### THE SCENE SETTER

▶ The No. 18-ranked Purdue Boilermakers look for a big road win on Saturday as it visits Ann Arbor, Michigan, to face the Wolverines in a key Big Ten contest. The contest will tip off at 2 p.m. ET with **Mike Tirico** and **Dan Dakich** providing expert commentary on ESPN while **Bart Fox** will produce the game. On the radio dial, legendary broadcasters **Larry Clisby** and **Rob Blackman** will do the same on the Purdue Radio Network with **Wes Scott** producing. Live stats will be available on StatBroadcast.com and as always, in-game updates will be provided on the Purdue Basketball Twitter account (@BoilerBall).

### THE BOILERMAKER NOTEBOOK

▶ The Purdue basketball program has won at least 20 games in 23 of the last 37 seasons, including in eight of **Matt Painter's** 10 seasons.

▶ Purdue is 41-18 since the start of last season, including 8-8 in true road games.

▶ Purdue ranks in the nation's top 30 in rebound margin (3rd), assists per game (9th), scoring margin (9th), field goal percentage defense (10th), scoring defense (17th), free throw percentage (24th), assist:turnover ratio (27th) and blocked shots (30th). Last year's squad finished in the top 30 in one category (blocked shots).

▶ Purdue is the only team in the country to not be outrebounded this year. It has outrebounded 24-of-25 foes and tied Maryland on the glass.

▶ The Boilermakers are 14-1 at home with the lone loss coming to the current No. 4-ranked team in the country, Iowa, on Jan. 2.

▶ Three of Purdue's five losses have come to the nation's top-4 ranked teams (two losses to Iowa, one to Maryland).

▶ Purdue has won 34 straight games when attempting more free throws than its opponent.

▶ Purdue's bench is outscoring its opponents bench by a 808 to 379 margin this year, an average of 17.1 points per game.

▶ Purdue has shot at least 50.0 percent from 3-point range in two of the last three games (.583 vs. Nebraska; .500 vs. Michigan State).

▶ In the last meeting vs. Michigan, Purdue had 26 assists against 9 turnovers (26 asts on 30 FGs).

▶ **A.J. Hammons** has made 29 field goals in the last two games; 11 of them have been dunks.

▶ **Rapheal Davis'** six 3-pointers against Michigan State were the most for a Purdue player since **Kendall Stephens** hit six trifectas against Penn State on Jan. 17, 2015.

**■ ABOUT THE WOLVERINES**

- Michigan enters Saturday's contest with an 18-7 overall record and is tied with Purdue for fourth in the Big Ten standings with an 8-4 mark.
- The Wolverines have played without All-America candidate **Caris LeVert** for the last eight games, posting a 5-3 record during that span.
- After LeVert's 17.6 scoring average through 14 games, **Derrick Walton Jr.** is averaging 12.3 points, **Duncan Robinson** is at 12.2 points and **Zak Irvin** averages 10.9 points per game.
- The Wolverines have made 262 3-pointers this year, connecting on 40.9 percent of their tries. Four players are shooting over 44.5 percent from 3-point range.

**■ SERIES HISTORY**

- Purdue leads the series with Michigan by an 85-66 margin and has won two games in a row in the series.
- Purdue is 22-19 all-time at the Crisler Center. The Boilermakers are looking for three straight wins in the series for the first time since Jan. 5, 2008 to Jan. 31, 2009.
- Purdue has scored at least 75 points in three of the last five meetings.
- Purdue has, however, lost two straight trips to the Crisler Center.

**■ THE LAST TIME VS. MICHIGAN**

- A.J. Hammons** scored 17 points and **Rapheal Davis** added 16 points, six assists and five rebounds to lead Purdue to an 87-70 win over Michigan on Jan. 7, 2016.
- Leading 66-60, Purdue ended the game on a 21-10 run over the final 5:20 to earn the victory.
- Purdue's 87 points were its most against Michigan since an 89-82 win on Jan. 29, 1998, a span of 32 games.
- Purdue started the game 3-of-15 from the field. It finished making 27 of its last 39 shots (.692).
- Purdue's 26 assists were its most in a Big Ten game since having 29 against Minnesota on Feb. 19, 2000.
- Purdue's 76.2 percent shooting in the second half was the 12th-best percentage in a half in school history and highest since Nov. 14, 1997, vs. LIU Brooklyn. It was the highest against a Big Ten foe since Jan. 27, 1990, vs. Iowa.
- Purdue was 9-of-11 (.818) from inside the 3-point line in the second half. One of the misses was an **A.J. Hammons** dunk attempt.
- Purdue's senior class accounted for a then season-high 43 points.

