BOILERMAKERS HIT THE ROAD LOOKING FOR POINTS IN KEY BIG TEN GAMES

- With its home schedule complete. Purdue closes out the regular season with three straight road games. The Boilermakers travel to Madison and the Twin Cities this weekend for a pair of key contests in their Big Ten Tournament push. Both Wisconsin (12 points) and Minnesota (11 points) are just ahead of Purdue in the current standings.
- The Boilers enter the week tied for eighth with Ohio State. Purdue owns a potential tiebreaker with the Buckeyes thanks to its head-to-head victory Oct. 9 in West Lafayette. Normally the top eight teams in the final standings qualify for the Big Ten Tournament. But it looks like it will be the top seven this year. Northwestern, which is currently in last place, receives an automatic bid as the event host.

PURDUE POSTS SNOWMAN ON SCOREBOARD TO TIE PROGRAM GOALS RECORD

- A snowman on the scoreboard on a rainy night (Oct. 13) at the Varsity Soccer Complex allowed Purdue to retain the Golden Boot traveling trophy. Led by a hat trick from Kellie Phillips, the Boilers tied a program record with eight goals in an 8-2 blowout win against rival Indiana. Chinyelu Asher (two), Mollie Kuramoto, Lauren Montenegro and Hadley Stuart also scored in the victory.
- The game was scoreless until the 28th minute when Kuramoto found the back of the net for the first time as a Boiler. It was the first of four Purdue goals in 10 and a half minutes. The Boilermakers also scored eight goals in a 2003 home win against Evansville. But this season's total was Purdue's highest ever in a Big Ten game, eclipsing the seven scored in a 2007 blowout of Indiana.
- The win also extended the Boilers' unbeaten streak (12-0-3) against the Hoosiers to 15. That represents the longest such streak against any opponent in program history. Purdue has not lost to Indiana since 1999 and never lost possession of the Golden Boot since the rivalry trophy was introduced to the series in 2002.

PHILLIPS' HAT TRICK HIGHLIGHTS RECENT SCORING SURGE

- · Kellie Phillips has enjoyed a scoring surge over the last five games, scoring six times thanks in part to her hat trick in the Oct. 13 blowout of Indiana. The senior has scored in each of the last three games, the longest streak by a Boiler since Katie Leinert also scored in three consecutive Big Ten games last year.
- · Phillips' hat trick was only the third in program history, matching a Purdue single-game record for goals in the process. Previous hat tricks were recorded by Jessica Loredana Riverso Okoroafo (2007 vs. Indiana) and Courtney Coppedge (2003 vs. Arkansas in Columbia, Mo.).
- · Remarkably, after there was only one hat trick (Okoro-

afo in 2007) at the Varsity Soccer Complex in the facility's first 12 seasons, there has been a trio of threegoal efforts by a single player this year. Nebraska's Morgan Marlborough and Michigan's Nkem Ezurike accounted for each of their team's three goals in wins against the Boilers.

ASHER'S BIG NIGHT LEADS TO FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK HONORS

- · Chinyelu Asher played a role in three of the program record-tying eight goals in the rivalry win against Indiana, earning Big Ten Conference co-Freshman of the Week honors for her big night. She scored twice and setup Mollie Kuramoto's goal, which was the first of the eight. She also created the penalty kick opportunity that Kellie Phillips capitalized on.
- · With goals in the 39th and 67th minutes. Asher joined **Hadley Stuart** and Phillips as Purdue players with a multiple-goal game this year. She posted the first multi-goal effort by a freshman since Jessica Okoroafo also scored twice in an October 2005 win against Ohio State.
- · Asher joins Alex Hairston as Boilers to earn Big Ten Freshman of the Week honors this year. Purdue also had two different Freshman of the Week winners in 2009, a season in which Vanessa Ibewuike and Jessica Warren were both recognized.

KURAMOTO'S FIRST PURDUE GOAL COMES IN BIG TEN PLAY

- Mollie Kuramoto has setup a team-high five goals for teammates this year. In the Oct. 13 victory against Indiana, she finally joined the scoring column. The sophomore's first collegiate goal came on a breakaway opportunity up the right flank setup by Chinyelu Asher.
- Kuramoto is the first Boiler since Kaitlyn Blacha (2010 vs. Penn State) to score her first career goal in Big Ten play. Jessica Warren (2009 vs. Michigan) is the only other active player to accomplish the feat.
- Jordan Frick (vs. Cal State Northridge) and Hadley Stuart (vs. Indiana State), both sophomores as well, represent the other non-freshmen Boilers to also score their first collegiate goals this year.

