# HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Currently in his 16th season as the leader of the program, Schreiber is the program's all-time leader in overall wins and Big Ten wins. He eclipsed Dave Alexander's record for games coached (792 over 14 seasons) during the second weekend of the 2013 season. Schreiber played for Alexander at Purdue from 1983-86.

Purdue unveiled its new Alexander Field stadium and facilities during the 2012-13 school year, but the inaugural season at the new ballpark turned out to be a rebuilding year for the Boilermakers after losing 15 seniors and three junior MLB draftees from the 2012 Big Ten championship team.

In the five seasons between 2008 and 2012, Purdue went 172-110 overall (.610) and 75-51 in Big Ten play (.595). Both records represented the best marks in the league. The Boilermakers were the only conference team to qualify for the Big Ten Tournament each of those five seasons, the longest such streak in program history. Purdue has won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in eight of its nine appearances under Schreiber.

During its historic 2012 season, Purdue won a program-record 45 games, captured a pair of Big Ten titles, earned the right to host an NCAA Regional and closed out Lambert Field in thrilling fashion. Schreiber was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year after leading the Boilers to the most wins by a Big Ten team since 2008. He won his 400th and program-record 408th career games at Lambert in the spring of 2012. His 408th victory as the leader of the program, April 15 in the finale of a series sweep of Illinois, made him Purdue's all-time wins leader.

The Boilermakers began the 2012 season 14-1, won 10 consecutive games twice, posted their 20th win before April 1 for the first time, reached the 30-win mark at the earliest date (April 20) in program history and won their first Big Ten title since 1909. In its 16 games during the final year at Lambert, Purdue won three times in walk-off fashion and locked up the Big Ten title May 12 in front of a large group of program alumni.

Headlined by Kevin Plawecki's selection 35th overall by the New York Mets, Purdue had a program-record seven players picked in the 2012 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. Juniors Plawecki, Cameron Perkins and Nick Wittgren were each selected in the first 10 rounds to give the Boilers three players drafted in the first 300 picks for the first time. Highlighted by Big Ten Player and Pitcher of the Year honors for Plawecki and Joe Haase, Purdue had a program-high eight all-conference honorees in 2012.

Purdue's 37 overall wins in 2011 tied the program's previous single-season record and were the most in the Big Ten. Despite being picked eighth in the preseason coaches' poll, the Boilers finished third in the league with a 14-10 conference record, just one game shy of first. Purdue finished second in the Big Ten standings under Schreiber in 2001, 2005 and 2008.

Schreiber has coached 62 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 22 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft on 30 occasions. One of Schreiber's Boilermakers has led the Big Ten in hitting in four out of the last nine years.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha, finishing as regional runners-up to Auburn.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including first all-time in walks (132), tied for first in games played (226), sixth in runs scored (159) and tied for eight in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

# – BOILERMAKERS HOST PENN STATE FOR FIRST HOME WEEKEND –

After spending its first seven weekends of the season on the road, Purdue finally gets a chance to play a series at home as it welcomes Penn State to Alexander Field for the first time for the second weekend of Big Ten play for both teams.

First pitch is set for 6:30 p.m. Friday, 2 p.m. Saturday and noon Sunday. The Big Ten Network is set to televise games one and three live, with Friday's game marking the BTN's first live telecast at Alexander Field.

The Boilermakers (5-19, 1-2 Big Ten) have won six straight series against PSU (13-13, 2-0 Big Ten) dating back to 2008, taking 17 of the 21 meetings during that span. However, the Nittany Lions enter the weekend as the hottest team in the Big Ten, winners of four straight and eight of their last 10. First-year head coach Rob Cooper, who spent nine seasons as the skipper at Wright State, is one of two new head coaches around the Big Ten this year.

Purdue posted its first-ever series sweep at Penn State last year. **Kyle Johnson** (6-for-11, 4 RBI, 3 walks), **Mike Lutz** (Win, 3 App, 6 1/3 IP, 0 R) and **Jack Picchiotti** (6-for-13, 2 RBI, 2 runs) all shined in the series. Johnson won Big Ten Player and Freshman of the Week honors, becoming the only freshman in the league a year ago to win POW honors. **Jordan Minch** (8 IP, 5 H, 1 R, 5 K) performed well in his first career Friday start in Big Ten play and **Sean McHugh** delivered the go-ahead single with two outs in the 10th inning of game two.

Lutz worked a scoreless inning of relief in each of the first two games at Penn State last season, closing out the series-opening win. But he really shined on a rainy Easter Sunday victory, pitching out of numerous jams in 4 1/3 innings of scoreless relief. Johnson and Picchiotti both hit safely in all three games of the series.

Inclement weather prevented PSU a chance of finishing off a conference-opening sweep of Northwestern last weekend in Central Pennsylvania. The Nittany Lions improved to 7-0 at home with Tuesday's midweek win against Youngstown State, their best start at home since 1980.

