STORY LINES

- Following back-to-back road games, Purdue Football returns home to host No. 2 Oregon under the lights of Ross-Ade Stadium. Kickoff for Friday night's game is set for 8 p.m. ET on FOX.
- The contest is Purdue's annual Hammer Down Cancer game, raising money for the Tyler Trent Research Center.
- Tim Stratton, the inaugural John Mackey Award winner (2000), will be inducted in the Leroy Keyes Purdue Athletics Hall of Fame on Friday. Stratton was a three-time First Team All-B1G honoree and recorded 204 career receptions.
- · Friday's matchup is Purdue's only home game during the month of October, marking the first time since 1946 that the Boilermakers do not have a Saturday home game during the 10th month of the year.
- The Boilermakers and Ducks meet for just the fourth time in history, including the first meeting since 2009.
- Friday's game is a blackout, with Purdue donning a new black uniform for the first time.
- Both the Boilermakers and the Ducks play the famous song "Shout" at the end of the third quarter. Purdue began the tradition in 2006, while Oregon's started in 2010.
- Purdue has seven wins against ranked opponents over the past six seasons, including three against teams ranked in the Top 3 (No. 2 Ohio State in 2018, No. 2 Iowa in 2021, No. 3 Michigan State in 2021). .
- The Boilermakers are coming off a heartbreaking 50-49 overtime loss at No. 23 Illinois in which they rallied for a 24-point second half deficit. Purdue scored 46 points after halftime.
- Redshirt freshman quarterback Ryan Browne recorded 415 yards of total offense (297 passing, 118 rushing) in his first career start last weekend, becoming just the second Purdue QB (Brandon Kirsch - 2002) since 1970 to eclipse 250 passing vards and 100 rushing vards in the same game.
- Four of Purdue's remaining six games are against ranked opponents, including three ranked in the Top 5.
- One of the nation's leading tacklers as an All-American a season ago, sophomore Dillon Thieneman ranks second in the Big Ten and eighth nationally in solo tackles (5.5 per game) this year. The 2023 Big Ten Freshman of the Year leads the Boilermakers in total tackles (50) and solo tackles (33) once again this season.
- Kydran Jenkins ranks third in the Big Ten in sacks (0.83 per game), Jenkins is the conference leader in sacks while wearing a Big Ten uniform, recording 21.5 throughout his career to also rank sixth in Purdue history.
- Tight end Max Klare leads the Boilermakers in receptions (21), receiving yards (352) and receiving touchdowns (2), coming off a career-best game (six receptions, 133 yards) at No. 23 Illinois.
- Devin Mockobee ranks fifth in the Big Ten in yards per carry (6.54) and eighth in rushing yards (464).
- Purdue has blocked three kicks this season (two field goals, one punt) to lead the Big Ten and rank third nationally.
- In his first season as a Boilermaker, Keelan Crimmins is on pace for the second best punting average (45.0 yards per punt) in program history, behind only 2001 Ray Guy Award winner Travis Dorsch (48.1 yards per punt).
- Crimmins' punting average ranks fourth in the Big Ten and 21st nationally.
- Purdue has produced four All-Americans over the past three seasons (Dillon Thieneman 2023, Charlie Jones -2022, David Bell - 2021, George Karlaftis - 2021), the most in a three-year stretch since 1967-69.

NUMBERS TO KNOW

Devin Mockobee has eight 100-yard rushing games, ranking sixth in program history and the most by a Boilermaker since Kory Sheet recorded nine throughout his career (2005-08).

Purdue is playing a Friday game for just the 14th time in program history, including just the third at Ross-Ade Stadium. The Boilermakers have two Friday games on the schedule this year.

The Boilermakers scored 46 points after halftime (40-second half, 6-overtime) last week at No. 23 Illinois, the most they have recorded after halftime until at least 1980

Ryan Walters is the first Purdue head coach to lead his team to at least 49 points in two Big Ten games as coach of the Boilermakers since Joe Tiller did it eight times during his tenure.



HAMMER DOWN CANCER

- Friday night will be Purdue Football's annual Hammer Down Cancer game, raising money for the Tyler Trent Research
- The Tyler Trent Pediatric Cancer Research Center, named after the legendary superfan who passed away in 2019 from osteosarcoma, was formed in 2023 within the Purdue Institute for Cancer Research to expand Purdue's research into childhood cancers.

RECENT SUCCESS VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

- Purdue has beaten seven ranked teams over the past six seasons, going 7-11 against Top 25 opponents despite being the underdog in each one of those games.
- Three of those wins were against Top 3 teams, while Purdue handed five of those ranked teams their first loss of the season.
- The victories during the 2021 campaign (No. 2 lowa, No. 3 Michigan State) gave Purdue multiple wins over Top 5 teams in one season for the first time since 1960 (No. 3 Ohio State, No. 1 Minnesota).
- · Five of the seven wins have been by double digits, the biggest being a 29-point victory over No. 2 Ohio State in 2018.
- Five of Purdue's final seven opponents on its 2024 schedule are against ranked teams, including three ranked in the Top 5 (No. 2 Oregon, No. 3 Penn State, No. 4 Ohio State).

INTO THE HALL OF FAME

- · Eight Boilermakers will be inducted into the Leroy Keyes Purdue Athletics Hall of Fame on Friday, including one football legend - tight end Tim Stratton (1998-2001).
- Stratton was the inaugural winner of the John Mackey Award in 2000, presented to the nation's best tight end. He was also a finalist in 2001
- · He was a three-time First Team All-Big Ten Conference selection (1999, 2000, 2001), just the fourth in program history to earn the accolades three times.
- Stratton became just the third player in Big Ten history to eclipse 200 career catches, ending his career with 204 to set a then-school record that now ranks fifth in the Purdue record
- · Playing in all 49 games during his four-year Purdue career, Stratton recorded a reception in all but two contests.
- Along with Stratton, the hall of fame class of 2024 includes: Devynne Charlton (Women's Track & Field, 2013-18), Annie Drews (Volleyball, 2012-15), Chukwuebuka Enekwechi (Men's Track & Field, 2013-16), Bob Ford (Men's Basketball, 1970-72), Katie Gearlds (Women's Basketball, 2004-07, current Purdue head coach), Laura Gonzalez-Escallon (Women's Golf, 2010-13), Kevin Plawecki (Baseball, 2010-12).

