THE SCENE SETTER

▶ No. 20-ranked Purdue looks to tie a school record for most home wins in a season on Saturday, but it won't be easy as No. 10-ranked Maryland visits Mackey Arena for a 4 p.m. ET tip. **Dave O'Brien**, **Dick Vitale** and **Allison Williams** will provide expert commentary with **Bart Fox** producing on ESPN, beginning at 4 p.m. ET. On the radio dial, legendary broadcasters **Larry Clisby**, **Rob Blackman** and **Ralph Taylor** will do the same on the Purdue Radio Network with **Wes Scott** producing. Live stats will be available on StatBroadcast.com and as always, in-game updates will be provided on the Purdue Basketball Twitter account (@BoilerBall).

NOTES YOU NEED TO KNOW

- ▶ Purdue is looking for its first win in school history against Maryland. The Terrapins own a 2-0 series advantage against the Boilermakers.
- ▶ A win over Maryland would give Purdue 16 home victories, which would match the school record for wins at Mackey Arena (2010-11, 2007-08, 2006-07).
- ▶ Purdue is looking for its second straight win over a top-10 foe, after defeating No. 8-ranked Michigan State on Feb. 9 (82-81; overtime). Purdue last won two straight games over top-10 foes on Feb. 16-20, 2011 (No. 10 Wisconsin; No. 2 Ohio State).
- ▶ Purdue's five-game home winning streak is the second-longest streak in the Big Ten (Indiana - 16). Purdue has won 21 of its last 22 home games (loss to Iowa on Jan. 2).
- ▶ Purdue's bench has outscored the opposing bench in 26-of-28 games this year (Ohio State, Michigan State) and by a total margin of 887 to 417 (31.7 to 14.9 per game). Purdue's bench has accounted for 41.0 percent of Purdue's scoring.
- ▶ Purdue's senior class scoring over the last four games have been 49 points, 14, 35 and 15 points. Purdue is 17-1 this year when the senior class scores at least 21 points.
- ▶ Despite all the turnover woes, Purdue is on pace to average the sixth-fewest turnovers per game in school history (12.3 per game).
- ▶ In Purdue's seven losses, it has been outscored in "points off turnovers" by a combined 70 points. Purdue has lost the seven games by a combined 59 points.
- ▶ Purdue saw a 35-game winning streak when it attempted more free throws than its opponent end against Indiana last Saturday.
- ▶ **A.J. Hammons** has scored in double-figures in nine straight games. The last player to score in double-figures in 10 straight games was **Ronnie Johnson** from March 9 to Dec. 4, 2013.

• Maryland enters the contest with a 23-5 record and in second place in the Big Ten standings with an 11-4 mark.
• The Terrapins have lost two of their last three games (Wisconsin, Minnesota), but remain in the hunt for their first Big Ten title.

■ SERIES HISTORY

• Maryland leads the series with Purdue by a 2-0 margin, having won the only meeting last year and the first meeting this year three weeks ago in College Park.
• Maryland is one of six Power-Five schools that Purdue has never beaten (Maryland, Syracuse, Florida State, Oklahoma State, Oregon State and Stanford).
• Purdue is averaging just 60.5 PPG in its two meetings vs. Maryland.

■ THE LAST TIME OUT

• Purdue's miraculous rally fell just short and Indiana defeated Purdue for the first time in almost 1,100 days with a 77-73 win last Saturday night.
• Purdue had five players in double-figures, led by **Caleb Swanigan's** 14 points and eight rebounds. Purdue lost for the first time this year when having five or more players in double-figures (last loss: Gardner-Webb on Dec. 22, 2014).
• Purdue's front line of **A.J. Hammons**, **Isaac Haas**, **Caleb Swanigan** and **Vince Edwards** combined to go 19-of-26 from the field (.731). The rest of the Boilermakers went 8-of-20 (.400).
• Purdue forced just four turnovers in the contest. Indiana entered the game averaging 14.1 turnovers per game.
• Purdue lost for the first time this year when shooting 48.0 percent or better from the field. The Boilermakers shot 58.7 percent against the Hoosiers. It was its highest percentage in a loss since shooting 63.3 percent in a loss to Indiana on Jan. 30, 1988.
• It was Purdue's best field goal percentage against Indiana since Feb. 19, 1990.