A TRIO OF BACK-TO-BACK QUICK SCORES

- · Multiple goals for the Boilers in a short time frame highlighted the home wins against Ohio State and Indiana.
- In the Indiana victory, Purdue scored four times in a span of 10 minutes and 28 seconds in the first half. The middle goals of the four, registered by Lauren Montenegro and Kellie Phillips, were scored only two minutes and 11 seconds apart. Then late in the second half, Phillips and Hadley Stuart scored only one minute and 43 seconds apart, which represents the shortest amount of time between goals this season.
- The Boilermakers' two goals in the Ohio State win were scored only three minutes and 39 seconds apart. Phillips and Kaitlyn Blacha accounted for those scores.
- The Boilermakers won a pair of games in 2010 thanks to similar back-to-back goals. In the Sept. 17, 2010 victory at Colorado, Phillips and Katie Leinert scored two minutes and eight seconds apart. In the Aug. 29, 2010 win vs. St. Bonaventure, Purdue scored three times in a span of four minutes and 42 seconds. Rachael Kimack and Shae Desmond scored late in the first half and Phillips capped the offensive flurry with a goal 40 seconds after the second half kicked off.

MORE ON THE HAT TRICKS AT THE VSC

- In the three Big Ten losses at home this season, Purdue surrendered eight goals. They were scored by only three players. Laura Heyboer scored twice in Michigan State's 2-1 win. And hat tricks by Nebraska's Morgan Marlborough and Michigan's Nkem Ezurike accounted for all their team's scoring. Marlborough (18), Heyboer (16) and Ezurike (10) have scored a combined 44 goals this season entering the week.
- · With Purdue having rarely surrendered three goals to an opposing team (much less a single player) at home over the years, the hat tricks by Marlborough and Ezurike are believed to be only the second and third by a visiting player, and the first two at the Varsity Soccer Complex. The other hat trick against Purdue in West Lafayette was recorded by Marquette's Kelly Roethe in the program's 1998 inaugural game. However, Marquette won that game, 10-1, which was played at the intramural soccer fields.
- · Entering the season, Purdue had surrendered three or more goals in a home game at the Varsity Soccer Complex (1999-present) only six times.
- · Prior to this season, Illinois' Vanessa DiBernardo was the last opposing player to record a hat trick against Purdue, scoring four times in last year's game in Champaign.

IRONWOMAN ROGERS FINALLY LEAVES THE FIELD

- · With additional depth and fewer injuries this season, Purdue head coach Robert Klatte divided up the minutes more evenly this season. But defender Brookley Rogers remained a constant among the field players. On a rainy night at the Varsity Soccer Complex with Purdue blowing out Indiana in the second half. Rogers left the field for the first time since November 2009. The senior went the distance in 35 consecutive games during that stretch. Her 51 consecutive games started is still the longest active streak on the team. Rogers & fellow senior Lauren Montenegro have never missed a game during their Purdue careers.
- Fellow defender Jessica Warren went the distance in 10 of the 12 games she started (all but Missouri and Indiana State) to open the season before moving to a reserve role in time for the Big Ten road trip to Northwestern and Illinois Sept. 30 through Oct. 2.

KRIDLER SECOND IN BIG TEN IN SAVES: NEARING PURDUE SEASON RECORD

- · Clara Kridler has performed well in her first opportunity to be the full-time starting goalkeeper this year. She has helped Purdue shutout Toledo, Colorado and Indiana State and enters the week ranked second in the Big Ten with 82 saves, close behind league-leader Hayley Kopmeyer of Michigan. Kridler has averaged just under five saves per game, making a season-high eight saves in the season-opening win against Toledo and the 1-1 draw with lowa. She has made six or more saves in six other contests.
- · Kridler is also approaching the Purdue single-season saves record of 97, established by Lauren Mason in 2006.

HAIRSTON RANKS AS PURDUE'S TOP FRESHMAN GOAL SCORER SINCE 2005

· Alex Hairston shares the team lead with six goals and could finish her freshman season as the Boilers' top goal scorer this fall. Her six goals represent the most by a freshman since Jessica Okorofao scored 10 in 2005, establishing a program freshman record. Parrissa Eyorokon, Lauren Sesselmann, Annette Kent, Jennie Moppert and Chrissy Creamer were also Purdue's top goal scorers as freshmen. Okoroafo (35 career goals, 1st), Sesselmann (34, 2nd), Kent (31, 3rd), Eyorokon (27, 4th) and Moppert (17, 7th) all finished their careers among the program's all-time Top 10.

PURDUE CHANGES UP BACK FOUR

- · Jordan Frick, Brookley Rogers, Jessica Warren and Shae Desmond started each of the first 12 games as Purdue's defensive back four. But the coaching staff changed up the defensive alignment for the first time in the Sept. 30 win at Northwestern, with only Frick remaining in the same position. Rogers moved to outside back and Marta Lynch and Alexis Tryba were inserted as the center backs. Lynch and Tryba have gone the distance in all five games since the change, while Frick and Rogers only left the field in the second half of the blowout win against Indiana.
- Lynch had not played in 14 consecutive games the final two matches of 2010 and first 12 this season before rejoining the mix for the first Big Ten road trip of the season.

