GAMEDAY STORYLINES

► **SCENE SETTER:** The 24th-ranked Purdue Boilermakers head to the Garden State for the second straight year when it faces Rutgers on Monday night at The RAC in Piscataway, N.J., at 7 p.m. ET. **Kevin Kugler** and **Stephen Bardo** will provide expert commentary for the Big Ten Network, while **Larry Clisby** and **Rob Blackman** and **Ralph Taylor** will have the call on the radio dial for the Purdue Radio Network. Live stats will be provided on StatBroadcast.com and as always, Twitter updates will be available on Purdue basketball's official account (@BoilerBall).

► **ROAD WARRIORS:** Purdue is 2-1 in "true" road games this year and is looking to move to 2-1 in Big Ten road games on Monday at Rutgers. The Boilermakers are looking for their first 2-1 start in Big Ten road games since the 2011-12 season. Since the start of the 2007-08 season, only Michigan State (55), Wisconsin (55) and Ohio State (44) have more wins on the road than Purdue (43) in Big Ten action.

► **UNDERCLASSMEN LEADING THE WAY:** Purdue's freshmen and sophomores have combined to score 823 of Purdue's 1,408 points, accounting for 58.5 percent of the Boilermakers' scoring. Over the last two games, the group has scored 105 of Purdue's 144 points (72.9 percent). Against Penn State, Purdue's sophomore class scored 41 points, the fourth-most points scored in a game this year by the group.

► **BENCH PRODUCTION:** Purdue's bench production has been sensational this year, as the group has outscored the opposing bench by 363 points, an average of 20.2 points per game, outscoring the opposing bench in every game this year. The group is averaging 34.9 points per game and is shooting 46.9 percent from the field and 36.2 percent from 3-point range, while boasting an assist-to-turnover ratio of 141:78 (1.81). In Big Ten play, the group is averaging 32.0 points per game while shooting 47.6 percent from the field.

► **FROM DEEP:** Questions about Purdue's long-distance shooting have been with the Boilermakers all season long, but Purdue has quieted those for the most part. Over the last three games, Purdue is 24-of-61 (.393) from long distance, including an 8-of-21 (.381) effort against Penn State. In the second half of conference play, the Boilermakers are 17-of-45 (.378) from beyond the arc, including 13-of-30 (.433) over the last three games.

► **STRONG INSIDE PLAY:** A Purdue player has led the Big Ten in blocked shots in six of the last seven years and **A.J. Hammons** is attempting to lead the league in blocked shots for the fourth straight time, something done just once before in league history (PSU's **Calvin Booth**). Purdue ranks 22nd in the country in blocked shots. Meanwhile, Purdue ranks third nationally in 2-point percentage defense (.390) and 40th in 2-point percentage offense (.538).

► **CAN I ASSIST YOU WITH THAT?:** Purdue has dished out at least 15 assists in each of the last four games and ranks 12th nationally in assists per game (18.1). The Boilermakers are seventh nationally in assist rate, despite the fact that it has no player among the Big Ten's top 15 in assists. Purdue has seven players averaging between 1.6 and 2.9 assists per game. Three other players have all dished out at least 10 assists.

► **POLL POSITION:** The Boilermakers entered this week ranked No. 24 in the AP Top 25 poll. It marks the 318th week (10th straight) that Purdue has been ranked in the AP poll and with its No. 9 ranking on Dec. 14, Purdue has been ranked in the top 10 in 116 weeks all-time.

► **ABOUT RUTGERS:** Rutgers enters Monday's game with a 6-12 overall record and an 0-5 mark in Big Ten play. In Big Ten play, he Scarlet Knights are averaging 63.2 points per game, while allowing 86.0 points per contest. Freshman **Corey Sanders** leads the Scarlet Knights in scoring (13.6 PPG) and assists (5.7), while shooting 29-of-79 (.367) from long distance. Sanders is the top-scoring freshman in the Big Ten. **Mike Williams** averages 11.8 points per game and **Bishop Daniels** contributes 9.4 points per game.

► **SERIES HISTORY:** Purdue leads the series with Rutgers by a 6-1 margin and having won four straight games against the Scarlet Knights. The Boilermakers won both meetings last year (61-51 at The RAC; 92-85 at Mackey) and prior to the Scarlet Knights joining the Big Ten Conference before last year, the previous meeting had been in Dec. 1994. Purdue also won an NIT game against Rutgers in 1982, by a 98-65 tally.

