– BOILERS CLOSE SPRING BREAK TRIP WITH SERIES AT TENNESSEE TECH –

Purdue baseball concludes its eight-game, 10-day spring break trip through the Volunteer State with a weekend series at Tennessee Tech, taking on the Ohio Valley Conference's defending regular-season champion.

The first pitch is set for 4 p.m. Friday, 3 p.m. Saturday and 2 p.m. Sunday (all times EDT). The Boilermakers (11-5) enter the weekend looking to snap a three-game losing streak while finishing the spring break trip with at least a .500 mark.

This weekend also marks the culmination of Purdue's season-opening stretch of 19 straight games away from home. The Boilermakers are scheduled to host Illinois State (Tuesday) and Wabash (Wednesday) for midweek games at Lambert Field after returning home Sunday.

Purdue is 5-2 against Ohio Valley teams this season, winning weekend series at Morehead State (3-of-4) and Tennessee-Martin (2-of-3). Both losses came in walk-off fashion.

Tennessee Tech (7-10) has claimed an Ohio Valley trophy each of the last two years, winning the OVC Tournament as a No. 5 seed in 2009 and capturing the regular-season title last season. The Golden Eagles have posted a 6-4 record in March since opening the year 1-6.

The Boilermakers have been forced to change up the starting rotation due in part to a finger injury to No. 1 starter Matt Morgan. The senior struggled with his control in his March 11 start at Tennessee-Martin and was unable to make it through the third inning. Purdue's staff ace is not expected to miss more than one or two starts.

Robert Ramer picked up the slack out of the bullpen in the trip-opening victory last Friday, working five innings of one-run relief. He will get the ball in the series opener at Tech, making the first weekend start of his career. In his three midweek starts in 2010, Ramer worked a combined 11 shutout innings, surrendering only four hits.

Nick Wittgren is also expected to make the temporary move from the bullpen to the rotation this weekend. As Purdue's top reliever so far this year, he has factored in four of the first 11 victories, earning a win and three saves. Wittgren faced only one batter in the games against Vanderbilt and Belmont this week.

Meanwhile, **Brad Schreiber** will remain the game three starter for the Boilermakers. As the team's most consistent starting pitcher so far this season, the sophomore has worked at least five innings in each of his first four starts. Schreiber gave Purdue a much-needed seven

innings Sunday after the Boilers were forced to use seven pitchers in the first two games of the UTM series. Schreiber was in line to earn his fourth victory of the season until the Skyhawks rallied in the ninth to stun Purdue in walk-off fashion.

Tennessee Tech enters the weekend having played 12 of its last 14 games at home. The Golden Eagles swept Youngstown State at home last weekend and were three outs away from posting their fourth straight win Tuesday only to see East Tennessee State score five times in the ninth to rally for a 6-5 win.

Outfielder Chad Oberacker was selected as a preseason All-American by *Collegiate Baseball* and the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association after ranking third in the nation with a .452 batting average and recording over 100 hits in 2010. Compared to his impressive numbers of his junior season, Oberacker is off to a slow start at the plate (.274) but is contributing more on the mound. The left-hander enters the weekend limiting opposing hitters to a .187 batting average against thanks in part to 22 strikeouts in 20 1/3 innings pitched. He struck out 12 in his win against Youngstown State Sunday.

Projected game one starter Tristan Archer has been the starting pitcher in three of Tech's first seven wins. But it was projected game two starter Matthew Shepherd who earned OVC Pitcher of the Week honors Monday after working seven innings of one-hit ball in his win against Youngstown State Saturday.

Offensively, freshman Zach Stephens leads the way with a .380 batting average and 24 RBIs. Thirteen of his 27 hits have gone for extra bases.

Purdue has never played Tennessee Tech before, representing the only first-time opponent on the Boilermakers' 2011 regular-season schedule.

HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Entering his 13th year as the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber has posted a 343-328 overall record and a 176-168 Big Ten mark through his first 12 seasons. His overall win total ranks second in Purdue history, while his conference victories stand alone in first. In 2007, Schreiber became the third head coach in Purdue baseball history to surpass the 500-games mark as the Boilermakers' head man. Dave Alexander, whom Schreiber played for from 1983 to 1986, owns the record for most games coached at Purdue with 792 over 14 seasons, while Joe Sexson guided the Boilermakers for 527 games over 18 years.

