BOILERMAKERS HOST MSU FOR FIRST SATURDAY HOME GAME SINCE 2009

• Purdue begins its stretch run by hosting Michigan State for the first time since the 2011 Big Ten opener. It will be the Boilers' first Saturday home game since defeating Valparaiso on Sept. 5, 2009, over what was Labor Day Weekend that season. Purdue also hosts Indiana (Oct. 25) and Michigan (Nov. 1) on Saturdays for the final two games of the regular season.

• The Boilmakers will be looking to end a five-game losing streak as well as a five-game winless drought (0-4-1) vs. Michigan State. Purdue has not beaten MSU since 2008 after winning eight of nine meetings from 2000-08. The Boilers have been outscored 11-1 during their current five-game losing skid. The one goal over five games represents the team's fewest over a five-game stretch since 1999.

HAIRSTON BREAKS ASSISTS RECORD IN LOSS AT MARYLAND

• **Alex Hairston** setup **Makaela Nellams'** goal in the third minute at Maryland for her 23rd career assist, breaking the Purdue all-time record in the process. She had tied Lauren Sesselmann's program benchmark with two assists in the Sept. 14 win vs. Ohio State, her team-record sixth career multi-assist effort.

• The new assists mark is the first prominent Purdue all-time record to change hands since Jessica Okoroafo eclipsed Sesselmann's goals record in 2009.

• Nellams also scored in the OSU win off a Hairston assist. Nellams is the 10th different Boilmaker that Hairston has helped setup a goal for. Hairston has also assisted on five of **Maddy Williams'** 15 career goals, making her the most frequent goal scorer among Hairston's assists.

NELLAMS NETS HER FIRST TWO IN BIG TEN PLAY

• **Makaela Nellams** scored her first collegiate goal in the Ohio State win Sept. 14 and also found the back of the net early in the Oct. 2 loss at Maryland. She's the fifth Boilmaker to score her first career regular-season goal this year, joining **Delia Repasky**, **Soraya Toppin-Herbert**, **Nicole Robertson** and **Erika Arkans**. But Nellams is the first Purdue player to record her first goal in a Big Ten game since **Kate Fowee** in 2012 vs. Wisconsin. She also joined **Mollie Kuramoto** as active Boilers to score each of their first two collegiate goals against Big Ten rivals.

• Nellams' third-minute score at Maryland was the earliest of the season for Purdue and the team's quickest since **Alex Hairston** found the back of the net 31 seconds after the opening kickoff in the win at Ohio State last year.

19 DIFFERENT STARTERS, 11 DIFFERENT LINEUPS

• Having used three different starting goalkeepers along with seven freshmen all starting at least once, Purdue has had 19 different players start a game this year. That's the tied for the second most in program history. The Boilmakers had 16 different players start last season, the fewest since 2003. Purdue has used 11 different starting lineups in its first 14 regular-season games.

• Sophomore **Delia Repasky** was the latest Boiler to make her first career start, doing so at Rutgers Oct. 5. Including the seven freshmen, she's the ninth Boiler this year to start for the first time.

SEASON-HIGH FOUR GOALS AGAINST SINK PURDUE AT RUTGERS

• Suffering their first true blowout loss of the season, the Boilmakers surrendered three goals in a span of 18 minutes in the first half in the Oct. 5 loss at Rutgers. Purdue gave up four scores for the first time since October of last season at Michigan State. Penn State also scored three in the first half against the Boilers a year ago. Goalkeepers **Erika Yohn** (six) and **Jordan Ginther** (three) did team up to make nine saves, a season-high total for Purdue.

• Oct. 2 at Maryland, the Boilers lost for the first time this year after holding the lead. They had not lost when scoring first since Oct. 24 of last season vs. Indiana, also a 2-1 result. **Makaela Nellams'** goal at Maryland ended Purdue's scoring drought at 272 consecutive minutes.

