Purdue heads to Bloomington to battle for Old Oaken Bucket

Saturday is the 119th meeting between the Boilermakers and Hoosiers.

»GAME THEMES

- Saturday is Purdue's sixth game under interim head coach Gerad Parker and third on the road.
- Parker was named interim head coach Oct. 16 after Darrell Hazell was relieved of his duties
- Purdue and Indiana meet for the 119th time in series history.
- Saturday is the 92nd meeting in the **Bucket Series.**
- Purdue is looking for its first win in the series since 2012.
- The Boilermakers are looking for their first win in Bloomington since 2011.
- Purdue is coming off a 49-20 loss to No. 6 Wisconsin.
- The top two passing offenses in the Big Ten square off. Purdue averages 301.3 pass yards per game to Indiana's 292.5.
- Saturday's game is the third in four years to be played in Bloomington.

GERAD PARKER FILE



Gerad Parker was elevated to interim head coach Oct. 16, 2016, taking over for Darrell Hazell, who was relieved of his duties.

Parker is in his fourth season at Purdue. He

was hired Feb. 11, 2013, and spent his first two seasons as tight ends coach before becoming wide receivers coach in 2015. He also has served as recruiting coordinator.

Parker is the second-youngest head coach in college football this season.

In Parker's first season as wide receivers coach, junior DeAngelo Yancey regained the form he displayed as a true freshman. After totaling merely 12 catches as a sophomore, Yancey bounced back with 48 receptions for a team-high 700 yards and five touchdowns. Senior Danny Anthrop led all Boilermakers with 57 receptions in 2015, the most by a Purdue player since Antavian Edison had 58 catches in 2012.

Parker previously worked at Marshall, joining the Thundering Herd coaching staff in the spring of 2011 and spending two years as wide receivers coach. In 2012, Marshall led all Football Bowl Subdivision teams in passing offense with an average of 365.1 yards per game. Wide receiver Tommy Shuler led all FBS players with 9.2 receptions per game and ranked 18th nationally with 94.8 yards per game average. In a Sept. 29 game against Purdue in West Lafayette, Shuler set an opponent record vs. the Boilermakers with 19 receptions for 200 yards.

Prior to Marshall, Parker spent three seasons at UT-Martin as the Skyhawks' passing game coordinator, recruiting coordinator, wide receivers and running backs coach. He began his collegiate coaching career as a graduate assistant at Kentucky, his alma mater.

A four-year letterwinner for the Wildcats, Parker twice was named to the Southeastern Conference Scholar Athlete Honor Roll (2002 and 2003), was selected the Most Inspirational Player by his teammates (2004) and was the UK Football Scholar Athlete of the Year (2004).

Parker (born Jan. 4, 1981) earned his bachelor's degree in business management in 2003 and his master's in education in 2005, both from Kentucky. He and his wife, Kandi, have three daughters: Kolbi, Gwyneth and Rosalyn. Rosalyn was born Sept. 6, 2016, four days before the Boilermakers hosted Cincinnati.

»GAME 11 REWIND

- Purdue lost to No. 6 Wisconsin 49-20.
- The Boilermakers led 3-0 after the first quarter, becoming just the fourth team to score in the opening 15 minutes against the Badgers this season.
- Wisconsin took advantage of a trio of Purdue turnovers to take a 35-10 lead at the half.
- The Boilermakers' touchdown came on a 75-yard pass from David Blough to DeAngelo Yancey.
- Jake Replogle played his first full game since Oct. 8 at Illinois. He had a dominant first quarter and finished the day with eight tackles, including 2.5 for loss.
- Blough found Yancey for a second touchdown in the fourth quarter.
- Yancey finished the day with a careerhigh 155 receiving yards on six catches, including two touchdowns.
- David Blough extended his streak of games with at least one touchdown pass to 11
- Markus Bailey continues to lead the defense, as he finished with nine tackles, including 2.0 for loss.
- Gregory Phillips came up with a fumble recovery on a Wisconsin muffed punt. It was Purdue's first fumble recovery since the Illinois game.
- J.D. Dellinger was 2-for-2 on field goals and is now 9-for-13 on the season. He has made seven of his last eight after starting the year 2-for-5.
- The game was senior day as 18 student-athletes played their final game at Ross-Ade Stadium.

