ATHE STARTING FIVE -- FIVE FACTS TO KNOW

1>> The Boilermakers bounced back Wednesday night with a decisive 82-70 victory over Buffalo. Purdue shot a blistering 52.7% clip from the field, including a 57.9% mark from distance. The defense converted 21 turnovers into 34 points, the most since Dec. 17, 2017, against Eastern Washington. Purdue will close out its non-conference slate against a second consecutive opponent from the Mid-American Conference.

- 2 >> Purdue has scored at least 80 points in two of its first three games for the third time in the Versyp era, joining the 2006-07 and 2018-19 squads. Kayana Traylor (16.7), Tamara Farquhar (12.3) and Brooke Moore (11.3) have powered the Boilermakers in the opening three games
- 3 >> After going 1-for-28 to start the season and missing their last 20 3-point attempts, Purdue knocked down 11 3-pointers against Buffalo. Led by four triples from Brooke Moore, six different Boilermakers connected from outside. The impressive shooting display took Purdue from a 3.6% clip from outside to a 25.5% 3-point percentage.
- 4 >> Already the team's leading facilitator for the last two years, Kayana Traylor stepped up to lead the team in scoring with 16.7 points per game, touching double figures in three straight games for the first time in her career. The junior ranks 14th in the Big Ten in scoring, while her 4.3 assists per
- 5 >> Tamara Farquhar notched her first double-double of the season against Buffalo. With 12 rebounds per game, the senior leads the Big Ten and ranks 14th nationally. Farquhar has grabbed double-digit boards in back-to-back games since the final two contests of her sophomore season. Coming off injury, the Canadian international is also playing a career-high 30.6 minutes per game this season.

- · Purdue put on a shooting clinic in an 82-70 win over Buffalo, tallying its highest-scoring game since Jan. 28, 2018, at Penn State with 88 points.
- The Boilermakers put up 31 points in the third quarter at a 71.4% clip, the most in that frame in more than two years.
- The Boilermakers shot above 50% for the first time since Feb. 16 at Illinois last year.

THE DROUGHT IS OVER

- · Purdue knocked down 11 3-pointers against Buffalo, their highest total since Feb. 17, 2019, with 12 in a game capped off by a Karissa McLaughlin 3-pointer at the buzzer. Six different Boilermakers drained a 3-pointer in the win, led by Brooke Moore's four.
- The 3-point haul was Purdue's seventh game with at least 10 triples since the start of the 2015-16 campaign.
- Entering the game against Buffalo, Purdue was 1-for-28 from behind the arc and had missed it's last 20 3-point attempts
- Technically speaking, Purdue has not lost a game when making a 3-pointer this season.

TOP TAM

- · Tamara Farquhar returned from injury and immediately injected herself at the top of the national charts, leading the Big Ten and ranking 11th in the nation in rebounds per game at 12.
- · Averaging a double-double with 12.3 points and shooting 40%, Farquhar is one of 15 players in the nation to have 12 points, 12 rpg and shoot at least 40% this season.
- Prior to her senior season, Farguhar had 10 games with at least 10 rebounds. She has two so far this year.
- In addition, Farquhar has set career highs in 3-pointers made (1 vs. Buffalo) and assists in a game (6 vs. Buffalo).

- The Boilermakers totaled 21 on 29 made field goals against Buffalo, marking the 16th time in the last six seasons Purdue has had at least 20 assists on less than 30 made field goals in a game.
- Kayana Traylor leads the team with 13 dimes on the year and ranks 12th in the Big Ten, followed by Farquhar with nine.
- · Including just three assists against Valpo, which tied for fourth fewest in a game in program history, Purdue is averaging 13 assists per game.

BOILER NOTES

GETTING TO THE LINE

- Purdue is averaging 17 made free throws per game this season, good for third in the Big Ten behind Northwestern (20) and Nebraska (18.3) and on track for the most in the Versyp era.
- However, Purdue is shooting just 66.2% at the line, 11th in the league.
- Kayana Traylor has made a living at the line making 17 of 21 attempts. The junior is nearly a third of the way to her career-high 64 makes in a year.