PURDUE TAKES ON NATIONALLY-RANKED OPPONENT IN FOUR STRAIGHT WEEKENDS

• With games against No. 8 Penn State, No. 22 Illinois, No. 13 Wisconsin and No. 25 Rutgers over the first four weekends of Big Ten play, the Boilers played a nationally-ranked opponent four weekends in a row for the first time in program history. However, in 2005 Purdue played four nationally-ranked teams over a stretch of six games. The first two games of that stretch were played on the same weekend. The Boilers are still in search of their first victory against a ranked foe since August 2009 at No. 6 Texas A&M.

PURDUE DROPS CONSECUTIVE 1-0 GAMES FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 2006

• While hosting Minnesota and Wisconsin for the third year in a row, the Boilers dropped each game in 1-0 fashion after both opponents scored off headers in the second half. Purdue had not lost consecutive 1-0 games since the last two games of the 2006 season – vs. Illinois at the Big Ten Tournament and at Marquette at the NCAA Tournament. It had not happened at home since October 2004 vs. Wisconsin and Michigan.

• Each of Purdue's first five losses this season came in shutout fashion, including four 1-0 results. The six shutouts are the most since the 2004 team was also blanked six times. However, the four 1-0 losses have already matched a program high. The 2004 and 2008 teams also lost four times in 1-0 fashion.

• The Boilmakers were blanked in three straight games for the first time since October 2012.

LASKY'S CONSECUTIVE MINUTES STREAK HIGHLIGHTS IRON WOMAN QUARTET

- Defender **Mikayla Lasky** has played every minute of the season (1294) and has now logged 2,721 consecutive minutes since last year. She was inserted into the lineup full time at halftime of the game at Kansas on Sept. 1 last season and has not left the field since.
- Mollie Kuramoto** (1268 of 1294 minutes), **Kim Love** (1264) and **Vanessa Korolas** (1247) have also been iron women this season. Kuramoto and Love have gone the distance in 11 of the first 14 games. Korolas has played every minute of a game 10 times.
- After playing every minute of 2012, Love missed the first three games last season due to injury. She returned to the lineup in time for the Kansas game and went on to play every minute of the final 15 games, logging 1,472 consecutive minutes. The junior left the field in the 2014 season opener vs. Miami (Ohio) for the first time as a Boilermaker. She had gone the distance in each of the 35 games she had played since the start of 2012.

GINTHER RETURNS AS STARTING GOALKEEPER, MAKES CAREER-HIGH EIGHT SAVES

- Jordan Ginther** returned to the starting goalkeeper role in time for the Sept. 26 game against Minnesota, seeing her first action since having to leave the Aug. 29 match against Ball State after the mid-game lightning delay. She made a career-high eight saves in the Wisconsin loss, matching **Erika Yohn** for the highest save total by a Purdue goalkeeper this year. Yohn's eight saves Sept. 12 against Penn State were the most by a Boilermaker since the 2012 season finale.

BOILERS LOOKING TO END POST-SEPTEMBER STRUGGLES

- As the calendar turns to the 10th month of the season, Purdue will be looking to find more October success than in recent seasons. The Boilermakers have lost each of their last six games the last two years and are 6-23 after Oct. 1 dating back to 2010. However, this season Purdue has the advantage of having already played three of the top four teams (Penn State, Wisconsin and Illinois) in the Big Ten standings entering the month of October.

ARKANS BECOMES FIRST FRESHMAN TO SCORE GOLDEN GOAL

- Erika Arkans** scored in the 104th minute at Northwestern Sept. 19 to lift Purdue's to its 13th all-time overtime win. She joined **Alex Hairston** (2012 vs. Eastern Illinois) and **Taylor Niewoit** (2012 at Nebraska) as active Boilers with a golden goal on their collegiate résumés. Arkans also became the first Purdue freshman to score an overtime goal. She leads the team with three game-winners this year.
- Arkans also assisted on **Mollie Kuramoto's** goal at Northwestern, which opened the scoring in the 24th minute. Kuramoto scored her first goal in Big Ten play since October 2011 at Minnesota. She's already the eighth Boiler to score this year.

