– PURDUE OPENS NEW CAMPAIGN AT BIG TEN/BIG EAST CHALLENGE –

Purdue begins one of the most anticipated seasons in recent program history under the fair skies of Florida's Gulf Coast, opening its new campaign at the Big Ten/Big East Challenge for the fourth consecutive year.

The Boilermakers have been matched up with UConn and Notre Dame at the season-opening Challenge for the second year in a row.

Coming off a 37-win season in which they tied the program's single season wins record, the Boilermakers are one of the favorites to win the Big Ten this season. But well before the conference play gets underway March 23 in Columbus, Purdue will be tested by a formidable nonconference schedule. While the first three weekends all feature numerous tough games, the Boilers are scheduled to play seven of their first nine contests at neutral sites.

Purdue jumpstarted its successful season a year ago with a strong showing at the Big Ten/Big East Challenge. The Boilermakers recorded wins over nationally-ranked Connecticut and Pittsburgh, finishing as one of only three Big Ten teams to post a winning record. Purdue also exceeded its win total in its first two years of the event.

The season-opening win against UConn in 2011 was arguably the Big Ten highlight of the event. Although the Huskies scuffled out of the gate, they lived up to their 2011 preseason billing, winning the Big East regular-season title and reaching the Super Regionals of the NCAA Tournament. Connecticut was picked third in the 2012 Big East preseason coaches' poll behind favorites St. John's and Louisville. Notre Dame (No. 6) and Cincinnati (No. 7) were predicted to qualify for the eight-team Big East Tournament as well.

Kevin Plawecki and Tyler Spillner have been the Boilers' standout performers at the Big Ten/Big East Challenge during their careers. Plawecki has hit safely in all seven games he has played in Clearwater-St. Pete, entering the weekend 14-for-24 (.583) with eight RBIs at the event. He represented Purdue on the All-Tournament Team last year. Spillner, meanwhile, is a .438 career hitter (14-for-32) at the Challenge, recording six doubles, eight walks and 10 RBIs.

But it was Barrett Serrato who led the way at the plate for Purdue at 2011 event, earning Big Ten Player of the Week honors and kickstarting his First Team All-Big Ten campaign. Serrato hit safely and drove in a run in all three games, finishing the weekend 6-for-9 with four RBIs.

The last two Purdue-Cincinnati games, both played in Clearwater, have been wild affairs. The Boilermakers scored seven times over the final four innings to rally for an 11-10 walk-off win in the 2009 season opener. The Bearcats returned the favor in 2010, stunning Purdue by scoring seven times in the bottom of the ninth inning in a 7-6 final. Cincinnati's probable starter, Andrew Streng, and relief ace Zach Isler both pitched in the 2010 game.

Connecticut lost five starters and four starting pitchers from its Big East title team. Junior second baseman LJ Mazzilli (.338, 31 XBH, 32 RBIs), the son of MLB veteran and former manager Lee Mazzilli, has garnered Preseason All-America acclaim as the Huskies' top returning player. Right-hander Pat Butler is expected to start on the mound. He pitched in seven games a year ago, earning three victories but tallying only six strikeouts in 27 innings.

The lone lowlight of the 2011 Challenge from a Purdue point of view was a 19-2 blowout loss at the hands of Notre Dame on Saturday evening at Al Lang Stadium on the waterfront in Downtown St. Petersburg. The two teams will square off again at the same location this year. The Boilermakers will be looking to snap a six-game losing streak against their in-state rival dating back to 2003.

HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Entering his 14th year as the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber has posted a 380-348 overall record and a 190-178 Big Ten mark through his first 13 seasons. His overall win total ranks second in Purdue history, while his conference victories stand alone in first. In 2007, Schreiber became the third head coach in Purdue baseball history to surpass the 500-games mark as the Boilermakers' head man. Dave Alexander, whom Schreiber played for from 1983 to 1986, owns the record for most games coached at Purdue with 792 over 14 seasons. Schreiber will make a run at Alexander's all-time wins record (407) this season and is on pace to break the games coached benchmark in 2013.

Purdue's 37 overall wins in 2011 tied the program's single season record and were the most in the Big Ten. Despite being picked eighth in the preseason coaches' poll, the Boilers finished third in the league with a 14-10 conference record, just one game shy of first, and reached the Big Ten Tournament for the fourth consecutive year and seventh time in the last eight seasons. The four straight tourney appearances represent the longest active streak in the league as well as a program high. The program's 58 Big Ten wins over the last four years are also the most in the league.

