#### **BOILERMAKERS HOST INDIANA FOR GOLDEN BOOT GAME**

- Purdue's annual rivalry game with Indiana is up next. The Golden Boot traveling trophy will once again be on the line. The Boilermakers regained possession of the Golden Boot last year with their first win in Bloomington since 2009. It was the third straight victory by the road team in the series. Purdue can retain possession of the trophy with a win or a draw Saturday.
- The Boilermakers were eliminated from Big Ten Tournament contention Sunday with their loss at No. 16 Penn State coupled with the Hoosiers' win at Maryland. Wisconsin (15 points), Indiana (14), Nebraska (14), Ohio State (12) and Illinois (10) are vying for the final three Big Ten Tournament berths.

#### DANNAH WILLIAMS' FIRST COLLEGIATE GOAL LIFTS PURDUE TO VICTORY VS. UMD

- · One day after her 20th birthday, Dannah Williams scored her first collegiate goal off a corner kick late in the game to lift Purdue to a 1-0 win vs. Maryland on Oct. 13. The Boilermakers snapped their six-game losing skid with their first 1-0 win since defeating Evansville at home during Labor Day Weekend of last season. But it was the team's first 1-0 victory in Big Ten play since October 2013 vs. Northwestern.
- Williams joined Gianna Milaro and Vanessa Korolas as Purdue players to score their first collegiate goals this season, all coming in Big Ten games. The 2011 season opener at Toledo marked the last time the Boilermakers won in 1-0 fashion via a player's first collegiate goal. Alex Hairston was the goal scorer that day. The same scenario had not happened in Big Ten play since Jessica Warren's first goal was the difference in an October 2009 home victory vs. Michigan.

#### **BOILERMAKERS OUT SHOOT PENN STATE FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 2007**

- Purdue played well in its first trip to Penn State since September 2013, but came out on the wrong end of a 1-0 final. The Boilermakers enjoyed a 15-13 edge in the shot count, out shooting PSU for the first time since 2007. That year also marked the last time Purdue conceded just one goal in a game at the home pitch of the Big Ten's top perennial power. But while the Boilermakers managed to create seven shots on goal, most of them led to easy saves for goalkeeper Amanda Dennis. Purdue held Penn State without a shot on goal in the second half.
- The game at Penn State marked the first time the Boilermakers played a defending national champion. Penn State and Rutgers both qualified for the NCAA College Cup (Final Four) last year. Purdue had not played two teams that both reached the College Cup the year before since 2003 (North Carolina, Penn State).

#### KASER AN IRONWOMAN IN BIG TEN PLAY

 Senior Megan Kaser has started and gone the distance at center back in 10 consecutive games. In the process, she has logged 909 consecutive minutes during the streak. It's the longest streak on the team this year and the longest of her career. Kaser is one of only four Boilermakers to start every Big Ten game, joining Erika Arkans, Vanessa Korolas and Hannah Mussallem. Korolas and Mussallem have started every game of 2016.

#### KOROLAS' GOAL, GINTHER'S 11 SAVES HIGHLIGHT OVERTIME THRILLER AT RUTGERS

- Vanessa Korolas scored a highlight-reel caliber goal and goalkeeper Jordan Ginther made a career-high 11 saves, but No. 24 Rutgers scored late in the first overtime period to defeat Purdue in an Oct. 6 overtime thriller in New Jersev.
- · Ginther made a save on a penalty kick for the second time this season en route to finishing with the most saves by a Boilermaker since Jenny Bradfisch made 12 at Minnesota in October 2008. Her 11 saves also matched the fourth most by a goalkeeper in program

history. Ginther made her 100th career save in the first half, becoming the eighth goalkeeper in program history to reach the benchmark.

- · Korolas ended Purdue's scoring drought at 306 consecutive minutes with her second goal of the season. The junior had also accounted for the team's most recent goal in the first half of the Sept. 23 game vs. Wisconsin. Korolas' goal was Purdue's first in the three meetings with the defensively stout Scarlet Knights as Big Ten rivals. After last year's scoreless draw in West Lafayette, the goal ended a 255-minute scoring drought vs. Rutgers.
- · The Boilermakers also lost in overtime to Montana during the season-opening weekend. They're 2-4-1 in overtime games since the start of the 2015 campaign after not losing an overtime game in the previous two years, going 2-0-3 in games longer than 90 minutes from 2013 to 2014.