TOTALLY TRAYLOR

- From facilitator to scorer, Kayana Traylor is setting the tone for a career year with 16.7 points per game, good for 18th in the league.
- Traylor leads Purdue in scoring (16.7 ppg), assists (4.3 apg), free throws (17) and minutes played (36.3 mpg).
- With three straight games in double-digit scoring Traylor recorded the first such stretch of her career.

CLOSING IN ON 900 PROGRAM WINS

- The Boilermakers are closing in on another massive milestone for program history, 900 victories.
- Purdue currently sits at 882 wins for an average of 19.5 per season.
- The Boilermakers is 40th in NCAA Division I history. Below is a list of the programs within 20 wins of joining the 900-victory club.

STARTERS SHINE

- Purdue has rolled with three different starting lineups this season, with Fatou Diagne, Tamara Farquhar and Kayana Traylor earning a spot in the five for all three games so far.
- The Boilermakers' starting five has averaged 48.3 points per game or just about 70%, getting a little more production out of the bench with 21.3 points per outing.
- The Boilermakers squeezed everything they can out of their starting lineup last season, accounting for 80.2% of Purdue's total points this season.

D UP

- Purdue has forced an average of 19 turnovers a game, which ranks fourth in the Big Ten, and coverted them into 24.6 points per night.
- Against Buffalo, the Boilermakers recorded 34 points off turnovers, the most since Dec. 17, 2017, against Eastern Washington.
- With the graduation of Ae'Rianna Harris, Purdue's blocked shot tally has dropped from 4.6 blocks per game to 2.3.

MADISON MAKING AN IMPACT

- Rookie Madison Layden has made two starts in her early career, making a substantial impact on both ends of the floor.
- The rookie broke the 3-point drought with her first career triple to start the game against Buffalo. She finished with six points on the night.
- In addition to four boards a game, Layden is one of two Boilermakers to record a positive plus-minus in every game this season.

OKAY, SHAY

- Freshman Ra Shaya Kyle made a statement in her first game in the old gold and black, nearly tallying a double-double with 16 points and nine rebounds... IN ONLY EIGHT MINUTES.
- Kyle's nine boards were the most by a rookie in her debut since Sam Ostarello
 The freshman managed just three rebounds in her second outing, but she continues to sit second on the team with six boards per game.

THE NEW ROOKIES

- The anticipated duo of Ra Shaya Kyle and Madison Layden made its debut in the season opener against North Alabama, with Layden earning her first start in the following game.
- After signing their National Letters of Intent in November of 2019, ESPNW ranked the recruiting class at No. 19 in the nation.
- Layden was a two-time Indiana state champion, a runner up for Indiana Miss Basketball and the first player in IHSAA history to lead three different Final Fours in scoring in boys or girls and a four-star recruit and the No. 57 player in the nation by ESPN HoopGurlz.
- Kyle, the tallest player in program history at 6-foot-6, cracked the top-100 scorers in Indiana history, the 47th player in state history to score 50 points in a game, five-star recruit and the No. 36 player in the nation by ESPN HoopGurlz.

KT'S DIMES

- Junior guard Kayana Traylor makes her return to the point for her third season in West Lafayette poised to break into the career top-25 in assists, currently 25 away from Janon Roland with 259 in 24th place.
- The Martinsville, Ind., native ranks 14th in program history with a 1.23 assist-to-turnover ratio.
- Traylor was the seventh Boilermaker to deal at least 100 assists in each of her first two seasons.
- She led the Boilermakers in assists 31 times over her career and posted 21 games with at least five assists.
- Traylor has basketball in her blood. Her mother (Danielle) played at LSU, her father (Jeff) at lowa and aunt (April) at Florida State. She also has three sisters who are up-and-coming talents on the prep stage.

