SETTING THE SCENE

- Purdue heads to Rutgers for the first meeting between the schools.
- The Boilermakers will be up against a Rutgers staff that includes wide receivers coach Jafar Williams.
 Williams was at Purdue from 2013 through 2015 where he was in charge of the running backs.
 Williams coached current Purdue running backs Tario Fuller, Markell Jones, D.J. Knox and Richie Worship.
- The Boilermakers are coming off a hard-fought loss at No. 7 Wisconsin, 17-9.
- Rutgers is coming off a 35-24 road victory at Illinois.
- The game is Purdue's second of three crossover games against a team in the Big Ten East. The Boilermakers fell to then-No. 8 Michigan in their first crossover. They will then wrap up the season against in-state rival Indiana in their final crossover of the season.
- Saturday's game is Purdue's first noon kickoff this season.
- Purdue is the only team in the Big Ten that has not already played at least one noon ET game heading into Saturday's matchup.
- The game will be televised live on the Big Ten Network with Kevin Kugler, Matt Millen and Lisa Byington calling the action for the second week in a row.

SERIES HISTORY

- Purdue and Rutgers meet for the first time in series history.
- Rutgers is the only team in the Big Ten that Purdue has never faced.
- Purdue is the only Big Ten team that Rutgers has never faced
- Since Rutgers joined the Big Ten in 2014, the Scarlet Knights have faced every Big Ten team except Purdue and Northwestern heading into Saturday's game.
- Rutgers is scheduled to make its first trip to West Lafayette on Oct. 10, 2020.
- In Purdue's first-ever matchup against the other 12 current Big Ten teams, the Boilermakers are 6-6 with wins over Illinois, Indiana, Michigan State, Nebraska, Penn State and Wisconsin.

>TOUGH DEFENSE ON THE ROAD

- The Boilermakers have played two road games this season - at Missouri and at No. 7 Wisconsin.
- In those games, the Boilermakers have allowed just 10.0 points per game, including zero points in either second half.
- The Boilermakers have six takeaways in road games with three interceptions and three fumble recoveries.
- In road games, the Boilermakers have forced 11 punts this season.
- The Boilermaker defense has allowed just two touchdowns on the road this season and none after the first quarter.
- Entering this week, Missouri's offense ranks 41st nationally and Wisconsin's 26th.

- Brohm's Playing Career
- He was a three-year starter at Louisville, playing for the Cardinals from 1989 to 1993.
- He still ranks sixth in program history in touchdown passes (38), seventh in total offense (5,410), eighth in completion percentage (.562), eighth in passing yards (5,451), eighth in passing efficiency (129.97), ninth in passing attempts (715) and ninth in completions (402).
- Brohm was voted the team's Most Valuable Player as a junior and senior, and his number 11 became part of Louisville's Ring of Honor in 2006.
- Brohm still has the 11th longest touchdown pass in school with an 80-yard strike to Ralph Dawkins vs. Texas in 1993.
- Brohm threw 20 touchdown passes in 1993, which is tied for 10th most in a single season.
- Brohm played in the NFL with the San Diego Chargers (1994), Washington Redskins (1995-96), San Francisco Apers (1997-98), Tampa Bay Buccaneers (1998), Denver Broncos (1999) and Cleveland Browns (2000).
- In eight career games all with the 49ers he completed 37-of-58 passes (63.8 percent) for 353 yards with one touchdown and one interception.
- His best game came Oct. 27, 1996, when he completed 19-of-30 passes for 176 yards and a touchdown to lead San Francisco to a 10-9 win over the Houston Oilers.
- In 2001, Brohm played in the XFL for the Orlando Rage and was named first team All-XFL.

Brohm at Western Kentucky

 Brohm came to the Boilermakers from Western Kentucky, where he compiled a remarkable 30-10 overall record (.750 winning percentage), including a 19-5 Conference USA mark (.792), from 2014 to 2016. • The Hilltoppers were league champions in 2015 and 2016, the school's first back-to-back titles as an

FBS member. • They won the 2014 Bahamas Bowl (49-48 over Central Michigan) and the 2015 Miami Beach Bowl (45-35 over Miami, Fla.), as well as the 2016 Boca Raton Bowl (51-31 over Memphis under interim head coach Nick Holt).

Western Kentucky was ranked No. 24 in the final 2015 Associated Press poll.