PURDUE WINS 11TH STRAIGHT VS. NORTHWESTERN

- The Boilermakers' overtime victory at Northwestern Sept. 19 was their 11th consecutive in the series, extending their longest streak against any opponent in program history. Coincidentally, the streak began with an overtime win in Evanston in 2005. Purdue's 14 wins vs. the Wildcats are the most against any opponent in program history and its 6-2 record in Evanston is also good for its top winning percentage at any Big Ten foe.

HAT TRICK ENDS PURDUE'S STRONG STRETCH OF DEFENDING

- Purdue's improvements defensively are a big reason why the team had a chance to win each of the first nine games this season. The Boilermakers did not concede more than one goal in any of those nine games, the longest streak of its kind since the 2009 team also went nine straight games without allowing multiple goals. Through nine games last year, Purdue had conceded 20 goals.
- The Boilers' nine-game streak ended Sept. 21 at Illinois when Big Ten scoring leader Janelle Flaws posted a hat trick in the final 10 minutes of the game. It was the first hat trick against Purdue since Minnesota's Taylor Uhl scored three times at the Boilermaker Soccer Complex in October 2012.
- Though they lost the game 1-0, the Sept. 12 Big Ten opener against No. 8 Penn State marked the first time since 2007 that the Boilers limited PSU to a single goal. Purdue lost last year's game at Penn State, 6-1.

WILLIAMS THE FASTEST BOILERMAKER TO 15 CAREER GOALS

- Maddy Williams'** third career multi-goal game helped lift Purdue to a 3-1 victory against Ohio State Sept. 14 live on the Big Ten Network. She became the first Boilermaker to score multiple goals in a Big Ten game since Kellie Phillips recorded a hat trick in an October 2011 home victory against Indiana.
- With four goals in the last four games and five for the season, Williams has increased her career total to 15. While accomplishing the feat in just 26 career games, the sophomore is the fastest player in program history to reach the 15-goal benchmark. Previously, Annette Kent (30 games) had set the standard. Of the three players that scored 15 goals before their 40th career game, all went on to finish their career with at least 30. Jessica Okoroafo, Lauren Sesselmann and Kent also rank one-two-three in program history in goals.

THREE STARTING GOALKEEPERS IN FIRST FIVE GAMES

- Freshman goalkeeper **Erika Yohn** started six straight games from Sept. 4-21, joining **Jordan Ginther** and **Maddy Olsen** as Boilers to start at goalkeeper this year. Never before had three different goalkeepers started at least one game in the same year for Purdue, much less it happening in the first five games of a season. Ginther started the first three games before a thigh injury sidelined her during the Aug. 29 win against Ball State. With Yohn still recovering from a shoulder injury, Olsen took over for the rest of the BSU win and started the SIU Edwardsville victory.
- The Boilermakers also used three different goalkeepers in the same season in 2013, 2012, 2010, 2009, 2002 and 2001.

REPASKY'S FIRST COLLEGIATE GOAL HIGHLIGHTS COMEBACK WIN AT MARSHALL

- **Maddy Williams** scored on her first collegiate penalty kick opportunity and **Delia Repasky** accounted for what proved to be the game-winner late in the first half as the Boilermakers won 2-1 at Marshall Sept. 4 after facing an early 1-0 deficit. Repasky found the back of the net in the 43rd minute only two minutes after making her season debut.
- The win at Marshall marked the first time Purdue rallied to win a road game in regulation after giving up the first goal of the contest since September 2010 at Colorado. In 2012 (at Nebraska) and 2013 (at Miami Univ.), the Boilers rallied to win a road game in OT after giving up the first goal.