#### THREE SAVES ON PENALTY KICKS THIS YEAR

• Jordan Ginther made a save on a penalty kick in the second half of the overtime loss at Rutgers. Opponents are now 1-for-4 on penalty kicks against Purdue this year, with Ginther also making a PK save in the season-opening win vs. Marshall and Erika Yohn doing likewise at Dayton. Dating back to the start of 2015, opponents are only 2-for-7 on penalty kicks vs. Purdue.

#### PURDUE LOSES 1-0 AT IOWA AFTER CONCEDING EARLY GOAL

- The 1-0 loss at lowa was unique in that a goal scored in the third minute proved to be the difference in the contest. In 2013, Purdue won a game 1-0 at Ohio State after scoring in the opening minute. A 2010 loss to USC in Fullerton, California, marked the last time an opponent's goal in the first 10 minutes was the difference in a 1-0 final. But it had been nearly a decade since a goal in the opening five minutes was the difference. The Boilermakers lost 1-0 in the semifinals of the 2006 Big Ten Tournament after Illinois scored the game's lone goal in the fourth minute.
- lowa had not scored since the second half of its non-conference finale at Colorado on Sept. 11. The goal ended the scoring drought at 402 consecutive minutes.

#### **GINTHER FINISHES WISCONSIN-MINNESOTA WEEKEND WITH 17 SAVES**

- · Goalkeeper Jordan Ginther returned to the starting lineup for the first home weekend of Big Ten play, making a combined 17 saves in the losses to Wisconsin and No. 9 Minnesota. She made a career-high nine saves vs. the Badgers and followed that up with eight saves vs. the Gophers. With Erika Yohn also making nine saves in games at No. 4 West Virginia and Northwestern this month, a Purdue keeper has stopped nine shots on goal in three of the Boilermakers' last six games. Prior to this season, a Purdue keeper had not made nine saves since the 2012 season finale.
- · Ginther's 17 saves were the most by a Boilermaker in consecutive games since Jenny Bradfisch made 19 in October 2008 vs. Minnesota (12) and Iowa (7). However, the Minnesota game went to overtime and was not decided until the 109th minute. Lauren Mason was the last keeper with at least 17 saves in consecutive 90-mintue games. Mason made 21 saves in October 2006 vs. Wisconsin (10) and Illinois (11).

#### MILARO, KOROLAS & D-WILLIAMS SCORE FIRST COLLEGIATE GOALS IN BIG TEN PLAY

· Gianna Milaro (at Illinois), Vanessa Korolas (vs. Wisconsin) and Dannah Williams (vs. Maryland) have all scored their first collegiate goals during Big Ten play this year. They've joined Hannah Mussallem (2015 vs. IIlinois) as active Boilermakers to record their first collegiate goals in a Big Ten game. Prior to Mussallem, Makaela Nellams (2014 vs. Ohio State) and Kate Fowee (2012 vs. Wisconsin) were the last players to accomplish the feat. The 2009 campaign marked the last time multiple Boilermakers did it in the same year - Jessica Warren (vs. Michigan), Roya Akhavain (vs. Illinois) and Remi Gibba (vs. Iowa).

#### SECOND-HALF GOALS BURNING THE BOILERMAKERS

- Purdue has been outscored 16-6 in the second half this year, giving up five second-half goals during the Wisconsin-Minnesota weekend (Sept. 23-25). The Badgers rallied to win Sept. 23 at Folk Field thanks to three second-half goals, becoming the first visiting side to score three goals in a half in West Lafayette since Nebraska scored four in the second half of an Octobe 2013 game.
- The Wisconsin game also marked the second time this season that Purdue led for at least half the game but ended up losing. Aug. 21 vs. Montana, the Boilermakers held the lead for 77 minutes but lost in overtime.

