### THE NOTES TO KNOW

- In the midst of its most-grueling portion the 2024-25 schedule, Purdue returns home for a Sunday afternoon contest against a surging Nebraska squad. The contest will be just Purdue's third home game in the last 34 days before the Boilermakers hit the road again to venture to the Pacific Northwest next week to face Washington and Oregon.
- In an incredible twist of scheduling fate, the Boilermakers will visit both coasts in a the span of a week, visiting the Jersey Shore and the Atlantic Ocean coast on Jan. 9, before heading to Seattle next week for a journey to the Pacific Ocean to face both Washington and Oregon. The contest with Nebraska is sandwiched in between trips to the coasts.
- A win will give Purdue a season-long five-game winning streak, and keep the Boilermakers within striking distance of the Big Ten leaders. A victory will also give Purdue a 5-1 start or better for the fifth time under **Matt Painter** (2023, 2018, 2011, 2008). Ironically, Purdue has only won the Big Ten regular-season title once when starting 5-1 or better (2023).
- Since the start of the 2022-23 season, Purdue owns a 19-2 record in the month of January, having won nine straight games. The nine-game winning streak in the month is the fourth longest nationally (Saint Mary's - 24; Vermont - 13; McNeese State - 10).
- Purdue has just 30 turnovers over the last four games. Purdue averaged 12.3 turnovers per game in the first 12 games of the season. In the last four games, Purdue has 75 assists against 30 turnovers. It has also forced 51 turnovers in that span, a margin of plus-5.25 per game.
- In the last four years, Purdue has defeated teams ranked No. 1 (Arizona), No. 2 (Alabama), No. 4 (Marquette), No. 5 (Villanova), No. 6 (Wisconsin, Tennessee, Gonzaga), No. 7 (Tennessee), No. 8 (Duke) and No. 9 (Illinois). All but Alabama and Illinois came away from Mackey Arena.
- Since the 2021-22 season (**Caleb Furst's** freshman year), Purdue owns a 54-3 (.947) record in Mackey Arena. The 94.7 winning percentage is the second-best nationally (Houston; .951).
- Purdue is playing its best basketball of the season, winning the last four games by an average of 18.8 points per game. However, Purdue is just 33-of-97 (.340) from 3-point range during that span. The Boilermakers are 83-of-135 (.615) from inside the arc in that span.
- Purdue is now 104-23 since the start of the 2021-22 season, recording the second-most wins in the country (Houston - 106; Connecticut - 103) during that span. The senior class of **Caleb Furst** (only senior) became the seventh class in school history with 100 career victories.
- The starting backcourt of **Braden Smith** and **Fletcher Loyer** are 75-15 since their arrival at Purdue, starting every game of their tenure. The 75 wins since their arrival are the third most nationally (Connecticut - 80; Houston - 76).
- Braden Smith** is the only player in America with 225 points, 125 assists and 75 rebounds. Smith is on pace to become the first player since Loyola Marymount's **Terrell Lowery** (1990-91) to average 15.0 points, 8.5 assists, 4.5 rebounds and shoot over 40.0 percent from 3-point range.
- Braden Smith** and **Fletcher Loyer** both surpassed 1,000 career points in the last week, becoming the first junior teammates nationally to play at one school and reach the 1,000-point club. **Trey Kaufman-Renn** needs 309 points to join them.
- Trey Kaufman-Renn** is one of two players nationally (South Dakota State's **Oscar Cluff**) to average 17.0 points, 6.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists and shoot at least 60 percent from the field. He has scored in double-figures in all 16 games this season.
- Purdue, Duke, Gonzaga and Houston are the only programs in America to have made at least a Sweet 16, Elite 8 and Final Four during their last five NCAA Tournament appearances. Purdue reached the Sweet 16 in 2022, the Elite 8 in 2019 and the Final Four in 2024.
- Since **Matt Painter's** second year at Purdue (2006-07), the Boilermakers' 226 Big Ten wins are the most in the Big Ten (Michigan State - 223).

## ▶▶▶ BOILERS FINDING THEIR GROOVE

- With the 68-50 win over Rutgers on Thursday night, Purdue has now won three straight Big Ten games by 18 or more points, with two of the victories coming on the road. It marks the first time since Jan. 13 to 20, 2018 (Minnesota, Wisconsin, Iowa) that Purdue has won three straight Big Ten games by 18 or more points.
- Purdue has never won four straight Big Ten games by 18 or more points.

## ▶▶▶ DEFENSE COMING AROUND

- The Purdue defense is starting to turn it around during its four winning streak.
- In the win over Rutgers, Purdue held two of the league's four leading scorers and likely NBA Lottery picks, **Dylan Harper** and **Ace Bailey**, to 23 combined points on 7-of-24 shooting with five turnovers.
- Purdue held Northwestern to 38.3 percent shooting and its two leading scorers, **Brooks Barnhizer** and **Nick Martinelli**, who entered the game averaging 40.2 points per game between them, to 21 points on 6-of-23 shooting with 10 combined turnovers.
- Over the last four games, opponents are shooting just 39.9 percent from the field, while averaging 59.0 points per game.
- Purdue has held three straight Big Ten opponents under 62 points for the first time since Jan. 31 to Feb. 15, 2015 (5 straight games).
- In addition, over the last four games, opponents are shooting just 25.3 (20-of-79) from 3-point range and Purdue is plus-21 in turnover margin (30 to 51 turnovers), forcing 12.8 turnovers per game.

