GAME NOTES

- This is the 40th season in Purdue Women's Basketball history. The Boilermakers are 779-418 all-time, including a 409-130 record at home.
- Purdue is 193-99 under head coach Sharon Versyp, who is in her ninth season with the Boilermakers. She has a career record of 310-164.
- Purdue is 364-188 all-time in Big Ten Conference play, including a 209-67 mark in Mackey Arena.
- Versyp is 91-53 at Purdue in conference play and 100-60 for her career in Big Ten action.
- Purdue is 212-130 in January, including a 118-44 record at home. The Boilermakers are 8-5 all-time on Jan. 29, including a 4-3 record in Mackey Arena.
- The Boilermakers are 499-190 in the state of Indiana.
- Purdue is 23-15 all-time in the 21st game of the season.
- Thursday was the first-ever Big Ten meeting between Purdue and Rutgers, who is playing in its first season in the conference. It was the first win for Rutgers over Purdue as the Boilermakers lead the all-time series, 2-1.
- The Boilermakers have lost six of their last seven, including their last three at home.
- Purdue was outrebounded, 36-33, but both teams managed just six second-chance points.
- Rutgers had a 22-16 advantage in points off of turnovers, committing just 14 to Purdue's 18.
- Purdue's 49 points are a season low and just the 63rd time in school history they've failed to score at least 50 points (3-60).
- The Boilermakers matched their season-low with just 17 field goals made, and contributed as season-low eight assists.

GAME PERFORMANCES/INDIVIDUAL HIGHS

- Senior Whitney Bays had 16 points and eight rebounds, grabbing all eight boards in the first half.
- Sophomore Ashley Morrisette finished with 11 points on four-of-11 shooting.