FATOU FINDING A WAY

- Fatou Daigne has had a productive start to the year with 7.3 points and five rebounds per game to go along with a 63.6% shooting clip.
- The Senegalese international took tremendous strides during the 2019-20 season, posting career highs with 3.5 ppg and 4.1 rpg.
- Diagne missed Purdue's 2019 Australia Tour due to playing with Senegal in the Women's AfroBasket, in which she helped the Lionnes reach the championship game against Nigeria.
- During the early stages of the pandemic isolation stages, Diagne helped raise money for orphanages back in her native Senegal.

WE WANT SOME MO

- Brooke Moore scored a Purdue season-high 20 points against Buffalo on 7-of-15 shooting with four triples. She ranks third on the team with 11.3 points per game.
- The junior transfer was declared immediately eligible at the start of November, slating her to make an immediate impact.
- A two-year player at Auburn, Moore averaged 6.8 ppg and 2.3 ppg.
- The 5-foot-7 guard was ranked as the No. 11 guard in the nation coming out of high school.

SPLASH HARDIN

- · Cassidy Hardin knocked down her first triple of the year against Buffalo.
- The Bargersville, Ind., native has 31 career games with at least one 3-pointer, 17 with multiple triples.
- Hardin is a career 30.1% shooter from deep with 62 of her 69 made field goals coming from distance.
- The junior's enjoyment for knocking down triples carries over even when she goes home, spending much of her free time shooting in her indoor halfcourt setup.

- The 2017 Indiana Miss Basketball has led the Boilermakers in 3-pointers made all three seasons with 75, 88 and 71 triples, respectively.
- The senior needs seven 3-pointers to break Courtney Moses' all-time record of 240 career triples. McLaughlin is currently second.
- McLaughlin is a career 36.6% shooter from behind the arc, good for ninth in program history.

- The "Splash Sisters" accounted for 265 3-pointers since the start of the 2018-19 season.

 With more than 100 dimes in each of her three seasons, she is the fifth player in program history to amass 100 assists as a freshman, a sophomore and a junior.
- McLaughlin earned her undergraduate in selling and sales management.
 She will begin her graduate program in technology leadership and innovation at Purdue next semester.

SPECIAL STALLINGS

- Ajah Stallings played a career-long 31 minutes in her first career start against North Alabama.
- An inspiration to the local basketball community, Stallings was a threestar recruit and Honorable Mention All-State at North Central High School.
- Stallings overcame a damaged brachial plexus at child birth, the network of nerves that sends signals from the spinal cord to the shoulder, arm and hand, that limited the range of motion of her right arm, stopping her from flattening or rotating her palm.
- In addition to her achievements on the court, Stallings enrolled in the College of Pharmacy and received her white coat in the fall of 2020.

DOOOOOM-BIA

- Rokia Doumbia, while being forced to sit out due to NCAA transfer regulations, has made an impact during practices, alongside fellow transfer Brooke Moore.
- The Mali international spent two seasons at Arkansas, playing 55 games over two years, averaging 3.3 ppg and 4.2 rpg as a sophomore in 2019-20.
 Prior to her time with the Razorbacks, Doumbia was a four-star recruit and was also named the MVP of the FIBA U16 Africa Championship in 2015 for her native Mali.

TOWERING TALLS

- The Boilermakers have some serious height on the roster this season, with the average height at 5-foot-11 and one-quarter inches.
- Ra Shaya Kyle is tied for the tallest player in program history at 6-foot-6, while Fatou Diagne and Rickie Woltman both check in at 6-foot-4.
- Purdue has six players standing at least 6-feet tall on the 2020-21 roster.

♠ COVID-19 CHANGES

2020 ADJUSTMENTS

- Due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, the Boilermakers will face a year unlike any other.
- Playing a shortened 25-game regular season, Purdue will play five non-conference games and 20 contests in the Big Ten.
- Unfortunately, fans will not be allowed at Mackey Arena this season for the first time in program history.
- After the cancellation of the Cancun Challenge, the Boilermakers do not have a non-conference tournament/event on the schedule, also a program first.