FRIDAY NIGHT LIGHTS

BOILER NOTES

- In 136 seasons of Purdue Football, the Boilermakers have played on Fridays 13 times throughout history, recording a 5-7-1 record. Seven of those games have been night games and only two have been in Ross-Ade Stadium.
- Friday's matchup is the only home contest for Purdue during the month of October, marking the first time since 1946 that the Boilermakers will not have a Saturday home game during that month.
- For the first time in program history, the Boilermakers have two Friday games on the schedule.
- After hosting the Ducks, Purdue travels to Michigan State next month (Nov. 22) for a Friday night matchup.

WHAT CAN BROWNE DO FOR YOU?

- · Making his first career start in place of an injured Hudson Card, redshirt freshman Ryan Browne rose to the occasion and nearly led Purdue to the biggest comeback in program history last weekend at No. 23 Illinois.
- Browne recorded 415 yards of offense, throwing for 297 while adding 118 on the ground to join Brandon Kirsch (2002) as the only Purdue quarterbacks since 1970 to record 250 passing yards and 100 rushing yards in the same game.
- The Clarkston, Michigan, native also became just the sixth Boilermaker quarterback to eclipse 100 yards rushing in a game, joining Mike Phipps, Bob Bobrowski, Gary Danielson, Rob Henry and Kirsch. His 118 rushing yards were the most by a Purdue quarterback since Henry had 132 at Northwestern on Oct. 9, 2010.
- Browne's day on the ground eclipsed his 85-yard day he had in relief against Northwestern a season ago, as he joined Drew Brees as the only Purdue guarterbacks (since 1996) to produce a pair of 80-yard rushing games.
- For his performance against the Illini, Browne earned a 90.9 grade from PFF, the best by a Purdue QB on the road since at least 2008
- Browne was tabbed the Shaun Alexander Player of the Week after performance vs. Illinois

SECOND HALF SPARK PLUG

- Trailing 27-3 in the second half at No. 23 Illinois (Oct. 12), the Purdue offense caught fire and scored 46 points after halftime (most points after halftime since at least 1980).
- The Boilermakers recorded 382 yards of total offense in the second half, averaging 11.9 yards per play.
- Ryan Browne threw for 288 of his 297 passing yards in the second half
- Five different Boilermakers found the end zone after halftime: Jahmal Edrine, Will Heldt, Devin Mockobee (2), Jaron Tibbs, Arhmad Branch (OT).
- Purdue was a perfect 6-for-6 in the red zone in the game, including 5-for-5 in the second half (four touchdowns, one field goal).

ABOUT THE MATCHUP

- Purdue and Oregon will meet for just the fourth time, with the previous three games have been decided by a combined total
- A Boilermaker rushed for 100 yards or more in all three contests.
- In the first matchup in 1979, Wally Jones and John Macon combined for 261 yards on the ground, as No. 10 Purdue outgained the Ducks 401-143 in a 13-7 win.
- No. 16 Oregon rallied to defeat Purdue in double overtime in 2008, after the Boilermakers built up a 20-3 lead in the second.
- A year later, Purdue saw a last-minute rally come up short when its two-point conversion was ruled incomplete in a 38-36 loss.

OUR LAST MATCHUP VS. OREGON

- The Boilermakers nearly pulled off a come-from-behind win on the road at Autzen Stadium, but fell 38-36 for then-Oregon head coach and current Ohio State offensive coordinator Chip Kelly's first win with the Ducks.
- Running back Ralph Bolden ran for 134 yards on 29 carries and two touchdowns.
- Joey Elliott was 24-of-41 with 266 yards and one touchdown.
- Down 38-30 with 1:09 on the clock on 4th-and-11 from the Oregon 15-yard line, wide receiver Keith Smart hit receiver Aaron Valentin on a reverse pass to pull Purdue within two.
- Joey Elliott hit tight end Kyle Adams on the ensuing two-point conversion pass, but Adams' foot landed mere inches out of
- Purdue outgained Oregon 451-356, but the Ducks tallied 17 points off three Boilermaker turnovers to come away with the win.

HERE COMES THE MOCK TRAIN

- From walk-on to phenom, Devin Mockobee has certainly made a name for himself in his time in West Lafayette.
- With 11 carries for 102 yards at No. 23 Illinois (Oct. 12), Mockobee became the seventh Boilermaker to produce at least eight 100-yard rushing games over a career and the first since Kory Sheets (2005-08) recorded nine over his career.
- He rushed for a season-high 168 rushing yards at Oregon State (Sept. 21), becoming the sixth Boilermaker since 1996 to record a 100-yard rushing game in three separate seasons.
- Breaking open a 63-yard rush against the Beavers, he eclipsed 2,000 rushing yards for his career.
- Mockobee sits 11th on Purdue's all-time rushing list (2,243), passing legendary All-American running back Leroy Keyes (2,094) against Nebraska (Sept. 28). He also sits in a tie for 11th with 17 rushing touchdowns.
- He started his career by setting a new Purdue freshman record with 968 rushing yards while also adding nine touchdowns.
- After being put on scholarship in the first official act of the Walters era, he led the team in rushing once again with 807 yards and six touchdowns in 2023.
- In doing so, Mockobee became the first Boilermaker to lead the team in rushing in back-to-back seasons since Markell Jones, who did it three years running (2015-17).
- The Boonville, Ind., native is one of only four Big Ten players to rush for more than 800 yards in each of the past two seasons.

MAD MAX

- Max Klare has not missed a beat since he returned to the lineup at the start of the season.
- The sophomore tight end leads Purdue in receptions (21), receiving yards (352) and receiving touchdowns (2).
- He had his best game as a Boilermaker at No. 23 Illinois (Oct. 12), hauling in six receptions for a career-high 133 yards. It marked the most receiving yards by a Purdue tight end since Payne Durham's 150-yard night in the 2021 season opener and the sixth most by a Boilermaker tight end since 1996. Klare added 76 yards after catch as part of his receiving total.
- Klare was on pace to be one of the best tight ends in the country before his 2023 season was cut short. However, the sophomore bounced back in the 2024 season opener with five catches for 71 yards, both team highs.
- He also caught Purdue's first touchdown of the season, a 9-yard strike from Hudson Card on the opening drive.
- Klare was also tabbed to the Comeback Player of the Year Award Watch List ahead of the year.

