► HEAD COACH JEFF BROHM

- is now 45-27 in his sixth year as a head coach.
- is now 15-17 in his third year at Purdue.
- is now 1-0 against Maryland
- is now 12-11 in day games at Purdue.
- is now 10-11 against Big Ten opponents.

► PURDUE RECORDS

- is now 616-571-48 all-time.
- is now 1-2 against Maryland.
 - ... lost 24-7 in Champs Sports Bowl (Dec. 29, 2006)
 - ... lost 50-7 in College Park (Oct. 1, 2016)
- is now 1-0 at home against Maryland
- is now 333-402-32 in Big Ten play.
- is now 52-41-4 all-time on Homecoming.

► TEAM NOTES

- Four freshmen scored all five touchdowns (Bell - 2, Doerue, Wright, Trice). It marked the first time since at least 1997 that even three freshmen scored a touchdown in a game (David Bell, King Doerue and Milton Wright).
- First time since at least 1997 with two true freshmen scoring receiving touchdowns in a game (Bell and Wright).
- Scored 30 points in the first half, the most in the first half of a Big Ten conference game since Oct. 18, 2014, at Minnesota (31).
- Purdue's 547 yards of total offense were the 13th most in a game against Big Ten opposition in school history.
- Purdue's 11 third-down conversions were the 13th most in a game in school history.
- Purdue's third-down conversion percentage of 61.1 percent was its highest with at least 18 attempts since Nov. 14, 2009, vs. Michigan State.
- Purdue was 5 of 5 in the Red Zone.
- Maryland had 269 yards of offense in the first half, but just 134 yards in the second half.
- First time since Dec. 31, 2001, vs. Washington State that Purdue had at least three players with at least eight receptions (Hopkins - 10; Bell - 9; Anthrop - 8).
- First time since Dec. 26, 2007, vs. Central Michigan that Purdue had at least two receivers with at least 130 yards.

• Cory Trice

- ... Returned an interception for a touchdown just before half-time, becoming the first Purdue freshman with a pick-six since Ricardo Allen in 2010 at Michigan State.
- ... Added another interception in the third quarter to be the first Boilermaker since Markus Bailey in 2016 at Indiana with multiple INTs in a game.
- ... Also led the team with six tackles.

Jack Plummer

- ... Completed 33 of 41 passes for 420 yards and three touchdowns and no interceptions, the most completions and passing yards by a Purdue freshman since Danny Etling vs. Indiana (Nov. 30, 2013).
- ... it was the second-most passing yards by a freshman in school history (Etling above), and 19th-highest total by a quarterback in school history.
- ... Entering this week, there were zero freshman quarterbacks in the country to have at least 400 yards passing with three touchdowns and no interceptions. It had been done just eight times this year.

David Bell

- ... Produced career-highs in receptions (9), yards (138) and touchdowns (2) to become only the third Purdue freshman to reach those marks in a single game (others were Rondale Moore in 2018 and Taylor Stubblefield in 2001).
- ... Over the last three weeks, Bell has 20 catches for 308 yards and two touchdowns.

Brycen Hopkins

- ... Had career highs of 10 receptions and 140 yards.
- ... Most receptions by a Purdue tight end in a game since Tim Stratton in 2001 against Washington State.
- ... Most receiving yards by a Purdue tight end in a game since Dustin Keller in 2007 against Central Michigan.