■ **PURDUE BASKETBALL HISTORY**

- Purdue is in its 118th season of basketball, owning a 1,727-989 (.636) all-time record. The Boilermakers rank 19th all-time in victories (1,727) and their 63.6 winning percentage is 20th all-time.
- Purdue has had just two head coaches, **Gene Keady** and **Matt Painter**, since the start of the 1980-81 season, a span of 35 years.
- Since the **Ray Eddy** era began in 1950, Purdue has had just six head coaches in 66 years and just eight head coaches in the last 99 years.

■ **NOTES FROM THE PENN STATE GAME**

- Purdue is now 15-3 overall, matching its best 18-game start in the last 22 years. Other teams that started 15-3 were the 2010-11, 2009-10 and 1997-98 squads.
- Purdue is 3-2 in Big Ten play for the fifth straight season.
- Purdue has won nine straight games against Penn State in Mackey Arena and is now 18-2 against the Nittany Lions in Mackey Arena. Matt Painter is now 17-5 against Penn State.
- Purdue is 17-1 in its last 18 games at Mackey Arena.
- Purdue remains the only team in America to outrebound every team. The Boilermakers held a +17 (42-25) advantage on the glass over the Nittany Lions.
- Purdue has now won 30 straight games when shooting more free throws than its opponent.
- Purdue improved to 113-4 under Coach Painter when holding opponents to 59 points or less.
- Purdue's bench has outscored all 18 opponents this year.
- Vince Edwards** tallied a season-high 19 points by shooting 6-of-8 from the field and 4-of-4 from 3-point range. Edwards' four 3-pointers without a miss are tied for the fourth-most 3-pointers made without a miss in school history (school record is five).
- A.J. Hammons** became the seventh player in Big Ten history to block 300 shots. He now has 301 blocked shots during his career.
- Hammons has scored in double-figures in eight straight games -- a career-long streak.
- Hammons moved into 25th place on the school's career scoring list with 1,320 points. He passed Terone Johnson (1,318 points; 2011-14) tonight.
- Caleb Swanigan** moved into eighth place on the Purdue freshman rebounds list (156).

■ **A CLOSER LOOK AT THE BOILERMAKERS**

- Purdue is 15-3 through 18 games for the first time since the 2010-11 team started the year 15-3, while matching the best start for the Boilermakers since the 1993-94 season (16-2). Other teams that have gone 15-3 during the modern era are the 2010-11, 2009-10, 1997-98, 1993-94 (16-2), 1889-90 (16-2), 1987-88 (17-1), 1986-87 (16-2) and 1985-86 (15-3) squads -- 9 teams.
- Purdue has six players averaging between 7.5 and 13.8 points, led by **A.J. Hammons** at 13.9 points per game. However, in Big Ten play, Hammons (15.0) and Vince Edwards (10.6) are the only players averaging in double figures.
- A.J. Hammons** is 30-of-46 (.652) from the field in Big Ten play. The rest of the team is 99-of-236 (.419).
- In Big Ten play from long distance, **Vince Edwards** and **Dakota Mathias** are a combined 16-of-27 (.593). The rest of the team is a combined 21-of-72 (.292).
- Purdue is the only team in America to outrebound every opponent. The Boilermakers rank ninth nationally in rebound margin (+11.1). The school record for rebound margin in a season is 7.6 rebounds per game during the 1969-70 season.
- Over the last two games, opponents are shooting 50-of-102 (.490) from the field. In the season's first 16 games, foes shot just 35.0 percent.
- Purdue has now held 10 teams this year to 59 points or less. The Boilermakers are 113-4 under Painter when holding teams to 59 points or less.
- Purdue continues to lead the country in defensive points per possession (0.85) and is third in field goal percentage defense (.363).
- Purdue has won 30 straight games when shooting more free throws than its opponent, including 12 times this year.
- Over the last 16 games, Purdue is shooting 243-of-318 (.764) from the charity stripe.
- Purdue has held four of its five Big Ten opponents to single digits in offensive rebounds, including in each of the last three games. Over the last two games, foes have grabbed just seven offensive rebounds, while Purdue has 49 defensive rebounds for a defensive rebound percentage of 87.5 percent.
- Purdue has won the turnover battle just three times this year (Vermont, IUPUI, Howard). The Boilermaker have had 15 or more turnovers five times this year, including in three of the last seven games (all losses). In addition, Purdue has forced just 46 turnovers in Big Ten play (9.2 per game).
- Purdue has made at least 10 3-pointers in six games this year, the most since having 10 games of double-digit 3-pointers in the 2011-12 season. Purdue is on pace (35-game schedule) for 290 3-pointers, which would surpass the school record of 284 set in 2011-12.
- Purdue is shooting 37.4 percent from long distance during Big Ten play, ranking fourth in the league during conference games only. Over the last three games, Purdue is shooting 24-of-61 (.393) from long range.
- Purdue's seven "wing" players (not including Haas, Hammons, Swanigan) all have assist-to-turnover ratio better than 1.00.
- Seven of Purdue's 10 rotation players are shooting above 72.0 percent from the free throw line. Last year's team had five players over 72.0 percent.
- Halfway through his freshman season, **Caleb Swanigan** is on pace for 359 points and 303 rebounds (based on a 35-game schedule). He would become the sixth player in school history to record a 300-300 season and the first since **Brad Miller** during the 1997-98 season.
- Purdue's 76.2 percent shooting in the second half against Michigan (Jan. 7) was the best percentage in a half during the **Matt Painter** era and the best since Nov. 14, 1997 vs. LIU Brooklyn (82.1 percent; 2nd half).
- Purdue has already recorded 11 double-doubles through 18 games, which is the most since the 2010-11 season (12).
- Purdue has forced 10 shot clock violations already this year, one year after forcing 19 in 34 games. If you're counting, that 29 in 52 games.