SENIORS & SUBS LEAD PURDUE TO BIG WIN OVER OHIO STATE

- Seniors Kellie Phillips and Kaitlyn Blacha scored only three minutes and 39 seconds apart in the first half, leading the Boilers to a key Big Ten win against Ohio State Oct. 9 at the Varsity Soccer Complex. Laura Mc-Calla assisted both goals, joining Mollie Kuramoto as Purdue players with a multi-assist effort this season. Jordan Frick later added her name to that list in the Indiana win on Oct. 13.
- · Shae Desmond (who also assisted on Phillips' goal), Blacha and McCalla had all entered the game shortly before Phillips scored the equalizer in the 35th minute. Blacha's first career game-winner was scored in the 38th minute. With Ohio State having taken an early 1-0 lead, it marked the first time this season that Purdue rallied for a victory after the opposition scored first.
- McCalla was selected to CollegeSoccer360.com's Primetime Performers national honor roll for her efforts. She posted the first multi-assist game by a Purdue player in a Big Ten game since Jessica Stellhorn in November 2009. The senior had not played since Sept. 23 due to injury.

BOILERMAKERS POST 150TH ALL-TIME WIN

· Purdue's victory at Northwestern Sept. 30 on the shores of Lake Michigan was the 150th in program history. The Boilermakers reached the sesquicentennial mark in just 14 seasons as a varsity program. Previously, Purdue posted its 50th win in 2003 and 100th victory in 2007.

· Alex Hairston enters the weekend leading the team with five goals. She has accounted for the first two goals of Big Ten play, scoring a second-half equalizer in the Sept. 18 loss to Michigan State and giving Purdue an early lead in the Sept. 25 draw with Iowa. Hairston has joined Katie Leinert as the only Boilers in program history to score Purdue's first two goals of the Big Ten portion of a season. Leinert accomplished the feat in 2009, accounting for an equalizer in a conference-opening draw at Wisconsin and the game-winner against Northwestern.

FOURTH STRAIGHT PURDUE-IOWA OVERTIME GAME IN WEST LAFAYETTE

- Purdue and lowa played into overtime for the fourth consecutive game in West Lafayette Sept. 25 in the finale of the Boilers' eight-game homestand. However, while the previous three OT games ended on golden goals (two for Purdue, one for Iowa), this year's game finished as a 1-1 draw.
- Including a scoreless draw in Iowa City in 2006, five of the last seven Purdue-Iowa games have now gone to overtime.

HAIRSTON BIG TEN FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

- After playing a role in three of the Boilers' five goals the week of Sept. 12-18, Alex Hairston was selected as the Big Ten Freshman of the Week. She scored the Boilers' third goal in the Sept. 14 win against Indiana State and accounted for an equalizer in the second half of the conference opener versus Michigan State. She also assisted on Hadley Stuart's second of two goals against ISU.
- · Hairston became the first Purdue freshman to score in her Big Ten debut since Jessica Stellhorn in 2007. Stellhorn went on to win Freshman of the Year honors.
- Hairston represents the Boilers' first Freshman of the Week honoree since Jessica Warren in November 2009 and the first Purdue player to receive one of the league's three weekly awards since former goalkeeper Carianne Betts was selected the Defensive Player of the Week in September 2010.

BOILERS SCORE FOUR IN RAINY SHUTOUT OF INDIANA STATE

- Thanks to goals from Lauren Montenegro, Hadley Stuart (two) and Alex Hairston, Purdue scored a seasonhigh four goals in its nonconference final, a shutout win against Indiana State on a rainy night (Sept. 14) at the Varsity Soccer Complex. It was the Boilers' first four-goal showing since defeating St. Bonaventure, 4-1, in August
- · Hairston also assisted on Stuart's second goal to join Kellie Phillips and Rachael Kimack as active Boilers with a goal an assist in the same game.
- Purdue registered 10 of its season-high 11 corner kicks in the second half of the rainy game. The 11 corners were the most since the Boilers had 12 in an August 2010 draw with Miami (Fla.).

STUART & KURAMOTO THRIVE ON MULTI NIGHT

- Hadley Stuart scored twice and Mollie Kuramoto setup a pair of goals in the Sept. 14 win against Indiana State. Stuart scored off a Kuramoto assist in the final minute of the first half and also accounted for Purdue's final goal of the night in the 65th minute. In the process, she was finally able to break through and record her first collegiate goal, ending a frustrating recent stretch that had seen her nearly score on multiple occasions.
- · Stuart became the first Boiler to score twice in the same game in which she recorded her first collegiate goal since Katie Seeger in the 2009 season opener versus Ohio.
- The August 2010 home win against Morehead State marked the last multi-goal and multi-assist games by Boilers. Marta Lynch scored twice and Liz Secue setup two goals in that victory. Alexis Tryba (2009 vs. Ball State) is the other active Boiler with a collegiate multi-goal game.
