BOILERMAKERS OPEN BIG TEN PLAY WITH LAND OF LINCOLN TRIP

• Purdue kicks off conference play this week with road games at Illinois and Northwestern. Thursday's game marks the first time the Boilermakers have ever opened league play against the Fighting Illini. Purdue has won six straight games in Evanston dating back to an overtime win in 2005. However, the Boilermakers are winless in Champaign since 2003 and have never beaten the Illini on their home pitch. Northwestern enters the week undefeated and ended Purdue's 11-game win streak in the series, the longest against any opponent in program history, with a 1-0 victory in West Lafayette last year.

• The Boilermakers have a dozen Illinois natives on the roster this season, including Champaign native **Dagny Olson**. Ten other Boilermakers hail from the Chicagoland area. Purdue kicked off its season last month with a 3-0 exhibition win at Loyola in its first trip to the Lakefront.

UTAH GAME CALLED AFTER 60 MINUTES DUE TO T-STORMS & LIGHTNING

• Purdue led Utah 1-0 at the top of the 61st minute in its September 9 non-conference finale when a long line of thunderstorms produced lightning that first delayed and later forced the cancellation of the game before it became official.

• **Andrea Petrina** scored in the 37th minute to give Purdue a halftime lead. But the storms arrived in full force about 8:20 p.m., leading to the lightning delay. By rule, the game was not permitted to be restarted three hours after kickoff (7 p.m.). Therefore, when lightning was still within 10 miles of the stadium at 9:30 p.m., the game was officially called and ruled a no contest because 70 minutes were not completed. It will not be rescheduled.

• It was the Boilermakers' first scheduled contest that did not go final since a 2012 home game against Milwaukee was canceled due to lightning before it could kick off. Two weeks ago, the opening kickoff of Purdue's road game at Baylor was delayed about 80 minutes due to lightning in Waco, Texas.

ALREADY HAD 18 PLAYERS START AT LEAST ONCE

• With only five Boilermakers – **Vanessa Korolas**, **Gabby LaMere**, **Hannah Leinert**, **Hannah Mussallem** and **Andrea Petrina** – starting each of the first six games, Purdue has already had 18 different players start at least once this year. The Boilermakers have not used the same starting lineup twice yet. The 18 different players to start at least once has already matched last season's total and is just two players shy of the program record from 2001 and 2014.

• Had the Utah game not been canceled after 60 minutes due to lightning, **Lydia Brosnahan** would have become Purdue's 19th player to start this year. But she's likely to start at center back Illinois on Thursday.

PURDUE SHUT OUT AT DAYTON DESPITE RECORDING 23 SHOTS

• The Boilermakers enjoyed an advantage in the shot count (23-17) and number of corner kicks created (10-6), but Dayton goalkeeper Kaelyn Johns made eight saves to help her team win the game 3-0. Purdue's 23 shots were its most in a loss since October 2013 and matched its most ever in a 90-minute game in which it was shut out.

• Purdue was shut out in both games of its Labor Day Weekend road trip, getting blanked in consecutive games for only the second time under second-year head coach **Drew Roff**. Led by **Erika Yohn's** career-high nine saves, the most by a Purdue goalkeeper since the 2012 season finale, the Boilermakers played well defensively in the Sept. 1 loss at No. 4 West Virginia. The game remained scoreless until the 66th minute. But the loss kept Purdue winless against top-25 teams since August 2009 when the team posted an upset win at No. 6 Texas A&M.

PETRINA, LASKY SCORE IN FIRST TWO WINS

• In each of Purdue's first two wins this season the goals have come from **Andrea Petrina** and **Mikayla Lasky**, in that order. It marked the fifth time in program history (since 1998) that the same two players both scored in each of the Boilermakers' first two victories, also happening in 2005, 2008, 2010 and 2013. However, in each of the previous four occurrences, Purdue scored at least a combined six goals in those first two wins. This year it was only four goals, all from Petrina and Lasky.

PURDUE RALLIES FOR OVERTIME WIN VERSUS CINCINNATI

• The Boilermakers bounced back from their 5-1 loss at Baylor with an overtime win against a Cincinnati team that qualified for the NCAA Tournament last season and entered the day 3-0 on the young season. **Mikayla Lasky's** golden goal in the 97th minute lifted Purdue to its first overtime win at home since August 2012. However, the Boilermakers have now won at least one OT affair in each of the last five seasons.

• Purdue won the game despite trailing 1-0 for 37 minutes until **Andrea Petrina** scored on a penalty kick in the 80th minute. In program history (since 2000), that represented the second longest amount of time the Boilermakers trailed in a game they ended up winning. Purdue was victorious after conceding the game's first goal for the first time since October of last year at Maryland. But the Boilermakers had not won at home after conceding the first goal since October 2011 vs. Ohio State. Coincidentally, current assistant coach **Katie Baumgardner** was the starting goalkeeper for OSU that day.

FIRST BLOWOUT LOSS IN A WHILE

• The 5-1 loss at Baylor on Aug. 26 in a game that was delayed about 85 minutes due to lightning was Purdue's most lopsided defeat in some time. The Boilermakers had not trailed by four goals since an October 2014 loss at No. 25 Rutgers and had not conceded five goals since a 6-1 loss at No. 8 Penn State in September 2013.