■ SLOW STARTING IN BIG TEN PLAY

- Purdue is now 3-2 in Big Ten play for the fifth straight year and is looking for its first 4-2 start in league play since the 2011-12 season.
- Purdue has started 4-2 or better in just four of **Matt Painter's** 10 seasons at Purdue.

■ IT COMES DOWN TO TURNOVERS

- Purdue has had an issue with turnovers in its losses coming to Butler, Iowa and Illinois. If the Boilermakers can solve those issues, a special season could be on the horizon.
- In Purdue's three losses, the Boilermakers have had 48 turnovers, resulting in 67 points. The losses have come by a combined 27 points.
- Purdue has been outscored by 33 points in the "points off turnovers" category in those three games, clearly making a huge difference in the outcome of those contests.
- Purdue has lost the "points off turnovers" category in seven of the last eight games (lone game Purdue won the category was the Michigan game). During the last eight games, Purdue has been outscored in the "points off turnovers" category by a combined 40 points.
- Meanwhile, Purdue ranks 171st nationally in turnovers per game (12.9), 302nd in turnover margin (-2.28) and 326th in turnovers forced (10.7).
- Since the start of the 2012-13 season, Purdue has ranked 116th, 178th, 228th and now 170th (this year) in turnovers per game. These numbers come on the heels of ranking 53rd (2007-08), 17th (2008-09), 15th (2009-10), 9th (2010-11) and 1st (2011-12) nationally in turnovers per game.
- From the 2008-09 to 2011-12 seasons, Purdue never ranked lower than 24th nationally in turnover margin. From 2012-13 through this year, Purdue has not ranked higher than 230th nationally in turnover margin.

■ REACHING THEIR AVERAGE

- Illinois became the first team since Vermont (which had played one game) to reach their pregame scoring average and field goal percentages entering the game. The Illini scored 84 points and shot 54.2 percent from the field to surpass their averages.
- The Boilermakers have held 15 of a possible 17 opponents under their pregame scoring average. Rutgers enters the game averaging 68.0 points per game.

■ SLOW STARTING

- Purdue has started slow in each of its last six games, a trend it hopes to buck sooner rather than later.
- Through varying points of the first half over the last six games, Purdue opened the game a combined 31-of-105 (.295) shooting. The numbers included are from the Vanderbilt (6-of-22), Wisconsin (8-of-23), Iowa (2-of-10), Michigan (3-of-15), Illinois (3-of-11) and Penn State (9-of-24) contests.
- However, since those slow starts, Purdue has responded to shoot a combined 119-of-235 (.506) against Vanderbilt (15-of-36), Wisconsin (14-of-27), Iowa (21-of-49), Michigan (27-of-39), Illinois (24-of-49) and Penn State (18-of-35) for the remainder of the game.