**■ PURDUE BASKETBALL HISTORY**

- Purdue is in its 118th season of basketball, owning a 1,732-991 (.636) all-time record. The Boilermakers rank 19th all-time in victories (1,732) and their 63.6 winning percentage is 20th all-time.
- Purdue has had just two head coaches, **Gene Keady** and **Matt Painter**, since the start of the 1980-81 season, a span of 35 years.
- Since the **Ray Eddy** era began in 1950, Purdue has had just six head coaches in 66 years and just eight head coaches in the last 99 years.

**■ NEAR THE TOPS IN THE COUNTRY**

- Purdue's 14 homecourt wins are tied for the fourth most for any program in America. The school record for most wins in Mackey Arena are 16 (2010-11, 2007-08, 2006-07). Purdue has three home games left to try and surpass that mark.

**■ BOILERMAKERS HOT AT HOME**

- Purdue saw its 15-game home winning streak come to an end on Jan. 2, 2016, against Iowa. It marked Purdue's first loss since a 69-60 setback to Maryland on Jan. 10, 2015. The 15-game homecourt winning streak was tied for the sixth-longest streak in Mackey Arena.
- However, Purdue has won 21 of its last 22 games at home, the lone loss being to Iowa (Jan. 2, 2016). Since the start of last year, Purdue is 28-4 at Mackey Arena.
- Of Purdue's 14 wins at home, 13 of them have been by at least 11 points. The lone victory not decided by 11 points was Tuesday night's overtime thriller against Michigan State (82-81).
- Purdue has now won at least 12 home games for 10 straight years.

**■ VANQUISHING A TOP-10 FOE**

- With Purdue's 82-81 overtime win over Michigan State on Tuesday night, the Boilermakers defeated their first top-10 opponent since Feb. 20, 2011, a 76-63 win over Ohio State.
- The victory snapped a 17-game losing streak against top-10 foes.
- Purdue is 10-28 against top-10 teams under **Matt Painter**.

**■ LOUD NOISES**

- Mackey Arena is widely considered one of the loudest arenas in America and when **Rapheal Davis** hit his fifth 3-pointer of the first half to give Purdue a 30-14 lead on the Spartans, the decibel level in Mackey Arena hit 118 dB, about the same as a turbo-fan aircraft at takeoff from 200 feet.
- It's the second-loudest recorded level in Mackey Arena history. Bear in mind, we have only been doing this the last six years.

**■ MICHIGAN WEEK**

- Purdue defeated Michigan 87-70 on Jan. 7 and Michigan State on Tuesday night, 82-81, in overtime
- Purdue has a chance to sweep the season series against the two Michigan schools for the first time since the 1995-96 season. The Boilermakers swept the regular-season meetings in 2010-11, but lost to the Spartans in the Big Ten Tournament.

**■ SENIOR LEADERS**

- Purdue's four seniors of **A.J. Hammons**, **Rapheal Davis**, **Johnny Hill** and **Stephen Toyra** know they are entering the stretch run of their careers and are playing like they need to.
- In the win over Michigan State, the group scored 49 of Purdue's 82 points and had 21 of Purdue's 42 rebounds.
- Over the last four games, the group is averaging 39.8 points per game, and as a group when it scores 21 or more points, the Boilermakers are 16-1 (loss to Maryland -- 26 points).
- When at least two of the four members score in double-figures, the Boilermakers are 7-0 this year.

**■ BIG-GAME NUMBERS**

- A.J. Hammons** scored 19 points with 13 rebounds, eight blocked shots and three assists in the win over Michigan State. He became just the third player nationally since 2010-11 to reach those marks.