The 2010 season saw the Boilermakers post 33 victories, the program's most since 2000. Purdue navigated a hotly-contested Big Ten race that saw all six league tournament-qualifying teams finish within three games of first place. The Boilermakers reached the Big Ten Tourney for the eighth time under Schreiber, including six of the last seven seasons. Purdue eliminated Northwestern and Indiana from the 2010 tournament before bowing out. The Boilers have won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in seven of their eight appearances under Schreiber.

The 2010 Boilermakers posted new school records for hits (636) and runs per game (7.2) at the plate and led the Big Ten in strikeouts (435) and batting average against (.276) on the mound. Purdue went 15-6 at home and 9-2 in midweek action, compiling a 32-18 mark after opening the season 1-6.

Individually, Matt Bischoff was honored as a First Team All-Big Ten starting pitcher and newcomers Kevin Plawewski, Cameron Perkins and Brad Schreiber were recognized for standout freshman seasons. Bischoff led the Big Ten with 10 wins and 95 strikeouts and in the process became the first player in program history to be a four-time All-Big Ten honoree. He established new single-season and career strikeout marks in his final season as a Boilermaker. Bischoff and fellow pitcher Kevin Cahill were both selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Schreiber has coached 48 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 16 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft on 23 occasions. One of Schreiber's Boilermakers has led the Big Ten in hitting in four out of the last six years.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha, finishing as regional runners-up to Auburn.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including top-six ranking in four categories. Schreiber ranks first all-time in walks (132), fourth in runs scored (159), tied for third in games played (220) and tied for sixth in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

BOILERMAKERS ENTER TECH SERIES 2-3 ON SPRING BREAK TRIP

• Purdue closes out its eight-game spring break trip with a three-game series at Tennessee Tech, entering the weekend having lost a season-high three straight. The Boilermakers lost midweek games at No. 1 Vanderbilt and Belmont after dropping the series finale at Tennessee-Martin in walk-off fashion. Purdue has trailed after more innings (17) during the current losing streak than it did during the first 12 games of the season (15).

• The Boilermakers carried a four-run lead into the bottom of the ninth inning of the series finale at Tennessee-Martin and were two outs away from completing a three-game sweep. But the Skyhawks hit a pair of home runs in the ninth inning, including a walk-off two-run blast. It was Purdue's second walk-off loss of the season.

• Tuesday, the Boilers were shutout for the first time since April 2009 in a loss at top-ranked Vanderbilt. It marked the first time that Purdue played a team ranked No. 1 in the country since getting swept in a 2005 series at Texas.

SPILLNER SELECTED BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK

• **Tyler Spillner** hit safely and scored a run in all four games last week while batting .500, earning the junior Big Ten Conference co-Player of the Week honors for his consistency at the plate.

• Spillner busted out of an early-season slump with a big weekend series at Tennessee-Martin, finishing the three-game set a team-best 7-for-13 with three extra-base hits, four RBIs and six runs scored. He also singled, drew a walk, executed a sacrifice bunt and scored a run in the midweek win at nationally-ranked Louisville.

• Spillner led off the series finale at UT Martin with his first home run of the season. For the week, Purdue's leadoff man reached base safely to begin an inning in five of his seven opportunities, none more important than his leadoff double in the top of the ninth inning of game two of the UTM series. He eventually scored the game-tying run.

SPILLNER & CHARLES GO DEEP IN HOMER-HEAVY SERIES FINALE

• After no home runs were hit in the first two games of the Purdue-UT Martin series, both teams went deep three times in the finale. **Tyler Spillner** and **Eric Charles** both connected for homers, Spillner leading off the game with a long ball for the second time in his career. Charles, meanwhile, posted his first career multi-homer game with a solo shot and two-run blast. He joined **Angelo Cianfrocco** as Boilers with a multi-homer game this season and **Cameron Perkins**, **Kevin Plawecki** and **Stephen Talbott** as active Purdue players to accomplish the feat in their careers.

• Spillner and Charles had also gone deep at Tennessee-Martin's Skyhawk Field as freshmen in 2009. Charles has now hit three of his five career home runs and Spillner two of his three career long balls in Martin, Tenn.

McHUGH GOES DEEP FOR HIS FIRST COLLEGIATE HIT

• Freshman **Sean McHugh** made his first start for Purdue in the March 16 loss at Belmont and took advantage of the opportunity with a 2-for-3 showing. He was also hit by a pitch and scored twice. But the highlight of the day came in his first at-bat when he went deep to left field for his first collegiate hit. The two-run homer gave Purdue a 3-0 lead in the second inning.