MAKING THE MOST OF ISOLATION

- After the 2019-20 roster saw its postseason dreams crushed by the (100% correct) decision to cancel the NCAA Tournament for safety purposes, Coach Versyp was instrumental in helping the Boilermakers find their ways home.
- All but two student-athletes were able to return home, while Fatou
 Diagne remained in Indiana due to strict travel restrictions back to
 Senegal, and Tamara Farquhar stayed in West Lafayette to actively rehab
 her knee injury.
- While scattered all over the world, Versyp held multiple Zoom chats each week with the team to ensure each student-athlete's well-being.

NEW-LOOK MACKEY

- Mackey Arena will have a decidedly different look to it without fans this season, as only family members will be allowed to watch the game.
- In an effort to keep a secure bubble around the student-athletes, only certain tested individuals will be allowed on the event level, in addition to student-athletes being tested daily throughout the season.
- The benches have been separated by at least three feet, forcing support staff to sit behind the scoring table, which has also been pared down.
- Players will have masks on while on the sidelines. Each student-athlete will have a small pale next to her assigned seat that will have multiple water bottles, a towel and other necessities to recover on the sideline.
- Purdue's marketing team continued its successful fan cutout program, after nearly 2,000 were purchased for football season. An even higher number is expected for the hoops campaign.

MEDIA CHANGES

- A limited number of media and photographer credentials will be issued during the 2020-21 season. All requests must be made at least 48 hours prior to tip by emailing lan MacDougall.
- There will be no media or photographer access to the floor or event level.

 There will be no in-person interviews.
- All interviews will be conducted via Zoom over a link that will be sent through email to credentialed media.
- Aside from a pregame flipcard, there will be no printed materials provided to the media. All stats can be found via PurdueStats.com. A postgame book will be posted to PurdueSports.com within an hour of the game's end.

"SHARON VERSYP SHOW" RETURNS

- The new season of the "Sharon Versyp Show" debuted two weeks before the season in a new location, the Kissel Center at Ross-Ade Stadium.
- Host and voice of the Boilermakers Tim Newton and Coach Versyp chat from 7-8 p.m. every Monday night about the previous week, the upcoming opponents and other behind-the scenes nuggets.
- Fans can listed on 95.3 BOB FM or by logging onto the Purdue Athletics Facebook page or the Purdue Women's Basketball Twitter feed.

DIGITAL PROGRAM

- With no fans in attendance Purdue Athletics created a digital program that will be updated several times throughout the year.

- Burke served as the Purdue Athletics' leader from 1993 to 2016 and helped the Boilermakers navigate into the modern era.
- He had an impact on the women's basketball team, heading the department during the 1999 national title run and the hiring of Sharon Versyp.

- Boilermakers the option to play multiple bigs in the post at the same time.

 Despite playing in 15 games as a sophomore compared to 31 as a freshman, she shot a career-best 40% from the field last year.
- Gony had an active offseason being named to the Big Ten Anti-Hate and Anti-Racism Coalition in early fall.

SIGNING THE NEXT GENERATION

- Head coach Sharon Versyp made another big splash on the recruiting trail in November, signing a quartet of prep stars to National Letters of Intent.
- The Boilermakers will welcome Sacha Washington (Georgia), Ava Learn (New York), Skye Williams (Ohio) and Jayla Smith (Indiana) to West Lafayette next summer, as the Class of 2021 was ranked No. 22 in the nation by ESPNW.
- In addition to the Class of 2020 being tabbed No. 17 last year, Versyp has signed a top-25 recruiting class 13 of her 15 seasons.

