• The Boilermakers continue their stretch of 11 consecutive games against six different teams with winning records, which began the weekend of March 29 to 31 with the series victory vs. Penn State and concludes Tuesday vs. Butler (live on FS1).

- AROUND THE HORN -

• Purdue plays 13 of its next 16 games at home, beginning with its second home weekend of the season that features Iowa's first visit to Alexander Field since 2015. The Boilermakers play at home three of the next four weekends and four of the final six.

• Dating back to April 24, 2018, Purdue is 17-2 at Alexander Field. The Boilermakers have won four straight weekend series at home for the first time since taking the final five played at Lambert Field from 2011-12. They've won 11 straight B1G home games.

• The Hawkeyes visited Alexander Field in each of the first three years of the ballpark's existence (2013-15). From May 2013 to April 2015, nine of the Boilermakers' 30 home games were against Iowa. But since the end of Iowa's April 2015 visit, Purdue has played 76 home games against 27 teams. During that span, Iowa has gone the longest of any Big Ten without an appearance in West Lafayette.

• Additionally, only three of the Boilers' last 101 games against Big Ten teams have been vs. Iowa. Since April 6, 2015, Purdue has played more games against nine different non-conference opponents than it has against the Hawkeyes.

- 15 of the 17 runs he has allowed in 33 innings as a starting pitcher this season have scored in the first inning.
- Purdue won each of his 4 starts from March 9-29, moving him to Friday in the rotation in time for Big Ten play; had 31 strikeouts over 22 innings during that stretch.
- Shined in his first career start at Alexander Field, striking out a career-high 9 and winning a 1-0 pitcher's duel with Penn State's Dante Biasi.
- Made his first start as a Boilermaker in the Sunday series finale at Texas, working five consecutive scoreless innings after giving up three runs in the first.
- Quality start at UT was made possible by retiring 17 of the final 19 batters he faced.
- Was used in a pair of high-leverage relief situations during the season-opening series at Southern Miss.
- Pitched in 10 games, all in relief, in 2018 as a transfer from Heartland College in Bloomington, Illinois; made eight of his 10 appearances in Big Ten play.
- Enjoyed a big week in mid-April as Purdue's 13-game win streak began, working a combined 4 2/3 innings of one run-ball over two appearances.
- Purdue won both road games in which he pitched that week in extra innings.
- Worked two innings of one-hit relief in the 10-inning win at Indiana State.
- Gave up only one run over 2 2/3 innings in the 11-inning win at Maryland.
- Won his lefty-lefty matchups in LOOGY appearances vs. Indiana and Ohio State.
- Appeared in 13 games in 2017 at Heartland, going 7-3 with 48 strikeouts and 40 hits allowed in 51 innings.
- Part of two combined no-hitters as a high school senior in Chicagoland.
- Also was a quarterback and wide receiver on the football team.

- Pitched in 12 games and made five starts in 2018 after redshirting the year prior.
- Started the 2018 Big Ten Tournament championship game vs. Minnesota and an NCAA Regional game vs. Houston.
- Posted a 2.01 ERA and .203 batting average against in 22 1/3 innings as a starting pitcher, recording 21 strikeouts vs. 16 hits allowed.
- Pitched a combined 7 1/3 innings of three-run ball over his two postseason starts
- Purdue led 4-0 when he left the mound in the fifth inning of his start vs. Houston on Sunday of the NCAA Regional.
- Led Purdue to a key late-season win vs. Oral Roberts with 4 1/3 innings of two-run ball
- Earned the win in his first collegiate start with five innings of two-hit ball against Chicago State, retiring the first 12 batters of the game
- Struck out a season-high nine over 5 2/3 innings vs. Purdue Fort Wayne.
- Had Tommy John Surgery prior to enrolling at Purdue, an injury that sidelined him during his senior season of high school at Hamilton Southeastern in suburban Indy.
- Went 5-1 with a 2.55 ERA as a junior, helping lead HSE to a sectional title.
- Prep Baseball Report Indiana ranked him among the top 10 recruits in the state.

