

PURDUE BASKETBALL POSTGAME NOTES

Florida State (7-1) at Purdue (3-3)

Purdue Boilermakers 64, Florida State Seminoles 67 (OT)

GAME NOTES

- This is the 40th season in Purdue Women's Basketball history. The Boilermakers are 772-410 all-time, including a 404-126 mark at home.
- Purdue is 186-91 under head coach Sharon Versyp, who is in her ninth season with the Boilermakers. She has a career record of 303-156.
- Purdue is 180-80 in December, including a 91-20 mark on its home court. The Boilermakers are 9-6 all-time on Dec. 3, it was their first loss ever on the date in Mackey Arena (6-1).
- Purdue is 24-16 all-time in the fifth game of the season.
- The Boilermakers are 12-5 all-time against teams from Florida.
- Purdue is 494-186 when playing in its home state of Indiana.
- Purdue is 19-20 all-time against the Atlantic Coast Conference, and 1-7 in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge.
- The Boilermakers are 0-2 in overtime games this season and 29-22 all-time.
- The Boilermakers scored 30 points off of 22 Florida State turnovers.
- Florida State won the rebounding battle, 47-32, but 30 of their boards came on the defensive end, while Purdue matched them on the offensive end (17-14).
- The Seminoles outscored Purdue on second-chance points, 18-7, but the Boilermakers had the final seven points in the category.
- Purdue's bench outscored Florida State's, 20-10, and the Boilermakers had a slight 26-24 advantage in the paint.
- Florida State led for almost 37 minutes of game time as Purdue didn't take its first lead until 5:59 left in regulation.
- The Boilermakers had their best free throw shooting performance of the season, making 19-of-23 at the stripe (.826).
- Purdue's 12 turnovers were its lowest amount on the season.
- The Boilermakers made a season-low three three-point field goals, attempting a season-low 10 from behind the arc.

GAME PERFORMANCES/INDIVIDUAL HIGHS

- April Wilson led the Boilermakers in scoring for the fourth straight game, narrowly missing a career-high with 17 points. She also added five assists and three steals.
- Ashley Morrisette had nine points, including a game-tying three with just 26 seconds left in regulation.
- Bree Horrocks scored a career-high eight points on three-of-four shooting.
- Whitney Bays had eight points, seven rebounds and three assists, but was injured on the final play of regulation and missed the entire overtime period.
- Liza Clemons had seven points and a season-high eight rebounds, in addition to two blocks and two steals.
- Hayden Hamby had seven points and two assists.