■ PURDUE BASKETBALL HISTORY

• Purdue is in its 118th season of basketball, owning a 1,733-993 (.636) all-time record. The Boilermakers rank 19th all-time in victories (1,733) and their 63.6 winning percentage is 20th all-time.
• Purdue has had just two head coaches, **Gene Keady** and **Matt Painter**, since the start of the 1980-81 season, a span of 35 years.
• Since the **Ray Eddy** era began in 1950, Purdue has had just six head coaches in 66 years and just eight head coaches in the last 99 years.
• Purdue owns a 588-136 (.812) record at Mackey Arena, now in its 48th year as the home of Purdue basketball.

■ INDIVIDUAL QUICK HITS

• **Matt Painter** will coach in his 496th career game on Saturday against Maryland. He will coach his 500th career game either during the Big Ten Tournament or NCAA Tournament.
• In his 11th year at Purdue, Painter is the third-longest active tenured coach in the Big Ten (**Tom Izzo** -- 21st year; **Thad Matta** -- 12th year).
• In league games only, **A.J. Hammons** is the only player in the league to rank in the top 10 in scoring (10th), rebounding (4th) and field goal percentage (4th). He also ranks second in the league in blocked shots.
• Hammons needs 22 points and 34 rebounds to become the third player in Purdue history with 1,500 points and 900 rebounds (**Joe Barry Carroll** and **Terry Dischinger**; first to do so in 36 years).
• **Vince Edwards** is the second player in school history to have 500 points, 300 rebounds and 150 assists by the end of his sophomore season (**E'Twaun Moore**). Edwards has 575 points, 310 rebounds and 174 assists.
• Edwards is 1-of-4 freshman or sophomores nationally this year with 275 points, 150 rebounds, 80 assists and 30 or more 3-pointers (Oregon's sophomore **Dillon Brooks**, UConn sophomore **Daniel Hamilton**, Washington's **Dejounte Murray**).
• **Ryan Cline's** 37 3-pointers are the fourth most in the Big Ten by a freshman (Illinois' **Jalen Coleman-Lands** -- 65; Northwestern's **Aaron Falzon** -- 56; Rutgers' **Corey Sanders** -- 38). His 19 in Big Ten play only are the third most.
• **Rapheal Davis** needs 37 points and eight rebounds to become the eighth player in Purdue history with 1,000 points, 500 rebounds and 200 assists (**E'Twaun Moore**, **Walter Jordan**, **Robbie Hummel**, **Todd Mitchell**, **Brian Cardinal**, **Brad Miller**, **Mike Robinson**).
• **Isaac Haas** is averaging a free throw attempt every 3.62 minutes played for his career. He is the only player in America to shoot at least 100 free throws in under 15.0 minutes per game this year. He also accomplished the feat last year.
• **Johnny Hill** needs one assist for 250 in his career.
• **Dakota Mathias** owns a 2.50 (105:42) assist-to-turnover ratio for his career. He has just 16 turnovers in 498 minutes this year (31.1 minutes / TO).
• **Caleb Swanigan** needs 20 rebounds to move into the single-season top-20 rebounds list at Purdue. With 34 more points and 21 more rebounds, Swanigan will be the first Purdue freshman in school history with 300 points and 250 rebounds.
• **P.J. Thompson** owns the Purdue single-season assist-to-turnover ratio record at 5.50 (77:14). The previous school record was 3.12 set by **Mack Gadis** in 1986. For the season, Thompson is averaging a turnover every 45.1 minutes played (31.5 for his career).