Penn State center field Steve Snyder enters the weekend leading the Big Ten in batting average (.398) and on-base percentage (.496) after hitting safely in 21 of his last 22 games. Left-hander Tim Dunn will get a chance to take the ball on a Friday in Big Ten play for the first time in his career. The senior has surrendered just one earned run on eight hits over 15 innings this season. Purdue faced both of PSU's other two projected starters – T.J. Jann and Nick Hedge – in the opener of the series in University Park last season.

The Boilermakers' 36-21 record (.632) against Penn State during head coach **Doug Schreiber's** 16-year tenure represents the team's most wins and best winning percentage against any Big Ten rival during that span. Purdue will need to have a better showing at home in conference play after posting an unfathomable 1-11 mark in league action during the inaugural season at Alexander Field a year ago.

This weekend marks the beginning of a home-heavy stretch for the Boilers, in which they will play 12 of their 16 games at home over the next 24 days. Penn State, Michigan and Ohio State all visit West Lafayette during that stretch and series victories will be a necessity with two of the final three weekends of conference play being on the road.

Michigan State played its first home game Wednesday, leaving Northwestern as the only Big Ten team yet to play at home this season. Michigan State, Northwestern and Purdue are the only teams around the conference yet to have a home weekend after MSU and NU both had to move their Big Ten-opening series to different sites due to weather. That changes this weekend as all three teams are scheduled to play at their home fields.

The Boilermakers have won the opening game of the last two weekends only to end up losing the series. Winning on Friday behind Minch is always the preferred way to start a weekend and perhaps an even more crucial element this year with the lack of a dependable Sunday starter right now. Purdue has not rallied to win a traditional weekend series after losing the opener since May 2009. On nine occasions since then, the Boilers have taken the open but dropped the series.

On the first Friday of April a year ago, Purdue defeated Northwestern in the opener of a series at Alexander Field for its fourth consecutive Big Ten win. But the Wildcats came back to take the series and the Boilers were realistically not in contention for a Big Ten Tournament berth the rest of the year.

# **BOILERS DROP THREE STRIAIGHT AFTER 4-2 STRETCH**

• Purdue won four of its six games from March 19-28 but enters its first home weekend of the season having lost three straight while being outscored 32-10. The Boilermakers struggled in many facets of the game in an 18-5 loss at Illinois-Chicago Tuesday, committing a season-high four errors and giving up six runs in an inning twice. Purdue surrendered four or more run in an inning 12 times in its first 14 games. But while playing better over the last few weeks, big innings for the opponents were non-existent over an eight-game stretch. But the opposition has scored four-plus in an inning three times in the last two games.

• Each of the last two weekends, the Boilers have won the opener but ended up losing the series. **Mike Lutz** induced a game-ending 1-2-3 double play with the bases loaded and Illinois' No. 3 hitter up in the March 28 Big Ten opener for both teams. The Fighting Illini won games two and three to take the series. Purdue has lost five straight weekend rubber games dating back to May 2012. The Boilermakers have not won a weekend series after losing the opener since May 2009 at Michigan State. In the years since, on nine occasions Purdue has won the opener of a traditional three-game set but failed to win the series. Seven of those nine series have been in Big Ten play.

# **STACKED SCHEDULE**

• Purdue is challenging itself with a 2014 schedule that features numerous quality opponents. Indiana, LSU and Louisville all qualified for the 2013 College World Series and were preseason favorites in their conferences this year. Rice, San Diego State and Illinois were also NCAA Regional teams a year ago.

• The Boilermakers' strength of schedule ranked fifth nationally in the Boyd's World ISR as of April 3. Purdue's opponents have compiled a combined 319-213-2 (.599) record this year after posting a combined mark of 618-460 (.573) last season. The 10 teams that the Boilers have already played have compiled a 158-114-1 (.581) record this year.

# **BOILERMAKERS AMONG BIG TEN LEADERS IN FIELDING & DOUBLE PLAYS TURNED**

• Purdue's solid play defensively has been one of the bright spots during the first half of the season. Entering the weekend, the Boilermakers lead the Big Ten in double plays turned (29 in 24 games). They're also second in fielding percentage (.972), committing a league-low 25 errors in the 24 games. Unfortunately, nine of those 25 errors have come in the last four games. Nebraska leads the league in fielding percentage (.973) and is second in double plays turned (24 in 29 games). Purdue was tied for fourth nationally in double plays per game this week.

• **Sean McHugh** has also impressed individually with his play behind the plate. The senior has thrown out 16 base stealers (who are 12-of-28 with McHugh behind the plate) to lead the Big Ten. Base stealers are 16-of-33 against Purdue overall. Only Michigan State (19, 19-of-38) has thrown out as many runners as McHugh and the Boilers.

# **OVERLAPPING HIT & REACHED SAFELY STREAKS**

• **Sean McHugh, Conner Hudnall, Brandon Krieg and Kyle Wood** all enter the weekend riding notable streaks.

• McHugh's career-best 12-game hitting streak, the longest by a Boiler since 2011, was snapped March 30 in the finale of the Illinois series. But he has still reached base safely in 14 consecutive games. The senior has also reached base safely in 11 consecutive Big Ten games dating back to last season.