■ THE MOST EFFICIENT OFFENSIVE GAME

- For the first time since March 20, 2013, vs. Western Illinois, Purdue shot at least 50.0 percent from the field, 50.0 percent from 3-point range and 85.0 percent from the free throw line when it did so against Michigan. It has happened nine times in school history and twice during the Painter era.
- It also marked the first time that Purdue has done that while committing nine or fewer turnovers.

■ CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD

- The Boilermakers have outrebounded all 18 foes this year and rank ninth nationally in rebound margin (+11.1). Dating to last year, Purdue has outrebounded 21 of its last 22 opponents (Wisconsin in the Big Ten Tournament).
- Purdue is the only team in America to outrebound every opponent.
- The school record for rebound margin in a season is 7.6 rebounds per game set during the 1969-70 season.

■ SHARING IS CARING

- Purdue ranks 13th in the country in assists per game at 18.1 per contest. The Boilermakers have dished out at least 20 assists in a game seven different times this year, including in four of the last nine games.
- Purdue has assisted on 66.7 percent of its made field goals this year, a percentage that ranks seventh nationally in assist rate.
- Purdue's 26 assists against Michigan were its most in a Big Ten game since having 29 against Minnesota on Feb. 19, 2000.

■ BOILERMAKERS HOT AT HOME

- Purdue saw its 15-game home winning streak come to an end on Jan. 2, 2016, against Iowa. It marked Purdue's first loss since a 69-60 setback to Maryland on Jan. 10, 2015. The 15-game homecourt winning streak was tied for the sixth-longest streak in Mackey Arena.
- Since the start of last year, Purdue is now 25-4 at home, having won 18 of its last 19 games at Mackey Arena (lone loss to Iowa on Jan. 2).
- Purdue is outscoring opponents by 22.8 points per game in 12 home games this year.

■ LIMITING CHANCES

- Opponents have scored just 116 second-chance points this year, an average of 6.5 per game.
- Over the last three games (Michigan, Illinois and Penn State), the three teams have grabbed just 16 offensive rebounds for a total of 16 second-chance points. Illinois' two offensive rebounds were the fewest allowed in a game since 1986-87, when offensive rebounds became a statistic.
- Purdue has held eight of its 18 opponents to nine or fewer offensive rebounds, including 4-of-5 Big Ten opponents. Purdue leads the Big Ten during league games only in defensive rebound percentage at 79.5 percent (132 defensive rebounds, 34 offensive rebounds).
- Just four teams (Pittsburgh, Howard, Butler and Iowa) have managed to score at least 10 second-chance points against the Boilermakers.

■ BETTER FROM THE LINE

- After starting the season 38-of-59 (.644) from the free throw line in the first two games, Purdue has turned it around at the charity stripe.
- The Boilermakers are 243-of-318 (.764) from the free throw line during the last 16 games.
- In its two Big Ten road games, Purdue is shooting 84.0 percent (21-of-25) from the free throw line.
- Purdue has had seven games this year where it has made 80.0 percent or better from the free throw line. Last year's team had just four games all season of 80 percent or better.
- The school record for free throw percentage in a season is 78.2 percent during the 1968-69 season. This year's average (.745) ranks fifth in school history.
- Purdue ranks 26th nationally in free throw percentage, a significant improvement over the last four years where the Boilermakers ranked 275th (2012), 291st (2013), 261st (2014) and 213th (2015).
- Purdue is close to making more free throws (281) than opponents shoot (292). The Illinois game swung that stat the other way (9-28).

■ LET'S GO FOR A RUN

- Purdue has had 55 runs this year of 7-0 or longer, compared to just 19 for its opponents.
- Purdue has had 19 runs of 10-0 or longer, compared to just two for its opponents (Iowa -- 13-0 run; Illinois -- 10-0 run).

■ NOT WAITING FOR THE WEEKEND

- In games played on Saturday and Sunday this year, Purdue is just 6-3. In games played on weekdays, the Boilermakers are 9-0.

■ TWO-HEADED MONSTER

- Head coach **Matt Painter** has the luxury of having a 7-footer on the floor at all times and the results have been crushing to opponents.
- **Isaac Haas** and **A.J. Hammons** pair to create a rather formidable attack on the inside. The duo is a combined 161-of-266 (.605) from the field and 93-of-129 (.721) from the free throw line.
- The pair averages 23.3 points, 11.7 rebounds and 3.6 blocks per game in 36.2 minutes per game combined.

