# HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Currently in his 17th season as the leader of the program, Schreiber is the program's all-time leader in overall wins and Big Ten wins. He eclipsed Dave Alexander's record for games coached (792 over 14 seasons) during the second weekend of the 2013 season. Schreiber played for Alexander at Purdue from 1983-86.

Purdue unveiled its new Alexander Field stadium and facilities during the 2012-13 school year, but the first two seasons at the new ballpark turned out to be rebuilding years for the Boilermakers after losing 15 seniors and three junior MLB draftees from the 2012 Big Ten championship team. As of July 2014, 10 members of the 2012 championship team had signed with MLB organizations at some point in their post-college careers.

In the five seasons between 2008 and 2012, Purdue went 172-110 overall (.610) and 75-51 in Big Ten play (.595). Both records represented the best marks in the league. The Boilermakers were the only conference team to qualify for the Big Ten Tournament each of those five seasons, the longest such streak in program history. Purdue has won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in eight of its nine appearances under Schreiber.

After playing six NCAA Regional qualifiers throughout the season, including four opponents that were among the 16 Regional hosts, Purdue's strength of schedule in 2014 ranked among the Top 25 nationally for much of the year, including as high as No. 2 in the country for much of non-conference play. The Boilermakers' eight extra-inning affairs were the most in Schreiber's tenure as well as the most in the Big Ten. Purdue also played in 17 one-run games, but managed just a 5-12 record in those contests.

During its historic 2012 season, Purdue won a program-record 45 games, captured a pair of Big Ten titles, earned the right to host an NCAA Regional and closed out Lambert Field in thrilling fashion. Schreiber was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year after leading the Boilers to the most wins by a Big Ten team since 2008. He won his 400th and program-record 408th career games at Lambert in the spring of 2012. His 408th victory as the leader of the program, April 15 in the finale of a series sweep of Illinois, made him Purdue's all-time wins leader.

The Boilermakers began the 2012 season 14-1, won 10 consecutive games twice, posted their 20th win before April 1 for the first time, reached the 30-win mark at the earliest date (April 20) in program history and won their first Big Ten title since 1909.

Headlined by Kevin Plawecki's selection 35th overall by the New York Mets, Purdue had a program-record seven players picked in the 2012 Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft. Juniors Plawecki, Cameron Perkins and Nick Wittgren were each selected in the first 10 rounds to give the Boilers three players drafted in the first 300 picks for the first time. Six times since 2006 multiple Boilers have been selected in the same draft. Highlighted by Big Ten Player and Pitcher of the Year honors for Plawecki and Joe Haase, Purdue had a program-high eight all-conference honorees in 2012.

Schreiber has coached 62 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 22 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the MLB First-Year Player Draft on 32 occasions.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including first all-time in walks (132), tied for first in games played (226), sixth in runs scored (159) and tied for eight in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

## – BOILERS RETURN TO SOUTH TEXAS FOR SECOND WEEKEND OF NEW SEASON –

Purdue baseball heads to south Texas for the second weekend of the season for the second year in a row, flying to the Gulf Coast for the four-team Kleberg Bank College Classic hosted by Texas A&M-Corpus Christi and the Corpus Christi Hooks of Minor League Baseball.

The games will be played at Whataburger Field, which is located along the waterfront in downtown Corpus Christi. The Harbor Bridge looms in the background of the center field wall. The Corpus Christi Hooks are the Houston Astros' Double-A affiliate in the Texas League. This weekend will mark the first time Purdue has played in an active minor league stadium since sweeping a March 2013 series at Penn State.

Sam Houston State (3-1) and A&M-Corpus Christi (3-0) are both members of the Southland Conference. SHSU is the three-time defending champion of the Southland and has played in the last three NCAA Tournaments, advancing to the finals of the Fort Worth Regional hosted by TCU last season.

Purdue visited Houston this time last year for a three-game series at perennial power Rice. It was the Boilers' first trip to Texas since March 2009. Purdue closed out its 2005 spring break trip with a three-game series at A&M-Corpus Christi, but the final two games were played as part of a doubleheader in nearby Robstown, Texas. The Boilermakers also played Lamar on the 2005 spring break trip and those games remain the program's most recent against active members of the Southland Conference.