Purdue led the Big Ten in numerous statistical categories in 2011, highlighted by runs scored, doubles, slugging percentage, on-base percentage, sacrifice flies, saves and strikeouts. The Boilermakers drew the most walks at the plate and issued the fewest number of free passes on the mound.

Six Boilers were recognized as all-conference performers, matching the second-highest total in program history. Kevin Plawecki and Barrett Serrato were named First Team, Tyler Spillner and Nick Wittgren Second Team and Cameron Perkins and Stephen Talbott Third Team. With Serrato, Spillner and Talbott all honored as outfielders, it marked the first time 1991 that three Purdue outfielders were named all-conference in the same season.

The 2010 season saw the Boilermakers post 33 victories, the program's most since 2000. Purdue navigated a hotly-contested Big Ten race that saw all six league tournament-qualifying teams finish within three games of first place. The Boilermakers reached the Big Ten Tourney for the eighth time under Schreiber, including six of the last seven seasons. Purdue eliminated Northwestern and Indiana from the 2010 tournament before bowing out. The Boilers have won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in seven of their eight appearances under Schreiber.

The 2010 Boilermakers posted new school records for hits (636) and runs per game (7.2) at the plate and led the Big Ten in strikeouts (435) and batting average against (.276) on the mound. Purdue went 15-6 at home and 9-2 in midweek action, compiling a 32-18 mark after opening the season 1-6.

Individually, Matt Bischoff was honored as a First Team All-Big Ten starting pitcher. He led the Big Ten with 10 wins and 95 strikeouts and in the process became the first player in program history to be a four-time All-Big Ten honoree. He established new single-season and career strikeout marks in his final season as a Boilermaker. Bischoff and fellow pitcher Kevin Cahill were both selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Schreiber has coached 54 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 18 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft on 23 occasions. One of Schreiber's Boilermakers has led the Big Ten in hitting in four out of the last seven years.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha, finishing as regional runners-up to Auburn.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including top-six ranking in four categories. Schreiber ranks first all-time in walks (132), fourth in runs scored (159), tied for third in games played (220) and tied for sixth in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

BOILERMAKERS AMONG FAVORITES IN BIG TEN

• Tabbed first or second in the preseason predictions by nearly every college baseball publication and website, Purdue enters the 2012 season among the favorites in the Big Ten Conference. Baseball America and College Baseball Insider both predicted the Boilers will win the Big Ten and represent the conference at the NCAA Regionals. Baseball America also predicted Purdue would be a No. 3 seed at Regionals. The league coaches picked the Boilers second to defending conference co-champion Michigan State in the preseason poll.

• Although Purdue has not won a Big Ten title since 1909, the team has certainly come close quite a few times during head coach Doug Schreiber's 14-year tenure. Four times since 2001, the Boilers have either finished in second place (2001, 2005, 2008) or been just one game (or fewer) out of first place in the final standings (2001 & 2011).

• Purdue tied the program's single-season record with 37 wins in 2011. The Boilermakers led the Big Ten in victories and overall winning percentage (.649) a year ago.

FOUR STRAIGHT BIG TEN TOURNAMENT APPEARANCES

• Purdue is the only Big Ten team to reach the league tournament in each of the last four seasons, a program-long streak. The Boilermakers have managed to win at least one Big Ten Tournament game each of the last four years, and in eight of their nine tourney appearances under head coach Doug Schreiber. Purdue's 58 conference victories over the last four years are also tops in the league.

STACKED RETURNING LINEUP FEATURES SIX ALL-BIG TEN SELECTIONS

• The Boilermakers' opening day lineup is expected to feature all returning starters that are juniors or seniors. Purdue lost only three players that started games a season ago, with one of those graduated seniors, Payton Bieker, now an assistant coach.

• The opening day lineup is expected to feature six players that have earned All-Big Ten honors during their college careers. **Kevin Plawecki** (First Team catcher), **Barrett Serrato** (First Team outfielder), **Tyler Spillner** (Second Team outfielder), **Cameron Perkins** (Third Team third baseman) and **Stephen Talbott** (Third Team outfielder) were recognized among the best players in the conference at their positions in 2011. Second baseman **Eric Charles**, meanwhile, was a Third Team honoree as a freshman in 2009.

