Purdue heads to Wisconsin for second B1G road trip of 2015

The Boilermakers look to win in Madison for the first time since 2003.

THE GAME

- Purdue heads to Wisconsin for the 83rd meeting between the schools.
- Wisconsin leads the series 29-45-8 and the Badgers have won the last nine meetings.
- Purdue's last two wins in the series were both in Madison - in 2000 and 2003.
- Wisconsin has two coaches on staff who have previously coached at Purdue, Tim Tibesar and Ted Gilmore.
- Purdue graduate assistant Zach Opsal was a long snapper at Wisconsin from 2007 to 2009.
- The Boilermakers have a bye week after facing Wisconsin.

FIRST(S) AND 10

- Freshman tight end Cole Herdman caught his first career touchdown last week against Minnesota.
- Purdue's offense scored a touch-

down on its first possession last week. It was the first time the Boilermakers have done so since the Indiana State game earlier this season.

- Purdue shut Minnesota out in the first quarter. It's the first time the Boilermakers have shutout their opponent in the opening quarter since Indiana State.
- Garrett Hudson made his first career start on defense last week against Minnesota. He finished with three tackles.
- D.J. Knox's rushing touchdown against Minnesota was his first since the season opener at Marshall.
- Sophomore middle linebacker Ja'Whaun Bentley missed the first game of his career last week. He had started all 17 games of his career.
- Markell Jones finally had his first rush for negative yards last week. Jones had 62 straight carries without a negative rush to start his career.
- Danny Ezechukwu picked off his first pass of the season last week against Minnesota.
- Leroy Clark was first on the team with 11 tackles last week. That total is a career high.
- Purdue is looking for its first win over Wisconsin since 2003.

DAVID BLOUGH

- David Blough was named the starter on Tuesday, Sept. 22, prior to Purdue's game against Bowling Green.
- Blough is Purdue's 10th different starting quarterback since the 2008 season.
- In his first start, Blough was 29-39 for 340 yards and two touchdowns, with one interception, which came

THE DARRELL HAZELL FILE



Darrell Hazell was named the 35th head coach in Purdue football history on Dec. 5, 2012. He signed a six-year contract with the Boilermakers. Hazell is in his third year at

Purdue, after spending two seasons as the head coach at Kent State.

Hazell (HAY-zull) was named the 2012 Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year after leading Kent State to arguably its most successful season ever, with an 11-3 record and MAC East Division championship. The 11 wins set a school record.

Prior to his time at Kent State, Hazell spent seven seasons at Ohio State, where he served as an assistant head coach and wide receivers coach under Jim Tressel. Hazell has spent 28 years in the college coaching ranks, and has previous stints as Rutgers (2001-03), West Virginia (1999-2000), the U.S. Military Academy (1997-98), Western Michigan (1995-96), Pennsylvania (1992-94), Eastern Illinois (1988) and Oberlin (1986-87, 1989-91).

Hazell graduated in 1986 from Muskingum College with a B.A. in speech communications and business. He was a three-time all-conference selection as a wide receiver and an All-American as a senior.

A native of Cinaminson, N.J., Hazell (born April 14, 1964) and Annmarie have a son, Kyle.

- with three seconds left.
- Blough is one of just three freshmen in school history to throw for 300+ yards in his first career start.
- Blough is the first quarterback, and freshman, at Purdue to throw for at least 300 yards since Danny Etling at Indiana in 2013.
- Blough is Purdue's first quarterback to complete 74 percent or more of his passes (with multiple attempts) since Austin Appleby did so against Illinois in his first career start last season (15-20, 75 percent).
- Blough's two touchdown passes were 40 yards and 62 yards. The 62-yarder was Purdue's longest play of the season at the point.
- Blough had a stretch where he completed 13 straight passes in his starter debut against Bowling Green.
- Blough also scored his first career rushing touchdown against Bowling Green. He snuck it in from one yard out on fourth down to tie the score at 7.
- Blough accounted for 351 yards and three touchdowns in his first career start.
- Blough's 340-yard passing performance against Bowling Green is the fifth best by a Big Ten quarterback this season.
- Only three Big Ten quarterbacks have passed for more yards in a game this season.
- Blough is the 20th quarterback in Purdue history to have a 300+ yard passing game.
- Blough's 340 passing yards rank fifth-most in a single game by a Purdue freshman.
- Blough's 340-yard passing effort was the 52nd time in program history a Purdue quarterback has thrown for at least as many yards.
- Against Michigan State, Blough was 15 for 31 for 136 yards and a touchdown, against one interception, which came on a fourth down.
- Blough was recruited to Purdue in 2014 and redshirted last season.
- He was a three star prospect out of Carrollton, Texas, and was named an Elite 11 quarterback.
- Blough amassed 57 total touchdowns in his high school career at Creekview High School, and threw for more than 5,800 yards in three seasons.
- Trent Dilfer said of Blough after the Elite 11 camp, via ESPN.com, "David is so fiercely competitive. He's so determined to be the best he possibly can be. He doesn't let the pressure of that weigh him down."
- Blough was the top quarterback at