**■ INSIDE THE NUMBERS**

- Purdue has scored 70 or more points in eight of its last 10 games and in 18-of-25 games this year (16-2 record). When scoring 69 points or fewer, Purdue is 4-3.
- Purdue is now 9-1 on the season when making nine or more 3-pointers. When making eight or fewer, Purdue is 11-4.

- In games that Purdue shoots 25.0 percent or less from 3-point range, the Boilermakers are 4-1 (wins over Lehigh, New Mexico, Vanderbilt and Ohio State).
- Purdue is 5-1 this year when being outscored in the paint. Last year's team went 0-4.
- In games played on weekends, Purdue is just 7-5. In games played on weekdays, the Boilermakers are 13-0.
- Purdue has trailed by double-digits in just four games this year (Butler, Illinois, Iowa, Maryland).
- Three of Purdue's five losses have come to teams ranked in the top four (two to Iowa, one to Maryland).
- Seventeen of Purdue's 20 wins this year have been decided by at least 11 points (61-55 win over Wisconsin on Dec. 29; 68-64 win over Minnesota on Jan. 27; 82-81 win over Michigan State on Feb. 9).
- Twenty of Purdue's 25 games this year have been decided by at least 11 points (Iowa, Butler, Wisconsin, Minnesota, Michigan St.).
- Purdue has had just one game this year decided by a single possession (82-81 vs. Michigan State on Feb. 9).
- Purdue's bench has outscored the opposing bench in 23-of-25 games (Ohio State, Michigan State).

#### ■ WINNING / LOSING NUMBERS

- Purdue is 13-0 when winning or tied in the "points off turnovers" battle; the Boilermakers are 7-5 when losing the "points off turnovers" battle.
- Purdue is 13-2 when having a run of 10 points or longer (losses to Iowa, Maryland); Purdue is 7-3 when not having a 10-point run.
- Purdue is 7-0 when the sophomore class combines for at least 40 points, 13-5 when it does not.
- Purdue is 16-1 when the senior class combines for at least 21 points; 4-4 when it scores 20 or fewer points.
- Purdue is now 4-1 when making four or fewer 3-pointers with a loss to Maryland.
- Purdue is 6-0 when attempting 26 or more 3-pointers this year (North Carolina A&T, Vermont, Florida, Pittsburgh, Howard, Rutgers).
- Purdue is 8-0 when attempting 19 or fewer 3-pointers, including 6-0 in Big Ten play.
- When Purdue attempts between 20 and 25 3-pointers, the Boilermakers are just 6-5.
- Purdue is 13-1 when shooting 35.0 percent or better from 3-point range; just 7-4 when under 34.9 percent.
- Purdue is 13-0 when committing 17 or fewer fouls; but is 7-5 when committing 18 or more personal fouls.
- Purdue is 10-0 when dishing out 18 or more assists; 10-5 when dishing out 17 or fewer assists.
- Purdue is 9-0 when shooting at least 48.0 percent from the field; 11-5 when it shoots under 48.0 percent.
- Purdue is 16-2 when it has 15 or fewer turnovers (losses to Iowa, Maryland); when it has 16 or more turnovers, Purdue is 4-3.
- Purdue is 15-0 when holding foes to 69 or fewer points; when it allows 70 or more points, Purdue is 5-5.
- Purdue is 10-0 when four or more players score in double-figures; just 9-5 when having three or fewer players in double figures.
- Purdue is 12-0 this year when **Rapheal Davis** scores 10 or more points; the Boilermakers are 8-5 when Davis scores nine or fewer points.

- Purdue is 12-1 this year when **Isaac Haas** scores in double-digits; just 8-4 when he doesn't.
- Purdue is 9-1 when **A.J. Hammons** leads the team in scoring; but it is 11-4 when he doesn't.