BLOCK PARTY

- With three through the first half of the season, Purdue leads the Big Ten and ranks third in the country in blocked kicks (two field goals, one punt). No, Zach Edey is not part of the Boilermakers' special teams unit.
- In the Big Ten opener against Nebraska (Sept. 28), Purdue blocked a pair of Cornhusker field goals. Defensive linemen Joe Anderson and Damarjhe Lewis earned the first field goal blocks of their careers to help the Boilermakers hold the Huskers scoreless in the first half.
- Prior to the contest, the last time Purdue blocked two field goals in a game was Sept. 3, 2011 against Middle Tennessee.
- The other block came from wide receiver Leland Smith, who blocked a punt in the season-opening victory over Indiana State (Aug. 31).

BOILER NOTES | DT THE TACKLING MACHINE

- After pacing Purdue and becoming one of the nation's leading tacklers as a freshman, Dillon Thieneman is back atop the Boilermakers' chart for tackles in 2024.
- The sophomore defensive back leads Purdue in total tackles (50) and solo tackles (33), ranking second in the Big Ten solo tackles and fifth in total tackles.
- Thieneman's 5.5 solo tackles per game rank eighth nationally.
- A season ago, Thieneman led the team with 106 tackles, ranking fifth in the Big Ten among all players and the most by any freshman in the country
- His 74 solo tackles in 2023 led all freshmen nationwide and set a new Purdue freshman record

TACKLES-4-LOSS

- One of the major anchors of the defense is senior Kydran Jenkins (KAY-dran), who ranks sixth in Purdue history with 21.5 career sacks and 12th with 39.5 tackles-for-loss.
- The senior linebacker leads the Boilermakers in TFLs (8.0) and sacks (5.0), while ranking second in tackles (48).
- Jenkins sacks per game (0.83) ranks third in the Big Ten. The Boilermaker sits fifth in the conference and 19th nationally with 5.0 solo tackles per game.
- Jenkins had a huge game against Oregon State (Sept. 21), recording a career-high 16 tackles to go along with 3.0 TFLs and 2.0 sacks. With his second sack of the contest, he became the eighth Boilermaker in program history to make 20 career sacks.
- As a junior, Jenkins finished second in the Big Ten in tacklesfor-loss with 15.5 on the year, ranking 18th in the country and the most by a Boilermaker since George Karlaftis in 2019 (170).
- He garnered All-Big Ten Honorable Mention for the second straight year in 2023.
- A versatile player, Jenkins moved from RUSH END to middle linebacker ahead of the 2024 campaign, a position he played in high school and a spot the coaching staff believed would do more to impress NFL scouts.

HIGHWAY TO HELDT

- After recording only 12 tackles throughout his freshman season, sophomore rush end Will Heldt has made 30 tackles in the first half of the 2024 campaign. He ranks second on the team in sacks (4.0) and TFLs (5.5).
- Heldt recorded his first career touchdown with a 16-yard scoop-and-score at No. 23 Illinois (Oct. 12).
- At Wisconsin (Oct. 5), Heldt recorded a career-high eight tackles to pace Purdue.
- Heldt started the season with a team-high seven tackles, 3.0 tackles-for-loss and 2.0 sacks in the win over Indiana State.

 Prior to the season opener, Heldt's career high in tackles were

LOVIN' THE INTS

- An important part of Purdue's nickel defense, Kyndrich Breedlove produced a breakout game at Wisconsin (Oct. 5).
- The Nashville, Tennessee, native hauled in interceptions on back-to-back drives in the second quarter for Purdue's first INTs of the season.
- Breedlove's performance marked just the eighth time in the last decade that a Boilermaker recorded two interceptions in one game and the first since Dillon Thieneman did it in the 2023 season finale victory over Indiana.
- Breedlove leads the Boilermakers with four pass breakups on the season.

BOILER NOTES

ANOTHER AUSSIE

- Keelan Crimmins has quickly become Purdue's most reliable punter in at least seven seasons.
- Crimmins is fourth in the Big Ten and ranks 21st nationally with a 45.0-yard average.
- He is on pace for the second-highest season punt average in program history behind Ray Guy Award winner Travis Dorsch (48.1 yards per punt).
- Against Notre Dame, Crimmins punted 10 times for a 47.3-yard clip with a pair of balls over 50 yards and three inside the 20-yard line.
- It was only the sixth time a Big Ten punter averaged over 47 yards when punting 10 times. Iowa has three of them.
- His career-long 64-yard kick against the Irish was just the 20th ball of 64 or more yards by Purdue punter since 1996.
- He tallied a 46.7-yard average against Indiana State on three boots.
- The Aussie was the No. 3-ranked punter by ProKick Australia.
- He played cricket and high level Australian Rules Football.
- Crimmins is the second straight Purdue punter from Australia, joining Jack Ansell (2021-23), who also wore No. 30.

SPECIAL TEAMS BEING SPECIAL

- Pro Football Focus graded the Boilermakers' special teams at 91.1, the best in the nation, through the first four games of the year. The Boilermakers are now 11th at 88.2.
- Purdue was ranked atop the ESPN Football Power Index Special Teams Efficiency at 80.5 through the first four games, as well.
- Purdue is one of eight teams nationally and the only one from the Big Ten with three blocked kicks this season (2 - FG, 1 - Punt).
- Purdue ranks seventh in the Big Ten in kickoff return average (20.9), fourth in kick return defense (16.1) and sixth in net punting (41.6).
- Elijah Jackson is fifth in the conference with 18.1 yards per kick return this season.
- Punter Keelan Crimmins is 21st nationally and fourth in the Big Ten with a 45.0 punt average on the year.
- In his second year with the program, special teams coach Chris Petrilli has boosted the Boilermakers' special teams, including the kickoff return for a touchdown last season, the program's first in more than a decade.

MISSING BULLDOGS-TURNED-BOILERS

- Purdue was without two of its highest-ranked transfers to start the season.
- Wide receiver CJ Smith, one of four Boilermakers to transfer from Georgia, was injured in fall camp.
- Nyland Green, the No. 7 rated transfer and highest ranked cornerback in the portal according to 247Sports, was expected to make an immediate impact to the Purdue secondary before suffering an injury in fall camp.
- Green made his Purdue debut against Nebraska.