»FIRST(S) AND 10

 DeAngelo Yancey had 155 receiving yards against Wisconsin, becoming the first Boilermaker with at least 150 receiving yards in a game since Danny Anthrop had 151 at Indiana in 2013.

- Gregory Phillips recorded Purdue's first takeaway by fumble since Oct. 8 at Illinois.
- Purdue held Wisconsin scoreless in the first quarter, its first time holding an opponent scoreless in the opening 15 minutes since Oct. 10 last season against Minnesota.
- Jake Replogle played his first full game since the Boilermakers won at Illinois on Oct. 8.
- Saturday is Purdue's first noon road game this season. The previous four were 3:30 p.m. ET kickoffs.
- In his first full season of action, redshirt freshman Markus Bailey leads the defense in tackles (89) and interceptions (2), while he is tied for this on the team in tackles for loss (6.0).
- DeAngelo Yancey is the first Purdue wide receiver with at least nine touchdown receptions in a season since since Taylor Stubblefield in 2004.
- David Blough is Purdue's first 3,000yard passer since Joey Elliott in 2009.
- Purdue's first-quarter field goal against Wisconsin was just the fourth time this season the Badgers have given up points in the first quarter.
- Purdue's return defense, punt and kickoff, ranks first in the Big Ten this season.

- Purdue has played 23 freshmen, including nine true freshmen, and four first-year junior college transfers this season.
- Freshmen have accounted for 109 points, 452 rushing yards, 165 passing yards, 390 receiving yards, three interceptions, 171 tackles, a sack, 9.0 tackles for loss and four PBUs this season.
- First-year players scored 28 of Purdue's 34 points at Illinois, including 22 by freshmen, and racked up 34 tackles.
- First-year junior college players have added six points.
- Freshman kicker J.D. Dellinger is 34for-34 on his extra points and 9-for-13 on field goals.

- Blough's 88-yard touchdown pass to DeAngelo Yancey at Nebraska is tied for the 12th-longest pass in the country this season.
- His 89-yard touchdown pass to Cameron Posey at Minnesota is tied for the eighth-longest pass this year.
- His 59 pass attempts against lowa are tied for the 10th-most in a game.
- His five passing touchdowns against lowa are tied for the 11th-most in a game this season.
- Blough ranks eighth in the country with an average of 24.64 completions per game.
- His 57 attempts against Cincinnati are tied for 17th in the country this season.
- He ranks 12th in the nation with 3,127 passing yards on the season.
- He ranks 17th in the country with an average of 284.3 passing yards per game.

- Blough leads the Big Ten in conference games in touchdown passes (18), attempts (342) and yards (2,181) and is second in completions (193).

ADDITIONAL NOTES

- Blough has two of the Big Ten's three 400-yard passing performances this season and three of the conference's five-best passing performances.
- Blough has five 300-yard passing games this season, two more than any other Big Ten quarterback.
- His 458 passing yards against lowa are 192 more than any other team has passed for against the Hawkeyes. Only two other teams have even had a 200yard passing game against lowa.
- Blough is the only Big Ten quarterback with a 400-yard passing game in a conference game this season.
- Blough has three of the conference's nine 300-yard passing games against Big Ten foes.
- Blough is one of seven quarterbacks in school history with five touchdown passes in a game.