#### ■ PAINTER ERA WINNING / LOSING NUMBERS

- Purdue is 92-11 under Painter when shooting at least 48.0 percent; Purdue is 15-54 when opponents shoot at least 48.0 percent (win over Minnesota this year).
- Purdue is 192-30 under Painter when shooting a higher field goal percentage than its opponent; Purdue is 40-100 when opponents shoot better.
- Purdue is 167-32 under Painter when attempting more free throws than its opponent, including 16-0 this year.
- Purdue is 89-8 under Painter when winning both the rebound and turnover battles.
- Purdue is 134-30 under Painter when scoring at least 70 points; Purdue is 33-84 under Painter when allowing 70 or more points.
- Purdue is 4-34 under Painter when allowing 80-plus points (win vs. Michigan State this year).
- Purdue is 114-4 under Painter when holding foes to 59 points or less (losses to Michigan State [2010], Eastern Michigan, Iowa, Nebraska [2013]).

#### ■ SUPER SOPHOMORES

- Purdue's sophomore class has accounted for 39.7 percent of the team's scoring this year (778-of-1,961 points).
- The four-member group owns a 2.25 assist-to-turnover ratio (214:95).
- In games that at least two of the four sophomores score in double-digits, the Boilermakers are 8-1 (loss to Iowa). When zero sophomores score in double-digits, Purdue is 4-3.

- Purdue ranks third nationally in rebound margin. The Boilermakers outrebounded the top rebound margin team in America on Tuesday night against Michigan State (42-39). Since then, Michigan State has fallen to second.

#### ■ CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD

- Purdue has dominated the glass this year, being the only team in the country to not be outrebounded while ranking third nationally in rebound margin (+11.4).
- In Big Ten play only, Purdue leads the league in both defensive rebounding percentage (.794) and offensive rebounding percentage (.363).
- The Boilermakers have held nine of their 12 Big Ten opponents to single-digit offensive rebounds (Iowa 11, Ohio State 10, Michigan State 16). Six of the last nine opponents had five or fewer offensive rebounds (Illinois, Penn State, Rutgers, Iowa, Minnesota, Maryland).
- The Boilermakers are allowing just 9.0 offensive rebounds per game in all 24 games and just 7.1 offensive rebounds in Big Ten play.

### ► ROAD WARRIORS

• Since the start of the 2007-08 season in "true" road games, Purdue owns a 45-46 record, the third-most wins in the Big Ten during that span. Only four teams (Wisconsin, Michigan State, Ohio State, Purdue) have won at least 40.0 percent of their road games during that span.

- Purdue is second in the country in both total rebounds (1,063) and fifth in rebounds per game (42.5). Purdue is fourth in defensive rebounds per game (30.1; Gonzaga - 30.2).
- Purdue's +11.4 rebound margin is almost four rebounds per game more than the current school record (+7.6 in 1969-70).

### ■ BOILERMAKERS PUTTING POINTS ON THE BOARD

- Purdue is averaging 78.4 points per game through 25 games and is on pace to record its highest scoring average in almost 20 years, and the fifth-highest average in the last 40 years.
- Purdue is on pace (35-game schedule) to score 2,745 points, which would rank as the fourth-highest total in school history.
- Over the last 40 years, the four seasons that have a higher scoring average than this year's current average have produced a combined 111-22 record with two No. 1 seeds, a No. 2 seed and a No. 3 seed.

### ■ SEEING DOUBLE

- Purdue has already recorded 17 double-doubles through 25 games, the most during the **Matt Painter** era. The 17 double-doubles are the most for the Boilermakers' program since the 1997-98 season (18).
- Four different players have recorded double-doubles this year.
- The school record for most double-doubles in a season is 32 (1973-74).

### ■ BALANCED ATTACK

- Purdue has five players averaging between 9.8 and 14.7 points, led by **A.J. Hammons** at 14.7 points per game.
- Purdue has five players averaging at least 3.9 rebounds per game.
- Purdue has six players averaging between 2.0 and 3.1 assists per game and three more players averaging at least 1.0 assists per game.
- Purdue has six players with at least 20 3-point field goals for just the second time in school history (2000-01; 6).