- Induced a team-high 8 ground ball double plays, 42 ground ball outs in 32 innings.
- After not pitching at ORU, helped lead Purdue to a rubber game win vs. NJIT with his finest performance as a Boilermaker. Only run he allowed was a solo homer.
- Posted five zeros to begin the game in his start at Southern Miss, allowing only one run while he was on the mound.
- Opened and closed 2018 as Purdue's Sunday starter, excelling as a midweek starter from late-March to mid-May.
- Pitched very well at Alexander Field in 2018, compiling a 1.91 ERA and .222 batting average against in 33 innings. Also had 29 strikeouts vs. 10 walks at home.
- Led Purdue to a big non-conference win vs. Indiana in midweek play that was live on ESPN, working 5 2/3 innings of three-run ball.
- Earned the win in the finale of the 2018 series vs. Northwestern with 4 1/3 innings of two-hit scoreless relief, his most-effective relief appearance of 2018.
- His 0.84 ERA was the best in all of NJCAA Division I through the end of the 2017 regular season at College of Southern Idaho, winning Region 18 Pitcher of the Year.
- Finished the season 6-3 with a 1.04 ERA and .177 batting average against, recording 68 strikeouts in 69 1/3 innings pitched.
- Was a two-way player as a freshman, pitching 75 innings and finishing the year 9-for-28 with 6 RBI at the plate.
- Struck out 11 in the Region 18 Tournament in consecutive years, winning his start with a nine-inning complete game in 2016.
- Scholastic student-athlete of the year as a senior and a two-time all-state pitcher at Rocky Mountain High School. Already inducted into RMHS Hall of Fame.

BIG TEN PLAY CONTINUES: PURDUE BASEBALL HOSTS IOWA



HEAD COACH MARK WASIKOWSKI

Mark Wasikowski, an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at the Universities of Oregon, Arizona, Florida as well as Southeast Missouri State during his career, was hired as the head coach of Purdue baseball in June 2016.

Wasikowski has played and coached in the College World Series. He helped lead teams to 14 NCAA Tournament appearances during a successful 20-year run as an assistant coach. He also won an NCAA championship as the starting third baseman and a captain on Pepperdine's 1992 College World Series team.

Wasikowski (pronounced WOZ-uh-COW-ski) played for and worked under three-time national Coach of the Year Andy Lopez for a combined 18 years. He was part of Lopez's coaching staffs at both Florida (1999-2001) and Arizona (2002-11) before joining George Horton's staff at Oregon in the summer of 2011, spending five seasons with Horton in Eugene. Wasikowski was an assistant coach on Arizona's 2004 College World Series team, the same year that Horton led Cal State Fullerton to the national title.

Wasikowski garnered coach of the year consideration in 2018 after leading Purdue to 38 wins and runner-up finishes in both the Big Ten standings and at the Big Ten Tournament. The Boilermakers went 21-2 from April 20 to May 26 to qualify for an NCAA Regional. Wasikowski's team won 13 consecutive games overall (April 20-May 9) and at home (April 24-May 19) during the late-season surge, both streaks tying single-season program records. Purdue earned the No. 2 seed in the Chapel Hill Regional and held the lead at one point in all three of its NCAA Tournament games.

Wasikowski's arrival spearheaded one of the most successful two-year turnarounds in the history of Purdue Athletics. The Boilermakers went from 10-44 and 2-22 in Big Ten play during the 2016 season to 38-21 and 17-6 in the Big Ten in 2018, just his second year.

Wasikowski led the Boilermakers to a 19-win improvement in his first season. It ranked as the greatest turnaround in program history and tops nationally entering the week of the conference tournaments around the country. Purdue returned to the Big Ten Tournament for the first time since 2012 after winning 10 more games in league play. Wasikowski's team joined the 2007 Boilermakers as the only Big Ten teams since 1988 to post a 10-win improvement in conference play.