- Including Blough, seven Purdue quarterbacks have thrown at least five touchdowns in a game. Five is tied for fifth-most in a single game.
- Blough is the first Purdue quarterback with five touchdown passes in a game since Curtis Painter in 2008 against Indiana.
- Blough's 458 passing yards against lowa are the 10th-most in a game in school history, while his 391 at Minnesota rank 25th.
- Blough is one of 20 quarterbacks in school history with a 300-yard passing game.
- Blough's first start came last season against Bowling Green. He went 29 for 39 for 340 yards and two touchdowns, while also rushing for 11 yards and a score
- Blough, a third-year sophomore, has appeared in 21 games.
- His 57.5 percent completion percentage is tied for 10th in school history. (min. 300 attempts).
- Blough rushed for two touchdowns in the season opener against Eastern Kentucky, a career high. He added one at Illinois, one against Northwestern and now has eight for his career.
- Blough threw for at least 300 yards against Cincinnati and Nevada, making him the first Purdue quarterback with back-to-back 300-yard passing games since Joey Elliott in 2009 (367 at Michigan; 373 at Michigan State). He then had back-to-back 300-yard passing games with 458 yards vs. lowa and 309 yards at Nebraska.
- Blough picked up his first road win as a starting quarterback at Illinois.
- Blough's 88-yard touchdown pass to DeAngelo Yancey at Nebraska was Purdue's longest pass since Curtis Painter hit Selwyn Lymon for an 88yard score at Notre Dame in 2006.
- His 89-yard touchdown pass to Cameron Posey at Minnesota was the longest since Kyle Orton hit Taylor Stubblefield for a 97-yard touchdown at Notre Dame in 2004.
- Blough ranks sixth among active quarterbacks with an average of 36.43 attempts per game for his career.
- Blough ranks fourth among active players in college football with an average of 43.14 offensive players per game for his career.
- For his career, Blough has 10 touchdown passes of at least 50 yards.
- Blough has thrown a touchdown pass in all 11 games this season.
- He has a touchdown pass of at least 45 yards in each of the last seven games.

»INTERIM, ACTING HEAD COACHES

- Here is a snapshot of previous interim and acting head coaches with Purdue football:
- On Oct. 30, 1912, M.H. "Bill" Horr was dismissed as coach for "improper conduct." John "Keckie" Moll assumed control of the team, and the Boilermakers did not lose the rest of the season, winning three and tying one. Among their victories was a 91-0 demolition of Rose Poly on Nov. 17. In that game, halfback Elmer Oliphant set school records with five touchdowns (in the first year they were worth the modern-day six points), 13 extra points and 43 total points. Moll, who was expected to have his contract renewed. had an offer to become head coach at Ohio State, as well. But he died on Christmas morning of 1912 after a short illness stemming from typhoid fever.
- In July of 1937, Noble Kizer was stricken with a kidney disorder. He was granted a leave of absence Aug. 28 and tabbed longtime assistant Mal Elward as interim coach. Kizer staged a remarkable recovery but did not coach again and ultimately succumbed to the illness June 13, 1940, at just 40 years of age. Elward, who led the Boilermakers to a 4-3-1 record in 1937, had the interim tag lifted in the spring of 1938 and continued as head coach through the 1941 season before resigning to enlist in the Navy.
- When Danny Hope was relieved of his duties Nov. 25, 2012, wide receivers coach Patrick Higgins was named interim head coach. Higgins coached the Boilermakers in the Heart of Dallas Bowl, a 58-14 loss to Oklahoma State.
- Twice, Bob DeMoss served as acting head coach under Jack Mollenkopf and compiled a 4-2 record.
- Prior to Purdue's game at Michigan on Oct. 21, 1961, Mollenkopf was sidelined with an intestinal ailment. DeMoss, who was the offensive backfield coach, filled in for two games. The Boilermakers lost to the Wolverines 16-14 but then defeated fifth-ranked lowa at home 9-0 the following week. DeMoss was honored as Coach of the Week by United Press International.
- DeMoss again served as acting head





»BIG-PLAY YANCEY

- DeAngelo Yancey has a career-best nine touchdown catches this season.
- Seven of Yancey's nine touchdown catches this season have spanned at least 35 yards.
- His nine touchdown receptions this season average 46.8 yards.
- Last season was very similar, as he hauled in five touchdown catches, spanning an average of 42.4 yards per score.
- While his sophomore year yielded just three touchdown catches with an average of 12.3 yards per score, Yancey's two freshman touchdowns averaged 32.5 yards.
- Yancey had caught at least one touchdown catch in four straight games, before that streak was snapped against Northwestern. He made up for it with two touchdowns agains Wisconsin.
- In five of his last six games, Yancey has a touchdown reception of more than 50 yards.
- Nine of Yancey's 19 career touchdowns have been at least 45 yards, while eight have been at least 50.
- Five of his touchdown catches have been at least 60 yards, while two have been more than 80.
- Yancey needs one more 100-yard receiving game to crack Purdue's list for most in a single season.
- Yancey's 88-yard reception at Nebraska is tied for 12th-longest reception in the country this season.
- Yancey has been Purdue's top receiver in terms of receiving yards in three games.
- Those three games were Wisconsin, Penn State and Nebraska.

