## SETTING THE SCENE

- At 7-2, Purdue is off to its best 9-game start since the 2007 team was 7-1-1. The 2007 team went on to win the Big Ten Tournament and host the first two rounds of the NCAA Tournament. Members of that team will be honored at next Sunday's Alumni Day game.
- Week awards, the league's first player to repeat since October 2012. She entered the week leading the Big Ten in goals, assists and points and is two points shy of eclipsing Purdue's all-time record.
- Purdue and Penn State are the only Big Ten teams that have yet to be shut out this season. The Boilermakers have scored in 11 straight games dating back to last year's draw with Indiana.
- Purdue is looking to win three straight Big Ten road games for only the third time in program history. The Boilermakers have not accomplished the feat since 2005. They won four straight on the road in Big Ten play in 2003.

#### **BOILERMAKERS CLOSE OUT ROAD STRETCH IN BLOOMINGTON**

· Purdue's annual Golden Boot game against rival Indiana marks the finale of a five-game road stretch. The Boilermakers opened conference play by sweeping its Michigan-Michigan State road trip, starting Big Ten play at 2-0 for the first time since 2008 (and seventh time in program history). Purdue's 7-2 record represents the program's best nine-game start since 2007 (7-1-1).

- The Sept. 23 date of this year's Golden Boot game represents the earliest it has ever been contested. Previously, Oct. 7, 2010 was the earliest in the season the rivals ever met. The Boilermakers won the trophy back with a season-ending victory in Bloomington and kept possession of it with a 2-2 draw last year at Folk Field. The Hoosiers need a victory to regain possession of Golden Boot trophy.
- · Purdue and Maryland were the only Big Ten teams to play each of their first three conference games on the road this season. After Saturday, the Boilermakers play five of their final eight games at Folk Field.

#### WILLIAMS. PURDUE LEADING THE BIG TEN IN GOALS

• With Maddy Williams leading the way with a league-high eight
goals, the Boilermakers entered the week leading the Big Ten
with 24 goals. Purdue and Penn State are the only conference
teams that have yet to be shut out. Williams is also tied for fifth
nationally with the eight goals. She's also third nationally with
23 points.

• The Boilermakers have scored in 11 straight games dating
back to the penultimate game of the 2016 campaign. That's the
team's longest streak since scoring in the first 13 games of the
2013 campaign. Purdue is also currently riding a nine-game
scoring streak at Folk Field dating back to October 2016.

· The Boilermakers have already surpassed last year's totals for wins (4) and goals (16).

#### HASE'S LATE GOAL LIFTS BOILERMAKERS TO FIRST-EVER WIN IN ANN ARBOR

• Kylie Hase scored in the 83rd minute to propel Purdue to a 1-0 win at Michigan in the Big Ten opener for both teams. The goal lifted the Boil- 2017 ermakers to their first-ever victory in Ann Arbor 2015 Hannah Mussallem vs ILL and their first 1-0 Big Ten win on the road since 2011 Alex Hairston September 2013 at Ohio State (10th in program 2007 Jessica Stellhorn history). It was the first goal Michigan allowed at home in 450 minutes this year.

• The win marked the 11th time that Purdue opened conference play with a shutout. Ten of those 11 games were shutout victories. The Boilermakers went on to sweep its Michigan-Michigan State trip, beating both teams in the same year for only the second time ever (2005).

SCORED FIRST GOAL OF BIG TEN PLAY

 Hase became the first Purdue freshman to score the game-winner in a 1-0 Big Ten road victory. She joined teammate Hannah Mussallem among the five freshmen in program history to account for the Boilermakers' first goal of the Big Ten season.