 Under Brohm, the Hilltoppers averaged 44.6 points, 356.6 passing yards and 526.2 yards of total offense per game over three seasons.

• Their starting quarterbacks completed 69.2

percent of their passes and threw 131 touchdowns with merely 25 interceptions.

 Western Kentucky broke more than 75 school offensive records since 2013, when Brohm served as assistant head coach, offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach

 Brohm was a standout player at Trinity High School in Louisville, Kentucky.

• He won the Kentucky Mr. Football Award as a senior in 1988 while leading the Shamrocks to a state championship and undefeated season.

 Brohm was named the Kentucky High School Player of the Decade for the 1980s and was inducted into the Kentucky High School Athletic Association Hall of Fame in 2014.

• A native of Louisville, Brohm (born April 24, 1971) earned his bachelor's degree in business administration in 1994

 He and his wife, Jennifer, have a son, Brady, and a daughter, Brooke.

 Jeff is one of four family members to be a football letterwinner at Louisville, along with his father, Oscar (quarterback 1966-69), and brothers, Greq (wide receiver 1989-92) and Brian (quarterback 2004-07).

 The Brohm family, including mother, Donna, and sister, Kim, was inducted into the Louisville Catholic Sports Hall of Fame in 2013.

- In 1967: The consensus was that Purdue overlooked Oregon State for its Homecoming game. Six turnovers and suspect special teams play cost the Boilermakers in a 22-14 loss at Ross-Ade Stadium. It was a non-conference game, so all was not lost. The Boilermakers still were undefeated in the Big Ten Conference and had their sights set on the league championship.
- Noteworthy: On this date in 2000, Wisconsin attempted a 58-yard field goal on the opening possession of overtime. Redshirt freshman defensive tackle Craig Terrill blocked it, and the football was recovered by junior cornerback Ashante Woodyard, who raced 36 yards into the end zone to give the Boilermakers a remarkable 30-24 victory at Camp Randall Stadium in Madison. Wisconsin led 17-14 in the third quarter when senior guarterback Drew Brees connected with sophomore wide receiver Seth Morales on a 78-yard bomb that pushed Purdue in front 21-17. On that play, Brees became the Big Ten Conference career passing yards leader, overtaking Chuck Long of Iowa (1981-85). The win was the Boilermakers' sixth of the season, qualifying them for their fourth bowl berth in as many seasons under head coach Joe Tiller. More importantly, it put them in the driver's seat for the Big Ten championship and Rose Bowl berth, which became their ultimate destination.

GAME 6 REWIND

- The Boilermakers fell at No. 7 Wisconsin 17-9.
- After trailing 14-0 with 6:12 to play in the first quarter, the Boilermakers outscored the Badgers 9-3
- Purdue shutout Wisconsin in the second half. The Boilermakers have shutout both road opponents in the second half this season.
- The 17 points allowed are the fewest Purdue has allowed against a top-10 team since Nov. 15, 2003 at No. 4 Ohio State when the Boilermakers fell to the Buckeyes 16-13 in overtime.
- It is just the second time Purdue has allowed 17 or fewer points on the road against a top-10 team since Nov. 18, 1972.
- The defense forced three turnovers with two interceptions and a fumble recovery. The Boilermakers have had at least two takeaways in

- every game this season.
- Spencer Evans hit a 49-yard field goal. It was Purdue's longest made field goal since Nov. 8,
- Elijah Sindelar got the start at guarterback, the third of his career.
- Garrett Hudson blocked a punt, his second of the season. His two blocked punts this season tie the school record for most in a single season.
- Purdue did not lead in the game. It's the first time this season the Boilermakers have not led.
- Purdue recovered a fumble inside its own 5-yard line. The Boilermakers have recovered at least one fumble in every game this season, including three inside their own 5 and four inside their own 10.
- The game was Purdue's first without a touchdown since Nov. 2, 2013 against Ohio State.
- The Boilermakers were 0-for-2 in the red zone after entering the game 19-for-20.
- Da'Wan Hunte picked off the first pass of his career.
- Markus Bailey finished with a career-high 10 solo stops.
- Danny Ezechukwu had an interception, the third of his career.
- Ja'Whaun Bentley had a season-high 12 tackles to lead the team.
- Lorenzo Neal forced and recovered a fumble. He also led the team with 3.0 tackles for loss.