»IN THE B1G, NCAA

- For his career, Yancey has 19 touchdown receptions, averaging 38.7 yards per score. That ranks seventh in the country among active receivers with at least 10 career touchdown catches. It's the best in the Big Ten.
- Yancey leads the Big Ten in yards per reception this season with 20.3 yards per catch. That ranks seventh in the country.
- Yancey is second in the Big Ten with 873 receiving yards this season.
- He is second in the Big Ten with nine touchdown receptions.
- Yancey's 88-yard touchdown reception at Nebraska is the third-longest passing play in the Big Ten this season and second longest on the team.
- Yancey is second in the Big Ten with 79.4 receiving yards per game.

WIDE RECEIVER DEANGELO YANCEY

- Yancey is second in the Big Ten with four 100-yard receiving games this season.
- He is tied for 13th in the country for most 40-yard receptions over this season and last. He has 10 such catches.
- He is tied for seventh for most 50-yard receptions over this year and last. He has eight catches of at least 50 yards in that span.
- Yancey ranks ninth in the country among active receivers with a career average of 16.8 yards per catch (min. 100 catches).
- He is 22nd in the country with nine touchdown catches.

MARKELL JONES

»FRESHMAN NUMBERS

- Markell Jones led the team in rushing last season with 168 carries for 875 yards and 10 touchdowns. The 875 yards are the most ever by a Purdue freshman.
- Jones ran for 157 yards and two touchdowns at No. 2 Michigan State last year. That is the most singlegame yardage by a true freshman in program history. That was his first career start.
- Jones' 10 rushing touchdowns were the most by a Boilermaker since 2008, when Kory Sheets had 16, and rank tied for 15th-most in a season in program history.

»RANKINGS

- Jones is one of just two Big Ten running backs back this year who rushed for 10+ touchdowns in 2015.
 Jones had 10, MSU's LJ Scott had 11.

- Sophomore Joe Schopper is 78th in punting this season with an average of 40.7 yards per punt.
- While that number may not be great, it is very deceiving.
- Schopper has placed 23 of his 51 punts inside the opponent's 20-yard line, 45.1 percent.
- Twenty of those 23 punts also were at the 15-yard line or better.
- Ten of his punts have ended up at the 10-yard line or better, with eight inside the 10 and one on it.
- Two of his punts have been downed inside the 5.

Among that list, he is one of just three who are now sophomores.

»MORE

- Jones was named to the Doak Walker Watch List for the nation's premier running back for achievements on the field, in the classroom and in the community.
- In Jones' 168 carries last year, just seven went for loss all 1-yard losses.
- Against Cincinnati, he had 15 carries for 47 yards, before a shoulder injury sidelined him for the rest of the game.
- Jones has two 100-yard rushing games this season, after putting up 124 on Nevada.
- Jones is just one rushing touchdown shy of cracking Purdue's top-20 career list.
- He needs 179 yards to jump onto Purdue's top-20 career rushing yards list.

»2016 NUMBERS

- Jones led the Big Ten in week one with 145 rushing yards.
- Jones' rushing total is the fourth best for a Boilermaker in a season-opening game.
- Jones went over 1,000 career rushing yards against EKU and now has 1,456 after the Wisconsin game.
- Jones has 131 carries for 581 yards (4.4 avg.) and three touchdowns this season.
- Jones was limited to 30 yards on eight carries against Northwestern.

»WELCOME MIKE BOBINSKI

- Mike Bobinski was announced as Purdue University's new athletics director Aug. 9, 2016.
- Bobinski's first official day as the athletics director was Sept. 1.
- Bobinski is the ninth full-time athletics director in Purdue history.
- He came to Purdue from Georgia Tech, where he had been since 2013. He had previously served as AD at Xavier (1998-2004, 2006-13) and Akron (1994-1998).
- Bobinski is just the fourth full-time athletics director at Purdue in the last 74 years.