• All five aforementioned players started at least 55 games a season ago. Shortstop **David Miller**, designated hitter/first baseman **Angelo Cianfrocco** and first baseman **Ryan Bridges** are also back this season. Miller was a constant at shortstop and led the Big Ten in walks and on-base percentage in his first season with the program. Bridges and Cianfrocco are expected back at full strength after both missed long stretches of 2011 due to injuries.

• Outfielder **Andrew Dixon** also returns for his senior season. The left-handed hitter started 22 times, making at least one start at all three outfield positions, and played in a team-high 27 games off the bench.

• Plawecki and the outfield trio of Serrato, Spillner and Talbott made history last year. Plawecki was the first Purdue catcher to be named First Team All-Big Ten since 1960. The 1991 season marked the last time that three Purdue outfielders were All-Big Ten honorees in the same year.

WELCOME BACK BLAKE & BRIDGES

• While the Boilermakers will be without key starting pitcher **Brad Schreiber** this season due to offseason elbow surgery, Purdue does welcome back a pair of seniors who missed the final weeks of 2011. **Ryan Bridges** had started 24 of the first 31 games at first base when he suffered a broken leg in the finale of the Michigan series on April 10. He was batting .313 with 11 extra-base hits and 21 RBIs at the time of the injury. He had also impressed with his defense at first base.

• **Blake Mascarello** also returns to the active roster after missing the final month of 2011 due to a violation of team rules. The left-hander was a key member of the Purdue bullpen a year ago, compiling a 1.26 ERA in his six Big Ten appearances. Mascarello was a starting pitcher early in the season but proved most valuable in a relief role.

WITTGREN STARTS SEASON ON STOPPER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

• After leading the Big Ten with 12 saves and earning Second Team All-Big Ten honors in 2011, closer **Nick Wittgren** has received his fare share of preseason publicity this year. He was named to the NCBWA's Preseason All-America Third Team and was one of 45 relievers to be selected for the NCBWA's Stopper of the Year preseason watch list. Wittgren was the only player from a Big Ten school on the list for the award that recognizes the nation top Division I relief pitcher.

• Wittgren finished one save shy of the Purdue single-season record last year. He helped the Boilers establish a new program record with 21 saves as a team. But seven different relievers tallied at least one save, with all seven pitchers back this year.

• Twenty-four of Wittgren's 28 relief appearances on the mound saw him finish a game. He struck out 55 in 51 innings while issuing only 10 walks.

PERKINS' REACHES BASE SAFELY IN EVERY GAME OF 2011

- Highlighted by a 20-game hitting streak, **Cameron Perkins** managed to reach base safely in every game (56) in which he played in 2011. Dating back to 2010, he has reached base safely in 63 consecutive games. That ranked as the third longest active streak in the country entering the 2011 Big Ten Tournament.
- Perkins went hitless in the May 19 series opener against Iowa but his streak continued thanks to a dropped third strike on a passed ball. That was the opening play of a five-run eighth inning that allowed Purdue to rally for a victory.
- Perkins has reached base safely 126 times during his streak, collecting 93 hits, 12 walks and getting hit by a pitch 21 times. That's good for an on-base percentage of .423.
- In Big Ten play, Perkins has reached base safely in 42 consecutive contests dating back to last season. Including the Big Ten Tournament, he has managed to find his way on base in 49 straight games against conference opponents. He has compiled an on-base percentage of .425 during his Big Ten streak thanks to reaching base safely 94 times (70 hits, eight walks, 16 hit by pitch).

HAASE BEGINS 2012 AS SENIOR STAFF ACE

- Senior **Joe Haase** began the 2011 season in the bullpen but quickly emerged as one of Purdue's top pitchers and finished the year as the team leader in innings pitched. He started a game in each of the eight Big Ten weekend series and shared the team lead with 13 starts total. The right-hander begins the 2012 campaign as the team's Friday starter and ace of the pitching staff.
- Thanks in part to a complete-game shutout in his first career Big Ten start, a win against Minnesota at Target Field, Haase was able to record a consecutive scoreless-innings streak of 14 over four appearances during the first half of the season. He worked at least six innings in six of his nine starts against Big Ten rivals, finishing just one out shy of a complete game in the middle win game in the series sweep of Indiana.
- Haase also took the ball in the midweek games against nationally-ranked foes Louisville and Vanderbilt. He led the way in the win at Louisville, surrendering only two earned runs over 8 2/3 innings. He continued his mastery of Minnesota at the Big Ten Tournament, keeping the gritty Gophers off the scoreboard until the seventh inning in a game the Boilers lost, 1-0.