ROAD SECOND HALVES

- Purdue is yet to allow a point in the second half of a road game this season.
- The Boilermakers shut out Missouri on the road in week three
- Last week at No. 7 Wisconsin, the Boilermakers kept the Badgers off the board.
- In road second halves, Purdue has four takeaways with three interceptions and a fumble recovery.

INTERCEPTION RETURNS

- Purdue has picked off six passes and returned them 219 yards through the first six games.
- Purdue's interception return yardage already ranks 14th most for a single season in school history.
- The total is just 12 yards shy of climbing into Purdue's all-time top 10.

- Purdue, more specifically **Garrett Hudson**, has blocked two punts this season.
- The team blocked punt total is tied for second in the country with Air Force, Arizona State, Florida State and Texas A&M.
- Utah State has the national lead with four blocked punts this season.
- Hudson has already tied Purdue's single season record with the two blocked punts.
- Nationally, Hudson is one of 11 players with two blocked kicks of any kind.
- Hudson is the only player in the Big Ten with two blocked kicks this season.

SUCCESS WHILE PUNTING

- Joe Schopper has punted 29 times this season for 1,266 yards, an average of 43.7 yards per kick.
- This year, he was 10 punts of 50+ yards (34.5 percent), while 12 of his punts have been downed inside the 20 (41.4 percent). Fourteen punts have been caught for a fair catch (48.3 percent).
- None of Schopper's punts have been touchbacks.
- For his career, Schopper has 56 punts downed inside the 20 (39.2 percent), 30 punts of 50+ (35.0 percent), 47 have been fair caught (32.9
- For his career, he averages 41.1 yards per punt, which is sixth in school history.

CREATING TURNOVERS

- Purdue's defense has 15 takeaways through the first six games with nine fumble recoveries and six interceptions. That is the most through six games since 2007.
- The last time Purdue recovered at least fumble in each of the first six games to start a season was 2002 when the Boilermakers recovered exactly one in each of the first six games.
- Purdue's nine fumble recoveries are more than any other Purdue team since before 1980.

DEFENSE MAKING PLAYS

- Purdue's defense is night and day from a year ago.
- After ranking 117th in scoring defense, while allowing 38.3 points per game, the defense has improved by 18.1 points per game to 20.2. That ranks 33rd. Full comparison between 2016 and this season is on page 10.
- Purdue's defense had a pair of goal line stands against Louisville and the reigning Heisman Trophy winner, Lamar Jackson.
- The first came in the opening quarter when the Cardinals had 3rd & goal at Purdue's 1. Danny Ezechukwu picked up a Jackson fumble and dragged him to the 37-yard line.
- The second came early in the second quarter.
 Again at Purdue's 1, Ja'Whaun Bentley stripped running back Jeremy Smith as he reached for the end zone. Markus Bailey picked up the loose ball and returned it 19 yards to the Boilermakers' 20-yard line.
- The Cardinals had eight trips into the red zone and scored just three touchdowns and three field goals. The field goals were from 23, 30 and 32 vards.
- Louisville had four takeaways in the game, including one returned for a touchdown. On the other three, the defense forced two three-andouts and came up with a fumble recovery.
- Against Ohio, Purdue stopped the Bobcats three times on the Boilermaker side of the field. Twice the stop led to a punt, while the other was a sack on fourth down.
- Against Michigan, Purdue had a season-high four sacks, eight tackles for loss and forced seven three-and-outs. The defense also forced seven punts.
- Against Missouri, the defense forced two turnovers and seven punts and outscored Minnesota's offense in the second half.

• The defensive effort at Missouri was something not seen out of a Purdue team in a long while.

• Purdue held Missouri to 17 yards in the first quarter, 91 at the half, and 203 for the game.

- The defense forced five three-and-outs, while allowing more than one first down on a drive just on one of 13 drives.
- The most plays allowed on a drive was six, which happened just twice.
- Missouri's longest drive was 57 yards and ended with an interception by Kamal Hardy.
- The defense gave up just four first downs in the first half and 10 for the game.
- The score was 21-0 before Purdue allowed its second first down.
- The defense picked off two passes and recovered a fumble
- Only three receivers were able to catch a pass.

