GAME NOTES

- This is the 40th season in Purdue Women's Basketball history. The Boilermakers are 778-412 all-time, including a 409-127 mark at home.
- Purdue is 192-93 under head coach Sharon Versyp, who is in her ninth season with the Boilermakers. She has a career record of 309-158.
- Purdue is 363-182 all-time in Big Ten Conference play, including a 209-64 record at home.
- Versyp is 90-47 at Purdue in conference play and 99-54 for her career in Big Ten action.
- Purdue is 211-124 in January, including a 119-41 mark at home. The Boilermakers are 8-3 all-time on Jan. 4, including a 6-2 mark at home.
- Purdue is 22-18 all-time in the 14th game of the season.
- The Boilermakers are 129-57 all-time against teams from its native state of Indiana.
- Purdue is 499-187 when playing in its home state of Indiana.
- The Boilermakers have won six in a row at home against Indiana. They have won 50 of the last 59 meetings against Indiana including 10 of 11, 15 of 18, 21 of 25 and 30 of 35 to take a 52-26 advantage through the first meeting of the 2014-15 season.
- Purdue has played Indiana more than any opponent in school history as Sunday marked the 78th meeting in the series.
- The Boilermakers won for the first time this season when their opponent topped 60 points.
- Purdue scored a season-best 86 points, making 32 field goals and shooting 47.1 percent from the floor.
- The Boilermakers are 234-12 all-time when scoring at least 80 points.
- The Boilermakers assisted on 25 of 32 made field goals (.781).
- Indiana was limited to just 34.4 percent from the field (21-61), and took 30 three-point shots, the most of any Purdue opponent this season.
- The Boilermakers outscored Indiana in the paint, 40-24, and outrebounded the Hoosiers, 40-37.
- Purdue forced Indiana into 17 turnovers, converting them into 20 points. The Boilermakers committed a season-low eight turnovers, leading to just one Indiana point.
- The Boilermakers outscored Indiana on fast break points, 16-0.
- Purdue matched its season-best at the free throw line, connecting on 19-of-23 (.826)
- Purdue is now 6-0 on the season when shooting better than their opponents from the floor, and 8-2 when outrebounding their opponents.

GAME PERFORMANCES/INDIVIDUAL HIGHS

- Whitney Bays scored a career-high 27 points on 11-of-16 shooting, and became the first Boilermaker in school history to post five consecutive double-doubles, adding 10 rebounds. Bays breaks the mark previously shared by Stacey Lovelace and Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton.
- Ashley Morrissette posted 18 points and five assists (with no turnovers), going seven-of-14 from the floor.
- Bridget Perry scored in double-figures for the second time in her last three games, tallying 13 points, five assists and three rebounds.
- April Wilson had 10 points, seven assists, three rebounds and two steals.
- Despite not scoring Torrie Thornton had a solid all-round game, chipping in five rebounds, three blocks and two steals in 18 minutes.