JOE JEFF STEPS UP

- Sophomore Joseph Jefferson has found a pivotal role in Ryan Walters' defense filling in when Antonio Stevens missed time due to injury
- The Indianapolis native has made 25 tackles over the past four contests, including a career-high 10 at Oregon State.
- Adding nine more tackles against Nebraska, Jefferson's 26 total tackles on the season rank fourth among Purdue defenders.
- Jefferson began his career with only three tackles through his first 14 games as a Boilermaker, primarily playing on special teams. He recorded two tackles as a redshirt freshman last year before making one tackle in the first two games of this season.

DIFFICULT SCHEDULE

- A season ago, Purdue did not face a team with a losing record at the time of the game until battling Indiana for the Old Oaken Bucket in the season finale. This year's schedule may be even tougher.
- Purdue's schedule was ranked the 11th hardest in the nation by ESPN's Football Power Index, fourth by College Football News, seventh by College Football Network and sixth by Sports Grid.
- Four preseason Top 10 teams appear on the Boilermakers' 2024 schedule: No. 2 Ohio State (Nov. 9), No. 3 Oregon (Oct. 18), No. 7 Notre Dame (Sept. 14) and No. 8 Penn State (Nov. 16).
- No other team in the country plays more Top 10 teams than Purdue. Only Florida matched the Boilermakers with four Top 10 opponents.
- Three of the Top 10 matchups are at home, as Purdue hosts Notre Dame, Oregon and Penn State at Ross-Ade Stadium.

ROSS-ADE PACKED ALL SEASON LONG

- With three of Purdue's six home games coming against preseason Top 10 teams, Ross-Ade Stadium is expected to be packed all season long.
- Purdue has sold out two games against Notre Dame and Nebraska, which matched the highest attendance at Ross-Ade Stadium since 2014 when renovations began that trimmed capacity by nearly 10,000 seats.
- Purdue's attendance of 59,488 against Indiana State was the largest in a season opener for Purdue since 2005.
- The Boilermakers' home game against Northwestern is already sold out.
- The 2023 season featured Purdue's highest home attendance, both average and total, since the 2007 campaign, but those marks might be broken this season.
- With more than 42,000 season ticket holders, including more than 5,000 new season ticket holders, season tickets sold out for the 2024 season.
- Student season tickets also sold out five hours after going on sale, a record-breaking time.
- Purdue's in-state matchup against Notre Dame sold out one day after going on sale to the public.

THE ADMIRAL

- Gus "The Admiral" Hartwig once again leads the Purdue front line in his fifth year starting for the Boilermakers.
- The four-time All-Big Ten honorable mention honoree has played in 45 games, starting 42. He first start came at right guard against Minnesota during his freshman season in 2020.
- He was named to the Rimington Trophy Watch List each of the last three seasons, a trophy presented annually to the most outstanding center in college football, as well as the Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year Watch List.
- A cerebral leader at the heart of the offense, he has been named Academic All-Big Ten three times and is also a member of the NFF Hampshire Honor Society.
- He was Campbell Trophy Semifinalist in 2023 and 2024.
- Hartwig graduated with a bachelor's in Finance with honors and is now working on his master's in Global Supply Chain Management.

SMITH'S STATEMENT

- One of the newest Boilermakers, sophomore wide receiver Leland Smith made a statement in his debut donning the Old Gold & Black.
- Smith caught a pair of passes in the season opener, including a spectacular 31-yard touchdown for his first TD as a Boilermaker.
- In the fourth quarter, he showcased his versatility by blocking a punt on special teams. It was the first blocked punt by a Boilermaker since Jackson Anthrop did it in 2021 against Nehraska





in his second season as head coach of the Boilermakers. Walters was announced as the 37th head coach in Purdue Football history on Dec. 13,

During his first season at Purdue, Walters and the Boilermakers faced one of the toughest schedules in the country. As the Boilermakers prepared to play Northwestern in their 11th game of the season, all 11 teams on Purdue's schedule up to that point, including the Wildcats, did not have a losing record. Despite the gauntlet, Purdue tied for fourth in the Big Ten West and won both rivalry games to keep possession of the Cannon Trophy (Illinois) and the Old Oaken Bucket (Indiana) for the third straight season.

In Walters' debut season guiding the Old Gold and Black, Purdue found success in all three phases of the game. The offense led the Big Ten in rushing in conference contests, averaging 184.6 yards per game. That included the Boilermakers rushing for more than 300 yards in back-to-back games for the first time since 1968. The 2,029 rushing yards were the most since 2012, while Purdue became the only team in the Big Ten with two running backs eclipsing 500 yards in conference games (Devin Mockobee 625, Tyrone Tracy Jr. - 624). Purdue joined national champion Michigan as the only two teams to score seven touchdowns in a Big Ten contest.

On the defensive side of the ball, the Boilermakers recorded 35 sacks, the most since 2004 and the third-most in program history. Individually, Dillon Thieneman became an All-American (Third Team - AP) and was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Year after setting school records for interceptions (6) and solo tackles (74) by a freshman; both marks ranked third nationally by any defender in college football throughout the 2023 campaign. In Walters' defense, the duo of Nic Scourton and Kydran Jenkins had more sacks and TFLs than any other teammates in the conference, as both Boilermakers cracked the Big Ten's Top 3 in both categories.

The 2023 special teams unit averaged 24.2 yards per kickoff return, Purdue's best since 2004 and the fourth-most all-time. Tracy returned a kick 98 yards for a touchdown in the season opener, the first by a Boilermaker since 2013, while ranking second in the Big Ten and 15th nationally in kick return average (25.5).

Walters brought energy and excitement to Purdue Football, as season tickets nearly reached 40,000 and broke the 30,000 mark for the first time since 2007. The Ross-Ade Brigade, Purdue's student section, sold out season tickets for the first time in five years. Ross-Ade Stadium averaged 58,249 fans at each home game, the highest average attendance since 2007.