The 2015 edition of the Kleberg Bank College Classic marks the 10th anniversary of the four-team tournament. Big Ten teams have compiled an 8-2 record in the event, with Indiana (2-1 in 2011), Nebraska (4-0 in 2012) and Iowa (2-1 in 2013) all winning multiple games in recent seasons. Last year's field featured BYU, TCU, Texas-San Antonio and host A&M-Corpus Christi. From 2006-10, it was known as the Whataburger College Classic before Kleberg Bank came aboard as the title sponsor. Alabama, Arizona, Arizona State, Mississippi State, Notre Dame, Oklahoma, Rice, Texas Tech, UCLA, Oregon State, Connecticut are some of the universities that have played in the tournament over the last 10 years.

The Purdue coaching staff has opted to have freshman **Mike Kornacker** start Friday's game against A&M-Corpus Christi. The righthander from Chicagoland did not travel last week due in part to some lingering back soreness, but is projected to be a possible midweek starter or important reliever this year. He'll pitch the first two or three innings Friday in order to give him an opportunity to have a clean start to his first collegiate outing. **Gavin Downs** is expected to be the first man out of the bullpen vs. A&M-Corpus Christi, a role in which he excelled on Fridays early in 2014. Adam Dressler is also part of the travel roster this weekend after not going to Western Carolina for similar reasons as Kornacker.

**Brian Ghiselli** will take the ball in the nightcap of the Sam Houston State doubleheader Saturday after making his Purdue debut last weekend as the first man out of the bullpen in the season opener. **Matt Frawley** had the strongest outing of any Purdue starting pitcher at Western Carolina and will take the ball Sunday vs. Missouri (4-0).

**Kyle Wood** struck out a career-high seven of the 15 batters he faced over three innings of relief in the Boilers' 9-5 win in Cullowhee last weekend. It was the top strikeout total by a Purdue reliever since Pat Gannon fanned seven over four innings at Tennessee Tech in March

2011.

**Brandon Krieg**, **Kyle Johnson**, **Jeff Evak** and **Justin Gubser** all hit safely in each of the three games at Western Carolina. Krieg extended his reached base safely streak to 22 consecutive games dating back to April of last year. Evak has been on in 10 straight games going back to the final month of his freshman campaign. In his first three plate appearances as a Boilermaker, Gubser singled as a pinch hitter, connected for a solo home run and drove in another run with a sacrifice fly. The junior college transfer from California started games at catcher and first base in the doubleheader at Western Carolina.

Purdue will play four games in four days next weekend at Arizona State's Phoenix Municipal Classic in the Valley of the Sun, taking on first-time opponents Gonzaga (Thursday and Saturday), ASU (Friday) and CSU Bakersfield (Sunday).

# **BOILERMAKERS RETURN TO SOUTH TEXAS FOR CORPUS CHRISTI TOURNAMENT**

- For the second year in a row, Purdue travels to South Texas for its second weekend of the new season. The Boilermakers will take on Texas A&M-Corpus Christi, Sam Houston State and Missouri at the Kleberg Bank Baseball Classic. This time last year, Purdue flew south to Houston for a three-game series at Rice. Prior to last season, the Boilers had not played in Texas since March 2009.
- Sam Houston State is the three-time defending champions of the Southland Conference and a team that has been to the NCAA Tournament each of the last three seasons. SHSU is also the first of five first-time opponents on Purdue's schedule this year.
- The Boilermakers were outscored 37-19 during their season-opening series at Western Carolina, the two-time defending champion of the Southern Conference, but still managed to win the series finale. Purdue scored first in all three games, but was out scored 29-9 after the second inning. As they were early last season, big innings were an issue for the Boilers. WCU scored four-plus runs in an inning five times in the first two games. But Purdue put up a four spot to begin game three and rode the early lead to victory.
- The Feb. 13 season opener was the earliest in program history. The 2013 season began on Feb. 15, which at the time was the Boilers' earliest opener ever, eclipsing 2001 (Feb. 16). Purdue was scheduled to open on Valentine's Day last year at Tennessee, but didn't end up playing its first game until Feb. 16 due to weather delays. The 1997 team opened on Feb. 17.