the Elite 11 camp in 2013 after the initial list was revealed.

- The 2013 Elite 11 include:
Sean White, who was named the Auburn Tigers' starter the same day as Blough.
Kyle Allen, who is the starter at Texas A&M.
Will Grier, who is the starter at Florida.
Jerrod Heard, who is the starter at Texas.
Brad Kaaya, who is the starter at Miami (Fl.).
Deshaun Watson, who is the starter at Clemson.
DeShone Kizer was at the Elite 11 camp, but did not finish in the final 11. He is the starter at Notre Dame.
- Blough saw his first career action against Indiana State. He was 0 for 1 passing and had one rush for one yard.
- Against Virginia Tech, Blough was 3-7 passing for 11 yards.
- Blough is the third quarterback in the last three years to take over the reins mid-season.
- The last Purdue quarterback to start every game in a season was Caleb TerBush in 2011. Including the 2008 season, just two quarterbacks have started every game in a season since (also Joey Elliott in 2009).

NATIONALLY RANKED

- Antoine Miles is tied for 16th in the country with two forced fumbles.
- Markell Jones ranks 29th in the country and fourth among freshman with a 6.24 yards per rush average.
- Ja'Whaun Bentley is 41st in the country with 5.2 solo tackles per game.
- Bentley is tied for 26th with 1.5 tackles for loss per game.
- Bentley is tied for 17th in the country with 9.8 tackles per game.
- Joe Schopper is 30th in the country, and third among freshmen, with a punting average of 43.7 yards.
- DeAngelo Yancey is tied for 32nd in the country with 18.71 yards per reception.
- Purdue's defense is t-23rd in the country in fourth down defense, allowing conversions on just 33.3 percent of occasions.
- Purdue's defense is t-23rd in the country with five fumble recoveries.
- Joe Schopper's 69-yard punt is the longest in the Big Ten this season and the 14th longest in the country.
- Purdue's 95 offensive plays at Marshall is the most in a game by a Big

Ten team this season.

- Purdue's pass defense in Big Ten games ranks third in the conference, allowing just 110.5 pass yards per game.
- Purdue is third in Big Ten games in net punting, with a net of 40.6 yards per punt.
- Purdue is the least penalized team in Big Ten games, with just two penalties for 20 yards. The Boilermakers did not commit a penalty against Minnesota.

YOUNG, TALENTED RUNNING BACKS

- Purdue's top two running backs both recorded their first career carry in the season opener at Marshall.
- **D.J. Knox (So.)** rushed 22 times for 102 yards and scored the first touchdown of the season for Purdue from four yards out in the first quarter.
- Knox is the first Boilermaker to rush for 100+ yards in his first career start in a season opener since Raheem Mostert did so last year, and the second since Ralph Bolden's first start during his sophomore season in 2009.
- Knox is the first Boilermaker to rush for over 100 yards in his first season-opening game carrying the ball for Purdue since Mel Gray rushed for 104 yards against Stanford in 1982.
- Knox followed up the performance with 91 yards on 16 carries against Indiana State.
- Knox has 80 carries for 315 yards, 3.9 yards per carry, and two touchdowns this season.
- **Markell Jones (Fr.)** had 12 carries for 72 yards, including a 36-yard touchdown in the third quarter, at Marshall.
- Jones had 67 yards on 14 carries, including a touchdown, against Indiana State.
- Jones had a 60-yard touchdown run against Virginia Tech, which was then Purdue's longest offensive play this season.
- Jones had his first career start at Michigan State and rushed 22 times for 157 yards, 7.1 yards per carry, and two touchdowns, including a 68-yarder in the fourth quarter. That run is Purdue's longest play this season.
- Jones started his career with 62 straight carries before his first for loss.
- Jones broke Purdue's all-time true freshman rushing record with 157 yards on the ground at Michigan State. The previous record was 146

by Mike Northington at Iowa on Nov. 3, 1973.