Hired at age 36 after spending two seasons as Illinois' defensive coordinator and creating the nation's No. 1 scoring defense (12.3 ppg in 2022), Walters became the fourth-youngest coach in the Power 5 conferences behind Kenny Dillingham (32-Arizona State), Kane Wommack (35-South Alabama) and Dan Lanning (36-Oregon) and eighth youngest in

Walters elevated Illinois' defensive unit from the back of the pack into one of the nation's elite in just two seasons. Following the 2020 season, in which the Fighting Illini ranked 97th nationally in scoring defense (34.9) and 114th in yards allowed per game (466.8), Walters' first year in Champaign saw his side of the ball rise to 29th (21.9) and 49th (367.0), respectively. In 2022, the results were shown nationwide as Illinois went into the bowl schedule No. 1 nationally in scoring defense (12.3) and No. 2 in yards allowed per game

Considered one of the nation's fastest rising young coaches, Ryan Walters is A former safety at Colorado (2004-08), Walters tutored two of the nation's top defensive backs during his two-year stint in Champaign. Among six Illini defenders to earn All-Big Ten recognition in 2021 was safety Kerby Joseph, who was Illinois' first All-Big Ten First Team defensive back since 1989. Two more Illinois defensive backs accomplished the feat in 2022, with Devon Witherspoon and Sydney Brown earning first team accolades from the conference. Witherspoon, notably, became Illinois' first Jim Thorpe Award (top defensive back in college football) finalist in school history this past

> Walters spent six seasons at Missouri prior to his tenure with the Illini, including three as defensive coordinator. He oversaw an impressive transformation of the Tigers' defense into one of the Southeastern Conference's top units. His 2019 defense ranked in the nation's Top 20 in several categories, including total defense (14th NCAA; 3rd SEC - 312.0) and scoring defense (17th NCAA; 6th SEC - 19.4), while excelling as a Top 10 pass defense (8th in passing yards allowed NCAA; 2nd SEC - 179.3).

> Walters previously served as co-defensive coordinator for the 2016 and 2017 seasons in Columbia before being promoted to defensive coordinator permanently ahead of the 2018 season, with Missouri's overall defensive improvement leading the way to an eight-win season and bid to the 2018 AutoZone Liberty Bowl. Previously during bowl preparation in December 2017, Walters ascended to the role of defensive coordinator before the squad's 2017 Texas Bowl appearance after assuming control of the entire secondary ahead of that season. He had focused on the safeties in his first two seasons with the program.

Prior to making the move to Missouri in 2015, Walters coached at Memphis where he spent the 2014 season as cornerbacks coach and oversaw a defense that was among the most improved in the nation when the Tigers

A native of Aurora, Colorado, Walters was a football student-athlete at Colorado, where he was a standout safety for the Buffaloes (2004-08). He started 33 times in 46 career appearances as a Buffalo and earned All-Big 12 Conference Honorable Mention his senior season. He began his coaching career as a student assistant at Colorado, working with the secondary in 2009, and then spent two years on staff at Arizona, where he was a graduate assistant in 2010 before being promoted to defensive backs coach for the 2011 season.

From Arizona, Walters moved to Oklahoma as a graduate assistant cornerbacks coach in 2012, as the Sooners went 10-3 and played in the 2013 Cotton Bowl. He moved to North Texas for the 2013 season, where he oversaw cornerbacks and helped lead UNT to a 9-4 record in its first year in Conference USA.

Prior to his arrival at Illinois, Walters was one of 12 coaching participants in the National Coalition of Minority Football Coaches' inaugural Coalition Academy in April 2020, a first-of-its-kind mentorship program pairing influential athletic directors with minority football coaches.

Walters earned his degree in history from the University of Colorado in December 2008 with dual majors in history and ethnic studies. Walters and his wife Tara have two sons, Aaron and Cason.

- True freshmen Tarrion Grant and Shamar Rigby turned heads during preseason camp to earn starting spots on opening day.
- Grant and Rigby joined Dillon Thieneman, George Karlaftis, Jalen Graham and Ja'Whaun Bentley as the only true freshmen to start week one for the Boilermakers in the 21st Century.
- They were the first rookie duo to start together since Karlaftis and Graham suited up in 2019.
- Based on in-depth research, Rigby is the first offensive player to start a season opener for Purdue in over 25 years.

"THE MOST FEARED DEFENSIVE BACK IN THE COUNTRY"

- $\, \cdot \,$ Dillon Thieneman is one of the best defensive backs in the nation. Period.
- David Hale of ESPN wrote that, "Dillon Thieneman might be the most feared defensive back in the country."
- The sophomore was tabbed Third Team All-America, the FWAA Defensive Freshman of the Year and Thompson-Randle El Big Ten Freshman of the Year.
- Thieneman racked up five Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors, becoming the first defender in conference history to win any weekly award five times in a single season.
- He ranked third nationally in interceptions (6) and solo tackles (74), leading all freshmen and setting new Purdue freshman records. His solo tackle record passed Rod Woodson's mark of 67 that stood since 1983.
- He became the first Purdue freshman to record multiple double-digit tackle games since Ja'Whaun Bentley (New England Patriots)
- Thieneman was the No. 83-ranked player in EA College Football 25 with an overall rating of 90.
- The Westfield, Ind., native also garnered a spot on Bruce Feldman's 'Freaks List', checking in at No. 96. Since his arrival on campus, Thieneman has put on 11 pounds of muscle, trimmed body fat and added to his already ridiculous speed.

TACKLES BY TONE

BOILER NOTES

- After battling injuries to start his career, Antonio Stevens has cemented his spot in the starting lineup on defense, following time on special teams during his first three seasons.
- After ranking sixth in the Big Ten in tackles through two games, Stevens was 18th in the league with 6.0 per game before missing the game against Nebraska due to injury.
- In his four games, Stevens has 22 tackles. He had 25 in his first four years at Purdue.
- The Nashville native recorded a career-high eight tackles against Notre Dame, after a team-high seven stops against Indiana State in the season opener.

THE GREEKS

- Yanni Karlaftis is in his first full season as a starter after playing his way into the lineup in the middle of the 2023 campaign.
- This season, Karlaftis is one of the top tacklers with 27 stops.
- He set career highs last year with 55 total tackles and 28 solos, including 47 stops in the final eight games of the year.
- Karlaftis grew up in Greece with his family and won a world judo championship at age 11.
- Yanni's older brother is Purdue All-American and two-time Super Bowl champion George Karlaft's of the Kansas City Chiefs.

BEST GROUND GAME IN THE BIG TEN

- Last season, Purdue's ground game was the best in the Big Ten in league games with 184.6 rushing yards per game.
- The Boilermakers tallied 300 yards on the ground in back-toback weeks (353 vs. Minnesota, 303 at Northwestern), a first for Purdue since 1968.
- It marked just the fifth and sixth times Purdue recorded over 300 yards rushing in a Big Ten game since 1996. Both were the lone 300-yard games in the Big Ten last season.
- Purdue was the only school in the 14-team league to have two running backs rush for more than 500 yards in Big Ten games (Devin Mockobee - 625 yards, Tyrone Tracy Jr. - 624 yards).
- Purdue's 2,029 yards on the ground were the most in a season since 2012.