# **PURDUE PITCHERS STRIKE OUT 15 IN GAME THREE WIN AT WCU**

• **Matt Frawley** (5), **Kyle Wood** (7) and **Joe Eichmann** (3) teamed up to strike out 15 Western Carolina batters as Purdue won game three of the series in Cullowhee, 9-5. It ranked as the third-highest strikeout total in program history and the most since the Boilers fanned 16 in a March 2010 victory at Ohio. Frawley struck out four his first time through the lineup. Wood struck out seven of the 15 batters he faced, striking out the side in the sixth and seventh innings. Eichmann struck out WCU's 2-3-4 hitters in order after giving up a leadoff walk and a batter reaching on an error to open the ninth inning. The senior earned his first career save.

• Wood's career-high strikeout total was the most by a Purdue pitcher since Jordan Minch and Connor Podkul both fanned seven as starters last season. However, they pitched at least six innings each time. Wood racked up his seven Ks in only three innings. **Matt Gibbs** and **Tim McElroy** both struck out six in a relief appearance last season, but Wood's seven Ks were the most by a Purdue reliever since Pat Gannon had seven over four innings in a March 2011 win at Tennessee Tech.

• Overall, Purdue pitchers were more aggressive in the strike zone than what they demonstrated for much of last season. The Boilers had 29 strikeouts vs. only seven walks (a 4.14 K/BB ratio) during the season-opening weekend. A year ago, the pitching staff had only 17 more strikeouts (243) than walks (226), a 1.08 K/BB ratio.

# **KRIEG EXTENDS STREAK INTO 20s, PICCHIOTTI'S ENDS AT 20 AT WCU**

• **Brandon Krieg** and **Jack Picchiotti** entered 2015 riding notable 19-game reached base safely streaks. Krieg hit safely in all three games of the Western Carolina series to extend his reached safely streak to a career-long 22 straight games. Krieg has hit safely in 16 of the 22 games while posting the second-longest streak on the team among active players, behind only **Kyle Wood's** 24-game run last year. Picchiotti had reached base safely in the final 19 games of 2014 season in which he started, but that streak came to an end at 20 in game two of the series. It dated back to April 5, 2014, and the nightcap of a doubleheader vs. Penn State.

# **FINDING A WAY TO WIN MORE CLOSE GAMES**

• Purdue was 9-16 in games decided by two runs or fewer last season. Ten of their 17 one-run games came in Big Ten play. Additionally, eight of those 25 close games were extra-innings affairs, Purdue going 3-5 in games longer than nine innings. The Boilermakers' eight extra-inning affairs were the most in the Big Ten during the regular season and the 17 one-run games ranked second in the league behind only Illinois (18).

• A better showing in close games coupled with a less-daunting pre-Big Ten schedule would seem to go hand in hand in helping Purdue have a better season this year. With six starting position players and almost the entire bullpen back from last year, numerous Boilers have experienced the ups and downs of numerous nail biters as well as playing six NCAA Regional qualifiers in 2014.

• Conversely, staying out of big innings early in games would also help Purdue's cause. The Boilers were outscored 53-7 in the first inning during the 2014 campaign, leading to many early deficits the offense was not equipped to overcome after scoring four or more runs in an inning only twice in 50 games.

# **NINE TRANSFERS LOOKING TO MAKE INSTANT IMPACT**

• Seven of Purdue's nine transfers made their team debuts during the 2015 season-opening weekend. **Justin Gubser** (4-for-8, 2B, HR, 2 RBI) and **Michael Vilardo** (5-for-14, 2B, 3B, 4 RBI, 3 R) led the way with strong weekends at the plate.

• Five of the nine transfers began their college careers at other four-year universities. **Shane Bryant** (Indiana Wesleyan), **Brett Carlson** (Austin Peay) and **Brian Ghiselli** (Miami Univ.) have all been part of the program since the fall of 2013, sitting out last season as redshirts. Vilardo joined the program at the start of the 2015 spring semester as a graduate transfer from Penn, where he was a Second Team All-Ivy League second baseman in 2014. **Daniel Sander** and **Alex Lyons** helped Vincennes University reach the 2014 NJCAA Division II World Series.