■ TEAM QUICK HITS

• Purdue has scored 70 or more points in 10 of its last 13 games and in 20-of-28 games this year (17-3 record).
• After starting last year with an 11-8 record, Purdue is 31-12 (.721) over its last 43 games, dating to Jan. 24, 2015, a 67-63 win over Iowa.
• Over the last six games, Purdue is shooting 37-of-97 (.381) from 3-point range. If you throw out an icy 3-of-25 against Maryland in the first meeting, Purdue is 34-of-72 (.473) during the other five games.
• Purdue is just 63-of-93 (.677) from the free throw line in the last five games.
• Purdue hasn't forced double-digit turnovers since Minnesota had 10 on Jan. 24, a span of six games. Over the last six games, foes are averaging just 7.0 turnovers game. During the same span, Purdue is averaging 11.8 turnovers per game (-4.83 turnover margin).
• Purdue has lost the turnover battle in eight straight games. The last time Purdue had fewer turnovers was against Ohio State on Jan. 21.
• Over the last three games, Purdue has had just six blocked shots. It has had three or fewer blocked shots in 8-of-15 Big Ten games.
• Purdue has shot at least 55.0 percent from the field in three Big Ten games (Michigan, Nebraska, Indiana) for the first time since the 1994-95 season (3 times).
• Purdue has reached the century mark twice this year against Vermont and Rutgers. It marked the first time since the 1997-98 season that Purdue had multiple 100-point games.
• Purdue has now won at least 20 games in 23 of the last 37 seasons, including in eight of **Matt Painter's** 11 seasons at Purdue.
• Purdue has made at least two 3-pointers in 94 straight games, dating to a March 25, 2013, loss to Santa Clara.

LINEUP NOTES

- Purdue has used six different starting lineups this year and no group has started more than six games together.
- The projected starting lineup against Maryland has 395 combined games of experience and 280 previous starts.
- Vince Edwards** has started 57-of-61 career games at Purdue, owning a 40-17 career record in games that he starts. Edwards has Purdue's longest active current streak of starts at 32 games.
- Caleb Swanigan** has started all 27 games that he has played in. The school record for starts by a freshman is **Russell Cross** with 32 in 1981.
- A.J. Hammons** needs to appear in five games and **Rapheal Davis** needs six more appearances to become the 12th and 13th players in Purdue history to appear in 130 games.

THE KEYS TO VICTORY

- Since the start of last year, Purdue is 35-1 when attempting more free throws than its opponent (17-1 this year). The lone loss came last Saturday night against Indiana (loss, 77-73). Purdue had 16 attempts to Indiana's 13.
- Purdue is 9-1 this year when shooting 48 percent or better from the field (loss to Indiana). Purdue is 92-12 under Painter when that happens.
- Purdue is 17-3 this year when outshooting its opponent from the field and 192-32 under Painter when outshooting its foes.
- When Purdue makes 10 or more 3-pointers this year, Purdue is 7-0. Under Painter, the Boilermakers are 35-8 when having 10 or more 3-pointers.
- Purdue is 5-2 this year when being outscored in the paint. Last year's team went 0-4.
- In games played on weekends, Purdue is just 7-7. In games played on weekdays, the Boilermakers are 14-0.
- Three of Purdue's five Big Ten losses have come to teams with a combined 43-2 home record (Iowa, Indiana, Maryland).
- Purdue is 13-0 when winning or tied in the "points off turnovers" battle; the Boilermakers are 8-7 when losing the "points off turnovers" battle.
- Purdue is 13-2 when having a run of 10 points or longer (losses to Iowa, Maryland); Purdue is 8-5 when not having a 10-point run.
- Purdue is 7-1 when the sophomore class combines for at least 40 points (loss to Indiana), 14-6 when it does not.
- Purdue is 17-1 when the senior class combines for at least 21 points; 4-6 when it scores 20 or fewer points.
- Purdue is 6-0 when attempting 26 or more 3-pointers this year (North Carolina A&T, Vermont, Florida, Pittsburgh, Howard, Rutgers).
- Purdue is 13-3 when shooting 35.0 percent or better from 3-point range; just 8-4 when under 34.9 percent.
- Purdue is 14-1 when committing 17 or fewer fouls (loss to Indiana); but is 7-6 when committing 18 or more personal fouls.
- Purdue is 10-1 when dishing out 18 or more assists (loss to Indiana); 11-6 when dishing out 17 or fewer assists.
- Purdue is 17-4 when it has 15 or fewer turnovers (losses to Iowa, Maryland, Michigan, Indiana); when it has 16 or more turnovers, Purdue is 4-3.
- Purdue is 16-1 when holding foes to 69 or fewer points (Michigan); when it allows 70 or more points, Purdue is 5-6.
- Purdue is 10-1 when four or more players score in double-figures (loss to Indiana); just 11-6 when having three or fewer players in double figures.
- Purdue is 12-0 this year when **Rapheal Davis** scores 10 or more points; the Boilermakers are 9-7 when Davis scores nine or fewer points.
- Purdue is 12-3 this year when **Isaac Haas** scores in double-digits; just 9-4 when he doesn't.
- Purdue is 10-1 when **A.J. Hammons** leads the team in scoring (loss to Maryland); but it is 11-6 when he doesn't.
- Purdue is 89-8 under Painter when winning both the rebound and turnover battles.
- Purdue is 135-31 under Painter when scoring at least 70 points; Purdue is 33-85 under Painter when allowing 70 or more points.
- Purdue is 4-34 under Painter when allowing 80-plus points (win vs. Michigan State this year).
- Purdue is 114-4 under Painter when holding foes to 59 points or less (losses to Michigan State [2010], Eastern Michigan, Iowa, Nebraska [2013]).

