PROGRAM-LONG HOMESTAND BEGINS THIS WEEKEND

- After playing three of its first four games on the road, Purdue will be home for four consecutive weekends in September. The Boilermakers will welcome nine opponents to the Varsity Soccer Complex during their program-long eight-game September homestand, beginning with the first-ever night game at the Varsity Soccer Complex Sept. 2 against Colorado. Cal State Northridge, Dayton and Kansas round out the field at the Boilermaker Challenge the weekend of Sept. 9-11. Purdue will not play Dayton or Kansas. Colorado, USC and Northridge will be making their first-ever trips to West Lafayette during the homestand.
- Previously, the longest homestand in program history was seven consecutive games in 2007. The Boilermakers won all seven games, including six in shutout fashion, on their way to posting an 11-game win streak and a program-best 20 overall wins that season.

PURDUE SUFFERS FIRST LOSS WHEN TRYBA SCORES

- The Boilermakers took an early lead in the Aug. 28 loss at Missouri when **Alexis Tryba** scored her eighth career goal in the 21st minute off a nice pass from **Alex Hairston**. But after Missouri responded with three unanswered goals and went on to win, 4-2, the Boilers suffered their first-ever loss when Tryba scored. With four of her eight goals proving to be game-winners, she has supplied the game-deciding score with half of her goals.

BLACHA SCORES WHEN SHE STARTS

- Kaitlyn Blacha** finished off a corner kick chance in the second half at Missouri for her second career goal. The senior was in the starting lineup for the first time this season in the Aug. 28 loss in Columbia. Coincidentally, she has scored both of her two career goals in the two games she has started. Last season against Penn State, Blacha received her first opportunity to start and scored only 21 seconds after kickoff.

STARTING STREAKS END FOR THREE SENIORS

- Fourteen different players have received an opportunity to start in Purdue's first four games of the season. But more telling, the Boilers have utilized a different starting lineup in each of their first four games. Only seven players – **Shae Desmond**, **Jordan Frick**, **Alex Hairston**, **Kellie Phillips**, **Brookley Rogers**, **Jessica Warren** and goalkeeper **Clara Kridler** – have started each of the first four matches. In comparison, seven players started all 20 games in 2010.
- Seniors **Katie Leinert**, **Lauren Montenegro** and **Alexis Tryba** were among those seven players that started every game of 2010. All three players have come off the bench once early this season. In fact, Montenegro did not start for the first time in her Purdue career Aug. 26 against Oregon State. She still logged 71 minutes in the loss, playing the entire second half. But it ended Montenegro's team-long streak of 65 consecutive games started dating back to 2008.

BACK-TO-BACK SHUTOUT LOSSES SNAP GAMES WITH A GOAL STREAKS

- Purdue was kept off the scoreboard in back-to-back loss, Aug. 21 at No. 13 West Virginia and Aug. 26 versus No. 24 Oregon State. The Boilermakers finally ended a shutout streak of 230 consecutive minutes with **Alexis Tryba's** first-half goal at Missouri.
- The loss at WVU was Purdue's first shutout since Oct. 2, 2010 at Michigan State. That snapped a streak of seven consecutive games with a goal, the Boilers' longest streak since scoring in the first 12 games of the 2009 season.
- Purdue had not been blanked at home since playing Wisconsin to a scoreless draw in the 2010 Big Ten opener. The Boilermakers' last shutout loss at the Varsity Soccer Complex was in the 2010 season opener, an overtime defeat at the hands of Toledo.
- Purdue's 30 consecutive games with at least one goal is one of the more impressive records in program history. The Boilermakers scored in the final 13 games of 2002 and the first 17 games of 2003. The 17-game run in 2003 represents the longest single-season streak in program history.

A DOZEN CORNER KICKS AGAINST

- Missouri created 12 corner kick opportunities en route to defeating the Boilers, 4-2, in a wild wide-open game Aug. 28 in Columbia. Since the beginning of the 2007 season, it marked only the third that a Purdue opponent recorded 10-plus corners. Michigan registered 10 in last year's game in Ann Arbor and Kentucky created 10 in the 2007 season opener, a double-overtime scoreless draw at the Varsity Soccer Complex.
- Both teams scored multiple goals in the Missouri-Purdue game. The Boilermakers had not played in a nonconference match in which both teams scored multiple goals since defeating No. 6 Texas A&M, 3-2, in College Station in 2009. The season finale at Iowa, won by the Hawkeyes 3-2, was Purdue's only game of the 2010 campaign in which both teams scored multiple goals.