#### SCORED SIX TO CRUSH THE SPARTANS

- The Boilermakers' six goals in their win at Michigan State were their most ever in a Big Ten road game. They scored at least three goals in both halves for only the second time in program history, also accomplishing the feat in an October 2011 win vs. Indiana.
- Purdue snapped a seven-game (0-6-1) winless drought against MSU, posting its first win in the series since 2008. It was the program's first victory in East Lansing since 2007.
- The Boilermakers also scored six times in the Indiana State win. They have two wins with at least six goals in the same season for the first time ever.
- · Purdue rallied to win after conceding the game's first goal for the first time since last year's overtime victory vs. Cincinnati. The Boilermakers rallied to win on the road after going down 1-0 for the first time since October 2015 at Maryland.

#### WILLIAMS REPEATS AS BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK; HASE HONORED

- For their leading-role contributions in Purdue's sweep of its conference-opening road trip, Maddy Williams and Kylie Hase were honored as the Big Ten Offensive Player and Freshman of the Week. Williams is the league's first player to repeat as the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week since Ohio State's Tiffany Cameron in October 2012.
- Williams tied program records with three assists and seven points in the 6-2 blowout at Michigan State. Hase scored the game-winner in the 1-0 victory at Michigan. The 2005 season marked the last time a Boilermaker won Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week twice in the same season. Purdue's last Big Ten Freshman of the Week was in 2014.

#### SCORED FIRST IN FIRST EIGHT GAMES

- The Boilermakers scored first in their first eight games of the season. After also scoring first in the final of the 2016 campaign, Purdue's nine-game streak ranked as the longest in program history. The 2009 and 2015 teams scored first in their first six games. The 2002 and 2006 teams also posted six-game streaks in which they scored first.
- Michigan State scored in the third minute to end Purdue's streak. Lexy Warner's goal, scored just 123 seconds after the opening kickoff, was the earliest goal conceded by the Boilermakers since October 2013 vs. Minnesota (55 seconds).
- The Boilermakers also scored in the first half of their first seven games, registering goals in the opening 10 minutes of a match three times. For the season, Purdue has held the lead for 514 of the 810 minutes (63 percent) while trailing for just 17 minutes.

#### WILLIAMS ECLIPSES PURDUE ASSISTS RECORD

- With her conference-leading seven assists this season, Maddy Williams has established a new Purdue all-time record with 25 career helpers. She broke a record held by former teammate Alex Hairston. Williams has had a direct impact on 57 goals during her Purdue career, which is now also the most in team history.
- By scoring the game-winning goal in the victories vs. DePaul, Dayton and Louisville, Williams became the first Boilermaker since Shauna Stapleton in 2007 to account for the decisive score in three consecutive contests. Her four game winners are already good for fourth most in a season at Purdue.

#### PURDUE POSTS LONG SHUTOUT STREAK

- The Boilermakers won three straight games in shutout fashion for the first time since midway through the 2013 campaign. Purdue's shutout streak was snapped at 358 consecutive minutes when Louisville scored in the 87th minute. The streak ranked as the sixth longest in program history.
- The Boilermakers came within four minutes of recording four or more consecutive shutouts for only the fifth time in program history. The 2007 team, which won 20 games while conceding only 12 goals, accomplished the feat twice and was the last to do so.

#### WILLIAMS' HAT TRICK LEADS TO BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS

• Maddy Williams' hat trick in the win at Louisville earned the senior her second career Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week honor. She posted the fifth hat trick in program history, tying the Boilermakers' record for goals in a game. She scored three minutes and six seconds apart in the first half. The third score of the natural hat trick was also her 30th career goal and 10th career game winner.

• Williams was also named the Big Ten's Offensive Player of the Week in October 2013 after she scored the lone goal in consecutive 1-0 wins vs. Illinois and Northwestern. She joins Jessica Okoroafo (4) and Parrissa Eyorokon (2) as Boilermakers to win Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week multiple times during their careers. Goalkeepers Lauren Mason (6) and Jenny Bradfisch (2) were also Defensive Player of the Week winners on multiple occasions.