»Stout against Michigan

- Entering the Michigan game, the defense had just one sack and eight tackles for loss.
- In the first half against the Wolverines, the defense had three sacks and six tackles for loss. The Boilermakers finished with four sacks and eight tackles for loss.
- The defense also forced an interception and a fumble in the game.
- Michigan had just 131 total yards at the half.
- For the game, 25 of Michigan's 75 offensive plays (33.3 percent) were no gain, loss of yards or a turnover.

»Resilient against Minnesota

- Despite turning the ball over four times in the first half, Purdue's defense kept them in the game trailing just 14-6 at the half.
- All 14 first half Minnesota points were off Purdue turnovers.
- On the other two first half Purdue turnovers, the defense forced a three-and-out and forced and recovered a fumble.
- For the season, Purdue's defense has forced and recovered three fumbles inside its own 10-yard line.
- The defense held Minnesota to just 1 of 13 on third downs of four or longer.
- The defense gave up just 101 passing yards on 11 of 25 (44.0 percent).
- With the game on the line and Minnesota driving for a tying score, Ja'Whaun Bentley picked off Conor Rhoda on fourth down and returned it 76 yards for a touchdown to seal the game.
- The defense forced three three-and-outs and seven total punts against the Gophers.

- Through its first six games, Purdue's defense has allowed 18.1 points less per game than it did a year ago.
- That total is the second best in the country.
- During Purdue's six game stretch, it has played five Power Five teams, as well as three teams ranked in the top 16 in the AP Poll.

- Only three other teams in the country have 11 Power Five (including Notre Dame) programs on the schedule.
- Texas faces the full Big 12 slate, as well as Maryland and USC.
- California's schedule features nine Pac-12 opponents as well as North Carolina and Ole Miss.
- USC's schedule features nine Pac-12 opponents as well as Texas and Notre Dame.

»Highly-Ranked Foes, Too

- The Boilermakers faced three top-16 teams through the first six games of the season, including two in the top eight.
- The Boilermakers are one of just three teams in the country who faced three top-16 foes through the first 16 games.

ICONSECUTIVE GAMES WITH A TD PASS

- David Blough had thrown a touchdown pass in 15 straight games, before the streak ended against Michigan. That was the fourth longest active streak among FBS quarterbacks.
- Blough is the first Purdue quarterback to throw a touchdown pass in at least 15 consecutive games since Drew Brees had a touchdown pass in 18 straight games in 1998 and 1999. Brees had a TD pass in all 13 games in 1998 and the first five games of 1999.
- The Boilermakers had thrown at least one touchdown pass in 22 straight games before being kept out of the end zone at Wisconsin last week.

BLOUGH A TOP-20 FINALIST FOR GOLDEN ARM

- David Blough was named one of 20 candidates for the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award.
- The cut to 20 individuals was made Oct. 11.

BLOUGH NAMED A MANNING STAR OF WEEK

- For his performance against Ohio, David Blough was named one of eight Manning Stars of the Week.
- Blough had the highest quarterback rating in the country for the week (minimum of five action plays) with a rating of 99.4.

NEWCOMER NUMBERS

- Purdue had 16 newcomers (freshmen, transfers, 2016 newcomers who redshirted last year) play in the season opener. Seven more played against Ohio, including three true freshmen.
- Redshirt freshman Jackson Anthrop had the biggest day numbers-wise with seven catches for 82 yards and two touchdowns. He also had a carry for four yards and nine punt return yards.
- Junior college transfer wide receiver **Isaac Zico**, a junior, had two catches for 12 yards.
- Freshman KeyRon Catlett had four kickoff returns for 51 yards.
- Spencer Evans, a junior kicker who transferred from Baylor, made two extra points and put three of his five kickoffs into the end zone for touchbacks.
- Grad transfer linebacker T.J. McCollum tied for second on the team with nine tackles.
- Grad transfer cornerback Josh Okonye tied for second on the team with nine tackles, including 1.0 for loss.
- Junior college transfer safety **T.J. Jallow** had six tackles.
- Grad transfer right tackle David Steinmetz, Northern Illinois transfer left guard Shane
 Evans and redshirt freshman left tackle Grant Hermanns all started on the offensive line.
- Redshirt freshman Jared Sparks played for the first time at quarterback and receiver against Ohio. He finished the game with four carries for 24 yards.
- Freshman **Derrick Barnes** played his first game against Ohio. In his second game at Missouri Barnes tied for second on the team with five tackles.

