GAME NOTES

- This is the third meeting between Purdue and IPFW, with the Boilermakers improving to 3-0 against the Mastodons.
- Sharon Versyp improves her overall record as a head coach to 238-129 and her Purdue record to 121-64.
- Purdue has become the sixth Big Ten team with 10 wins in non-conference play. Ohio State, Michigan, Nebraska, Northwestern and Penn State also have 10 or more wins this season.
- Sam Ostarello has gotten off to quick starts on offense in the last two games, scoring the first six Boilermaker points against Oakland and Purdue's first four points versus IPFW. Ostarello ended the game shooting 3-of-4 from the field, with 13 points and eight rebounds.
- The Boilermakers held IPFW to only 12 points in the first half. This was a season low for Purdue's defense.
- The Purdue was up 24 points at the half, the largest Boilermaker halftime advantage of the season.
- Purdue went on a 21-3 run over a 9:06 period to end the half leading IPFW 36-12.
- Purdue improves to 6-2 with Houser, Moses, Rayburn, Ostarello and Jones in the starting lineup.
- Tonight's game is the seventh time Purdue has held an opponent under 50 points this season. The Boilermakers are 7-0 in those contests.
- All 12 players saw action against IPFW and 11 scored. The last time all 12 players saw action was Dec. 20, 2011, versus Oakland. This has happened five times this season.
- For the first time this season, Purdue did not allow a single player on the opposing team to score in double figures. The Boilermakers also did not allow a Mastodon to record more than four rebounds.

TEAM HIGHS AND LOWS

- Antionette Howard set a season high with nine rebounds to go along with 10 points.
- Liza Clemons tied her career high for blocks with two, both in the first half.
- With two three-pointers against IPFW, Houser made multiple three-pointers in a game for the first time this season and the first time since hitting 2-of-4 three-pointers against Seattle on Nov. 20, 2009. Houser missed the 2010-11 season with an ACL injury.
- This is the first time this season that four players have reached double figures: Moses (14), Ostarello (13), Rayburn (11) and Howard (10).
- Purdue held IPFW to only 12 field goals, which is the lowest by an opponent this season. The previous season low was 15 against UT Martin on Nov. 20, 2011.

- IPFW's 36 was an opponent season low. The previous low was UT Martin's 39 points.
- IPFW's 23.1 percent shooting (12-of-52) was an opponent season low.
- Purdue's 37-point margin of victory is the largest of the season.
- Courtney Moses scored a game-high 14 points. It is the fifth time this season she has led the Boilermakers in scoring, tying Brittany Rayburn who has also led Purdue in scoring five times.