The 2017 Boilermakers won seven weekend series after having only six such successful weekends from 2013 to 2016. Purdue was 8-3 in one-run games after having a 2-13 record in similar contests the year before. The Boilermakers' 18 true road wins were tied with Minnesota for the most in the Big Ten.

Wasikowski has coached 130 players that have been selected in the Major League Baseball Draft, a list highlighted by 33 big leaguers. During his 10 seasons at Arizona, Wasikowski coached 59 Major League Baseball draft picks and 22 future big leaguers. As the recruiting coordinator, he assembled the Wildcats' 2012 national championship team, leaving for Oregon before the start of the 2011-12 school year.

Wasikowski was a two-time All-West Coast Conference honoree at Pepperdine after spending his first two collegiate seasons at Hawaii and Rancho Santiago Junior College. He was selected by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 1993 MLB Draft, but opted to remain at Pepperdine to finish his bachelor's degree in business administration while serving as a student assistant under Lopez during the 1994 season.

Wasikowski was inducted into the Pepperdine Athletics Hall of Fame along with all of his teammates from the 1992 national championship team. He led the Waves in doubles as a junior and hits as a senior, guiding Pepperdine back to the NCAA Tournament in 1993.

QUITE THE TURNAROUND

• The Boilermakers' 19-win improvement from 2016 to 2017 was tops nationally. Purdue took the next step in year 2 under head coach **Mark Wasikowski**, finishing second in the Big Ten and earning an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament for just the second time in program history. The 28-win turnaround over two years, from 10-44 to 38-21, is one of the most impressive in the history of Purdue Athletics.

• The Boilermakers had the best record (172-110, 75-51 B1G) in the Big Ten from 2008 to 2012, but fell on hard times following their program-record 45-win Big Ten championship season. Coach Waz has the program trending upwards again. The 2018 senior class more than doubled its win total (67-48, .583) from its underclassman seasons (30-78, .278).

PITCHING CARRIED THE LOAD UNTIL TOUGH SERIES AT NEBRASKA

• The Boilermakers surrendered only one run over 19 innings against Penn State the final weekend of March. Purdue's 22 consecutive scoreless innings from the second inning of the March 26 win vs. Valparaiso through the fifth inning of the March 31 victory vs. Penn State represented the team's longest streak since posting 24 straight zeros in May 2016.

• The Boilermakers posted 29 consecutive scoreless innings against Penn State from 2018 to 2019 — 15 straight to finish off a three-game sweep in Central Pennsylvania last season and 14 in a row to begin this year's series.

• Over a 15-game stretch from March 10 to April 3, Purdue compiled a 2.34 ERA, 1.23 WHIP and .243 batting average against. The Boilermakers also posted a .975 fielding percentage. Those marks have helped them go 8-7 during that stretch after opening the season 2-10.

• But things did not go well for Purdue in a three-game sweep at Nebraska the first weekend of April. The Huskers scored 39 runs in the series and scored six-plus runs in an inning four times. Walks and wild pitches doomed the Boilermakers early in the series opener and the 17-0 loss was the most lopsided of the season. But it was costly errors that helped open the door for big innings for Nebraska over the final two games. Purdue conceded eight unearned runs over the final two games of the series.

PURDUE 2ND IN BIG TEN IN Ks PER 9; MOST STRIKEOUTS IN A 3-GAME WEEKEND SINCE 2005

• The Boilermakers rank second in the Big Ten in strikeouts per nine innings, averaging 9.33. With 14 double-figure strikeout games already, they're fourth overall in the league with 276. The 14 games with 10-plus Ks has already matched a program high since 2005.

• Purdue struck out a team-record 18 batters in the 10-inning loss at Indiana on April 10. **James Kulak** led the way with six over 3 1/3 innings and **Bo Hofstra** had five vs. nine batters faced.

• Led by **Trent Johnson** (20 in 9 2/3 innings), Purdue racked up 56 Ks over 45 innings in its first five conference games (11.2 Ks per 9). Things did not come as easy at Nebraska (20 Ks in 24 innings), but the record 18-K game in a non-conference midweek matchup with Indiana followed.