• **Ryan Bridges** also connected for a two-run homer in the loss at Belmont, his first long ball of the season and third career.

BIG HITS FROM DIXON & SERRATO IN COMEBACK WIN

• Purdue posted its first true comeback win of the season March 12, scoring in each of the final five innings – highlighted by a two-run ninth – to defeat Tennessee-Martin, 8-7. The Boilermakers trailed for much of the game after giving up a first-inning run for the first time this season.

• **Andrew Dixon** and **Barrett Serrato** came through with key hits late in the game. Dixon singled with two outs in each of his final two at-bats, driving in the game-tying run in the sixth and eighth innings. Later with one out, the bases loaded and Purdue trailing by a run, Serrato singled home the game-tying run. The Boilers went ahead moments later when **Ryan Bridges** drove in the go-ahead run with a sacrifice fly to left field.

TALBOTT STILL A PERFECT BASE THIEF

• Purdue has been active on the base paths for much of the season, successfully stealing at least one base in 13 of the first 16 games. Ten Boilermakers have swiped at least one base but **Stephen Talbott** leads the way at a perfect 7-for-7. The sophomore is also a perfect 12-for-12 in his career.

• Talbott enters the weekend leading the team with 17 runs scored despite batting no higher than eighth in any of the 15 games he has started.

• Talbott is the only Boiler that has hit safely in all five games of the spring break trip, entering the Tennessee Tech series 8-for-17 with four extra-base hits and five runs scored. He finished a home run shy of the cycle in the March 12 win at Tennessee-Martin.

PLAWECKI FINALLY HELD HITLESS

• **Kevin Plawecki** managed to record at least one hit in each of the first 11 games of the season in which he played. The longest hit streak of the sophomore's Purdue came to an end with an 0-for-5 showing in the middle game of the Tennessee-Martin series March 12. The 11-game run represents the Boilers' longest single-season hit streak so far this year.

CIANFROCCO & MORGAN SIDELINED; RAMER PROVIDES TRUE RELIEF

- The March 11 series-opening win at Tennessee-Martin came at a steep price for Purdue. Starting pitcher **Matt Morgan** and **Angelo Cianfrocco** both left the game early with injuries and have not played since. Morgan struggled with his control due to a finger injury and Cianfrocco reinjured his right shoulder while hitting a foul ball. The timeline for returning from injury is uncertain for both players, but neither is expected to play for the remainder of the spring break trip.
- Morgan's injury forced him from the game with one out in the third inning of the series opener at UT Martin. **Robert Ramer** picked up the slack out of the bullpen, working five innings of one-run relief to earn the victory. He struck out a career-high five while matching the longest outing of his career.

BEST START SINCE 1993

- Purdue won its sixth straight game March 8 at No. 20 Louisville, posting its third win against a nationally-ranked opponent from the BIG EAST Conference this year. After winning each of the first two games of the Tennessee-Martin series, Purdue opened the year with an 11-2 mark. That represented the program's best start since the 1993 team was also 11-2. The 1993 Boilermakers began the year 16-2 on their way to posting a 36-win campaign.

MORE NOTABLES ON LOUISVILLE WIN

- Although the teams played only twice from 1999-10, Purdue managed to post its first win against Louisville since 1998 March 8. In the process of winning 6-4, the Boilermakers snapped a pair of notable U of L streaks.
- Purdue was the first team to score more than four runs against the Cardinals this year. The Louisville pitching staff entered the game with a 1.47 team ERA.
- The Boilermakers snapped Louisville's 11-game win streak against Big Ten Conference teams dating back to 2009. The Cardinals won all three of their games at the season-opening BIG EAST-Big Ten Challenge and were 23-2 against Big Ten opponents since 2006.

PURDUE SCORES FIRST IN FIRST 12 GAMES

- Purdue scored first in each of its first 12 games this season thanks in part to outscoring its opponents 37-7 in the first two innings this year. The Boilermakers' pitching staff did not give up a run in the first inning until game No. 13 on March 12. Purdue has also batted first in 15 of the first 16 games, acting as the home team in only the Feb. 19 loss to Notre Dame.
- Because the Boilermakers have scored first in 14 of the first 16 games, they've trailed very infrequently early this year. Purdue did not trail in the first seven games of its recent eight-game win streak, a streak of 61 consecutive innings. For the season, the Boilers have held the lead for 85 of the 144 innings they've played.
- In the four-game series at Morehead State (Feb. 26-27), Purdue scored multiple runs in the first inning of each of the first three games, including five-run rallies in games one and three.