- Jones averages 6.2 yards per carry.
- Jones had the second-most rushing yards in the Big Ten in week five. He rushed for 157 yards on 22 carries, a 7.1 average, and scored two touchdowns at Michigan State.
- Only Ohio State junior Ezekiel Elliott rushed for more in week five, as he had 274 yards on the ground at Indiana.
- His 157 yards at Michigan State is tied for the 45th-best rushing performance in program history.
- Only 18 Boilermakers, including 17 running backs, have rushed for more yards in a game than Jones did against Michigan State.
- Jones had the second-most points scored in week five in the Big Ten with 12.
- Knox led Purdue in receptions at Marshall, while Jones did so against Indiana State.
- Knox and Jones touched the ball a combined 40 times and did not have a single negative play at Marshall.
- Knox and Jones both hit the century mark rushing in their first career start.

FRESHMEN PILOTING THE OFFENSE

- Redshirt freshman **David Blough** took over as Purdue's starting quarterback prior to the team's game against Bowling Green.
- True freshman running back **Markell Jones** made his first career start at Michigan State.
- Not only are Blough and Jones freshmen who have started at offensive skill positions, both are working to become pilots.
- Jones is working on a degree in aviation technology, while Blough picked it up over the summer with the intention to major, before deciding on another field. Blough is in enough classes to obtain his private pilot's license.
- Blough and Jones both flew all summer, including solo flights, while balancing football workouts.
- In Blough's first career start, he had the fifth-best all-time performance by a Purdue freshman, throwing for 340 yards and two touchdowns.
- In Jones' first start, at No. 2 Michigan State, he rushed for a Purdue true-freshman record 157 yards and two touchdowns.

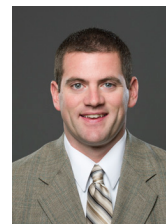

- 12** The Boilermaker defense has recorded 12 sacks through the first six game this season.
- 11** The 11 FBS teams on Purdue schedule are a combined 47-19, a .712 winning percentage, this season.
- 10** Freshman tight end Cole Herdman had a 10-yard touchdown reception last week, his first career score.
- 9** The Boilermakers have thrown nine touchdown passes this season.
- 8** Eight different Boilermakers have recorded a takeaway this season, led by Danny Ezechukwu and Anthony Brown, who both have two.
- 7** Six years ago to the day of Saturday's game, Purdue snapped a five game losing skid by knocking off No. 7 Ohio State 26-18.

completed 68 of 127 passes for 694 yards and four touchdowns, against five interceptions, though two on fourth downs, in three starts.

- Purdue's leading rusher is true freshman Markell Jones, who has 66 carries for 412 yards, 6.2 yards per carry, and five touchdowns.
- Sophomore D.J. Knox is Purdue's second-leading rusher, and has started five games. He has rushed 80 times for 315 yards and two touchdowns.
- Junior DeAngelo Yancey leads the team in receiving yards with 318.
- Purdue has scored 155 points this season, including 126 by position players (non-kicking). Here is the breakdown:

Juniors: 36

- Freshmen offensive linemen Martesse Patterson and Kirk Barron have seen regular playing time, including one start by Patterson.
- Sophomore Gregory Phillips has two touchdown receptions in his last three games, including a 62-yarder against Bowling Green.
- Redshirt freshman tight end Cole Herdman made his first career start at Michigan State. He has nine catches for 68 yards and a touchdown this season.
- Junior wide receiver Cameron Posey has 10 catches for 139 yards and a touchdown.
- Purdue's top two tacklers are sophomores, led by linebacker Ja'Whaun Bentley with 49 tackles. Danny Ezechukwu has 40, as well as a 90-yard fumble return touchdown.
- Junior Leroy Clark is third on the team in tackling, while juniors Robert Gregory and Andy James Garcia are fourth.
- Purdue's defense has 41 tackles for loss this season. Here is the breakdown:

NOT YOUR AVERAGE FRESHMAN

- Purdue freshman Jarrett Burgess turned 25 on August 25.
- Burgess played five seasons of minor league baseball after being selected in the sixth round of the 2008 Major League Baseball draft by the Seattle Mariners.
- Burgess played outfield and pitched,

throwing 97 miles per hour off the mound, during his career in rookie and 'A' ball.