• Johnson has recorded 29 outs in his first four Big Ten appearances, with 20 of those coming via the strikeout. He's one of nine pitchers to already register 20 Ks in conference play this year and the only reliever to accomplish the feat. Johnson's ratio of 18.6 Ks per nine innings is the highest among those nine pitchers by a wide margin.

• The Boilermakers have racked up 30-plus strikeouts in a weekend twice this season, recording a double-figure total in five of those six games. Purdue had 37 Ks in 28 innings vs. NJIT and then fanned 32 batters over 25 innings following weekend at Jacksonville State.

• Three-game series became the norm throughout the season beginning in 2009 when the Big Ten moved away from the four-game weekends that had been utilized for more than two decades. So while Purdue played fewer three-game series prior to 2009, the JSU series still marked only the second time since 2005 that the Boilermakers posted a double-figure strikeout total in all three games of a weekend.

This decade, Cameron Perkins (2012) is the only other Boilermaker with a pair of walk-off RBI in the same season. **Seth Gergely** joined Milo Beam (2017), Nick Dalesandro (2016), Alec Olund (2015), Jeff Evak (2014) and Kevin Plawecki (2010) as freshmen to score the game-winning run in a walk-off this decade.

• McKenzie also delivered a game-tying, two-out double in the ninth inning April 10 at Indiana.

- Of Hunter's 53 career multi-hit games, tops among active Boilermakers, 17 have featured him recording hits from both sides of the plate.
- In 140 career games, Hunter has 180 hits and a .331 average. Of those 180 career hits, 124 have come as a left-handed hitter and 56 as a right-handed hitter. Daryl Hallada (1997-00) owns Purdue's all-time hits record (279) thanks to a .340 career batting average as a Boilermaker. Hallada is also the program's all-time leader with 820 at-bats. PURDUE'S DOUBLE-FIGURE STRIKEOUT GAMES THIS YEAR

- The Boilermakers have posted their 14 double-figure strikeout games, already the program's most since at least 2005, against nine different opponents. They had 30-plus strikeouts in series against both NJIT (37) and Jacksonville State (32). They likely would have reached that the 30-K mark against Penn State (28 over two games) as well had the final game of the series not been canceled.
- Eight different pitchers have led the team in strikeouts during one of Purdue's 10-K games this year. Andrew Bohm has led the way a team-high five times. **Austin Peterson, Trent Johnson** and **Conner Tomasic** have all posted team-high totals as relievers.

JOHNSON IS PURDUE'S ONLY RELIEVER WITH 10-STRIKEOUT GAME SINCE 2005

- Trent Johnson struck out 10 of the 15 batters he faced over 4 1/3 innings of one-hit relief Saturday at Northwestern, becoming just the eighth Boilermaker with a double-figure strikeout game since the beginning of the 2005 season. He's the only member of that group to do it as a reliever.
- By striking out 67 percent of the batters he faced, Johnson accounted for one of the most dominant performances by a Purdue pitcher since 2005. Only six Boilermakers have recorded at least five Ks and struck out more than half the batters they faced, with all-time saves leader and current big leaguer Nick Wittgren accomplishing the feat twice in 2011. Johnson's 10 Ks are easily the most among that group.

WON MULTIPLE ONE-RUN GAMES IN SAME WEEKEND TWICE THIS YEAR

- Already twice this season, Purdue has won a weekend series via a pair of one-run victories. The series wins vs. NJIT and Penn State both included a walk-off win as well. Prior to this year the Boilermakers had not won a pair of one-run games vs. the same team in the same weekend since March 2011. Since the Big Ten moved to three-game weekend series in 2009, the Boilermakers have won a pair of one-run games in the same weekend only six times. The 2012 Big Ten championship team was the last to do it twice.