- Sophomore catcher **Kevin Plawecki** has been named to the initial watch list for the Johnny Bench Award, which honors the nation's top Division I catcher. Forty-two catchers appeared on the initial watch list, which will be updated periodically until a list of semifinalists is unveiled May 19.
- Plawecki was a Freshman All-American in 2010 and is among the Big Ten's top prospects for the 2012 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. He has batted cleanup in every game he has started this season and proved to be Purdue's toughest player to strikeout, going down on strikes only twice in his first 71 plate appearances.

MORGAN GOES THE DISTANCE, HAASE PITCHES INTO THE NINTH

• In the last four games, the Purdue starting pitchers have prevented the opposition from scoring until at least the fifth inning. **Matt Morgan** kept Lipscomb off the scoreboard entirely with his three-hit, complete-game shutout in Purdue's 1-0 win on March 4. It was the senior's first career complete-game shutout and second complete game overall, earning him Big Ten Pitcher of the Week honors for the second time this season.

• **Joe Haase** finished one out shy of also pitching a complete game in the March 8 win at Louisville, but was still impressive with 8 2/3 innings of four-run ball. He did not issue a walk. It was the longest outing of the junior's career by more than four innings.

• Morgan was honored for the third time in his career after striking out 10 in Purdue's first 1-0 win since 2007. While registering his third career game with 10 or more strikeouts, he struck out at least one batter in eight of his nine innings. His five 1-2-3 frames were highlighted by a ninth inning in which he retired the heart of the Lipscomb lineup in order. He needed only 108 pitches to go the distance in a game that was played in one hour and 51 minutes.

ANOTHER NO-HIT BID INTO THE SIXTH, SCHREIBER WINS FIRST THREE STARTS

• **Lance Breedlove** carried a no-hitter into the sixth inning of his first start as a Boilermaker, helping Purdue win game one of the March 6 doubleheader at Lipscomb. The right-hander gave up a leadoff single in the sixth but still managed to earn his first win as a member of the program with 5 1/3 innings of three-run ball.

• It marked the second Sunday in a row that a Purdue pitcher carried a no-hitter into the sixth inning. **Brad Schreiber** did likewise Feb. 27 at Morehead State before it was broken up by a two-out hit. Schreiber also won his start in the nightcap of the Lipscomb doubleheader, improving to 3-0 on the season. He's become the first Purdue weekend starter to open the season 3-0 since Jay Buente in 2006. Buente won three of his first four starts as the team's No. 1 arm, the lone no decision coming in a Purdue win at nationally-ranked North Carolina.

MILLER MAKES THE MOST OF HIS OPPORTUNITY

• **David Miller** has started at shortstop in 11 of the last 12 games and taken advantage of his playing time. The junior college transfer has reached base safely in each of the 11 games he has started, scoring a run in seven of those contests. For the season, he has drawn 11 free passes (seven walks, four HBP) versus only four strikeouts in 53 plate appearances.

• After finishing the Morehead State series 8-for-13 with four RBIs, Miller also excelled in the doubleheader sweep of Lipscomb March 6. He reached base safely in each of his five plate appearances in game one and finished the day 4-for-6 with a home run, four walks and four runs scored.

PERKINS' HITTING STREAK SNAPPED AT 14

• **Cameron Perkins'** career-best 14-game hitting streak dating back to the final four games of the 2010 season was snapped in the March 8 win at Louisville. The 14-game run matched **Eric Charles** for the longest streak by an active Boilermaker. Charles hit safely in 14 straight games in 2009 on his way to earning Freshman All-American honors.

• Perkins extended his hitting streak in his final at-bat of the March 4 win at Lipscomb, delivering the big hit of the 1-0 victory with a two-out, run-scoring single in the eighth inning to plate **Stephen Talbott** from second base. In the March 6 doubleheader, he singled in his first at-bat of both games to extend the streak early. Perkins finished the series 5-for-15 with a team-best four RBIs. He was also 8-for-18 with five extra-base hits and a team-high nine RBIs in the four games at Morehead State. He delivered a clutch bases-clearing, two-out double that put Purdue ahead in the ninth inning of game two. The sophomore came back the next day and connected for a two-run homer to center field in both games of the doubleheader.