■ HAMMONS IN ELITE COMPANY

- **A.J. Hammons** is having a terrific senior season and has worked his way into Big Ten Player of the Year and All-America consideration.

- Hammons has scored in double-figures in eight straight games, the longest streak of his career. During those eight games, he is averaging 15.4 points, 7.8 rebounds, 3.1 blocks and 1.3 assists per game while shooting 49-of-78 (.628) from the field.

- He has blocked a shot in 11 straight games and his 301 blocks are the most for an active player nationally.

- He is one of three players nationally to have scored 1,200 points, grabbed 750 rebounds and blocked 250 shots (Austin Peay's **Chris Horton**, Evansville's **Egidijus Mockevicius**).

- Hammons is one of seven Purdue players in school history to have 1,300 points and 750 rebounds (**Robbie Hummel**, **JaJuan Johnson**, **Brad Miller**, **Joe Barry Carroll**, **Walter Jordan**, **Terry Dischinger**).

- Hammons is one of four Big Ten players in league history to have 1,300 points, 750 rebounds and 275 blocks and is the first player in 23 years to do so (Iowa's **Acie Earl**, Ohio State's **Herb Williams**, Purdue's **Joe Barry Carroll**).

- Hammons is the Big Ten's active leader in double-doubles with 19. Thirteen of his 19 double-doubles have come against Big Ten opposition and 17 of the 19 have been against major-conference opponents.

- Hammons currently ranks fifth on the Purdue single-season field goal percentage list., connecting on 62.8 percent of his field goal attempts this year.

- In the second half of games this year, Hammons is shooting 70.0 percent (56-of-80) from the field and 74.4 percent (29-of-39) from the free throw line.

- In Big Ten play during the second half, Hammons is shooting 19-of-26 (.731) from the field while averaging 9.8 points in just 14.0 minutes of play.

- Hammons needs 180 points, 116 rebounds and 49 blocks to become the first player in Big Ten history with 1,500 points, 900 rebounds and 350 career blocked shots. Based on a 35-game season, he would need to average 10.6 points, 6.8 rebounds and 2.9 blocked shots per game to reach those plateaus.

- Hammons ranks 15th nationally in field goal percentage (.628) and 17th in blocked shots (2.63). He joins Evansville's **Egidijus Mockevicius** and Stony Brook's **Jameel Warney** as players to rank in the top 25 of both categories.

- Hammons is 1-of-4 players in America to shoot over 60.0 percent from the field with a minimum of 100 field goal attempts and make at least four 3-pointers (UNC Greensboro's **R.J. White**, Connecticut's **Shonn Miller**, Evansville's **Jaylon Brown**).

- Hammons has more career games of five or more blocked shots (16) than career games of zero blocked shots (13). He has blocked at least three shots in 56 of his 114 career games.

- ▶ Leads the team in steals with 24; 3rd-most steals among all Big Ten players
- ▶ After having four turnovers in the first four games of the year, has had 24 miscues in the last 14 games.
- ▶ Pursuing a graduate degree in Technology and Leadership Innovation.

#3 - P.J. Thompson

- ▶ Averaging 7.3 PPG and 2.7 APG over the last three games off the bench (7-of-16 FGs; 4-of-8 3Ps).

- ▶ Only player in America with at least 30 assists and seven turnovers or fewer.
- ▶ Won the high school 3-point shooting championship during Final Four weekend.
- ▶ Name is in the Basketball Hall of Fame after winning the Elks Free Throw National Championship as a 12-year old.
- ▶ His four 3-pointers vs. Pittsburgh in the second half lifted Purdue to the win.

#20 - A.J. Hammons

- ▶ All-American candidate.
- ▶ Named Big Ten Player of the Week on Dec. 7 and Dec. 28.
- ▶ Wooden and Abdul-Jabbar Award candidate.
- ▶ Averaging 12.8 points and 6.8 rebounds while shooting 65.6 percent (21-of-32) from the field in the last three games.
- ▶ One of two active players with 1,300 points, 750 rebounds and 275 blocks (Austin Peay's Chris Horton).
- ▶ One of three players to rank in the nation's top 25 in field goal percentage and blocked shots.
- ▶ His eight-game double-figure scoring streak is the longest streak of his career.
- ▶ Dominated in the second half against Pittsburgh in the Big Ten / ACC Challenge, finishing the game with 24 points and 12 rebounds; had 17 points and eight rebounds in the second half.
- ▶ Had 24 points in a the Big Ten-opening road win at Wisconsin.
- ▶ Trying to become the second player in Big Ten history to lead the league in blocked shots four times (Penn State's Calvin Booth).