EXPERIENCE IN THE TRENCHES

- Purdue's offensive line is one of its most experienced groups in 2024 with a combined 166 starts.
- The line is anchored by four-time All-Big Ten honoree center Gus Hartwig. In his final season in West Lafayette, Hartwig has the most starts of any active player at Purdue with 36. He was named to the Rimington Trophy Watch List for the third straight campaign, as well as his first nod on the Senior Bowl Watch List.
- Marcus Mbow, Mahamane Moussa and Jalen Grant return after making starts for Purdue last season. Mbow garnered a preseason spot on the Senior Bowl Watch List.
- 2024 is the third straight year Hartwig, Mbow and Moussa have started on the line together.

PURDUE FOOTBALL IS BACK

- The Boilermakers kicked off their 137th season of football in 2024 with a 49-0 shut out victory of Indiana State.
- Ross-Ade Stadium has been Purdue's home for 100 seasons, marking the 2024 campaign as the 101st full season; Ross-Ade will turn 100 years old on November 22 when the Boilermakers play at Michigan State.
- Purdue closed out the 1924 season with its first game at Ross-Ade, a 26-7 Homecoming win over Indiana (Nov. 22, 1924).

YEAR 2 OF THE WALTERS ERA

- ${\bf \cdot}$ Ryan Walters is in his second campaign in West Lafayette.
- The three pillars of Walters' program: Competitive, Tough, Disciplined.
- Known as a players' coach, Walters has established a culture in which everyone in the program feels like family.
- Hired at age 36 after being named the 2022, 0n3 Coordinator of the Year Walters, now 38, is one of the youngest coaches in college football - the fourth youngest among the Power 4 conferences (Kenny Dillingham - 34, Dan Lanning - 38, Sherrone Moore - 38).
- Despite the record not being what Walters and Purdue wanted, facing one of the toughest schedules in the country, there were several positives the Boilermakers could take away from Walters' first year in West Lafayette to build off of heading into the 2024 season.
- Purdue brought in a consensus top-10 transfer class this offseason.

CARD CHAPTER ONE

- Hudson Card had a productive first season in West Lafayette, overcoming several significant injuries to his offensive line and key recieving targets in 2023.
- The Boilermaker signal caller appeared in 11 games last year and threw for 2,387 yards and 15 touchdowns during his first campaign at Purdue in 2023.
- He guided Purdue to a win over Indiana in the Old Oaken Bucket Game, recording 360 yards of offense (275 passing, 85 rushing) and four touchdowns (three passing, one rushing) to become the first quarterback since Drew Brees (2000) to pass for at least 275 yards and rush for at least 85 yards in the same game.
- Card was one of two quarterbacks in the Big Ten last season to throw for 15 scores and rush for five more on the ground, joining Maryland's Taulia Tagovailoa.
- Card is the fifth Purdue quarterback since 1956 to reach those marks in a single season:

THREE-STRAIGHT AT ROSS-ADE

BOILER NOTES

- With the win over Indiana State, Purdue posted a home winning streak of three games, dating back to last season.
- The Boilermakers' offense found its groove in its final two home games during the 2023 season with a 49-30 win over Minnesota and a 35-31 come-from-behind victory to retain the Old Oaken Bucket against Indiana.
- Purdue tallied over 450 yards of total offense over three home games, including a 604-yard outing against Minnesota.
 Hudson Card threw for over 250 yards in each game,
- combining for 799 yards, 10 touchdowns and no interceptions.
- Purdue's ground game tallied 779 yards, averaging 260 per contest. Devin Mockobee led the rushing attack with 95 yards per game, including his sixth career rushing 100-yard performance against Minnesota last season.
- Purdue committed just one turnover in those home contests.

HAPPY 100th ROSS-ADE

- Ross-Ade Stadium will turn 100 years old on Nov. 22.
- The Boilermakers celebrated its 100th season in Ross-Ade Stadium last year, capped by their 300th win since moving in.
- Purdue opened Ross-Ade Stadium with a 26-7 rout of in-state rival Indiana on Nov. 22, 1924.

BOILERMAKERS TO THE NFL

- The 2024 NFL Draft marked the fifth straight year that at least two Boilermakers were chosen, totaling 14 over the span. That last time Purdue had a five-year streak of multiple Boilermakers drafted was 1998-2002.
- Tyrone Tracy Jr. was the first Boilermaker off the board, as the New York Giants selected the running back in the fifth round with the 166th overall pick. Despite sharing the workload in the backfield with Devin Mockobee, Tracy tallied 716 yards on the ground, while leading the team in touchdowns (eight rushing, one kickoff return) and pacing the Big Ten in all-purpose yards in conference games (1274 ypg).
- Tracy averaged 6.3 yards per carry on 113 attempts, the secondbest single-season rushing average in school history.
- The Baltimore Ravens drafted detensive back Sanoussi Kane with their final pick (7th Round – 250th Overall). A four-year letterman, Kane played in 45 games over his Purdue career. He made 25 starts for the Old Gold and Black, totaling 161 tackles that included 115 solo stops.
- Kane became the first Boilermaker drafted by the Ravens, although Hall of Famer and Boilermaker legend Rod Woodson helped lead the team to a victory in Super Bowl XXXV and Bernard Pollard helped Baltimore win Super Bowl LVII.

THE TRENT FAMILY

- Walk-on offensive lineman Ethan Trent came to West Lafayette with a family legacy already deeply entrenched in Purdue history.
- · His older brother Tyler became a an inspiration for the Boilermaker faithful during the 2018 season. The Purdue superfan continued passionately cheering on his favorite team despite his battle with a rare form of bone cancer.
- Tyler's story was shared on ESPN College GameDay ahead of the Boilers' matchup against No. 3 Ohio State. In what became known as "The Tyler Trent Game," Purdue dominated the Buckeyes in a 49-20 upset rout in Ross-Ade.
- Ethan, who appeared multiple times in the GameDay piece, was the one pushing Tyler's wheelchair as the pair stormed the field along with thousands of other fans.
- The Tyler Trent (T2) Student Gate was dedicated during the 2019 season in memory of the Purdue superfan who passed away at the age of 20 from osteosarcoma.
- Ethan came to Purdue five years later after receiving a preferred walk-on offer from the previous staff that was then honored by new head coach Ryan Walters.