• **PERKINS' 14-GAME HIT STREAK: .390 (25-for-64), 5 2B, 3B, 2 HR, 18 RBI, 11 R, BB, 2 SB**

FOUR RELIEVERS ALREADY WITH AT LEAST ONE SAVE

• The Purdue bullpen has continued to backup the starting pitchers with solid relief work. During the current six-game win streak, only one of seven inherited base runners has come around to score.

• Meanwhile, four pitchers have already teamed up for Purdue's five saves. **Nick Wittgren** has closed out a trio of games but **Lance Breedlove**, **Calvin Gunter** and **Blake Mascarello** have also earned saves while recording the final out of a game. Mascarello backed up Breedlove with 3 2/3 scoreless innings of relief in game two of the Lipscomb series. He has issued only one walk in 11 2/3 innings this year. Gunter ended the Louisville win by striking out the Cardinals' leadoff man with the potential tying run on first base.

• Seven different pitchers had at least one save last season as Purdue totaled 14 as a team, none having more than three saves.

BOILERS OPEN WITH 19 STRAIGHT AWAY FROM HOME

• The program's 123rd season features the Boilermakers playing their first 19 games away from West Lafayette. Purdue plays 16 consecutive road games from the final weekend of February through the end of the spring break trip (March 19).

• This season also marks the 46th and final year for the Boilermakers at Lambert Field, their home since 1965. Construction of the new Northwest Baseball Facility is slated to begin this spring and the new stadium is scheduled to open in 2012.

CIANFROCCO NAMED BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK

• **Angelo Cianfrocco** hit for the cycle over the course of Purdue's series at Morehead State, earning Big Ten co-Player of the Week honors for his big weekend at the plate. The sophomore finished the series 10-for-16 with four extra-base hits, five RBIs and eight runs scored. He had multiple hits and scored twice in all four games over the weekend. And after walking twice and getting hit by a pitch, he reached base safely in 13 of his 19 plate appearances.

• Cianfrocco homered in his first two at-bats of the nightcap of Saturday's doubleheader, matching his freshman-season total in one game and accounting for the first two longballs of the new season for Purdue. In the process, he joined classmates **Cameron Perkins**, **Kevin Plawecki** and **Stephen Talbott** as current Boilers with a multi-homer game on their collegiate résumés.

SCHREIBER CARRIES NO-HITTER INTO SIXTH INNING, BULLPEN SOLID AT MSU

• In a four-game series that featured a combined 83 runs on 115 hits, **Brad Schreiber** was dominate in his game three start Feb. 27 at Morehead State. He took a no-hitter into the sixth inning and surrendered only two hits total. The right-hander retired 15 consecutive MSU hitters from the first through sixth innings until his no-hit bid was broken up by a two-out hit in the sixth. He would have retired the first 17 batters of the game in order if not for two-out error in the first inning. He gave way to the Purdue bullpen with the Boilers leading 14-1 after the sixth, having reached the 100-pitch threshold.

• Schreiber surrendered only seven hits over 12 innings in his first two starts of the season, good for a batting average against of .156. The sophomore has struck out 12 while issuing only two walks.

• The Purdue bullpen was also impressive in the series win at Morehead State. For the weekend, the quartet of **Lance Breedlove**, **Sean Collins**, **Pat Gannon** and **Robert Ramer** combined for 11 2/3 innings of scoreless relief. Breedlove closed out game one with three scoreless innings to earn his first save as a Boilermaker. Collins earned the win in game one with two innings of hitless relief and also got the final two outs of the series finale after entering the game with the bases loaded. Gannon worked three innings of scoreless relief, inducing a pair of double play balls, to back up Schreiber in game three. And Ramer gave Purdue an opportunity to win game two with three innings of hitless relief.

PURDUE OPENS WITH SUCCESSFUL WEEKEND AT BIG EAST-BIG TEN CHALLENGE

• Purdue opened its new season by winning two-of-three at the BIG EAST-Big Ten Challenge, posting wins against nationally-ranked Connecticut (10-2) and Pittsburgh (5-3). The Boilermakers also lost to Notre Dame after the Fighting Irish blew the game open with an 11-run fourth inning. Purdue scored first in all three games and never trailed against UConn, a team that was tabbed as the preseason favorite in the BIG EAST by the league coaches.

