GAME NOTES

- This is the 40th season in Purdue Women's Basketball history. The Boilermakers are 770-407 all-time.
- Purdue is 184-88 under head coach Sharon Versyp, who is in her ninth season with the Boilermakers. She has a career record of 301-153.
- Purdue is 92-26 in November, including a 19-10 record on the road. It was the first game in Boilermaker history on Nov. 14.
- The Boilermakers are 33-7 all-time in season openers, including 13 consecutive wins dating to 2002.
- Purdue leads the all-time series with Ball State, 17-5, including 14 straight wins over the Cardinals.
- The Boilermakers are 128-57 all-time against teams from Indiana, and 493-184 when playing in their home state. It was Purdue's first game in Muncie on Dec. 8, 1996.
- Purdue is 59-17 all-time against the Mid-American Conference, including eight straight wins.
- Purdue outrebounded the Cardinals 40-33. Including 16 offensive rebounds.
- The Boilermakers assisted on 13 of 17 field goals, and had six different players with two assists.
- Purdue scored 18 points off of 18 Ball State turnovers, turning the ball over just 13 times themselves.
- Ball State's 4,012-person attendance was its third-largest in school history.

GAME HIGHS AND LOWS

- Whitney Bays fell shy of her ninth straight double-digit rebounding game, posting 14 points and nine rebounds. She also added two assists, two blocks and two steals.
- Ashley Morrisette had a career-high 16 points in her first collegiate start.
- Andreona Keys had 12 points, four rebounds and a pair of steals in her collegiate debut, including a six-for-six showing at the charity stripe.
- Bridget Perry finished with 10 points, five rebounds, two assists and a pair of steals.
- Liza Clemons added eight points and seven rebounds, going three-for-three from the floor.
- Perry and Hayden Hamby both made their first collegiate starts.
- Freshmen Bree Horrocks and Justine Hall both played in their first collegiate games.