NEW CAPTAINS

- A week prior to the season, the players elected a their captains for the year Fatou Diagne, Tamara Farquhar and Kayana Traylor.
- The trio represent the 87th, 88th and 89th captains in program history.
 Together, Farquhar and Diagne mark the first time that two international student-athletes were captains at Purdue.
- · Farquhar is the 20th multi-year captain in Purdue history.
- The record for most years served as a captain is three, held by Drey Mingo, FahKara Malone and Carol Emanuel.

BIG SHOES TO FILL

- The Big 3 is no more. Gone are Ae'Rianna Harris and Dominique Oden to graduation, and Karissa McLaughlin will be out for a considerable amount of time due to offseason surgery.
- The trio accounted for 60% of Purdue's scoring last year and 51% of all points over the previous four seasons.
- Oden set the program record for most minutes played and games started, while finishing her career with 1,755 points for seventh in program history.
- Harris etched her name in the Purdue record book more than 25 times, including the all-time blocks record for men and women.
- Combined, the graduated duo accounted for 2,303 points, 1665 rebounds, 520 assists, 391 blocks and 322 steals over the previous four seasons.
- The trio were named All-Big Ten each of the previous two seasons, and Harris was named back-to-back Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year.

SOPHOMORE JUMP

- The 2020-21 campaign will offer two of Purdue's three sophomores to take a jump during their sophomore seasons.
- Rickié Woltman appeared in 19 games before her freshman year came to a close early due to injury. The St. Louis native has rehabbed and worked on her mid-range game to offer Versyp another option in her offensive arsenal.
- Bria Harmon found the floor just three times during her first year in West Lafayette, but the former Georgia First Team All-State selection has shown promising improvement during the offseason.
- Roxane Makolo suffered a major injury a few weeks before the season opener and will miss the entire campaign.

WELCOME BACK, TAM

- Tamara Farquhar's return from injury provides the Boilermakers with another key experienced veteran in the lineup.
- Prior to her season-ending injury at the start of Big Ten play in 2019-20,
 Farguhar had made 54 straight starts.
- The Canadian international was a complimentary piece in the post with Ae'Rianna Harris for two seasons and looks to build a new relationship with Fatou Diagne, Ra Shaya Kyle, Rickie Woltman and Nyagoa Gony.

A NEW YEAR

- Purdue entered 2020-21 with a trio of returning starters, despite one that will be sidelined for considerable time, from a squad that went 18-14 overall and 8-10 in the Big Ten Conference last season.
- The Boilermakers have a trio of players set to make their debuts in the old gold and black Sunday night, including the No. 19-ranked recruiting class of Madison Layden and Ra Shaya Kyle.
- Head coach Sharon Versyp entered her 15th season at the helm of her alma mater, now, five wins shy of her 300th victory in West Lafayette.
- Purdue's senior class of four is its largest since the 2011-12 season with six, when the Boilermakers lifted the Big Ten Tournament Championship.

FIGHTING OFF THE INJURY BUG

- The Boilermakers welcome back several players who were forced to miss the later stages of the 2019-20 season due to injury, all credit to athletic trainer Jessica Lipsett.
- Senior Tamara Farquhar remained in West Lafayette throughout the spring and summer to rehab a knee issue. After constant work, she was cleared full-go around the first practice of the fall.
- Rickie Woltman bounced back from a knee ailment that sidelined her in February to be ready for the season opener.
- The biggest setback was the offseason surgery to Karissa McLaughlin that led her to being ruled out for the season back in early July. The 2017 Indiana Miss Basketball has made notable strides in her rehab.

A LOOK BACK OVER THE LAST FEW MONTHS

- After going blow-for-blow with No. 6 Maryland in the Big Ten Tournament, the Boilermakers were set to reach their 27th NCAA Tournament in program history.
- When the NCAA made the (correct) decision to cancel the postseason tournament, head coach Sharon Verysp worked to ensure the student-athletes were able to make it home. Only two players did not return home.
- Tamara Farquhar stayed in West Lafayette to rehab an injury, while Fatou Diagne remained in Indianapolis to stay with her brother.
