GAME NOTES

- The Boilermakers are now 41-3 all-time in exhibition play, including an 11-0 mark under head coach Sharon Versyp.
- The exhibition victory is the 36th in a row for the Old Gold and Black.
- The 25 points scored by Findlay are the lowest total for an exhibition opponent in school history, surpassing the total of 33 by Clarke and Lindsey Wilson, posted in each of the last two seasons.
- The Boilermakers are surrendering just 44.7 points per game in 11 exhibition contests under Versyp.
- Five Boilermakers scored would-be career-high totals.
- Findlay made just three-of-28 from the field in the first half (10.7%), and finished 10-of-55 for the game (18.2%).
- The Oilers were 0-for-29 from behind the arc.
- Purdue outrebounded the Oilers, 54-20, including 17 offensive rebounds.
- The Boilermakers assisted on 23 of 33 field goals.
- Purdue converted 17-of-21 from the free throw line, good for 81%.

GAME HIGHS AND LOWS

- Whitney Bays led all scorers with 21 points. She also added 11 rebounds and three assists.
- The Boilermakers got another double-double from Liza Clemons, who finished with 13 points and 11 assists, going five-for-five from the floor and adding three blocks.
- Bridget Perry had 13 points and a team-high four steals.
- Ashley Morrissette stuffed the stat sheet with six points, nine rebounds and eight assists. Her rebounding and assist totals would be career highs.
- Andreona Keys had 10 points and four rebounds in her collegiate debut.
- Ciara Geiger led Findlay with eight points.