TALBOTT STILL A PERFECT BASE THIEF

- Purdue was active on the base paths for much of the 2011 season, successfully stealing at least one base in 42 of the 57 games. Twelve Boilermakers swiped at least one base but **Stephen Talbott** led the way at a perfect 17-for-17. He enters his junior season a perfect 22-for-22 in his career.
- Talbott was a Third Team All-Big Ten outfielder in 2011 thanks in part to ranking second in the conference with 54 runs scored. He did not bat any higher than eighth in the lineup until getting a chance to leadoff in the finale of the Tennessee Tech series (March 20). But for the season he batted no higher than seventh in 46 of the 55 games he started.
- Talbott nearly single-handedly won the opener of the Illinois series (May 13) thanks to a solo home run, double, insurance run and throwing out a runner at the plate. In the third inning, he threw out a runner at the plate to end the top of the frame and homered to open the bottom half.

BREEDLOVE & GUNTER OPEN 2012 IN STARTING ROTATION

- As two of the 15 seniors on the 2012 roster, **Lance Breedlove** and **Calvin Gunter** earned the right to join **Joe Haase** in the starting rotation as the new season opens. Together they made 39 appearances last season, starting 12 games. In his first year with the program, Breedlove joined **Nick Wittgren** as the only Purdue pitchers to appear on the mound in every weekend of the 2011 season. The right-hander made starts against Lipscomb, Tennessee-Martin, Minnesota and Illinois-Chicago. Breedlove made 15 of his 24 appearances in Purdue wins.
- Gunter finished the 2011 season as a member of the starting rotation. He earned the right to replace the injured **Brad Schreiber** in the rotation thanks to a quality spot start (5 2/3 IP, 3 H, 0 R, 0 BB, 4 K) in the rubber game win at Northwestern. He followed up that performance with 6 2/3 innings of one-run relief over two appearances in the series sweep of Indiana, earning the win in the finale thanks to 3 1/3 innings of one-hit work. The left-hander struck out a career-high seven over 5 1/3 innings in the middle game of the Iowa series.