ROSS-ADE HISTORY

- Ross-Ade Stadium was dedicated Nov. 22, 1924, ahead of its first game when Purdue hosted Indiana. The Boilermakers demolished their in-state foes in a 26-7 rout.
- The two men for whom the stadium is named after, David E. Ross and George Ade, were instrumental in building a stadium that has served as the backdrop to Purdue lore over the last 101 seasons. Ross conceived of the idea for a new stadium to replace Stuart Field, a 5,000-seat stadium that hosted Purdue Football from 1892 to 1924 and was located where the Elliot Hall of Music stands today.
- The original capacity for Ross-Ade Stadium in 1924 was 18,500, including standing room tickets. Over the years and several renovations, the capacity grew to its largest at 69,200 in 1970.
- The largest crowd ever to see a game at Ross-Ade is 71,629 against Indiana on Nov. 22, 1980, when Purdue outlasted the Hoosiers, 24-23, on the shoulders of consensus All-Americans quarterback (and current John Purdue Club Director of Leadership and Alumni Engagement) Mark Hermann and tight end Dave Young.
- Additional upgrades to the stadium included a new press box, luxury boxes and premium club areas in 2003 as a part of a \$70 million project. Permanent lighting was installed in 2017 and a new sound system in 2018.
- The Tyler Trent (T²) Student Gate was dedicated during the 2019 season in memory of Purdue superfan Tyler Trent who passed away at the age of 20 from osteosarcoma. The T² Gate was relocated to the south side of the stadium after the 2023 student section renovations were completed.

PHASE 1

The 2023 season saw the completion of the Phase I of a multi-phased renovation project at a cost of more \$45 million, fully funded by gifts to the John Purdue Club.

The three main enhancements to the stadium were the Tiller Tunnel, the south end zone student section and the team dining facility, which opened in July, on the north side of the stadium, bringing the total capacity up to 61,441

SOUTH END ZONE PROJECT

The Purdue student section and the All-American Marching Band have a new home in the south end zone of Ross-Ade Stadium. As a part of the Phase I project, the dedicated student section enhancements included the addition of a new Tyler Trent student entrance area, safe standing seats, patio and deck areas, rail seating, and enhanced concessions.

The completion of the bowl, in addition to the investment in the size of the concourse, allows for a more accessible fan experience as fans will now be able to traverse the entire stadium at the concourse level.

TILLER TUNNEL

The Boilermakers run onto Rohrman Field at Ross-Ade Stadium via the Tiller Tunnel. Completed in 2023, the tunnel provides direct access to the team back to the Kozuch Football Performance Center.

The tunnel is named in honor of the Purdue Hall of Fame inductee Joe Tiller, the winningest coach in the history of Purdue Football. Tiller left an incredible legacy on the program and Boilermakers everywhere. The result was 10 bowl games, including the 2001 Rose Bowl, and a Big Ten Conference championship in 2000.

DEN OF DEFENSIVE ENDS

Throughout its history, Purdue has produced many outstanding defensive ends, creating an institution unlike any other in college football - The Den of Defensive Ends.

The tradition of The Den of Defensive Ends dates to the days of Leo Sugar and Lamar Lundy from the late 1940s to the mid-1950s and Keena Turner in the late 1970s, but it has flourished more recently. While Purdue's high-powered offense has made headlines under head coaches Joe Tiller, Jeff Brohm and Ryan Walters, the Boilermakers' defense made a name for itself principally for the play of its ends.

CRADLE OF QUARTERBACKS

The Cradle of Quarterbacks has evolved over the last 70 years as a defining feature of Purdue football. Boilermakers have set numerous NCAA and Big Ten Conference records, many have been chosen as All-Americans and national awards winners or finalists.

Fifteen former Purdue signal-callers have gone on to play in the National Football League. Drew Brees, Dawson and Griese combined to win four Super Bowls. Purdue is one of just two universities that can claim three Super Bowl champs at the position. (Alabama)

The reference to Cradle of Quarterbacks was added in the late 1970s when the poster was updated to include Mark Herrmann.

INDIANA STATE Aug. 31, 2024 ROSS-ADE STADIUM • WEST LAFAYETTE, IND.

In front of Ross-Ade Stadium's largest crowd (59,488) for a season opener since 2005, the Boilermakers steamrolled to a 49-0 victory over Indiana State.

Senior quarterback Hudson Card tied the all-time FBS record for completion percentage (minimum 20 completions). completing 24 of 25 passes (96%). He threw for 273 yards and a career-high four touchdowns before being pulled near the end of the third guarter once the game was already in hand.

The Purdue offense posted its highest passing output of the Ryan Walters era so far, totaling 335 yards and four touchdowns, with 12 different players catching a pass. Seven different Boilermakers scored a touchdown for the first time since Sept. 15, 2012 vs. Eastern Michigan.

Tight end Max Klare led the aerial attack with a career-high 71 receiving yards and his first career touchdown, a nine-yard dot from Card on 3rd-and-Goal for the team's first score of 2024.

The Purdue rushing attack combined for 31 carries for 248 yards (8.0 average) and three touchdowns, with junior running back Devin Mockobee leading the way on 11 carries for 89 yards.

The Boilermaker defense made life difficult for the Sycamores all afternoon, holding both phases of the offense in check. Purdue forced six three-and-outs, facing the minimum 12 offensive plays in Indiana State's first four drives.

Purdue gave up just 50 yards on five passes, the lowest total allowed in a game since 2019 and the fifth time since 1996 that the Boilermakers allowed 50 passing yards or fewer. The rushing defense was stout as well, allowing 104 yards on 53 carries, just 2.4 yards per attempt.

Will Heldt and Antonio Stevens tied for the team lead with seven tackles, career highs for both players.

Purdue dropped a 66-7 decision to No. 18 Notre Dame on Saturday afternoon at Ross-Ade Stadium.

Senior running back Reggie Love III led the rushing attack, logging 10 carries for 61 yards and a 6.1 average against a stout Notre Dame defense.

Quarterback Hudson Card completed 11-of-24 passes for 124 yards and a touchdown. After a tough first half, he got the Boilers moving down the field with a 52-yard pass to Kam Brown in the third quarter.

Two plays later, Card tossed a five-yard touchdown to De'Nylon Morrissette, scoring the Boilermakers' only points of the afternoon. It was Morrissette's second score of the season.

Leading the team in catches again was Max Klare, who recorded three receptions for 36 yards.