#### TWELEVE WINS UNDER ROFF WHEN GIVING UP A GOAL

• Including the preseason victory vs. Iowa State this year, Purdue has found a way to win 12 times when conceding a goal under third-year head coach **Drew Roff**. Seven of those victories have come in 2-1 fashion. Overall, the Boilermakers are 12-21-1 (.367) when conceding at least one goal under Roff (including preseason). From 2012 to 2014, Purdue was 9-32-5 (.250) when surrendering a goal.

## MOOSE TO MADDY GIVES PURDUE A PAIR OF EARLY LEADS

- The Boilermakers held the lead for 166 of the 180 minutes during the DePaul-Dayton weekend after **Maddy Williams** scored in the opening 10 minutes of both wins. Right back **Hannah Mussallem** set up both goals with excellent long passes from the midfield stripe along the west sideline. Both passes beat the opposition's back line over the top.
- After also scoring in the win at Louisville, Williams recorded a goal in three straight games for the second time in her career.

- The Boilermakers scored five times in a span of 25 minutes in the second half to turn a one-goal lead into a 6-0 victory vs. Indiana State on Aug. 27. The six goals were the team's most since 2011. Sarah Griffith scored in the sixth minute to give Purdue an early lead.
- With Hannah Mussallem, Andrea Petrina and Kylie Hase also scoring in the ISU win, it marked the first time since a 2013 win vs. Dartmouth that four Boilermakers scored in the same game. Purdue duplicated the feat in its win at Michigan State.
- · The 2013 season also marked the last time six different players scored over Purdue's first three games, a feat accomplished this year after Hannah Melchiorre and Maddy Williams scored goals during the season-opening weekend.

 In the Indiana State win, the Boilermakers scored five goals in a half for the first time since a November 2007 win vs. Indiana. That win also marked the last time since two Boilermakers each scored twice in the same half, a feat accomplished by Petrina and Mussallem vs. ISU.

#### FRESHMEN SCORE FIRST OFFICIAL GOALS IN SAME GAME

· Although Sarah Griffith scored in both preseason wins, her goal vs. Indiana State became her first official tally. With she and Kylie Hase both recording their first goals in the victory, it marked the first time two freshmen scored their first goals in the same game since an August 2014 win vs. Ohio (Erika Arkans, Nicole Robertson). Including the two preseason wins, a freshman scored Purdue's first goal in each of the first five games this year.

#### SET UP TWO GOALS IN THE SAME HALF

· Hannah Melchiorre set up goals by Andrea Petrina and Kylie Hase in the Indiana State win, becoming the first Boilermaker to assist on a pair of goals in a half since a September 2015 win at Montana. Maddy Williams would later duplicate the feat in the first half of the Michigan State win. An August 2014 win vs. SIU Edwardsville marked the last time two Purdue players had multiple assists in the same game, a feat accomplished by Melchiorre and Williams vs. ISU.

#### MELCHIORRE THE FIRST FRESHMAN TO SCORE IN FIRST TWO GAMES

- · Hannah Melchiorre accounted for Purdue's first goal of both games during the season-opening weekend. In the process, she became the first freshman in program history to score in each of the PLAYER first two games of a season. Classmate Sarah Griffith did likewise Hannah Melchiorre in both of Purdue's preseason wins, but as exhibition games those goals don't count toward Griffith's career total.
- Maddy Williams (2015) remains the only Boilermaker to ever score in each of the first three games of a season.
- · Melchiorre is Purdue's first freshman to account for the Boilermakers' first goal of a season since Erika Arkans in 2014. However, Alex Hairston (in 2011) was the last Purdue freshman to score the team's first goal of a new campaign in a season opener.

- LUCE ONLY THE THIRD FRESHMAN KEEPER TO START A SEASON OPENER · Katie Luce started in goal and played all 180 minutes of the season-opening weekend. She is only Purdue's third freshman to start a season opener at goalkeeper. Jocelyn Cavalier in the inaugural 1998 campaign and Lauren Mason in 2003 are the only other Boilermakers to earn the honor.
- · Luce finished the season-opening weekend with 10 saves, making six in the win vs. Kent State. Both total were the most by a Purdue keeper since Clara Kridler made eight and 14 in a 2011 seasonopening road trip to Toledo and West Virginia.