### ■ DEFENSE LIVES HERE

- The Boilermakers have held 20 of a possible 24 opponents under their pregame scoring average. Michigan State reached its average in overtime on Tuesday night.
- The Boilermakers are 18th in the country in scoring defense (63.7) and 10th in field goal percentage defense (.382).
- Purdue is ninth in Ken Pomeroy's adjusted defensive efficiency, sixth in effective field goal percentage defense and 12th in 2-point pct. defense (.414).
- Purdue has held 15-of-25 opponents to 69 or fewer points, posting a 15-0 record when doing so.
- Purdue has forced 11 shot clock violations already this year, one year after forcing 19 in 34 games.

### ■ ON FIRE FROM THE LINE

- Purdue ranks 24th nationally in free throw percentage, a significant improvement over the last four years where the Boilermakers ranked 275th (2012), 291st (2013), 261st (2014) and 213th (2015).
- Purdue has won 34 straight games when shooting more free throws than its opponent, including 16 times this year.
- Four of Purdue's 10 rotation players are shooting above 80.0 percent from the free throw line.

### ■ BETTER FROM THE LINE

- After starting the season 38-of-59 (.644) from the free throw line in the first two games, Purdue has turned it around at the charity stripe.
- The Boilermakers are 349-of-459 (.760) from the free throw line during the last 23 games. If you throw out the two Iowa games (17-of-30), Purdue is 332-of-429 (.774) during that span.
- Purdue has had eight games this year where it has made 80.0 percent or better from the free throw line. Last year's team had just four games all season of 80 percent or better.
- The school record for free throw percentage in a season is 78.2 percent during the 1968-69 season. This year's average (.746) ranks fifth.

### ■ MAY I ASSIST YOU WITH THAT?

- Purdue ranks ninth nationally in assists per game (17.8) despite not having a player in the Big Ten's top 15 in assists per game. **Vince Edwards** leads the team in assists (3.1), ranking 18th in the league.
- The Boilermakers rank in the top 10 nationally thanks to six players averaging between 2.0 and 3.1 assists per game and three more averaging 1.0 assists per game.
- The Boilermakers' assist average of 17.8 per game would rank as the sixth-best average in school history and the best since the 1997-98 team averaged 18.9 assists per game.
- Purdue's current assist-to-turnover ratio of 1.42 (446:314) ranks as the fifth-best ratio in school history (1.58; 1985) and is 26th nationally.
- In addition, Purdue ranks 11th nationally in assist rate (A / FGM) at 64.7 percent.
- The Boilermakers have dished out 20 or more assists eight different times this year, including twice in Big Ten play (Michigan, Nebraska).

### ■ DIALING LONG DISTANCE

- Purdue has made at least 10 3-pointers in seven games this year, the most since having 10 games of double-digit 3-pointers in the 2011-12 season.
- Purdue's 58.3 percent shooting from long distance against Nebraska was its best percentage since March 20, 2013, vs. Western Illinois (.636; 7-of-11 3Ps).
- In Purdue's wins, the Boilermakers have shot 37.1 percent from 3-point range. In the five losses, Purdue has shot just 29.1 percent.

### ■ TURNING IT OVER

- Purdue has had an issue with turnovers in its losses coming to Butler, Iowa (twice) and Illinois. If the Boilermakers can solve those issues, a special season could be on the horizon.
- In Purdue's five losses, the Boilermakers have had 74 turnovers, resulting in 101 points. The losses have come by a combined 50 points.
- Purdue had 18 (Butler), 14 (Iowa), 16 (Illinois), 17 (Iowa) and nine (Maryland) turnovers during its five losses.
- Purdue has been outscored by 49 points in the "points off turnovers" category in those five games, clearly making a huge difference.
- Purdue has won the turnover battle just five times this year (Vermont, IUPUI, Howard, Rutgers, Ohio State).
- When Purdue has 15 or fewer turnovers, the Boilermakers are 16-2 with the losses coming to Iowa in the first meeting (14) and Maryland (9). When 16 or more turnovers, Purdue is 4-3 (wins over Incarnate Word, New Mexico, Wisconsin and Michigan State).

