GAME NOTES

- This is the 40th season in Purdue Women's Basketball history. The Boilermakers are 778-416 all-time, including a 248-221 mark on the road.
- Purdue is 192-97 under head coach Sharon Versyp, who is in her ninth season with the Boilermakers. She has a career record of 309-162.
- Purdue is 363-186 all-time in Big Ten Conference play, including a 154-121 record on the road.
- Versyp is 90-51 at Purdue in conference play and 99-58 for her career in Big Ten action.
- Purdue is 211-128 in January, including an 89-82 mark away from home. The Boilermakers are 7-6 all-time on Jan. 19, including a 4-5 record on the road.
- Purdue is 29-10 all-time in the 18th game of the season.
- Nebraska snapped a five-game Purdue win streak in the all-time series. The Boilers still lead the meetings, 5-2.
- Purdue is 102-148 all-time against ranked opponents, and 16-58 when Purdue is unranked against a ranked opponent.
- The Boilermakers turned the ball over 19 times, resulting in 19 Nebraska points. Purdue scored nine points off of 10 Nebraska turnovers.
- Purdue had a 39-33 edge on the boards, including 12 offensive rebounds, and outscored Nebraska on second-chance points, 11-2.
- The Boilermakers were nine-of-11 at the free throw line, while Nebraska converted 13-of-15. Purdue is 0-6 this season when making equal or fewer free throws than their opponents.
- The Boilermakers' four straight losses mark their longest losing streak since the end of the 2009-10 season, when they lost their last three regular season games and the Big Ten Tournament opener.
- Purdue is 0-8 this season when trailing at the half.
- The Boilermakers are 0-5 this season when two or fewer players score in double-figures.

GAME PERFORMANCES/INDIVIDUAL HIGHS

- April Wilson scored a career-high 20 points, hitting seven-of-nine from the field, including a season-high three three-point field goals. She also grabbed six rebounds and dished out three assists.
- Whitney Bays turned in her ninth straight double-double and 12th of the season, finishing with 14 points and 14 rebounds. She also chipped in three steals.
- Bays is now one double-double shy of the Boilermakers' single-season record, shared by Stacey Lovelace and Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton, and is tied for third all-time at Purdue with 20 for her career.
- Liza Clemons had four points, nine rebounds, two blocks and matched a career-high with five assists.
