only .119 (5-for-42) for the season. But beginning March 29, he went on to bat .321 the rest of the year to see his average rise .147 points. The impressive turnaround carried over to the summer league season. He batted .336 with nine extra-base hits, 16 RBI and 23 walks in 107 at-bats for the San Luis Obispo Blues of the California Collegiate League. He played for the North Division in the CCL All-Star Game.
- Johnson hit safely and drove in a run in all three games of Purdue's first-ever sweep at Penn State (March 29-31, 2013), leading to Big Ten Player of the Week honors. He was the only freshman around the conference to be named Big Ten Player of the Week in 2013. He also became the first Purdue freshman to be honored since 2003. He went on to post a 10-game hit streak in April, the longest on the team in 2013. Johnson also hit safely in all three games of the Big Ten series against Illinois, Nebraska and Michigan and scored a run in all three games against Michigan after drawing five walks in the series.
- Johnson was named the Boilers' defensive player of the year after the 2013 season. He made 41 of his 42 starts in center field and impressed with his range. He also made seven relief appearances on the mound and pitched for the SLO Blues in the summer as well.

#### **POSITIONAL FLEXIBILITY DEMONSTRATED IN 2013**

- Jack Picchiotti, Cody Strong and Kyle Wood all impressed with their positional flexibility in 2013. Picchiotti started games at five different positions (C, LF, RF, DH, 3B) and Strong saw action at five different spots (2B, 3B, RF, LF, C), starting at least once at every spot but catcher. Picchiotti also batted in eight of the nine spots in the lineup (all but cleanup). Meanwhile, Wood started games at four different positions (DH, P, 1B, RF). Conner Hudnall (RF, 3B, LF) and Sean McHugh (3B, C, SS) each started games at three different positions as juniors.
- As 2014 opens, look for Picchiotti to begin the season behind the plate, Strong at second base and Wood at first base.

#### **FOUR NEWCOMERS TO WATCH EARLY IN 2014**

• Unlike a year ago when Purdue used seven newcomers in its season opener and 14 total during the season-opening weekend, the large groups of sophomores and juniors on this year's team should make up a significant part of the lineup and rotation early in 2014. But based on head coach Doug Schreiber's preseason projections, look for outfielders **Jordan Lewis** and **Ted Snidanko** as well as pitchers **Brett Haan** and **Matt Frawley** to be among the newcomers with the early chances to contribute. Lewis and Snidanko are projected to start the season opener as the corner outfielders. Haan will take the ball for the first game of the season and Frawley could be one of the first guys used in relief. Haan is a Lafayette native and junior college transfer from Parkland College in Champaign, Ill. Lewis, Snidanko and Frawley are all true freshmen. Snidanko (8-for-21, 4 XBH, 5 RBI, 4 runs) and Frawley (Win, 2 App, 8 IP, 7 H, 1 R, 5 K) impressed during Purdue's Black & Gold Series in the fall.

#### **BIG TEN TOURNAMENT EXPANDS TO EIGHT TEAMS**

- For the first time, the Big Ten Tournament will be held at the same site as the College World Series, TD Armitrade Park in Omaha. It will also feature an eight-team field for the first time. The Big Ten Tournament has been played annually since 1981, with a four-team field through 1999 and a six-team event from 2000-2013.
- Purdue was predicted to finish eighth in the Big Ten standings this year by Perfect Game USA. If the prediction holds true, the Boilers would earn the final Big Ten Tournament berth. The league coaches picked Indiana, Nebraska, Ohio State, Michigan State, Illinois and Michigan to finish in the top six of the standings this year.
- The Boilermakers won the 2012 Big Ten Tournament but saw their program-long streak of five consecutive tourney berths snapped last season. It was the longest active run in the league at the time. Ohio State's three-year streak is now the longest active run. Six different teams won the tournament each year from 2007 through 2012 (Ohio State, Michigan, Indiana, Minnesota, Illinois and Purdue).
- Purdue has qualified for the Big Ten Tournament eight times in the last 10 years while making 10 appearances total in Doug Schreiber's first 15 seasons as head coach. The Boilermakers have qualified for the tournament field 16 times since its inception in 1981. Purdue is 18-30 all-time at the Big Ten Tournament and has gone two-and-out only four times in its 16 appearances, including just once (2001) under Schreiber.

#### STACKED SCHEDULE

- Purdue faces a challenging 2014 schedule that features numerous quality programs. No. 3 Indiana, No. 9 LSU and No. 20 Louisville all qualified for the 2013 College World Series and are preseason favorites in their conferences. No. 15 Rice, San Diego State and Illinois were also NCAA Regional teams a year ago. Nebraska-Omaha won the Summit League regular-season title in 2013, but was not eligible for the post-season as a reclassifying program from Division II to Division I. Missouri State (MVC) and Illinois-Chicago (Horizon) were picked to finish second in their leagues this year.
- Purdue's 2014 opponents compiled a combined record of 622-453 (.579) last season.