»FIRST START CENTURY CLUB

- Brian Lankford-Johnson made his first career start at running back at Illinois, filling in for injured Markell Jones.
- Lankford-Johnson had career-highs with 18 rushes for 127 yards and a touchdown.

- His game-winner is the first for Purdue since 2012 at lowa when Paul Griggs hit a 46-yarder as time expired to give the Boilermakers the 27-24 win.

»MALONE IN THE COMMUNITY

- Offensive coordinator Terry Malone, in his second year at Purdue and first calling plays, never shies away from extending a helping hand.
- On Aug. 24, nine tornadoes touched down across Indiana, the worst an EF-3 with a peak wind at 152 miles per hour in Kokomo, located about 45 miles east of West Lafayette.
- While fortunately no lives were lost, more than 1,000 structures were damaged, including 200 deemed a total loss. More than 15,000 people

were without power and more than 200 needed at least temporary shelter.

- Though just one week before the season-opener, Malone and his wife, Ann, cleared their Saturday, Aug. 27 schedule and drove over to help clean up.
- Malone said afterwards, "It was very satisfying. I'm not sure how much we did to help, because there's so much work to be done, but we cleared three or four yards of debris and cut a couple trees down. But we had a really good day."
- That was not the first time the Malones have stepped in after a disaster.
- Malone, who came to Purdue from the New Orleans Saints, opened his speech at the Purdue Football Preseason Banquet on Aug. 19, expected to be a quick overview of the offense, by asking the Boilermaker community for any help for his friends and neighbors back in Louisiana who are dealing with the tragic flooding.
- Malone was also helping in New Orleans after Hurricane Katrina, as he took the job in February 2006.
- Malone said, "There was never a year in New Orleans without having something. So, it becomes a part of the way you think. The fact is that you really don't need to do a whole lot to help people who are in need. They really appreciate it and you get a lot more satisfaction of doing it than they probably do out of you helping them."

»BOILERMAKERS IN THE COMMUNITY

- The Purdue football program is incredibly involved with community service initiatives, as players and coaches regularly volunteer their time.
- The Boilermakers amassed more than 500 hours of community service from January to August of 2016 and have made more than 500 appearances at events and outings over the past five years.
- They have been involved with mission trips to Haiti and South Africa, pioneered community projects like Dream Season and IMPACT, and are regular visitors to local elementary schools.
- In addition to campus programs like the Purdue Dance Marathon for Riley Children's Hospital and the Purdue University Center for Cancer Research 5K run/walk, the football program has participated in the Indiana Blood Center blood drive each of the last 18 years.

»BAILEY IN ELITE COMPANY

- Markus Bailey is one of a few redshirt freshmen with game experience prior to this season.
- Bailey appeared in the first three games last season before a knee injury sidelined him for the season.
- Bailey totaled 12 tackles, including nine solo, before the injury.
- Since then, he has taken over the defense, playing outside and middle linebacker.
- He made his first career start vs. EKU and finished with four tackles in the 2016 season opener.
- Bailey started against Cincinnati and led the team with nine tackles, including a then-career-high seven solo stops.
- He had his first career interception at Maryland on the defense's third play of the game.
- He had a then-career-high 11 tackles at Illinois and followed that performance with 11 more against lowa.
- At Minnesota, he recorded a careerhigh 12 tackles, including 0.5 for loss.
- He followed that up with 12 more tackles, including 2.5 for loss, and an interception against Northwestern and nine tackles, including 2.0 for loss against Wisconsin.
- Bailey tops the Boilermakers with 89 tackles and two interceptions. That dual leadership has been achieved in a season just nine times in school history, and merely three times by a linebacker and just once by a freshman (Stuart Schweigert, 2000):