FRUSTRATING DRAW AT YOUNGSTOWN STATE

- Purdue racked up a 31-11 edge in the shot count and 13-0 advantage in corner kicks, but had to settle for a 1-1 draw Sept. 7 at Youngstown State. It was the Boilers' highest shot count since recording 34 in a 2013 loss to Xavier. Purdue also had 13 corners in a 2013 draw with Seattle and held Akron without a corner kick opportunity in the 2013 season-opening win.
- Youngstown State goalkeeper Jackie Podolsky finished with 10 saves, helping keep her team in the game.
- **Maddy Williams** scored her 13th career goal in the 20th minute, but was unable to convert on a penalty kick in the 63rd minute after YSU had equalized in the 48th minute. Williams did manage to score in both games of the Marshall-YSU road trip, finding the back of the net in consecutive games for the third time in her career.
- The draw was Purdue's first on the road since September 2009 at Wisconsin. It was the Boilers' first overtime game since winning in the 102nd minute at Miami (Ohio) in the 2013 non-conference finale.

ARKANS NAMED BIG TEN FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

- **Erika Arkans**' multi-goal effort in the 4-1 victory vs. SIU Edwardsville earned the first-year Boilermaker Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors Sept. 3. She scored Purdue's second and fourth goals in the win after entering the game as a substitute in the 26th minute. She went on to log 60 minutes off the bench and also hit the crossbar with her first shot of the game.
- Arkans shared Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors this week with Megan Schafer of Penn State. She joins **Maddy Williams** (2013), **Kim Love** (2012) and **Alex Hairston** (2011) as active Boilers to garner the honor. Williams is the only other current Purdue player with a multi-goal game during her career.
- Arkans is one of seven freshmen that has started at least one game for Purdue this season.

SORAYA SCORES IN CONSECUTIVE GAMES

- Senior **Soraya Toppin-Herbert** scored her first collegiate goal in the Aug. 29 win against Ball State in what was her 30th game as a Boilermaker. She wasted no time in recording her second marker, opening the scoring in the Aug. 31 victory against SIU Edwardsville. In the process, she became the first Purdue player to account for consecutive goals and score in back-to-back games since **Maddy Williams** provided the offense in the consecutive 1-0 wins against Illinois and Northwestern last season.
- Though she was limited to 30 minutes due to illness, Toppin-Herbert got a chance to make her second career start in the SIUE victory. It was also her first-ever start at home as well as her first start overall since September 2012 at Iowa.

TWO MULTI-ASSIST EFFORTS IN SAME MATCH

- **Mollie Kuramoto** and **Maddy Williams** both assisted on a pair of goals in the 4-1 win vs. SIU Edwardsville, each setting up a goal by **Erika Arkans**. Kuramoto recorded her second career multi-assist effort, and her first since a September 2011 home win against Indiana State. Williams posted her first multi-assist game as a Boilermaker after scoring her first goal of the season in the Aug. 29 win vs. Ball State two days earlier.
- Twice in 2013, two Boilermakers recorded a multi-assist effort in the same game. **Alex Hairston** was involved in both instances on the way to breaking the Purdue all-time record for multi-assist games (five). Hadley Stuart and Hairston each had multiple helpers in a 4-1 win against Northern Illinois, a game in which Williams scored twice. Five different Boilers scored in a 5-3 victory against Dartmouth last year when Jordan Pawlik and Hairston had two assists apiece.
- **Gianna Milaro** and **Mikayla Lasky** recorded their first collegiate assists during the final weekend of August. Milaro had an assist in both wins.

17TH CAREER GOAL FOR ALEX HAIRSTON

- **Alex Hairston** scored her first goal of the season and team-high 17th career in the second half of the SIU Edwardsville win Aug. 31. With 23 career assists, she's looking to become only the third player in program history to join the 20-20 club for career goals and assists.
- Hairston's goal was her first since scoring the game-winner in the opening minute of the September 2013 win at Ohio State. The 11-game goal drought was the longest of her career. Previously, the longest goal-scoring drought she had experienced was seven (on three occasions).

OLSEN PRESSED INTO ACTION AFTER LIGHTNING DELAY

• The Aug. 29 win against Ball State was delayed about an hour and 45 minutes late in the first half due to lightning. **Jordan Ginther** had started the game in goal and kept it scoreless for the first 37 minutes. But a thigh injury flared up on her during the delay and she was not able to continue when play resumed. Freshman **Maddy Olsen** took over and ended up protecting the net for the final 143 minutes of the weekend.