IOE TILLER: 1942-2017

- Joe Tiller, one of the most beloved and popular figures in Purdue Athletics history, passed away Sept. 30 at the age of 74 in Buffalo, Wyoming.
- Tiller served as the Boilermakers' head football coach from 1997 to 2008. The winningest coach in school history, he posted an 87-62 record, including 53-43 in Big Ten Conference games.

GAME NOTES - VS. RUTGERS



- Prior to Tiller's hiring in November of 1996,
 Purdue football had played in a total of five bowl games. In the preceding 15 years, the Boilermakers managed merely a 54-107-5 record.
- Tiller introduced the spread offense to Purdue, featuring three, four, even five wide receivers and forcing defenses to cover the field from sideline to sideline. It was a radical change from the smash-mouth Big Ten style and, in the basketball-crazed state of Indiana, was dubbed affectionately "basketball on grass."
- The result was 10 bowl games, including the 2001 Rose Bowl, an average of more than seven wins per season and a Big Ten championship in 2000.
- Tiller coached 53 Purdue players who went on to the National Football League, six All-Americans and two Academic All-Americans.
- Tiller was recognized as the 1997 Big Ten and national Coach of the Year.
- In addition to the Rose Bowl, the Boilermakers played in the 1997 Alamo, 1998 Alamo, 2000 Outback, 2001 Sun, 2002 Sun, 2004 Capital One, 2004 Sun, 2006 Champs Sports and 2007 Motor City bowls.
- Purdue was nationally ranked in the Associated Press poll for 80 weeks – tied for the most under any coach in school history – including a high of No. 5 during the 2004 season.
- Tiller topped Jack Mollenkopf for the most wins by a Purdue coach with his 85th victory – a 32-25 verdict over Central Michigan at Ross-Ade Stadium on Sept. 20, 2008.
- Tiller served as head coach of the East team in the 2015 East-West Shrine Game and earned a 45-27 victory. He played for the West team in 1963 and became just the fifth individual to both play and coach in the Shrine Game.
- From 1983 to 1986, Tiller was assistant head coach, defensive coordinator and defensive line coach at Purdue under Leon Burtnett.
- In January of 2008, Tiller was awarded the Order
 of the Griffin, one of Purdue's highest honors,
 given to individuals whose commitment to the
 university goes well beyond the call of duty, and
 whose strength and vision have greatly benefited
 the institution. He was appointed head coach
 emeritus by the board of trustees Nov. 21, 2008.
- Tiller was inducted into the Indiana Football Hall of Fame in 2012 and the Purdue Intercollegiate Athletics Hall of Fame in 2013. Joe Tiller Drive, located immediately north of Ross-Ade Stadium, was named in his honor in 2015.
- Tiller's 18-year head coaching record, including six seasons at Wyoming from 1991 to 1996, was 126-92-1, a .578 winning percentage.



HONORING BOB DEMOSS

 Throughout the 2017 season, the Boilermakers are honoring Bob DeMoss, the patriarch of the Cradle of Quarterbacks and a member of the Purdue Intercollegiate Athletics Hall of Game with a helmet sticker and a flag atop section 101 of Ross-Ade Stadium. DeMoss, a former Boilermaker quarterback and head coach, passed away July

- 23 at age 90.
- DeMoss initially gained fame as a freshman at Purdue in 1945. He helped the Boilermakers win their first four games and move into the national rankings at No. 9. Their next opponent was fourth-ranked Ohio State on Oct. 20 in Columbus. Purdue raced to a 28-0 lead and went on to an improbable 35-13 victory before 73,585 fans, the most ever to watch the Boilermakers at that time.
- DeMoss went on to be Purdue's primary quarterback through 1948, passing for 2,759 yards and 23 touchdowns during his career, and then played professionally with the New York Bulldogs in 1949.
- DeMoss subsequently embarked on a 42-year tenure at Purdue as an assistant coach (1950-69), head coach (1970-72) and assistant athletics director (1973-92). Along the way, he recruited and developed many members of the Cradle Dale Samuels, Len Dawson, Bob Griese, Mike Phipps and Gary Danielson earning fame as a "guarterback architect."
- DeMoss was the last quarterback to coach the Boilermaker until head coach Jeff Brohm.