### AIMING TO CARRY OVER DEFENSIVE EXCELLENCE INTO 2015

- Purdue led the Big Ten in double plays turned (54) and outfield assists (17) through the end of the 2014 regular season. Those areas of defensive excellence coupled with a .971 fielding percentage helped keep the Boilers in the numerous close games a year ago. Defense is expected to remain a team strength but was not during the season-opening weekend. Purdue committed multiple in all three games at WCU and nine for the series. The Boilermakers did not commit multiple errors in three straight games all of last season and had multiple errors in consecutive games only four times.
- Freshman **Harry Shipley** started each of the first three games at shortstop primarily because of his defensive prowess. Two-year starting infielder **Brandon Krieg** moved to third base this year after strong defensive seasons at second base (2013) and shortstop (2014). **Kyle Johnson** began his third season as the starter in center field. Sophomore **Jeff Evak** is fast enough to start in center field but has remained a corner outfielder in right.
- Cody Strong** and **Jack Picchiotti** had each seen action at six different positions during their underclassman seasons. Strong started the season opener in left field but moved back to second base, where he was a constant in 2014, for the final two games of the WCU series. Picchiotti started twice behind the plate and once in left field to open 2015. He was projected to take over the full-time duties at catcher this season as Purdue needs to replace the graduated (and drafted) Sean McHugh, who was the team's overall and defensive MVP in 2014 at catcher.

### SUMMER LEAGUE SUCCESS

- Kyle Johnson** (Peninsula Pilots, Costal Plain League) and **Kyle Wood** (Lakeshore Chinooks, Northwoods League) helped their summer league teams win league championships in the summer of 2014. They were the starting designated hitters in the two games their teams won in the finals round of the playoffs to clinch the league titles. Johnson was in the starting lineup for all six games Peninsula won in the playoffs and did not play in any of the three losses. Wood's team was named the nation's top summer league team by Perfect Game USA.
- Jeff Evak** and **Matt Frawley** were named all-stars in the Midwest Collegiate League. **Brian Ghiselli** pitched in the Great Lakes League All-Star Game.

### BEST IN THE BIG TEN FROM 2008-2012; THIRD BEST IN LEAGUE PLAY FROM 2000-2012

- After a program-best five consecutive Big Ten Tournament berths from 2008-12, Purdue has failed to qualify for the Big Ten Tournament the last two years. With the tournament field remaining at eight teams this year, the Boilers are looking to avoid their first three-year streak of not qualifying since 1988-92 (when it was only a four-team field). Purdue was a Big Ten-best 172-110 overall (.610) and 75-51 in league play (.595) from 2008-12. But the program has managed just a 30-71 overall mark (.297) the last two years.
- From 2000-2012, the Boilermakers were 197-168 (.539) in Big Ten play. Only Minnesota (220-140, .611) and Ohio State (211-152, .581) were better.

### RUBBER GAME STRUGGLES

- Purdue did not win a weekend series in 2014 due in part to an 0-6 record in rubber games. Four times the Boilers won the opener of the series, but ended up losing two-of-three. Purdue has lost nine straight weekend rubber games dating back to May 2012. The Boilermakers have not won a weekend series after losing the opener since May 2009 at Michigan State. In the years since, on 11 occasions Purdue has won the opener of a traditional three-game set but failed to win the series. Nine of those 11 series have been in Big Ten play.

### JOHNSON, KRIEG & WOOD AMONG BIG TEN PLAYERS TO WATCH

- Kyle Johnson**, **Brandon Krieg** and **Kyle Wood** are all two-year starters that have been constants in the top half of the lineup the last two seasons. The trio was highlighted as the Boilers' contingent among the Big Ten Players to Watch for the 2015 season. Together, Johnson, Krieg and Wood had made a combined 267 starts entering the 2015 season. Johnson (center field) and Krieg (shortstop) were the only two Boilers to make all of their starts at the same position in 2014.
- Wood finished 2014 as the team leader in batting average (.302), on-base percentage (.390) and OPS (.804). He had a 24-game reached base safely streak during the middle of the season
- Krieg led the 2014 Boilermakers with 12 steals and 28 runs scored. Defensively, he contributed to 32 of the Big Ten-leading 54 double plays Purdue turned. After a 3-for-38 start to the season at the plate, he raised his batting average to .273 by April 20, and .272 entering the final day of the season
- Johnson seems poised to enjoy a breakout season as the athletic 6-foot-5 outfielder enters his junior campaign having started 88 of the 101 games the last two years. He batted third in the lineup all three games of the 2015 opening weekend and finished WCU series with five hits and four RBI.