• Olsen surrendered only one goal in the 143 minutes of game action and that marker was actually the first scored by an opposing player against Purdue this year after an own goal was the difference in the 1-0 season-opening loss to Miami. SIU Edwardsville's equalizer in the 34th minute ended Purdue's shutout streak at 259 consecutive minutes, which ranked as the team's fifth longest since the beginning of the 2008 season.

BOILERMAKERS SPLIT SEASON-OPENING WEEKEND

• Purdue opened its new season with a weekend split at the 14th edition of the Boilermaker Challenge Cup. After losing to Miami (Ohio), 1-0, on an own goal late in the first half, the Boilers rebounded with a 2-0 win against Ohio. **Jordan Ginther**, **Mikayla Lasky** and **Nicole Robertson** represented Purdue on the All-Tournament Team. The Boilermakers finished as the tournament runner-up thanks to a plus-1 goal differential. Freshmen **Erika Arkans** and **Robertson** scored the goals Sunday. Robertson also assisted on Arkans' game-winner. Ginther posted her second career solo shutout.

• Arkans became the sixth freshman to account for Purdue's first goal of the season, including the first since **Alex Hairston** in 2011.

• After suffering its first season-opening loss since 2010 (1-0 to Toledo in overtime, also the last time the team was shut out in an opener), Purdue fell to 10-6-1 all-time in season openers – including 8-4-1 at home. Purdue is now 18-7-3 all-time at the Boilermaker Challenge Cup, but has still not won the tournament since 2009.

ARKANS & ROBERTSON JOIN UNIQUE LIST

• With freshmen **Erika Arkans** and **Nicole Robertson** scoring the goals in the 2-0 win against Ohio Aug. 24, it marked only the seventh time since 2006 in which multiple Boilermakers scored their first collegiate goals in the same game.

• While **Maddy Williams** tied the Purdue freshman record with 10 goals last season, only three freshmen scored total and just once did two freshmen score in the same game. **Mikayla Lasky** and **Williams** were among the five goal scorers in the Sept. 5, 2013 win vs. Dartmouth, 5-3.

• Freshmen **Andrea Petrina** and **Maddy Woolford** did also both score in the Aug. 15 exhibition win at Illinois State, but as a preseason scrimmage the goals do not count towards their official career totals.

OWN GOAL BURNS BOILERS IN OPENER

• An own goal late in the first half for Miami (Ohio) turned out to be the only score of the Aug. 22 season opener for both teams. It was the first own goal against Purdue since the loss at Penn State in September of last year. However, it marked the first time an own goal doubled as a game-winning marker since a 2009 NCAA Tournament loss to Central Michigan in South Bend. Own goals against were also the difference in losses at Michigan (1-0) in October 2001 and vs. Northwestern (2-1) in October 2003.

• Since 2000, the Boilermakers have enjoyed a 9-5 advantage in own goals. The last one that counted positively for Purdue was in September 2012 at Iowa. However, the Boilers have not emerged victorious in a game that featured an own goal for either team since the 2009 regular-season finale against Iowa, a match Purdue won in overtime on an own goal.

CANADIAN IMPORTS

• Canadians **Vanessa Korolas** and **Andrea Petrina** are part of Purdue's eight-player freshman class this year. They represent the Boilers' first Canadian players since Sylvia Forbes (Whitby, Ontario) and Loredana Rivero (Mississauga, Ontario) suited up for Purdue from 2006-09. Forbes and Rivero were both First Team All-Big Ten honorees during their careers. Korolas also hails from Mississauga, Ontario, a suburb of Toronto.

HAIRSTON SISTER ACT

• Sisters **Alex** and **Juliana Hairston** are teammates at Purdue for the second year in a row. They both played in the same game five times last year. They're Purdue's first set of sister teammates since Karah and Tricia Henderson in 1998 and 1999 (the program's first two seasons).

• Jennie (2000-03) and Addie (2004-07) Moppert were also sisters that both played for Purdue, but their college careers did not overlap. However, Jennie Moppert was a volunteer assistant coach during the 2005 season while Addie was a sophomore.