#21 - Kendall Stephens

- ▶ A streaky shooter, Stephens is 5-of-23 (.217) from long distance in last six games, breaking a hot streak of 12-of-26 (.462) from 3-point range in previous four contests.
- ▶ Is 10-of-18 (.556) from inside the 3-point line for the season; recorded first career dunk in win over Michigan.
- ▶ Started year 14-of-32 (.438) from long distance in first four games.
- ▶ Has 30 career games (out of 84 games) of three or more 3-pointers (24-6 record).
- ▶ His 172 3-pointers are the seventh most for an active player nationally in his junior year or younger.
- ▶ Father, Everette, was one of the Three Amigos in the late 80s at Purdue and played in 38 games in the NBA (Indiana, Milwaukee) from 1988-91.

#23 - Jacquil Taylor

- ▶ After missing most of last year with injuries, Taylor received a medical hardship and is considered a freshman for the 2015-16 season.
- ▶ Gives the Boilermakers added depth in the frontcourt.
- ▶ Suffered a Lisfranc fracture in the summer of 2013 (junior year), which hampered his recruiting.
- ▶ Brother, Maurice, is a sophomore forward at Niagara.
- ▶ Aspires to be a filmmaker.

#24 - Grady Eifert

- ▶ A walk-on that gives a good effort every time on the floor.
- ▶ Brother of Cincinnati Bengals' tight end Tyler Eifert.
- ▶ Father, Greg, played basketball at Purdue from 1980-84, appearing in 115 games with 56 starts.
- ▶ Spent last season at Don Bosco Prep in Crown Point, Indiana.

#31 - Dakota Mathias

- ▶ Having a strong start to the Big Ten season, having made 9-of-18 (.500) 3-pointers in Big Ten play.
- ▶ Averaging 6.8 points and leads the team in assists (16) during Big Ten play; shooting 12-of-22 (.545) from the field in four Big Ten contests.
- ▶ Has 11 assists against just two turnovers over the last three games (39 minutes).
- ▶ Can slide over and play the point guard position.
- ▶ Hit a pair of huge 3-pointers in the final 1:18 of the Big Ten-opening win over Wisconsin after Badgers had cut lead to three and four points.

- With a pair of Sweet 16 appearances, six NCAA Tournament berths, Big Ten regular-season and tournament titles and an international gold medal on his résumé, 11th-year head coach Matt Painter is widely regarded as one of the brightest minds in all of college basketball.
- Painter affirmed his long-term commitment to Purdue in March of 2011, agreeing to a new eight-year contract that will keep him in West Lafayette through at least the 2018-19 season.
- Painter has averaged over 21 wins per season during his tenure at the helm of the Purdue program, including at least 20 victories in six of those seasons.
- Painter's tenure has seen Purdue basketball restore its status among the upper echelon of college basketball programs. The last eight years have seen six 20-win seasons and NCAA Tournament berths, two Sweet 16 appearances, a regular-season Big Ten title and a Big Ten Tournament crown.
- The three winningest classes in program history are the classes of 2011, 2012 and 2010, respectively, and five of the 10 winningest individual players Purdue has ever seen have come from the Painter ranks. Success, however, didn't happen overnight.
- Painter officially became the 18th head men's basketball coach in Purdue history on April 1, 2005, and immediately set about laying the groundwork for a dramatic reversal in the program's fortunes.
- The Boilermakers were at their best during the 2009 postseason run, rattling off double-digit victories over Penn State and Illinois to reach the Big Ten Tournament final, where they dispatched Ohio State, 65-61, to earn the first conference tournament crown in program history.
- Painter has also resurrected Mackey Arena as one of the country's best home-court advantages, piling up a 148-32 (.822) record at home over the last 11 seasons, including a remarkable 82-7 (.921) record against non-conference opponents.
- Painter has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year three times in the last six seasons, earning the consensus award in 2008 and 2011, and winning the coaches' vote in 2010. He is one of only six men to win the award more at least three times since its inception in 1974.
- Painter has seen a total of 21 players earn a combined 40 Academic All-Big Ten honors during his tenure as head coach. Painter has also mentored an Academic All-American, as Moore earned second-team honors during the 2009-10 season.