• The Boilermakers snapped a seven-game losing streak at the BIG EAST-Big Ten Challenge dating back to 2009 and exceeded their combined win total in the first two years of the event.

• The BIG EAST won the Challenge, 14-10. Michigan State (3-0), Purdue (2-1) and Penn State (2-1) were the only Big Ten teams to post a winning record. Sunday, the Boilers defeated at Pitt team that had beaten Illinois and Iowa in the first two days of the Challenge.

WINS OVER NATIONALLY-RANKED COMPETITION

• Purdue has posted wins against three nationally-ranked opponents: Connecticut, Pittsburgh and Louisville. UConn was ranked ninth by *Baseball America* in the publication's preseason poll. Pittsburgh was tabbed 30th by *Collegiate Baseball* in its preseason poll. The Boilermakers managed to defeat both teams during its season-opening weekend. Purdue also won at 20th-ranked Louisville in its March 8 midweek opener.

• The victory against UConn was Purdue's first against a nationally-ranked opponent since 2007 (Michigan) and first against a Top 10-ranked opponent since winning the opener of a 2006 series at North Carolina. The Boilermakers defeated No. 2 UNC and No. 16 Missouri early in the 2006 campaign, the last time Purdue had multiple wins against nationally-ranked teams in the same season.

SCHREIBER & WITTGREN IMPRESS ON THE MOUND IN PITT WIN

• **Brad Schreiber** and **Nick Wittgren** were Purdue's standout performers in the Feb. 27 win against Pittsburgh. Their work on the mound was a big reason why the Boilers limited a Pitt team that ranked second in the nation last season with a .363 batting average to three runs on nine hits.

• Schreiber won his first start of the season with six solid innings, surrendering only three runs (two earned) on five hits. He struck out a career-high seven, including the final two batters he faced while closing out his sixth inning of work.

• Wittgren earned his first Purdue save with a stellar relief outing, slamming the door on a potential Pitt rally with the bases loaded and one out in the seventh inning. He entered the game with the Boilers clinging to a one-run lead in the seventh and struck out the No. 4 and 5 hitters in the Pitt lineup to leave the bases loaded. After a 1-2-3 eighth inning, the Panthers posted back-to-back two-out hits against the sophomore right-hander in the ninth. But he again retired the Pitt cleanup hitter to close out the victory.

RECORDING-SETTING SEASON IN 2010

• The 2010 Boilermakers posted new school records for hits (636) and runs per game (7.2) at the plate and strikeouts (435), strikeouts per nine innings (7.76) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (2.35) on the mound.

• Individually, **Tyler Spillner** led the Big Ten with seven triples, a new Purdue single-season benchmark. Matt Bischoff established new single-season (95) and career strikeout records (291) while closing out his college career as a four-time All-Big Ten honoree.

• As a team, Purdue led the Big Ten in strikeouts (435) and batting average against (.276) while ranking second in ERA (4.78) and saves (14).