LARGE MARGINS

- Eighteen of Purdue's 21 wins this year have been decided by at least 10 points (61-55 win over Wisconsin on Dec. 29; 68-64 win over Minnesota on Jan. 27; 82-81 win over Michigan State on Feb. 9).
- Twenty-one of Purdue's 28 games this year have been decided by at least 10 points (Iowa, Butler, Wisconsin, Minnesota, Michigan St., Michigan).
- Purdue has had just one game this year decided by a single possession (82-81 vs. Michigan State on Feb. 9).

HOME-COURT ADVANTAGE

- Purdue's 15 homecourt wins are tied for the ninth most for any program in America. The school record for most wins in Mackey Arena are 16 (2010-11, 2007-08, 2006-07). Purdue has home games remaining against Maryland and Wisconsin.
- Purdue has won five straight home games, which is the second-longest home win streak in the Big Ten (Indiana - 16).
- Purdue is averaging 13,514 fans per game this year and with sellouts looming against Maryland and Wisconsin, the Boilermakers should finish with 245,916 fans through its turnstiles, an average of 13,662 fans per game. The 245,916 fans would be the second most in facility history, just 828 fans behind the record of 246,744 fans during the 2008-09 season.
- The current total of 216,224 fans ranks 16th in the country, while the average of 13,514 fans per game ranks 20th. Purdue hasn't finished in the top 20 in attendance since the 2010-11 season (17th).
- Mackey Arena is widely considered one of the loudest arenas in America and when **Rapheal Davis** hit his fifth 3-pointer of the first half to give Purdue a 30-14 lead on the Spartans, the decibel level in Mackey Arena hit 118 dB, about the same as a turbo-fan aircraft at takeoff from 200 feet.
- It's the second-loudest recorded level in Mackey Arena history. Bear in mind, we have only been doing this the last six years.

BOILERMAKERS HOT AT HOME

- Purdue saw its 15-game home winning streak come to an end on Jan. 2, 2016, against Iowa. It marked Purdue's first loss since a 69-60 setback to Maryland on Jan. 10, 2015. The 15-game homecourt winning streak was tied for the sixth-longest streak in Mackey Arena.
- However, Purdue has won 21 of its last 22 games at home, the lone loss being to Iowa (Jan. 2, 2016). Since the start of last year, Purdue is 29-4 at Mackey Arena.
- Purdue has now won at least 12 home games for 10 straight years and **Matt Painter** owns a 152-32 (.826) record at Mackey Arena.

