GAME NOTES

- This is the 40th season in Purdue Women's Basketball history. The Boilermakers are 772-408 all-
- Purdue is 186-89 under head coach Sharon Versyp, who is in her ninth season with the Boilermakers. She has a career record of 303-154.
- Purdue is 94-27 in November, including an 18-11 mark on neutral courts. The Boilermakers are 10-1 all-time on Nov. 28, including a 3-1 mark on neutral floors.
- Purdue is 28-12 all-time in the fourth game of the season.
- The Boilermakers are 21-5 all-time against teams from Texas.
- Purdue is 10-7 all-time playing outside of the United States, including a 2-1 mark in the Bahamas.
- Purdue is now 2-0 all-time against Texas Tech and 17-11 all-time against the Big 12 Conference.
- The Boilermakers connected on 26-of-54 from the field (.481), including four-for-10 from three (.400), while holding Texas Tech to just 18-of-51 (.353).
- Purdue is now 2-0 when making more than 40 percent from the field.
- The Boilermakers had 21 assists on 26 field goals and just 14 turnovers for the game, while adding 12 steals in route to 23 Lady Raider turnovers.
- Purdue was outrebounded for the second straight game as Texas Tech had a 33-32 edge, including 12 offensive rebounds.

GAME PERFORMANCES/INDIVIDUAL HIGHS

- April Wilson led the Boilermakers in scoring for the second straight game, finishing with a gamehigh 13 points. She also tied a career-high with nine assists (w/ 0 turnovers) and added three steals
- Wilson moved into 22nd on the Purdue all-time assists list with 220 for her career, surpassing former teammate Dee Dee Williams.
- Whitney Bays had her second double-double of the season and the 10th of her career. She finished with 12 points, 12 rebounds and four steals.
- Bays moved into a tie for 14th place in Purdue history on the career double-double list.

- Liza Clemons posted 12 points, four rebounds and four assists, going four-of-seven from the floor. She is shooting 65.2% from the field this season.
- Hayden Hamby matched her career-high for the second straight game, scoring all 10 points in the first half. She also had two rebounds, two assists and a steal.
- Ashley Morrissette was just shy of a career-high with five assists (against one turnover).