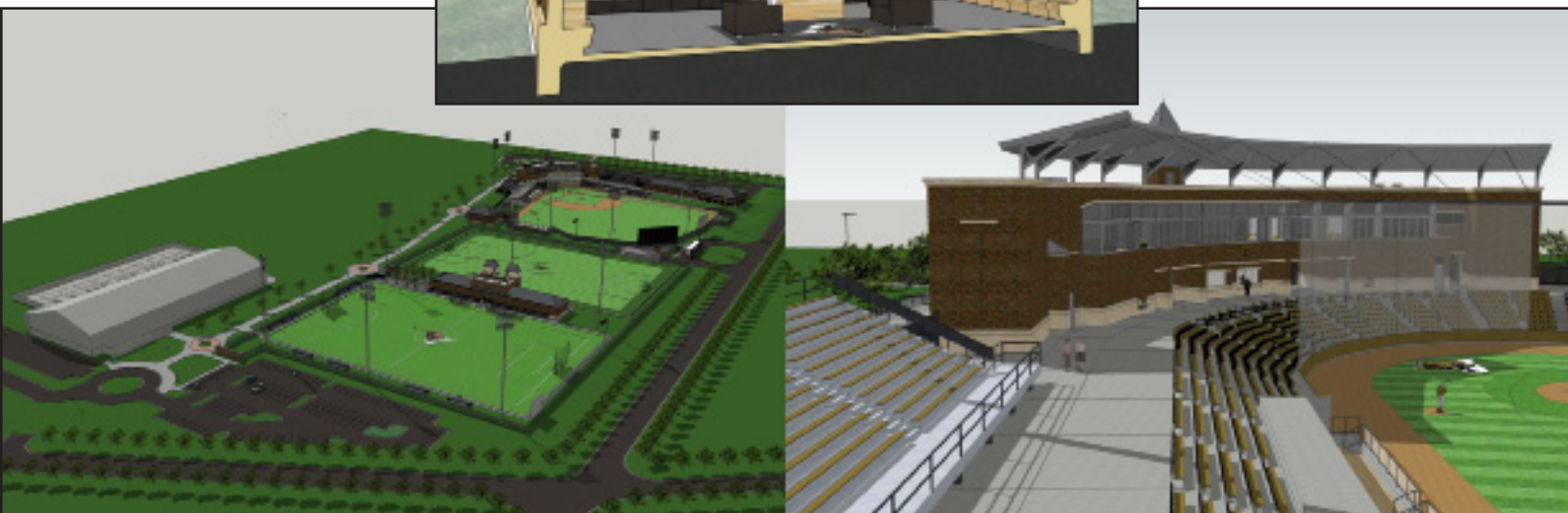
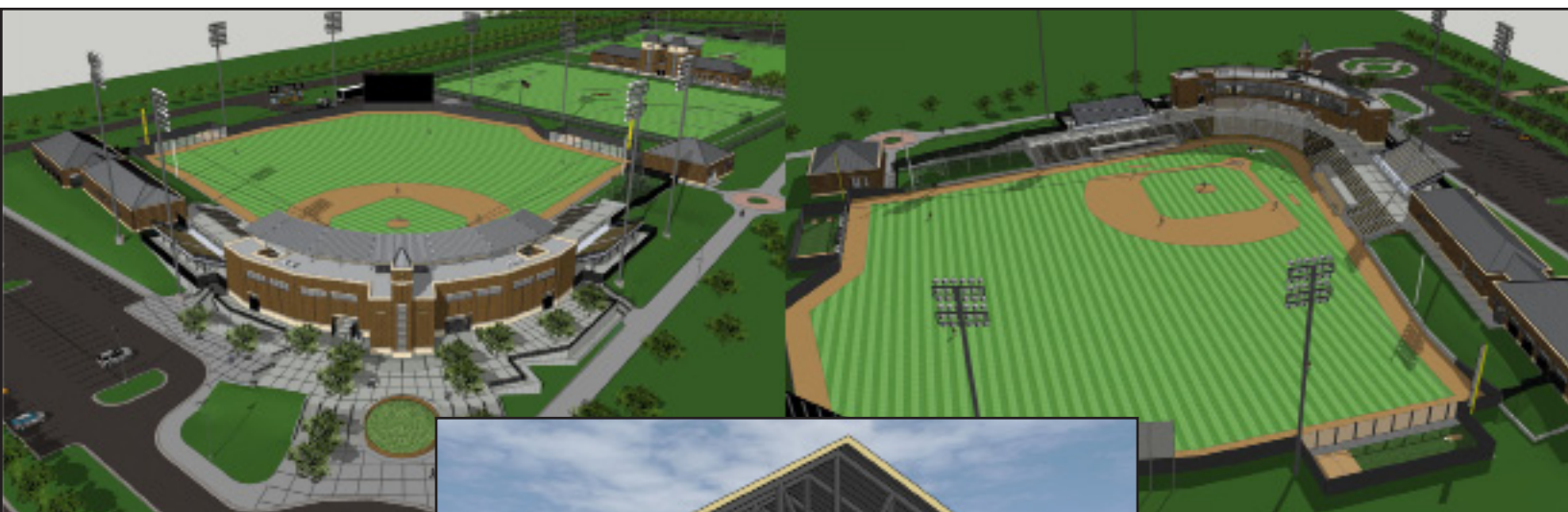

The 2011 season will be Purdue's last at Lambert Field. The new northwest baseball facility is set to open for the 2012 home opener. The \$21 million baseball stadium, to be financed with athletics department funds, could eventually seat up to 2,500 spectators in the first phase of improvements to the Northwest Athletics Complex that includes the adjacent soccer facility. The intercollegiate baseball stadium will replace the existing 1,100-seat Lambert Field, which has been the team's home since 1965. Purdue will close out Lambert Field this year with an eight-game homestand from May 11-21, highlighted by Big Ten Conference series against Illinois and Iowa.
