GAME NOTES

- Purdue moved to 785-428 all-time and 421-232 in non-conference play
- The Boilermakers are 99-29 all-time in November, including a 20-13 mark on neutral floors and a 6-5 record on Nov. 29
- Purdue is now 85-40 all-time in regular-season tournaments and 24-10 under Versyp
- The Boilermakers shot 50 percent (14-28) in the second half, including a 9-of-13 performance in the third quarter (.692)
- Purdue hit a season-high nine 3-pointers (9-23), cashing in 7-of-13 (.538) in the second half
- Sunday was the Boilermakers' first overtime game of the season and 55th in school history (30-25)
- Purdue was outrebounded for just the second time this season (39-38)
- The Boilermakers held Stanford without a field goal for stretches of at least three minutes on seven different occasions, including five of more than four minutes and one of 6:23 through the end of regulation and the first 3:44 of overtime
- Stanford had one of the best single-game free throw shooting performances by an opponent in Purdue history, making 25-of-26 at the line (.962)
- The Cardinal made just four field goals in the final 15 minutes of play, but converted 16-of-16 at the free throw line

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

- Ashley Morrisette was named to the all-tournament team after posting 16 points, two rebounds and two assists in the championship game
- April Wilson finished with 17 points, going 6-of-8 in the second half and 3-of-4 from behind the arc
- Wilson added five rebounds, five assists and a steal as well
- Bridget Perry finished with eight points, four rebounds and three steals before fouling out in the overtime session
- Hayden Hamby scored a season-high seven points, hitting a pair of 3's
- Nora Kiesler had six points and a career-high nine rebounds, marking the fourth straight game she's set a new rebounding best
- Dominique McBryde grabbed a career-high seven rebounds