»BURGESS' BASEBALL BACKGROUND

- Purdue sophomore receiver Jarrett Burgess turned 26 on Aug. 25.
- Burgess played five seasons of minor league baseball after being selected in the sixth round of the 2008 Major League Baseball draft by the Seattle Mariners.
- Burgess played outfield and pitched, throwing 97 miles per hour off the mound, during his career in rookie and Class A ball.
- Burgess came to Purdue last summer after not playing organized football for more than 10 years, as he did not play in high school.
- Burgess comes from a football-heavy family, as his dad, Fernanza, was a wide receiver for the New York Jets and Miami Dolphins, and his uncle James Burgess, played two seasons as a linebacker for the San Diego Chargers. Jarrett's cousin, James Jr., wrapped up his senior season as a linebacker at Louisville last fall.
- Last season, Burgess had 60 rushing yards and a touchdown on three carries, as well as 20 receiving yards.
- He made his first career catch against Eastern Kentucky in this year's opener.
- Burgess suffered a hand injury in practice before the Nevada game and missed that game, as well as at Maryland. He returned for the Illinois game on special teams.

»CURIOUS CASE OF THIRD DOWNS

- Third-down success on offense and defense can often predict the outcomes of games.
- Purdue's offense ranks 28th in the country in third-down conversions with a success rate of 44.8 percent.
- The defense, however, is on the other end of the spectrum, yielding first downs on 49.1 percent of occasions. That ranks 121st.
- For the most part, Purdue has seen much better defensive third-down success in second halves this season, limiting Eastern Kentucky to 0 for 7 in the final 30 minutes. Cincinnati was just 4 for 10 on third down in the second half against Purdue and Nevada picked up 3 of 7 in the second half. Maryland converted just 1 of 5 third downs in the second half, while Illinois was just 2 of 6. Iowa was just 2 of 8 on third downs in the second half.
- The Nebraska game flipped the trend

- for the first time this season, allowing third down conversions on just 2 of 6 occasions in the first half, compared with 5 of 9 in the second half.
- Against Penn State, Purdue gave up just 2 of 9 third downs, with 2 of 5 in the first half and 0 of 4 in the second.
- At Minnesota, the Gophers converted just 2 of 8 third downs in the first half and 2 of 7 in the final 30 minutes.
- Northwestern converted 7 of 11 third downs in the first half and 3 of 5 in the second.
- Against Wisconsin, the Badgers were 6 of 8 on third down in the first half and 3 of 7 in the second.
- Purdue's defense has given up first downs on 56 of 90 occasions in first halves this season (.622), while allowing just 25 of 75 in the second halves (.333).
- Third downs were a huge factor in Purdue's win at Illinois, as the offense picked up 9 of 16 third down tries, while the defense gave up first downs on just 3 of 11 occasions.
- The Boilermakers' first-half third-down success against Nebraska (4 of 9 on offense, 2 of 6 on defense) propelled them to a 14-10 halftime lead. Their first half third-down success against Penn State (6 of 11 on offense, 2 of 5 on defense) also helped them go into half time tied at 17. Purdue took a 28-23 lead into the half at Minnesota thanks in part to a 2 of 4 effort offensively on third downs.


»Jake Replogle

- Replogle most recently was named to the Rotary Lombardi Award watch list.
- That award goes recognizes the most outstanding college football lineman.
- Replogle is also on the Outland Trophy watch list.
- The Outland Trophy is presented to the nation's top interior offensive or defensive lineman.
- Replogle is also on the Chuck Bednarik Award watch list.









»FOOTBALL PERFORMANCE COMPLEX

- The Boilermakers are building a new football performance complex, a \$65 million project, on the north end of the Mollenkopf Athletic Center.
- The complex is part of the Football Master Plan, which consists of six points: coaching and support staff, player development, academic support, recruiting, fan engagement, and contemporary facilities.
- The project is expected to be completed in August 2017.
- The three-level structure totaling 110,000 square feet will include a locker room, team meeting room, position group meeting rooms, player development room, sports performance training area (weight room), sports medicine facility, nutrition station and coaches' offices, as well as a grand entrance lobby, which will highlight the Boilermakers' history and tradition.