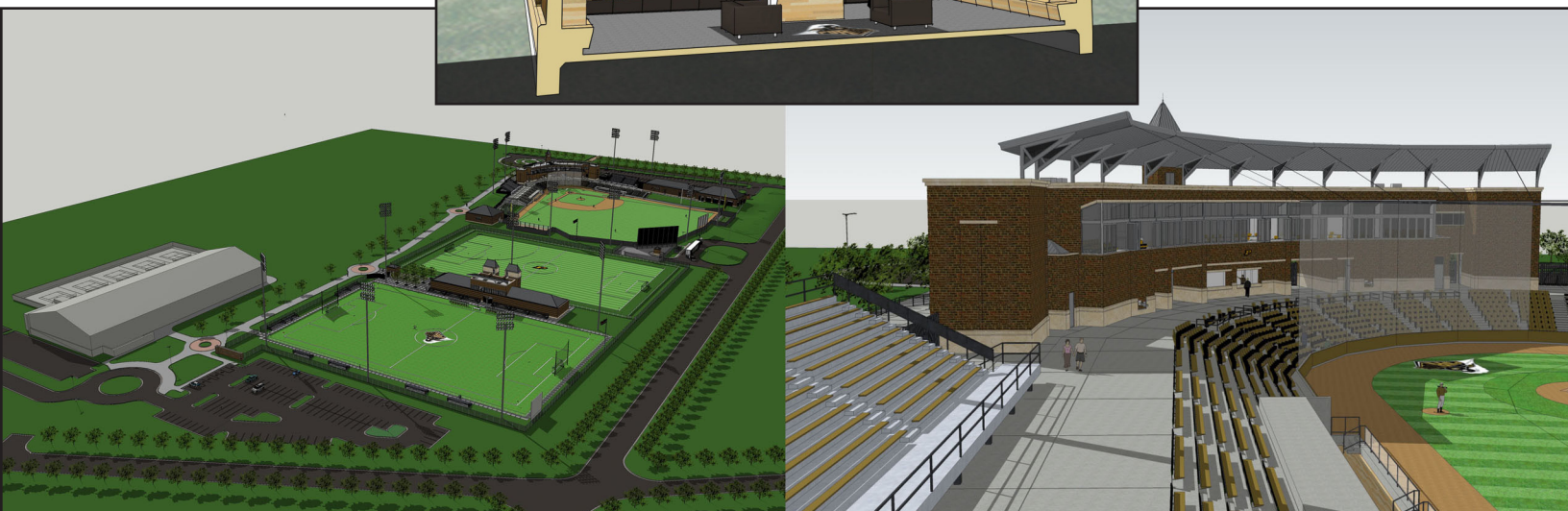
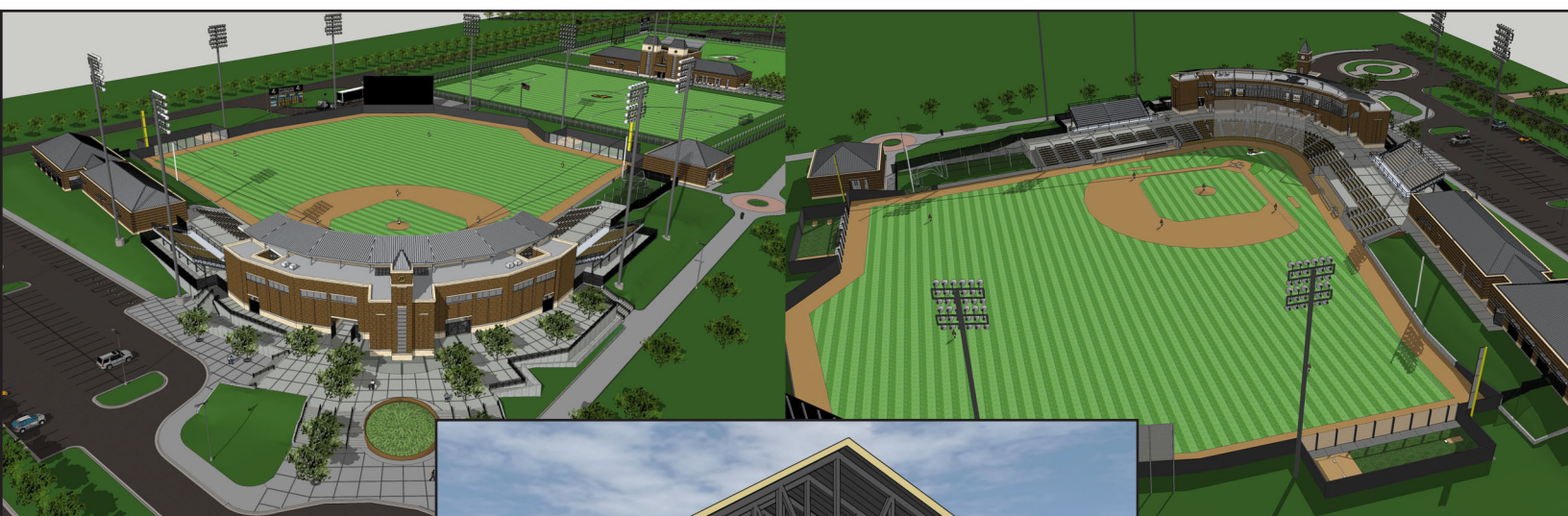

Coming Soon: Alexander Field at the Northwest Athletics Complex Construction Began in Spring of 2011 Stadium to be located near the intersection of McCormick & Cherry on the northwest side of campus

Alexander Field will soon be the new home of the Boilermakers. The \$21 million baseball stadium, to be financed with athletics department funds, could eventually seat up to 2,500 spectators in the first phase of improvements to the Northwest Athletics Complex that includes the adjacent soccer facility. The intercollegiate baseball stadium will replace the existing 1,100-seat Lambert Field, which has been the team's home since 1965. The new stadium will be named Alexander Field in honor of the late John and Anna Margaret Ross Alexander. The Alexanders were the parents of Dave Alexander, who is giving the lead gift for the project. John Alexander earned a bachelor's degree in 1933, while Anna Margaret Ross Alexander earned a bachelor's degree in 1935. Both received honorary doctorates from Purdue in 1986.