### ▶▶▶ TAKING CARE OF IT

- The Boilermakers have won 20 straight games when having fewer turnovers than their opponent, and is 19-1 since the start of last season when having single-digit turnovers (one loss: UConn in the National Championship game).
- Since the 2021-22 season, when Purdue has five or more turnovers than its opponent, Purdue is 20-15 (.571). In all other games, Purdue is 84-8 (.913).
- In Purdue's four losses this season, Purdue has recorded 67 turnovers (16.8 / game), resulting in 95 points off turnovers (23.8 / game).

- In Purdue's 15 losses since the start of the 2022-23 season, Purdue is plus-83 in turnover margin (+5.5 / game).
- Since the 2021-22 season, Purdue is 52-5 when forcing 10 or more turnovers in a game. When Purdue has single-digit turnovers, Purdue owns a 38-2 record in that span. Purdue has won 40 straight games when forcing between 10 and 15 turnovers in a game.

## ▶▶▶ SMITH NABS BIG TEN WEEKLY HONOR

- **Braden Smith** was named the Big Ten Player of the Week after a dominating two-week stretch that saw him average 25.0 points, 9.7 assists, 5.3 rebounds and 2.0 steals per game in three Purdue victories (Toledo, Minnesota, Northwestern).
- In the win over Toledo, Smith became the first player since Oklahoma's **Trae Young** to have at least 34 points and 12 assists in a regulation game.
- Then in the win over Minnesota, Smith became the first Big Ten player since **Diamond Green** in March 2012 to have at least 20 points, 10 assists and five rebounds with no turnovers in a game.
- Entering this season, Purdue had two performances all-time of at least 20 points and 10 assists. Smith has done it three times in the last six games, starting with the Maryland contest on Dec. 8.
- Smith is on a tear, averaging 23.0 points, 10.8 assists, 4.8 rebounds and 2.3 steals per game over the last four outings, with three double-doubles. He is shooting 33-of-65 (.508) from the field and 15-of-36 (.417) from 3-point range during that span.
- He has recorded 15 point-assist double-doubles in his last 54 games dating to last season, after having none as a freshman.
- Smith now needs just 12 assists and two rebounds to become the second player in NCAA history with 1,000 points, 600 assists and 450 rebounds in his first three years (Ohio's **D.J. Cooper**).

▶▶▶ REACHING THESE LEVELS IS AUTOMATIC

- With the wins over both Minnesota and Northwestern, Purdue has won 64 straight games when shooting at least 50.0 percent from the field, 40.0 percent from 3-point range and 70.0 percent from the free throw line. last losing to on March 3, 2004.

## ▶▶▶ JANUARY 12 (12-7)

- Purdue is 12-7 all-time in games played on January 12, and 3-3 under head coach **Matt Painter**.
- Purdue's 29-point win over Michigan State in 2020 was its third largest against a ranked opponent in school history and the largest against a top-10 ranked team.

## ▶▶▶ WINNING UGLY

- Purdue defeated Rutgers despite shooting just 4-of-24 (.167) from 3-point range and 8-of-16 (.500) from the free throw line and losing the rebound battle.

- With 16 NCAA Tournament berths, seven Sweet 16 appearances, five Big Ten regular-season championships, two Big Ten Tournament titles, two Elite Eight appearances, a trip to the Final Four, an appearance in a National Championship game and an international gold medal on his résumé, 20th-year head coach Matt Painter is widely regarded as one of the brightest young minds in all of college basketball.
- Painter was named the 2019 and 2024 Big Ten Coach of the Year and has led Purdue to nine straight NCAA Tournaments – the fourth-longest active streak in America. Included in that stretch are Sweet 16 appearances (and beyond) in five of the last seven tournaments.
- Painter affirmed his long-term commitment to Purdue in October of 2018, agreeing to a two-year extension that will keep him in West Lafayette through at least the 2023-24 season. The deal features five, one-year extensions that go into effect through the 2028-29 season. Following the 2029 season, Painter will still only be 58 years old.
- Painter will enter the 2024-25 season second on the school's all-time wins list (447) behind legendary mentor **Gene Keady** and ahead of **Ward "Piggy" Lambert**, both of whom have been inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.
- Has averaged over 23 wins a season in his 19 years at Purdue. If you don't include the first transitional year (9-19 record), the average balloons to 24.3 wins per year over the last 18 seasons.
- Has won at least 25 games in 12 of his 20 seasons as a collegiate head coach.
- Painter has averaged 11.9 wins per year in conference play, the third-best average in Big Ten Conference history.
- He was voted by his peers as the NABC National Coach of the Year after leading a team that started with a 6-5 record to the 2019 Elite Eight.
- Coach Painter's 16 NCAA Tournaments are the most for a coach nationally under the age of 55 (as of April 1, 2024 – Painter is 53 years old).
- Purdue has finished first, second or third in Big Ten play in 11 of the last 17 years, including in eight of the last 10 years.