HOPKINS AND HERDMAN

- Junior Cole Herdman and sophomore Brycen Hopkins entered the season as the top returning Power Five Conference touchdown-catching tight end duo after combining for seven TD grabs in 2016.
- No returning Power Five tight end had more touchdown catches than Hopkins' four last year.
- This season, Herdman and Hopkins have combined for 20 catches for 383 yards and four touchdowns.
- All 10 of Herdman's catches have been for first downs, while six of Hopkins' 13 catches have moved the chains. Two of Hopkins' other grabs are for touchdowns on -& goal situations.
- Herdman leads all tight ends this season with 24.3 yards per catch. Hopkins is tied for third among all tight ends with three receiving touchdowns this season.

ESTABLISHING THE GROUND GAME

- The Boilermakers established the run during its back-to-back wins over Ohio and Missouri.
- Against Ohio, Purdue rushed 44 times for 263 yards and a touchdown.
- At Missouri, the Boilermakers rushed 50 times for 205 yards and three scores.
- The Missouri game is the first time Purdue has rushed the ball at least 50 times since Dec. 27, 2011 in the Little Caesars Pizza Bowl against Western Michigan. The Boilermakers rushed 56 times in that game.
- Against Minnesota, the Boilermakers were solid on the ground with 132 rushing yards and a score.
- In its losses to Louisville, Michigan and Wisconsin, Purdue rushed for 51, 30 and 66 yards, respectively.

FIRST TIME STARTERS

- Fifteen Boilermakers have made their first start for the Old Gold and Black this season, including 10 that came in the season opener against Louisville.
- Senior wide receiver Anthony Mahoungou made his first start against Louisville and had four catches for 33 yards, including one that went for a first down
- Redshirt freshman Grant Hermanns made his first collegiate appearance as the starter at left tackle against Louisville. He is Purdue's first freshman - true or redshirt - to start at left tackle in the season opener since Mike Otto in 2003. Otto went on to be drafted by the Tennessee Titans in 2007.
- Junior Shane Evans, an immediately eligible transfer from Northern Illinois, started his first collegiate game. Evans, who appeared in 18 games for the Huskies, was the starting left guard against Louisville.

- Redshirt freshman wide receiver Jackson **Anthrop** started at one of the wide receiver positions against Louisville and led the team with seven catches for 82 yards and two touchdowns. He is the first freshman with two touchdowns in a season opener since Kory Sheets had a pair of scores against Akron in 2005. Sheets' TDs came on a blocked punt and a rush. No freshman receiver has hauled in two touchdown catches in a season opener since pre-1999.
- Sophomore Tario Fuller carried the ball eight times for 29 yards against Louisville. He was the team's leading rusher in his first career start.
- Graduate transfer linebacker T.J. McCollum has started 27 games at the FBS level, but 25 came before joining the Boilermakers. The transfer from Western Kentucky, who started at UAB, was second on the team with nine tackles in the opener.

- Purdue scored first in the first three games this season, before Michigan snapped the streak. The Boilermakers then scored first against Minnesota.
- The Boilermakers had the halftime lead in the first four games this year, before Minnesota took a 14-6 lead into the half. Wisconsin led 17-6 at the half last week.
- For the first time this season, the Boilermakers did not hold a lead against Wisconsin at any point in the game.

SURE-HANDED HERDMAN

- Junior tight end Cole Herdman has caught at least one pass in 23 straight games.
- In that span, he has 55 catches for 665 yards and six touchdowns.
- He extended the streak in the opener with an 11 yard reception from David Blough in the second quarter against Louisville.
- Against Ohio, Herdman's streak continued with

- a 62-yard touchdown reception from Blough in the second quarter. It was the longest reception of his career.
- At Missouri, the streak continued when Elijah Sindelar hit him for a 54-yard gain in the second quarter. It was the second longest reception of his career and the longest non-touchdown catch.
- Against Michigan, Herdman caught a 13-yard pass from Elijah Sindelar in the second quarter, which set up a J.D. Dellinger field goal.
- Against Minnesota, he caught a 20-yard touchdown on Purdue's second play of the game to extend his streak.
- At Wisconsin, he extended his streak with 18 seconds left in the half, which helped set up a field goal.
- Herdman has 11 catches this year, all for first downs



SEASON ODDS AND ENDS

- Jackson Anthrop had two touchdown catches in the season opener against Louisville to become the first freshman in school history with multiple receiving TDs in a season opener (freshman became eligible to play varsity in 1972).
- Ja'Whaun Bentley forced two fumbles in the season opener, one of just four players in the country to do so in week one.
- Transfer kicker **Spencer Evans** had seven touchbacks against Ohio matching Purdue's total for all of 2016. Evans has 22 touchbacks through the first six games.
- No returning FBS tight end had more touchdown catches last season than **Brycen Hopkins**, who had four. Hopkins has three through four games this season.
- Purdue's schedule is tied for the sixth toughest in terms of bowl teams from last year. The Boilermakers face nine teams that played in a

bowl last season.