• **McHugh's 12-Game Hit Streak (March 9-29): .365 (19-for-52), 4 2B, 2 HR, 7 RBI, 8 R, 4 BB**

• **McHugh's 14-Game Reached Safely Streak (March 9-Present): .339, 6 XBH, 6 BB, .418 OBP**

# **TIGHT FIVE-GAME WEEK**

• Purdue had a chance to win all five games the week of March 17-23 but ended up going 2-3 after losing twice in extra-innings and failing to capitalize on some early scoring chances Sunday at Southern Illinois en route to getting shut out for the third time in 2014. The finale of the wraparound series at San Diego State went 10 innings and the middle game of the SIU series wasn't decided until the bottom of the 16th.

• **Sean McHugh** (14-for-36, 7 RBI) and **Kyle Johnson** (11-for-31, 5 RBI) hit safely in all eight games of spring break. They accounted for the first three home runs in the history of Southern Illinois' new Itchy Jones Stadium. Unfortunately, four of the seven runs that the Boilers scored in the series came on the long ball. McHugh and Johnson both went deep with two outs and the bases empty Saturday. Purdue was 2-for-24 with runners in scoring position in the series. The Boilers (31) and Salukis (40) left a combined 71 men on base in the series.

• **Jack Picchiotti** (9-for-24, 6 walks), **Conner Hudnall** (10-for-34, 6 RBI) and **Brandon Krieg** (9-for-23) also enjoyed productive spring breaks at the plate. Purdue recently compiled a team ERA of 2.43 over a six-game stretch (March 19-28). The strong showing dropped the team ERA from 2.11 runs per game from 8.88 on March 17 to 6.77 entering game two of the Illinois series. But the last three losses, including the 18-5 loss at UIC, have caused it to spike again.

### McHUGH NAMED TO JOHNNY BENCH AWARD WATCH LIST

- **Sean McHugh** was among the four catchers added to the Johnny Bench Award Watch list on March 20. He joins Indiana's Kyle Schwarber, Ohio State's Aaron Gretz, Nebraska's Tanner Lubach and Michigan's Cole Martin as the Big Ten backstops on the list. Purdue's Kevin Plawecki was one of three finalists for the award in 2012, the year in which Plawecki was named the Big Ten Player and Year and Tournament's Most Outstanding Player.
- McHugh has hit safely in 16 of the last 17 games. He has thrown out 12 of 24 base stealers and leads Purdue with a .333 batting average and nine extra-base hits. He is one of three Boilers that have started every game.
- McHugh nearly single-handedly lifted Purdue to a 3-2 series-opening win at Southern Illinois March 21. He connected for a two-run homer as part of a four-hit effort and also scored the go-ahead run in the ninth inning.

- **Sean McHugh** and **Kyle Johnson** both hit solo homers and a trio of relievers worked out of numerous jams to extend the game into the 16th inning, but Purdue lost its longest game since 2004 in walk-off fashion, 5-4, at Southern Illinois March 22. The extended affair matched the longest game in program history. In April 2004, the Boilers defeated Ohio State on a 16th-inning walk-off at Lambert Field.
- Highlighted by home walk-off wins against Indiana (12 innings), Louisville (10 innings) and Michigan State (14 innings), Purdue won five consecutive extra-innings games from April 2011 through March 2013. But the Boilers have now dropped their last four extended affairs, losing twice in extras to Iowa at the end of the 2013 campaign as well games at San Diego State and Southern Illinois over spring break this year.

### IRONMEN IN THE BULLPEN

- Relief pitchers **Mike Lutz** (15 appearances), **Joe Eichmann** (14) and **Tim McElroy** (12) have been busy this season. All three have appeared in at least half of the first 24 games. They've all pitched in the same game three times (games one and three at Rice and at Samford) this season. Lutz appeared in seven of the first eight games, including six straight from Feb. 17 through March 1 (games 3-8). That was the longest streak for a Purdue pitcher since at least the beginning of the 2008 season. Lutz shares the Big Ten lead in appearances (15 in Purdue's 24 games) as of April 3. Nebraska's Zach Hirsch (13 in 29) and Indiana's Scott Effross (15 in 25 games) are even with Lutz in appearances. Eichmann is fourth in appearances.
- Eichmann has excelled at stranding inherited base runners this year, allowing only three of 20 to score this season. All three runners he allowed to score came in one game (game two at San Diego State). He has entered the game with at least one runner aboard in 12 of his 14 outings. He has stranded multiple runners on five occasions.
- Eichmann and Lutz both took the mound in all three games of the series at No. 11 Rice. Eichmann also pitched in all three games at Illinois. Prior to last season when Brett Andrzejewski (3 times), McElroy (Michigan series) and Lutz (twice) each accomplished the feat, no Purdue pitcher had appeared in every game of a weekend series since May 2009 when Conner Sestak did so in all three games of a weekend set vs. Indiana.