On defense, sophomore Dillon Thieneman was Purdue's leading tackler for the ninth time in his young career, finishing with nine stops (six solos) and his first sack of the season.

Shitta Sillah notched his first sack as a Boilermaker, dropping quarterback Steve Angeli for a 10-yard loss in the third quarter. Will Heldt and Kydran Jenkins also combined for a sack in the fourth quarter.

Punter Keelan Crimmins averaged 47.3 yards per kick on his 10 reps Saturday with two balls over 50 yards, a long of 64, and three inside the 20-yard line.

Notre Dame built up a 42-0 lead at the break and led by 49 before Purdue got on the board with Morrissette's touchdown grab with 9:33 to play in the third.

Purdue dropped its first road game of the season, falling 38-21 at Oregon State.

Running back Devin Mockobee eclipsed 2,000 career rushing yards. He gained 100 yards for the first time this season and the seventh time in his career, finishing with 168 yards on 16 carries for a 10.5-yard average and a touchdown.

The junior led the backfield as Purdue posted its highest rushing output (263 yards) since combining for 303 yards on the ground at Northwestern on Nov. 18, 2023.

Early Purdue turnovers spelled trouble after a promising defensive start, when the Boilers turned the Beavers over on downs just four plays into the game. The offense took the ball at the Oregon State 28-yard line and had three carries for 17 yards before a lost fumble spoiled a red zone trip.

On the next offensive possession, Hudson Card's pass to the flat took an unfortunate bounce off the leg of his target and was picked off and returned for a touchdown by the Beavers' defense.

On a two-play, 47-yard drive, Max Klare hauled in a 32-yard heave from Card for Purdue's first score, cutting the Beavers'

The score was 24-7 before Purdue answered again in the fourth quarter, when Reggie Love III capped a 7-play, 75-yard drive with his second touchdown of the season.

After another Oregon State score, Mockobee broke free for a 63yard gain, the longest run of the night. It set up his three-yard touchdown two plays later, making the tally 31-21, Beavers.

Purdue ultimately gave up one more touchdown and fell to 1-2 on the season.

Purdue fell in a 28-10 defeat to Nebraska on homecoming at Ross-Ade Stadium.

After a penalty-plagued first half by both teams, the score remained tied at zero at the break. It was the first 0-0 halftime score in a Purdue game since Sept. 25, 1993, against Notre

The Boilermaker defense and special teams collectively starred in the first half, bowing up to make six stops in their own territory. The Cornhuskers were held to three punts and three field goal attempts. All three field goal attempts were missed, with the Boilers blocking two of the three. It was the first time Purdue has blocked multiple kicks in a game since Sept. 3, 2011.

After the break, Hudson Card and the offense engineered a 13-play, 55-yard drive that took 8:08 off the clock and ended with a Spencer Porath 45-yard field goal, the freshman's first field goal of his career. Nebraska answered with a scoring drive of its own, finally getting on the board near the end of the third quarter to take a lead that it would not relinquish.

Purdue's deficit quickly snowballed after what was a close, hard-fought game through three quarters. Down 28-3 late in the game, the offense found the end zone for the first time. Leland Smith high-pointed a 15-yard pass from Card, scoring his second career touchdown.

Card completed 18-of-25 passes for 174 yards and a score, good for a 135.7 passer rating. He completed 72 percent of his passes, his career-best mark in a Big Ten game. Sophomore wide receiver Jaron Tibbs was Card's top target as he finished with career highs in catches (five) and yards (46).

Joseph Jefferson II and Dillon Thieneman tied for the team lead in tackles with nine apiece.

The Purdue football team fell in a 52-6 loss to Wisconsin at Camp Randall Stadium on Saturday afternoon.

Both defenses started strong with the Boilermaker defense forcing two punts to open the game. Wisconsin (3-2, 1-1 B1G) scored the contest's first points after a muffed punt by the Purdue return team, a costly turnover that allowed the Badgers to get the ball at Purdue's 12-yard line.

After another Wisconsin touchdown drive that made the score 14-0, defensive back Kyndrich Breedlove picked off two passes on back-to-back drives in the second quarter. In his breakout performance, it was the junior transfer's first two career interceptions and Purdue's first takeaways of the season. It also marked the first time a Boilermaker intercepted two passes in a game since Dillon Thieneman against Indiana on Nov. 25, 2023.

The Purdue offense took advantage of the field position from the interceptions and drove to the red zone on both ensuing drives, but was ultimately held to field goals, making the score 14-6, Badgers.

Freshman kicker Spencer Porath converted each of his two field goal attempts, from 21 and 23 yards, improving his season percentage to 75% (3-of-4).

The two field goals were the Boilermakers' only scores of the afternoon, and Purdue dropped to 1-4 (0-2 BIG) on the season.

Will Heldt and Dillon Thieneman tied for the team lead with eight tackles, six solos apiece. Devin Mockobee paced the backfield with 11 carries for 45 yards (4.1 average). Hudson Card was 11-of-21 passing for 111 yards.

After one of the most spirited comeback efforts in program history, the Purdue football team fell in a heartbreaking 50-49 overtime defeat at No. 23 Illinois on Saturday afternoon.

The Boilermakers trailed 27-3 early in the second half and 40-28 with five minutes to go before redshirt freshman Ryan Browne led the team on a pair of touchdown drives, giving Purdue the lead, 43-40, with 46 seconds to go. Illinois converted a 38-yard field goal as time expired to send the game into overtime.

After the Illini found the end zone to start overtime, the Boilermakers answered with a touchdown of their own as Arhmad Branch used his speed to beat the defenders to the pylon. With the ball in its hands, Purdue elected to go for two to win the game.

On the game's final play, Illinois brought the pressure and stopped the Boilermakers to prevent the largest comeback in Purdue history.

On a day without starting quarterback Hudson Card, Browne stepped into the signal caller role and lit up the box score, finishing 18-of-26 passing for 297 yards and three touchdowns, also garnering 118 rushing yards on 17 carries for a 6.9 average in his first career start.

Max Klare led Purdue with a career-high 133 yards on six catches. Devin Mockobee notched 102 yards on 11 carries, marking his eighth career 100-yard game.

Kydran Jenkins paced the defense with 10 tackles, six solos, 1.5 sacks and 2.5 tackles-for-loss. Will Heldt also had a career-best 1.5 sacks and 1.5 TFLs.