Wisconsin scored the equalizer and go-ahead goal only one minute and 27 seconds apart. It was the shortest amount of time between goals conceded by Purdue since the Badgers also scored just 27 seconds apart in the first half of their October 2012 win in West Lafayette.

#### PURDUE POSTS FIRST WIN VERSUS ILLINI IN CHAMPAIGN

· First-half goals from Erika Arkans and Gianna Milaro staked the Boilermakers to an early lead and the defense took care of the rest in a 2-0 victory at Illinois to kick off Big Ten play Sept. 15. The win was the first by the road team in the Purdue-Illinois series, which dates back to the Boilermakers' inaugural 1998 campaign. Purdue had not tasted victory in Champaign since defeating DePaul and Western Michigan in the first two rounds of the 2003 NCAA Tournament. Michigan and Penn State are now the only Big Ten opponents that the Boilermakers have never beaten on the road.

#### ALREADY HAD 19 PLAYERS START AT LEAST ONCE

• With only two Boilermakers – Vanessa Korolas and Hannah Mussallem - starting each of the first 15 games, Purdue has already had 19 different players start at least once this year. The Boilermakers have used the same starting lineup in consecutive games only three times, Sept. 15-18 at Illinois and Northwestern; Sept. 25-30 vs. Minnesota and at Iowa; Oct. 13-16 vs. Maryland and at Penn State. The 19 different players to start at least once is already more than last season's total and is just one player shy of the program record from 2001 and 2014.

#### STREAKS END DURING OPENING WEEKEND OF BIG TEN PLAY

- Three notable streaks came to an end during Purdue's Illinois-Northwestern road trip to begin Big Ten play. The Boilermakers ended their nine-game losing streak against the Illini in Champaign. Purdue also won its conference opener for the first time since 2008, ending a five-game losing streak and seven-game winless drought in the process.
- · Unfortunately, the Boilermakers' five-game winning streak in Evanston also came to an end with the 2-0 loss at Northwestern. It was the longest win streak in program history vs. any opponent on that foe's home pitch. Purdue had never been shut out in Evanston until this year. But Northwestern was able to extend its programrecord shutout streak to 627 consecutive minutes by keeping the Boilermakers off the scoreboard.

#### **UTAH GAME CALLED AFTER 60 MINUTES DUE TO T-STORMS & LIGHTNING**

- Purdue led Utah 1-0 at the top of the 61st minute in its September 9 non-conference finale when a long line of thunderstorms produced lightning that first delayed and later forced the cancellation of the game before it became official.
- · Andrea Petrina scored in the 37th minute to give Purdue a halftime lead. But the storms arrived in full force about 8:20 p.m., leading to the lightning delay. By rule, the game was not permitted to be restarted three hours after kickoff (7 p.m.). Therefore, when lightning was still within 10 miles of the stadium at 9:30 p.m., the game was officially called and ruled a no contest because 70 minutes were not completed. It will not be rescheduled.
- It was the Boilermakers' first scheduled contest that did not go final since a 2012 home game against Milwaukee was canceled due to lightning before it could kick off. Two weeks ago, the opening kickoff of Purdue's road game at Baylor was delayed about 80 minutes due to lightning in Waco, Texas.

#### PETRINA, LASKY SCORE IN FIRST TWO WINS

· In each of Purdue's first two wins this season the goals came from Andrea Petrina and Mikayla Lasky, in that order. It marked the fifth time in program history (since 1998) that the same two players both scored in each of the Boilermakers' first two victories, also happening in 2005, 2008, 2010 and 2013. However, in each of the previous four occurrences, Purdue scored at least a combined six goals in those first two wins. This year it was only four goals, all from Petrina and Lasky.

#### PURDUE RALLIES FOR OVERTIME WIN VERSUS CINCINNATI

 The Boilermakers bounced back from their 5-1 loss at Baylor with an overtime win against a Cin cinnati team that qualified for the NCAA Tourna ment last season and entered the day 3-0 on the voung season. Mikavla Laskv's golden goal in the 97th minute lifted Purdue to its first overtime win at home since August 2012. However, the Boilermakers have now won at least one OT affair in each of the last five seasons.

 Purdue won the game despite trailing 1-0 for 37 minutes until Andrea Petrina scored on a