FASCIA NAMED TO BUSTER POSEY AWARD WATCH LIST

- **Zac Fascia's** defensive excellence behind the plate and presence in the middle of the lineup in his first season as a Boilermaker has earned Purdue's catcher a spot on the initial watch list for the newly rebranded Buster Posey Award (formerly the Johnny Bench Award).
- Fascia has made 23 of his 30 starts this season behind the plate, serving as the starting catcher in 15 of the last 18 games. He has thrown out 12 base stealers in 28 attempts, sharing the league lead with Maryland's Justin Vought (who has a league-high 42 steals against). Fascia has also worked with a pitching staff that is averaging 9.33 strikeouts per nine innings, second best in the Big Ten. The Boilermakers already have 14 double-figure strikeout games this season, a program-high total since 2005.
- Fascia has batted in the middle of the lineup (3-4-5) in all 30 of his starts, making a team-high 25 starts as the cleanup hitter. He leads the Boilermakers with 14 RBI and 13 walks. A 2-for-32 slump from March 13 to 23 has held down his overall numbers a bit early this season.

FOUR-GAME TWO-HIT STREAK FOR EVARTS; HUNTER EQUALLY HOT

- **Nick Evarts** recorded two hits in four straight games from March 22 to 26 (8-for-15, .611 OBP), raising his average over .100 points. He became the first Boilermaker with four straight multi-hit games since Evan Warden in February 2018. Evarts was also just the seventh Boilermaker since 2013 to record multiple hits in all three games of a series or weekend. During the 2012 Big Ten championship season, that was a feat achieved 11 times by Boilermakers, including three times each by first team All-Big Ten performers Eric Charles and Cameron Perkins.
- **Skyler Hunter** posted three consecutive two-hit games in the 2017 season-opening series at Texas State, which was a four-game set. Remarkably, those were the first three games of Hunter's college career, serving as a case of foreshadowing as the junior now has 180 hits in 140 career games and 53 career multi-hit games. The switch-hitter has also posted three straight multi-hit efforts this year (March 9-12). He's batting

.383 (31-for-81) with nine extra-base hits and 16 runs scored since moving to leadoff spot in time for the nightcap of the March 9 doubleheader vs. NJIT. The junior has reached base safely in 25 consecutive Big Ten games.

HOFSTRA JOINS ELITE LIST OF RELIEVERS WITH MULTIPLE SAVES IN SAME WEEKEND

- While being the final pitcher used in each of the last six victories, **Bo Hofstra** recorded a win and three saves over Purdue's first two Big Ten series. Since 2005, Josh Lindblom is the only other pitcher to have a similar impact over the first two weekends of conference play. In 2008, Lindblom registered four saves as Purdue won three of four vs. both Northwestern (home) and Iowa (road) on its way to a 21-win conference record. That was the final season in which the Big Ten utilized a 32-game conference slate with Saturday doubleheaders every weekend.
- Hofstra worked three innings of hitless relief during the conference-opening series Northwestern, earning saves in games 1 and 3 of the series. He became just the fifth Purdue pitcher since 2005 to earn multiple saves in a Big Ten series. Overall, the feat has been accomplished by a closer only 11 times since 2005.

EARLY DEFICITS HAVE TESTED A TEAM STRUGGLING TO SCORE

- Purdue has been outscored 44-10 in the first inning this season, giving up at least one run in the opening frame 20 times. The Boilermakers have still managed to win six of those 20 games, rallying for victory when tied or trailing after seven innings five times. But sustained scoring has been an issue at times. From games No. 6 through 11, Purdue scored in only six of the 55 innings and did not hold the lead at any point during a streak of 52 straight innings. Then the Boilermakers only scored in just one of 36 innings from March 15-19. A nine-run inning in game 2 at Jacksonville State prevented them from losing all four games.
- The marquee win of the season was a shutout. Led by five scoreless innings from **Andrew Bohm**, Purdue limited Texas to just an infield single in a 4-0 win in game 3 of the series. **Bo Hofstra** closed out the win with three innings of hitless relief, retiring the final six batters he faced. The Boilermakers became the first team to shut out UT at home since April 2016.