BOILERS SPLIT CHALLENGING SEASON-OPENING ROAD TRIP

- Purdue opened its new season with a weekend split on the road, winning at Toledo Friday in shut-out fashion but losing to nationally-ranked West Virginia Sunday. Both opponents were favored to win the divisions of their respective conferences in the preseason polls. Toledo was predicted to win the West Division of the Mid-American Conference and the MAC Tournament. West Virginia was tabbed to win the American Division of the Big East Conference.
- The victory at Toledo in the Aug. 19 season opener marked the first time in program history that Purdue started its new campaign with a true road win. The Boilermakers are now 8-5-1 all-time in season openers.

HAIRSTON SCORES GAME-WINNER IN FIRST GAME

• Freshman **Alex Hairston** played the hero in the season-opening 1-0 win at Toledo, scoring the lone goal of the match in the 61st minute off an assist from **Lauren Montenegro**. Hairston joined **Rachael Kimack** (2010 vs. Morehead State) as current Boilers to score in their first collegiate games.

• More importantly, Hairston is believed to be the first player in program history to pull off the unique trifecta of a freshman scoring Purdue's first goal of the year in her first collegiate game, and that goal proving to be a game-winner. Lauren Sesselmann (2001) and Kristin Hetzel (2004) also scored game-winners in the season openers of their freshman seasons, but those goals were not the first of the year for Purdue.

• Among active players, **Kellie Phillips** also scored the Boilers' first goal of the year as a freshman. And **Alexis Tryba** had the first game-winner of a season as a freshman. Both players accomplished the feats in the 2008 victory against Eastern Illinois, which was Purdue's second game of the year.

PURDUE AMONG NATIONAL LEADERS IN NEWCOMERS

• The Boilermakers have 12 freshmen and 13 total newcomers on the 2011 roster, a total that is believed to be the most in the Big Ten. Purdue's 12 freshmen also ranks fourth nationally. The list to the right was compiled by Alex Edwards of South Carolina Upstate.

• Only five of Purdue's newcomers – freshmen **Chinyelu Asher**, **Alex Hairston**, **Taylor Niewoit**, **Jennifer Stoot** and UAB transfer **Laura McCalla** – saw action on the season-opening road trip to Toledo and West Virginia. But five more freshmen – **Devon Beckwith**, **Michelle Devilbiss**, **Jackie Kurgan**, **Anna Thyen** and **Soraya Toppin-Herbert** made their collegiate debuts during the Oregon State-Missouri weekend.

• Hairston has started each of the first four games. Niewoit started at Toledo and along with Asher are the only other freshmen that have played in each of the first four games. McCalla started at West Virginia and versus Oregon State. Thyen assisted on **Kaitlyn Blacha's** goal at Missouri in her first collegiate action.

THREE RETURNING STARTERS AMONG BIG TEN PLAYERS TO WATCH

• Collectively representing one-third of Purdue nine returning starters after each starting every game in which they played last year, **Mollie Kuramoto**, **Lauren Montenegro** and **Brookley Rogers** have been highlighted among the Big Ten Players to Watch this season.

• Each coaching staff singled out three of its own players, leading to a list of 36 Players to Watch from around the conference. The Big Ten Conference also unveiled a preseason coaches poll Tuesday. Purdue was predicted to finish ninth in the 12-team league. The Big Ten Tournament returns this fall after a two-year hiatus. The top seven teams in the final standings and tournament host Northwestern qualify for the eight-team field.

• Penn State, winner of 13 consecutive Big Ten titles, was selected as the preseason favorite. Newcomer Nebraska was picked seventh and Northwestern 10th. Ohio State (second in Big Ten poll), Illinois (fourth) and Minnesota (eighth) represented the league in the NSCAA preseason Top 25. Six Big Ten teams - PSU, OSU, Wisconsin, Illinois, Michigan and Minnesota - earned NCAA Tournament berths in 2010.

• Montenegro enters her senior season with an opportunity to become the program's first four-time All-Big Ten selection. She was a First Team honoree in 2009 and a Second Team pick in 2008 and 2010. She has started every game the last three seasons, scoring six goals and registering five assists as a midfielder.

• Rogers played every minute of every game last season as a central defender. She enters her senior season having started 34 consecutive games dating back to September 2009. Along with being an iron woman on the pitch, Rogers has also excelled in the classroom, earning Distinguished Big Ten Scholar and Academic All-Big Ten honors each of the last two years.

• Kuramoto started every game in which she played as a freshman in 2010, missing the Northwestern win and both games of the Illinois-Michigan State road trip after suffering a knee injury in the first half of the Big Ten opener against Wisconsin. She returned to the lineup in time for the rivalry win against Indiana and finished the season strong, seeing action as both a midfielder and defender. She was one of only nine underclassmen highlighted among the 36 Players to Watch around the conference.