SENIOR LEADERS

- Purdue's four seniors of **A.J. Hammons**, **Rapheal Davis**, **Johnny Hill** and **Stephen Toyra** know they are entering the stretch run of their careers and if Purdue is going to do anything in the tournament, this quartet needs to elevate its game.
- When the group scores at least 21 points in a game, the Boilermakers are 17-1. When it scores 20 or fewer points, the Boilermakers are 4-6.
- Purdue's best offensive performances of the season have come when the senior class plays well. It scored 51 points against Nebraska, 49 points against Michigan State and 43 points against Michigan. Those three games are considered the three-best offensive games of the year.

LOSING HALFTIME LEADS

- Purdue is 18-4 this year when leading at halftime, but is just 7-4 in Big Ten play when leading after 20 minutes, losing leads to Iowa (+17), Iowa (+2), Maryland (+3) and Michigan (+4).
- Since the start of last year, Purdue is 34-10 when leading at halftime, including just 13-8 against Big Ten opposition when leading at the break.

OVERCOMING HALFTIME DEFICITS

- However, since the start of last year, Purdue is 9-7 when trailing at halftime, having rallied for wins over Vanderbilt and Ohio State this year when trailing at the break. The Boilermakers also own a win over Wisconsin on the road this year when tied at the break.
- Purdue trailed to Indiana by seven at halftime and nearly came back for the win, falling by four on the Hoosiers' home court on Saturday (77-73).

SECOND-HALF WOES

- Over the last five games, Purdue has been outscored in the second half by a 197-163 margin, going 2-3 during those games.
- The Boilermakers are shooting just 38.8 percent from the field, 33.3 percent from 3-point range and 68.1 percent from the free throw line during that span.
- The Boilermakers also have just 33 assists against 28 turnovers.
- Opponents are shooting 44.8 percent from the field and 81.4 percent from the free throw line, while committing just 13 turnovers in 100 minutes of action.
- During Big Ten play, Purdue has been outscored by 32 points in the second half and opponents are shooting 47.4 percent in the second half of Big Ten play. Purdue has 90 turnovers in the second halves of Big Ten play; opponents have 53.

SUPER SOPHOMORES

- Purdue's sophomore class has accounted for 39.8 percent of the team's scoring this year (859-of-2,161 points).
- The four-member group owns a 2.24 assist-to-turnover ratio (233:104).
- In games that at least two of the four sophomores score in double-digits, the Boilermakers are 8-2 (loss to Iowa, Indiana). When zero sophomores score in double-digits, Purdue is 5-3.

CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD

- Purdue ranks fourth nationally in rebound margin at 10.9 rebounds per game and has outrebounded three of the top 25 teams nationally in rebound margin this year (No. 2 Michigan State +3; No. 11 Pittsburgh +5; No. 25 Indiana +2).
- Purdue was the nation's last team to be outrebounded this year, happening on Feb. 13 against Michigan (-4).
- Purdue has outrebounded four teams by at least 20 rebounds this year (Incarnate Word, New Mexico, Rutgers, Northwestern).
- The Boilermakers have held 10 of their 15 Big Ten opponents to single-digit offensive rebounds (Iowa 11, Ohio State 10, Michigan State 16, Michigan 11). Six of the last 12 opponents had five or fewer offensive rebounds (Illinois, Penn State, Rutgers, Iowa, Minnesota, Maryland).
- Purdue's +10.9 rebound margin is 3.3 rebounds per game more than the current school record (+7.6 in 1969-70).

SEEING DOUBLE

- Purdue has already recorded 18 double-doubles through 28 games, the most during the **Matt Painter** era. The 18 double-doubles are the most for the Boilermakers' program since the 1996-97 season (19).
- Four different players have recorded double-doubles this year.
- **A.J. Hammons** shares the Big Ten lead in double-doubles (8), while **Caleb Swanigan** is fourth (7).
- The school record for most double-doubles in a season is 32 (1973-74).