»The Latest

- The foundation has been laid at the Football Performance Complex from the northwest to the east and south.
- Ninety-five percent of vertical concrete has been poured for walls and columns, while nearly 55 percent of flat concrete is in place for floors on the second and third levels.
- Half of the heavy steel installation has been put in place. Long-span steel placement for the sports performance training center (weight room) has begun, as well.
- When all is said and done, some 881 tons of structural steel and fabrication will be in place.
- The roof deck is being put in place, while entryway work into Mollenkopf Athletic Center also has begun.
- Since work began, 23,375 cubic yards of mass excavation has occurred, and 401 aggregate piers and 92 augercast piles have been installed to support the foundation.
- All underground piping has been laid, including 2,697 feet of storm piping and 1,569 feet of water lines.

»NEW ASSISTANT COACHES

- The Boilermakers have five new assistant coaches, which is tied for the fifth-most of any team with the same head coach in FBS this year.
- John Nussman was elevated to assistant coach when Gerad Parker was named interim head coach Oct. 16.

»Ross Els - Defensive Coordinator/Safeties

- Els was hired Jan. 1, 2016.
- Els returned to collegiate coaching after spending the 2015 season as an assistant coach at Lincoln Southwest, his son's high school in Lincoln, Nebraska.
- A veteran of 26 seasons of coaching on the collegiate level, Els most recently spent four seasons (2011-14) as linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator at Nebraska.

»Darrell Funk - Offensive Line

- Funk was hired Feb. 4, 2016.
- Funk, who boasts 29 years of collegiate coaching experience, came to the Boilermakers from Akron, where he coached in 2015.
- Prior to Akron, Funk spent four seasons as the offensive line coach at Michigan (2011-14).
- His group has also had three games without allowing a sack and allowed just one on an intentional grounding against lowa.

»Tim Lester - Quarterbacks

- Lester was hired Dec. 28, 2015.
- Lester came to the Boilermakers from Syracuse, where he served as quarterbacks coach from 2013 to 2015 and as offensive coordinator the last two seasons, as well.
- Lester's work with David Blough has produced five 300-yard passing games, including two 400-yard performances already this season.
- Purdue leads the Big Ten in passing and Blough continues to climb up every Purdue career passing list.

»Randy Melvin - Defensive Line

• Melvin was hired Dec. 31, 2015.

Melvin returned to the Boilermakers from Miami (Fla.).

- He previously coached at Purdue as defensive ends coach from 1997 to 1999.
- He was at Miami for one year.
- Prior to Miami, he was at Florida International for a year.
- He was the defensive line coach with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers in 2012 and 2013.
- In 2001, he was the defensive line coach with the New England Patriots when they won Super Bowl XXXVI.

»DeAndre Smith - Running Backs

- Smith was hired Jan. 26, 2016.
- Smith came to the Boilermakers from Syracuse, where he spent the previous three seasons in a similar role.
- Smith previously coached running backs at New Mexico (2012, 2008), Illinois (2010-11), UNLV (2009), Miami (Ohio) (2005-07) and Northern Illinois (2001-04).
- Smith's group has three 100-yard rushing games, with two from Markell Jones and one by Brian Lankford-Johnson.

»Terry Malone

- Malone is a second-year coach, but enters his first season as the team's offensive coordinator.
- He was promoted Dec. 22, 2015.
- In his first game as offensive coordinator, the Boilermakers scored touchdowns on their first two drives.
 It was the first time since 2009 that Purdue scored on its opening drive of the season.
- Malone has rejuvenated the Purdue offense and has three 500-yard outings, as well as at least 450-yards in five games.

»John Nussman

- John Nussman, who began the 2016 season as offensive analyst, assumed assistant coaching duties when Gerad Parker was elevated to interim head coach.
- Nussman is working with the wide receivers.
- Nussman served as a graduate assistant with the Boilermakers from 2013 to 2015 after spending the 2012 season at Otterbein University.
- Nussman earned his bachelor's degree in strategic communications from Ohio State in 2012.
- As an undergraduate, he served three seasons as an offensive assistant/intern with the Buckeyes, taking part in the 2009 Rose Bowl (11-2) and 2010 Sugar Bowl (12-1) championship teams.



• Nussman played quarterback, wide receiver and punter at Northmont High School in Ohio.