- The Boilermakers had thrown at least one touchdown pass in 22 straight games before the streak was snapped at Wisconsin. The last time Purdue had not thrown one prior to that was Oct. 17, 2015, when the Boilermakers fell at Wisconsin 24-7.
- David Blough is 21 for 28 for 249 yards on first downs this season.
- For his career, Joe Schopper has 56 punts downed inside the 20, compared to just eight touchbacks.
- Purdue's defense had shut out opponents for three straight quarters - two to end the Missouri game and the first quarter of the Michigan game.
- During the three quarter shutout span, the defense forced two interceptions, two sacks, four tackles for loss and allowed just 165 yards.
- Purdue had four turnovers against Minnesota and won. It's the first time with at least four turnovers in a conference win since 2000 vs. Ohio State.
- Purdue has not allowed a point in a second half on the road through the first two away games.
- Six of Purdue's last 12 games have been against AP top 25 teams, including four in the top eight.
- The last time Purdue had three AP top-16 opponents in its first six games of a season was 2008, Joe Tiller's final season.
- The 1984 season saw Purdue face No. 8 Notre Dame, No. 5 Miami (Fla.) and No. 2 Ohio State in the first six weeks. Purdue was 2-1 in that span.
- Purdue also faced three top-16 teams in the opening six weeks seven other times.
- In 1953 and 1960, the Boilermakers faced four top-16 teams in the first six weeks.

LONG DRIVE CONTEST

- The Boilermakers have 18 touchdown drives on the season. Of those 18, 11 have been at least 60 yards.
- Purdue's longest touchdown drive this season is 97 yards, which came against Ohio. The Boilermakers went 9 plays, 97 yards in 4:03 capped by a 1-yard Tario Fuller touchdown run.
- At Missouri, Purdue had its second longest touchdown drive of the year, marching 96 yards for the score. That drive was 13 plays, 96 yards in 6:59 capped by a **Richie Worship** 3-yard touchdown run.
- The third longest touchdown drive of the year is 87 yards at Missouri. The Boilermakers used sever plays in 2:49 to score, capped by a 36-yard run by Fuller.

 The Boilermakers also had an 84-yard touchdown drive against the Bobcats, which now ranks as the fourth longest drive of the year. That scoring drive was 10 plays, 84 yards in 5:05 capped by a 5-yard pass from David Blough to Jackson Anthrop.

FIRST DEFENSIVE DRIVE SUCCESS

- Purdue had gotten a defensive stop on its first drive in every game this season until the Wisconsin game.
- Against Louisville, the defense gave up 52 yards before forcing and recovering a fumble.
- Against Ohio, Purdue allowed 18 yards before a punt.
- At Missouri, the defense forced a three-and-out after giving up just nine yards.
- Against Michigan, the defense gave up just 11 yards and forced a punt.
- Against Minnesota, the defense forced a threeand-out, allowing just one yard.

FIRST OFFENSIVE DRIVE SUCCESS

- Purdue has scored on its opening drive of the game three times this season.
- Against Ohio, Purdue went 56 yards in seven plays before making a 36-yard field goal.
- At Missouri, Purdue went 75 yards in 11 plays on its opening drive to score a touchdown.
- Against Minnesota, Purdue needed just two plays to go 37 yards and score a touchdown.
- The three games in which Purdue did not score on its opening drive were Purdue's three losses.

SECOND QUARTER SUCCESS

- Through six games, Purdue has dominated the second quarters.
- The Boilermakers are outscoring their opposition 58-23 in second quarters this season.
- Against Louisville, Purdue outscored the Cardinals
 7-3 in the second quarter.
- Against Ohio, Purdue outscored the Bobcats 24-0.
- At Missouri, Purdue outscored the Tigers 14-3 in the second quarter.
- Against Michigan, Purdue outscored the Wolverines 10-7 in the second quarter and gave up their first second quarter touchdown of the season.
- Purdue had its worst second quarter of the season against Minnesota, losing the quarter battle 7-0.
- Purdue and Wisconsin both scored three points in the second quarter.