- Burgess came to Purdue during the summer after not playing organized football for more than 10 years, as he did not play in high school.
- Burgess comes from a football-heavy family, as his dad, Fernandez, was a wide receiver for the New York Jets and Miami Dolphins, and his uncle James Burgess, played two seasons as a linebacker for the San Diego Chargers. Jarrett's cousin, James Jr., is a senior linebacker at Louisville.
- Against Virginia Tech, Burgess had his first career touch with a 29-yard rush, which set up a field goal, to the game at 17.
- Burgess scored his first career touchdown, and first touchdown in more than a decade, as he did not play high school football, against Bowling Green on a 5-yard plunge in the third quarter.
- Burgess is not the only football player in the country that began their professional career in another sport:
- Hayden Hurst, a 22-year-old freshman tight end for South Carolina played baseball in the Pittsburgh Pirates organization prior to playing for the Gamecocks.
- Morgan James, a 25-year-old freshman offensive lineman for Cincinnati, played minor league hockey prior to joining the Bearcats football team.
- Melvin Ray, a 26-year-old senior wide receiver for Auburn, was a 33rd-round draft pick of the Los Angeles Dodgers in 2008.
- Tyler Stovall, a 26-year-old sophomore wide receiver and holder for Auburn, was a second-round draft pick of the Atlanta Braves in the 2008 MLB draft. He also played in the Kansas City Royals system.
- Andy Phillips, a 26-year-old junior kicker at Utah, spent five years after high school competing on the U.S. National Ski Team as an alpine racer.
- Wallace Gonzalez, a 22-year-old redshirt freshman tight end at Utah, spent three seasons in the Houston Astros' organization after being selected in the 29th round of the 2011 MLB draft.

MOVING UP PURDUE'S RANKINGS

- Austin Appleby moved into the top 20 for career touchdown passes with 16. He is tied at No. 20 with Danny Etling.
- Appleby has moved into 14th for ca-

reer completion percentage with a minimum of 300 attempts. Appleby has completed 53.9 percent of his passes (209-388).

- Appleby's 209 career completions move him into 19th on the Purdue charts. He is 29 shy of Danny Etling, who is in 18th.
- Paul Griggs climbed into the top 20 at 13th in total points scored. Griggs now has 176 for his career. He is six points shy of 12th.
- Griggs has made 29 field goals in his career, which ranks sixth in program history. He is two shy of fifth.
- Frankie Williams picked off the eighth pass of his career against Bowling Green. He is now tied for 14th.
- Williams had one PBU at Michigan State, which gives him 21 for his career. That ranks tied for 20th in program history. He is one shy of 19th, two shy of 16th, three shy of 15th and four shy of 13th.

THE 'BACKERS ARE BACK

- Purdue returns all three starting linebackers from last season with Ja'Whaun Bentley, Danny Ezechukwu and Jimmy Herman.
- Purdue's linebacking corps, which comprises 11 individuals, has three juniors, four sophomores and four freshmen.
- Purdue is one of just three schools in the country to return all three linebacker starters and have all three with remaining eligibility after this season (also New Mexico State and UCLA).
- **Ja'Whaun Bentley** (So. - MLB) was voted as a captain by the team on Aug. 21. He is Purdue's first sophomore captain since Raheem Mostert in 2012.
- Bentley is Purdue's top returning tackler from 2014, after starting all 12 games and amassing 76 tackles, including 3.5 for loss, three fumble recoveries and an interception.
- Bentley was named to ESPN.com's True Freshman All-America team and USA Today Sports Freshman All-America team.
- Bentley led the team with 10 tackles, including 1.5 for loss, at Marshall.
- Bentley had a career high 3.0 tackles for loss against Virginia Tech and tied his then-career high with 11 total tackles.
- Bentley had a career high 14 tackles against Bowling Green.
- Bentley was second on the team with nine tackles at Michigan State,

including 1.5 for loss.