## ■ ASSISTING WITH THE BEST

- Purdue has several players boasting impressive assist-to-turnover ratio this year.
- P.J. Thompson** leads the way with a 71:11 (6.45) assist-to-turnover ratio, a ratio that would smash the school record of 3.12, set by **Mack Gadis** in 1986.
- Thompson's ratio is the best in the country for a player averaging at least 20.0 minutes per game (Stephen F. Austin's **Trey Pinkney**; 77:14 -- 5.50).
- Dakota Mathias** owns a 3.25 ratio (52:16), a number that would rank second in the single-season assist-to-turnover ratio chart.
- Ryan Cline** owns a 4.63 (37:8) ratio, a number that would rank first on the Purdue freshman list. Cline likely won't have enough assists (min. 75) to qualify for the single-season chart.
- The three of them have combined for a 160:35 (4.57) ratio between them in 1,358 minutes. The trio averages a turnover every 38.8 minutes.

## ■ NOT WAITING FOR THE WEEKEND

- In games played on Saturday and Sunday this year, Purdue is just 7-5.
- In games played on weekdays, the Boilermakers are 13-0.

## ■ SHOW A LITTLE CLASS

- In the classroom, the Boilermakers had an outstanding fall semester, registering a cumulative 3.04 GPA as a team. Eleven players boasted semester GPAs of 3.00 or better during the fall.

## ■ LET'S GO FOR A RUN

- Purdue has had 75 runs this year of 7-0 or longer, compared to just 28 for its opponents.
- Purdue has had 23 runs of 10-0 or longer, compared to just four for its opponents (Iowa -- 13-0 run; Illinois -- 10-0 run; Iowa -- 11-0 run; Michigan State -- 11-0 run).

- A.J. Hammons** picked up his third Big Ten Player of the Week honor on Feb. 1, after torching Nebraska for 32 points, 11 rebounds, five assists and four blocked shots in just 29 minutes.
- It was his league-best third Player of the Week honor this season, matching Michigan State's Denzel Valentine for the most POW awards this season.
- Hammons and Valentine are the league's most efficient players, posting a 0.41 efficiency rating / possession.
- Hammons is averaging just 14.7 points per game and 8.2 rebounds, but is doing so in just 24.0 minutes. Extrapolated to 40 minutes, Hammons is perhaps the league's best player.

• With a pair of Sweet 16 appearances, six NCAA Tournament berths, Big Ten regular-season and tournament titles and an international gold medal on his résumé, 11th-year head coach Matt Painter is widely regarded as one of the brightest minds in all of college basketball.

• Painter affirmed his long-term commitment to Purdue in March of 2011, agreeing to a new eight-year contract that will keep him in West Lafayette through at least the 2018-19 season.

• Painter has averaged over 21 wins per season during his tenure at the helm of the Purdue program, including at least 20 victories in six of those seasons.

• Painter's tenure has seen Purdue basketball restore its status among the upper echelon of college basketball programs. The last eight years have seen six 20-win seasons and NCAA Tournament berths, two Sweet 16 appearances, a regular-season Big Ten title and a Big Ten Tournament crown.

• The three winningest classes in program history are the classes of 2011, 2012 and 2010, respectively, and five of the 10 winningest individual players Purdue has ever seen have come from the Painter ranks. Success, however, didn't happen overnight.

• Painter officially became the 18th head men's basketball coach in Purdue history on April 1, 2005, and immediately set about laying the groundwork for a dramatic reversal in the program's fortunes.

• The Boilermakers were at their best during the 2009 postseason run, rattling off double-digit victories over Penn State and Illinois to reach the Big Ten Tournament final, where they dispatched Ohio State, 65-61, to earn the first conference tournament crown in program history.

• Painter has also resurrected Mackey Arena as one of the country's best home-court advantages, piling up a 151-32 (.825) record at home over the last 11 seasons, including a remarkable 82-7 (.921) record against non-conference opponents.

• Painter has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year three times in the last six seasons, earning the consensus award in 2008 and 2011, and winning the coaches' vote in 2010. He is one of only six men to win the award more at least three times since its inception in 1974.

• Painter has seen a total of 21 players earn a combined 40 Academic All-Big Ten honors during his tenure as head coach. Painter has also mentored an Academic All-American, as Moore earned second-team honors during the 2009-10 season.