• Second quarter success is a staple of Jeff Brohm teams. In his fourth season as a collegiate head coach, Brohm teams score an average of 14.1 points per second quarter. That ranks No. 1 of any active head coach in the country since 2014 (min. second year).

THE CAPTAINS

- The Boilermakers voted on captains in the team's first meeting of fall camp. Six individuals were chosen with three on offense and three on defense.
- The offensive captains are junior center Kirk Barron, junior quarterback David Blough and senior wide receiver Gregory Phillips.
- The defensive captains are senior linebacker Ja'Whaun Bentley, senior linebacker Danny Ezechukwu and senior cornerback Da'Wan Hunte
- Barron, Blough, Ezechukwu, Hunte are Phillips were selected for the first time in their career.
- Bentley has been voted a captain three years in a row. He is the first three-time captain in program history.



 Junior quarterback David Blough has put up impressive numbers on the field, but his biggest ovation may have come at the Big Ten Football

- Media Luncheon in Chicago over the summer.
- Blough was selected by the conference as the student-athlete keynote speaker for the luncheon and was given five minutes to talk about his platform as a student-athlete.
- Blough received a standing ovation after delivering a message about football teaching life. He mentioned how football challenges individuals to rise above adversity and work with the diversity within their communities or locker rooms.
- Blough also touched on his service trips to South Africa where he and teammates have worked at an orphanage.

LEGENDS RACE

- On Sept. 23, the first Purdue Football Legends Race took place.
- The Legends Race features likenesses of four Boilermaker greats – quarterbacks Drew Brees and Bob Griese, halfback Leroy Keyes, and defensive back Rod Woodson – and will occur at the end of the first quarter of all home games.
- Keyes came from behind to win in the inaugural race before Brees won during the Minnesota game.

BLOUGH'S SUMMER WITH THE MANNINGS

- Junior quarterback David Blough spent time this summer working at the Manning Passing Academy in Thibodaux, Louisiana. He was selected by a panel that included Archie Manning.
- At the camp, which was in its 22nd year, counselors worked extensively with the younger campers, from 1-on-1 instruction to teaching technique and fundamentals, to various other drills.
- Blough was among more than 25 other college quarterbacks, including Lamar Jackson of Louisville.
- In evening meetings, Blough and the other college quarterbacks were able to pick the Mannings' brains on everything from game preparation, film study, technique and more.

REMEMBER THE ALAMO

- Purdue celebrates the 20th anniversary of the 1997 Alamo Bowl championship team this year.
- Under first-year head coach Joe Tiller, the Boilermakers finished with a 9-3 record (6-2 in the Big Ten Conference – tied for second place), including a 33-20 victory over No. 24 Oklahoma State in the Alamo Bowl in San Antonio, and ranked No. 15 in the final Associated Press national poll. For a program that finished 3-8 in 1996, the six-game turnaround was the secondbest in the country and in school history.
- After losing at Toledo in the season opener, Purdue reeled off six straight wins. The dream season started with a 28-17 upset of No. 12 Notre Dame at Ross-Ade Stadium on Sept. 13, which broke an 11-year losing streak to the Fighting Irish.
- The Boilermakers led the Big Ten in passing offense (285.2 yard per game) and total offense (a school-record 459.2 yards per game at that time).
- Tiller was named national coach of the year by both Football News and Kickoff magazines, Region 3 Coach of the Year (Big Ten, Mid-American Conference and Conference USA) by the American Football Coaches Association, and the Big Ten Dave McClain Coach of the Year.

BLOUGH ON MULTIPLE WATCH LISTS

- Blough was named the the Wuerffel watch list. The award, named after 1996 Heisman Trophy winning quarterback Danny Wuerffel, is presented annually to a player who best combines exemplary community service with athletic and academic achievement.
- Blough is also on the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award watch list.
- The Golden Arm Award is presented at the end of each football season and the winner is selected based on his accomplishments both on and off the field. Candidates must be a college senior or fourth-year junior on schedule to graduate with their class.
- Blough made the cut to the final 20, which was announced Oct. 11.