#### **FIVE WINS VERSUS 10-WIN TEAMS FROM 2016**

• The Boilermakers have already posted five wins against teams that won at least 10 games in 2016. Notre Dame (13-3-5), lowa State (10-8-1), Kent State (15-3-2), DePaul (10-6-3) and Michigan (10-5-5) were a combined 58-25-16 (.667) a year ago. Purdue nearly had another victory against a 10-win team from 2016, but Loyola Marymount (11-5-3) rallied to steal the game 2-1.

#### FRUSTRATING SECOND-GAME SIMILARITIES

- Hannah Melchiorre's first-half goal allowed Purdue to hold the lead for 48 minutes, but Loyola Marymount scored twice in the final six minutes to rally for the win Aug. 21 at Folk Field. The Lions scored a pair of quality goals only four minutes and 20 seconds apart, equalizing in the 84th minute and taking the lead in the 88th minute.
- The Boilermakers also dropped their second game of the 2016 campaign 2-1 after holding the lead for more than half the game. Purdue lost to Montana in overtime after holding the lead for 77 minutes. By leading for 48 minutes, the LMU defeat ranks tied for third in program history among games Purdue ended up losing despite holding the lead for a long stretch.

#### LONG HOMESTAND TO BEGIN THE REGULAR SEASON

- For the second time in three years, Purdue began the regular with five straight games at home. Including the Aug. 12 preseason exhibition win vs. Iowa State, it was a six-game homestand at Folk Field for the Boilermakers. In 2015, **Drew Roff's** first year as head coach, the Boilermakers also played six straight games at home. They went 5-1 during that stretch en route to posting their first winning season (9-8-1) since 2009.
- During the homestand this year, Purdue hosted four teams that won at least 10 games in 2016 Iowa State (10-8-1), Kent State (15-3-2), Loyola Marymount (11-3-5) and DePaul (10-6-3). Kent State and Dayton both qualified for the 2016 NCAA Tournament. DePaul (Alexa Ben) and Dayton (Alexis Kiehl) also featured players on the Hermann Trophy's preseason watch list.

#### **BOILERMAKERS REMAIN PERFECT IN PRESEASON ACTION UNDER ROFF**

- With wins vs. No. 18 Notre Dame (13-3-5 in 2016) and Iowa State (10-8-1) in preseason action, Purdue defeated a pair of teams that won at least 10 games in 2016. Under head coach **Drew Roff**, the Boilermakers are now 6-0 in preseason games and 17-4 in all exhibition games (spring and fall). Three of those four losses had come at the hands of the Fighting Irish in spring exhibitions before this preseason. **Sarah Griffith** and **Maddy Williams** both scored in each victory.
- Even though they don't count towards her career total (27), Williams scored eight goals in six career preseason games. She had five goals in Purdue's two preseason wins in 2015, highlighted by a hat trick at Milwaukee.
- Purdue managed to rally for a 2-1 win vs. the Cyclones despite conceding the game's first goal. Iowa State's first-half goal ended the Boilermakers' preseason shutout streak at 553 consecutive minutes dating back to a 2014 exhibition win at Illinois State, which was coached by Roff at the time. Rallying to win was an encouraging sign after Purdue was 1-8-1 last season when the opposition scored first.

#### FIRST WIN VERSUS TOP-25 OPPONENT SINCE 2009

• While the Aug. 9 preseason win at Notre Dame will ultimately not count toward Purdue's record this season or in the all-time series with the Fighting Irish, it was still a win against a team ranked among the top 25 in the United Soccer Coaches' (formerly NSCAA) preseason poll. The Boilermakers have not beaten a top-25 team in the regular season since August 2009 at No. 6 Texas A&M.