- He leads the team with 49 tackles so far this season, including 7.5 for loss.
- He missed the Minnesota game with an injury
- **Danny Ezechukwu** (So. - OLB) started six games last season as a redshirt freshman. He finished the season with 43 tackles, including 3.0 for loss, 1.5 sacks, two forced fumbles and an interception.
- Ezechukwu had a career-high 12 tackles at Nebraska a week after racking up 10 at Minnesota. He had 34 tackles over the final five games last season.
- In the season opener at Marshall, Ezechukwu had two tackles, and followed it up with five tackles, including 1.0 for loss, vs. Indiana State.
- Ezechukwu scored his first career touchdown against Virginia Tech on a 90-yard fumble recovery. The play is tied for the second-longest fumble return in program history, and longest since 1966.
- Ezechukwu's touchdown is the first fumble recovery for a touchdown for Purdue since 2011.
- He finished the Virginia Tech game with five tackles.
- Ezechukwu had 10 tackles against Bowling Green and eight against Michigan State.
- Last week against Minnesota, Ezechukwu had an interception, a sack, a tackle for loss and 10 total tackles.
- **Jimmy Herman** (Jr. - OLB) started eight games last season and appeared in 10, missing two with an injury. Herman finished the season with 56 tackles, including 1.5 for loss. He finished with eight tackles in four different games.
- Herman had four tackles, including 0.5 for loss, in the season opener at Marshall.
- Herman had a big game against Indiana State with eight tackles, a career high 2.5 for loss, including 0.5 sacks.
- Herman had four tackles against Virginia Tech.
- Herman missed the Bowling Green and Michigan State games with an injury.
- Herman was back in the starting lineup against Minnesota and had seven tackles, including 1.0 for loss.

- Purdue returns all five starters on the offensive line, and six guys who started at least seven games up front last season.

- **Jordan Roos** (Jr. - Right guard) started all 12 games last year and has 24 for his career.
- **Jason King** (Jr. - Left guard) has started 23 straight games.
- **J.J. Prince** (Jr. - Tackle) started nine games at left and right tackle last season and has 11 career starts.
- **Cameron Cermin** (Jr. - Tackle) started eight games at tackle last season and started at right tackle all six games this season.
- **David Hedelin** (Sr. - Left tackle) started the final seven games of the season last year and has started every game, except the Indiana State game, this season.
- The group helped Purdue increase its rushing total by 91 yards per game from 2013 to 2014.
- The group allowed 14 fewer sacks in 2014 than the offensive line did in 2013.
- The group paved the way for 11 more rushing touchdowns in 2014 than in 2013 - nearly triple the total number.
- Purdue is one of nine schools in the country that returns five starters on the offensive line (also Ball State, Boise State, Bowling Green, North Carolina, Ole Miss, Oregon State, Texas, Washington State).
- Thirty-four other schools return four offensive line starters, including Purdue opponents Indiana and Michigan State.
- The Boilermakers return five starters on the offensive line, and six guys who started at least seven games up front a year ago, for the first time since 1963, when Purdue had 11 different guys start on the line that season, after having 10 in 1962.
- **Martesse Patterson** (R-Fr. - Left tackle) started his first career game earlier this season against Indiana State.

AUSTIN APPLEBY

- Austin Appleby was named the season-opening starting quarterback on Aug. 25, after starting the final seven games of the 2014 season. He started the first three games this season.
- Appleby has appeared in 14 games, including 10 last season. He is 209-388-17 for 2,186 yards and 16 touchdowns.
- This season, Appleby had career highs in completions (31), interceptions (4) and tied his career high with 48 pass attempts at Marshall,

and also set career highs in touch-down passes (4) and yards (289) vs. Indiana State.

- Appleby is Purdue's fifth different opening day starting quarterback in the last five years. No Purdue quarterback has started the season opener in consecutive years since Curtis Painter in 2006, 2007 and 2008.

the last 31 games heading into the season.

- **Cameron Cermin**, a junior tackle, has been named to the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award Watch List for the top offensive player from Texas who has overcome adversity, especially injury.

CAPTAINS

- Darrell Hazell announced team captains at the team's Kickoff Luncheon on Aug. 21.
- Hazell named seniors Danny Anthropol, Robert Kugler and Frankie Williams captains, as well as sophomore Ja'Whaun Bentley.
- Kugler earned captain status for the second year in a row.
- Bentley is the youngest captain Hazell has ever had. He is Purdue's first sophomore captain since Raheem Mostert was the special teams captain as a sophomore in 2012.
- Captains were voted on by the team. The vote was for upperclassmen, though one slot was opened up for a possible write-in. Bentley was written in by the majority of the team.