• Purdue was competitive throughout its 2015 campaign, suffering only two losses by multiple goals and trailing by two goals or more for only 110 of the 1671 minutes of regular-season action.

PETRINA SCORES IN OPENING MINUTE OF SECOND HALF

• **Andrea Petrina** had a goal and an assist in the season-opening win, becoming just the fourth player since 2000 to accomplish the feat in the first game of the season. She also scored in the first game for the second year in a row. By scoring at the 45:57 mark, she accounted for the third fastest goal to begin the second half in program history (since 2000).

• Including the two preseason exhibition games, Petrina either scored or assisted on six of the Boilermakers' first seven goals this season.

BOILERMAKERS ANSWER MARSHALL'S EQUALIZER QUICKLY

• The Boilermakers were victorious in their season opener against Marshall thanks to timely goals from **Andrea Petrina** and **Mikayla Lasky** early in the second half. Lasky scored her first career game-winning goal only 55 seconds after Marshall equalized to tie the game at 1-1. That represented the second shortest amount of time in program history (since 2000) in which Purdue answered an opponent's equalizer with the game winner.

• The Boilermakers improved to 12-6-1 in season openers, including 10-4-1 at home. They've won five of their last six openers dating back to 2011.

PURDUE LEADS FOR 77 MINUTES BUT LOSES IN OVERTIME

• The overtime loss to Montana could be classified as one of the most frustrating in program history. The Boilermakers led for 77 minutes, easily the longest amount of time they've held the lead in any defeat in program history (since 2000). **Hannah Leinert** scored her 35th collegiate goal in the sixth minute to give Purdue the early lead. Coincidentally, it was Boilers' earliest goal since **Maddy Williams** also scored in the sixth minute in the victory at Montana last season. But instead of building the on the early advantage, it remained a 1-0 game until the Grizzlies scored an equalizer in the 84th minute. They won in the 92nd minute on the first shot of overtime for either team. Purdue lost for the first time when Leinert has scored.

MADDY WILLIAMS TO REDSHIRT DUE TO INJURY

• Three-year scoring leader **Maddy Williams**, who has scored 24 goals as a Boilermaker, will be sidelined this season by a knee injury suffered in the final team practice of the spring. She will redshirt and return as a fifth-year senior for the 2017 campaign. Williams would have entered the 2016 regular season having started a team-high 38 consecutive games dating back to the finale of the 2014 campaign. She had missed only one game as a Boilermaker entering the year and remains Purdue's active career leader in goals, assists (18), points (66) and game-winning goals (6).

BIG TEN PRESEASON HONORS LIST

• Returning starters **Vanessa Korolas**, **Hannah Leinert** and **Dannah Williams** were highlighted among the Big Ten's preseason honors list unveiled the week of the season opener by the conference office. They were among the Boilermakers' most consistent players last year, making a combined 51 starts.

• Korolas entered her junior season having started all 37 regular-season games at outside back the last two years. She and Williams are the most experienced part of the Purdue backline. Williams started 16 games as a freshman a year ago, making the move from midfielder to center back during the opening weekend of Big Ten play. She went on to play every minute of the remainder of the season after the transition. After starting the first two games this year, she has now logged 1,120 consecutive minutes. Korolas was second on the team in minutes played in 2015. Williams was one of only six sophomores on the Big Ten list.

• Leinert missed only one game in her first year as a Boilermaker, contributing to 12 of the team's 28 goals by scoring seven times and assisting on five other goals. She accounted for game-winning goals in victories vs. Evansville, Montana and Nebraska while also making significant contributions in wins vs. Illinois and Maryland. The Illinois State transfer has scored 36 goals during her college career.

PETRINA LEADS PURDUE TO A PAIR OF EXHIBITION WINS

• With a multi-goal game in the 3-0 win at Loyola and a multi-assist effort in a 2-0 win vs. Miami (Ohio), **Andrea Petrina** lead Purdue to a pair of preseason victories this month. Purdue won both of its exhibition games in shutout fashion for the second year in a row. **Hannah Leinert** had a goal and an assist at Loyola. **Mikayla Lasky** and **Erica Arkans** scored the goals against Miami.

• The Boilermakers improved to 11-3 in exhibition action (fall and spring) under second-year head coach **Drew Roff**. They were 4-1 in the spring, with the lone loss coming at the hands of Notre Dame.

ROFF ERA BEGAN WITH WINNING SEASON

• A season-ending shutout win at rival Indiana last year not only allowed Purdue to regain possession of the Golden Boot trophy, but also clinched the Boilermakers' first winning season since 2009.

• Under first-year head coach **Drew Roff**, Purdue opened the season 5-1 and was competitive throughout its 9-8-1 campaign. The Boilermakers suffered only two losses by more than one goal; of the 1,671 minutes of regular-season action Purdue played in 2015, it trailed by multiple goals for only 110 minutes.

• Despite a less-than-favorable October schedule, the Boilermakers also avoided the late-season skid that had plagued them in recent years. After hosting Penn State and Rutgers – both NCAA College Cup qualifiers – the week of Oct. 11 to 16 for the final home games at the Boilermaker Soccer Complex, Purdue had to play its final three matches on the road. The team still managed to earn seven standings points from that five-game stretch, narrowly missing out on a Big Ten Tournament berth in the process.