- Purdue had five first time starters at Marshall:

- Last season, the Boilermakers had six first time starters for the season opener, with two on offense and four on defense.
- In 2013, the first year of the Darrell Hazell head coaching era, the Boilermakers had five first time starters.
- **Jordan Jurasevich (Sr., TE)** started the first game of his career against Virginia Tech.
- **Martesse Patterson (R-Fr., OL)** started his first career game at left tackle against Indiana State.
- **Joe Schopper (Fr., K-P)** started the first game of his career at punter against Virginia Tech. He had six punts for 296 yards, an average of 49.3 yards, including the longest punt in the Big Ten this season, a 69-yarder into the wind, which ended at the 2-yardline.
- **David Blough (R-Fr., QB)** made his first career start against Bowling Green and threw for 340 yards and two touchdowns, and added a touchdown on the ground.
- **Markell Jones (Fr., RB)** made his

first career start at Michigan State and rushed 22 times for a Purdue true-freshman record 157 yards and two touchdowns.

- **Cole Herdman (R-Fr., TE)** made his first career start at Michigan State and had two catches for two yards.
- **Garrett Hudson (So., LB)** started his first career game against Minnesota and finished with three tackles.

FIFTEEN-YEAR SALUTE

- The 17th-ranked Boilermakers were back on the road at Wisconsin on Oct. 21 and won an overtime thriller 30-24.
- On the opening possession of the extra session, Craig Terrill blocked a 58-yard field goal by the Badgers' Vitaly Pisetsky, and Ashante Woodyard picked up the ball and scampered 36 yards for the game-winning touchdown.
- On third down, Akin Ayodele came up with a sack, leading to the mammoth field goal attempt. Purdue trailed 17-14 midway through the third quarter before taking its first lead of the game on a 78-yard touchdown pass from Drew Brees to Seth Morales. On that play, Brees became the Big Ten Conference career passing yards leader, passing Chuck Long of Iowa (1981-85).
- The Boilermakers led 24-17 midway through the fourth quarter, but Wisconsin tied it with 3:50 remaining. Purdue had seven sacks for the second game in a row, led by Ayodele with three.
- Winners of three in a row, the Boilermakers now were 6-2 overall and 4-1 in the Big Ten. Next up was a home date with Ohio State.

ANTHROP-LOGY

- Purdue football's version of Anthropology focuses on senior wide receiver Danny Anthropol.
- Anthropol led Purdue in receiving seven straight games last season, including the Nebraska game, where he incurred a season-ending injury.
- Anthropol had two 100-yard receiving games, and a third with 99 reception yards: Southern Illinois (106), Michigan State (133) and Illinois (99).

- Anthropol also finished the 2013 season on a high with 151 receiving yards and a touchdown on five catches.
- Anthropol seemed to be the piece that kept Purdue's offense going, as in the eight games he was fully healthy, the Boilermakers averaged 28.3 points per game. In the other four, including at Nebraska where he was injured, Purdue averaged just 15.0 points per game.
- Anthropol surpassed 1,000 for his career against Virginia Tech.
- For his career, Anthropol, from West Lafayette, Ind., has 81 catches for 1,179 yards and seven touchdowns.

QUARTERBACKS ON THE FIELD

- The Boilermakers played three different players that were recruiting to Purdue as quarterbacks in 2012, and a fourth recruited quarterback.
- **Robert Gregory**, listed as the starting free safety on the depth chart, came to Purdue in 2012 as a dual-threat quarterback. That fall, he volunteered to switch positions to running back. Gregory was a reserve running back in 2013, before switching to safety in spring before the 2014 season. Gregory won the Hammer Award, given to the player who is the most outstanding hitter during spring practice, in 2014 and 2015. He made his first career start at safety at Marshall and had six tackles. Gregory recorded his first interception against Indiana State and finished the game with three tackles.
- **Bilal Marshall** came to Purdue in the same recruiting class as Gregory. He switched to wide receiver after one season as a reserve quarterback. Marshall has shown promise through fall and spring practices, including being named the offense's Most Improved Player during this year's spring ball. He played, though did not record any stats at Marshall. Against Indiana State, Marshall caught his first career pass for nine yards, which set up a Purdue touchdown.
- **Austin Appleby** was also a member of the 2012 quarterback recruiting class. He stuck with the position and made his 10th straight start for Purdue against Virginia Tech.
- **David Blough** was recruited in the 2014 class, after being named an Elite 11 quarterback in 2013. Blough redshirted in 2014 and made his first career start against Bowling Green, after playing sparingly against Indiana State and Virginia Tech. Blough also started at Michigan State and against Minnesota.

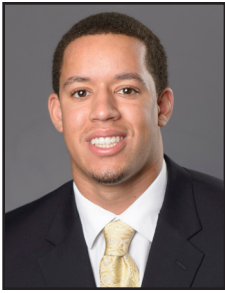