BALANCED ATTACK

- Purdue has four players averaging between 9.9 and 14.6 points, led by **A.J. Hammons** at 14.6 points per game.
- Purdue has five players averaging at least 3.9 rebounds per game.
- Purdue has six players averaging between 1.9 and 3.0 assists per game and three more players averaging at least 1.0 assists per game.
- Purdue has six players with at least 25 3-point field goals for the first time in school history.
- Purdue has six players with at least 45 assists for the first time since the 2010-11 campaign.

DEFENSE LIVES HERE

- The Boilermakers have held 23 of a possible 27 opponents under their pregame scoring average.
- The Boilermakers are 19th in the country in scoring defense (64.0) and 11th in field goal percentage defense (.387).
- Purdue is 10th in Ken Pomeroy's adjusted defensive efficiency, fifth in effective field goal percentage defense and 16th in 2-point pct. defense (.423).
- Purdue has held 17-of-28 opponents to 69 or fewer points, posting a 16-1 record when doing so (loss to Michigan on Feb. 13).
- Purdue has forced 12 shot clock violations already this year, one year after forcing 19 in 34 games.
- The Boilermakers are, however, one of the worst teams in America at causing turnovers, ranking 344th (out of 351) in defensive turnover rate.

ON FIRE FROM THE LINE

- Purdue ranks 36th nationally in free throw percentage, a significant improvement over the last four years where the Boilermakers ranked 275th (2012), 291st (2013), 261st (2014) and 213th (2015).
- Four of Purdue's 10 rotation players are shooting above 80.0 percent from the free throw line.
- Purdue has had eight games this year where it has made 80.0 percent or better from the free throw line. Last year's team had just four games all season of 80 percent or better.
- The school record for free throw percentage in a season is 78.2 percent during the 1968-69 season. This year's percentage (.740) ranks seventh.
- However, over the last three games, Purdue is just 39-of-58 (.672) from the free throw line.
- Purdue has outscored all opponents from the free throw line by 95 combined points (3.4 points per game).

■ MAY I ASSIST YOU WITH THAT?

- Purdue ranks 11th nationally in assists per game (17.3) despite not having a player in the Big Ten's top 15 in assists per game. **Vince Edwards** leads the team in assists (3.0).
- The Boilermakers rank in the top 10 nationally thanks to six players averaging between 1.9 and 3.0 assists per game and three more averaging 1.0 assists per game.
- The Boilermakers' assist average of 17.3 per game would rank as the seventh-best average in school history and the best since the 1997-98 team averaged 18.9 assists per game.
- Purdue's current assist-to-turnover ratio of 1.40 (484:345) ranks as the fifth-best ratio in school history (1.58; 1985) and is 33rd nationally.
- In addition, Purdue ranks 10th nationally in assist rate (A / FGM) at 63.7 percent.
- The Boilermakers have dished out 20 or more assists eight different times this year, including twice in Big Ten play (Michigan, Nebraska).

■ DIALING LONG DISTANCE

- Purdue's 58.3 percent shooting from long distance against Nebraska was its best percentage since March 20, 2013, vs. Western Illinois (.636; 7-of-11 3Ps).
- In Purdue's wins, the Boilermakers have shot 36.9 percent from 3-point range. In the six losses, Purdue has shot just 33.1 percent.
- Over the last six games, Purdue is 37-of-97 (.381) from long distance. However, that includes a 3-of-25 (.120) performance against Maryland.
- If you throw that game out, Purdue is 34-of-72 (.472) from long distance in games against Nebraska, Michigan State, Michigan, Northwestern and Indiana.
- Purdue has averaged just 16.2 3-point attempts per game over the last six outings.

■ TURNING IT OVER

- Purdue has had an issue with turnovers in its losses coming to Butler, Iowa (twice) and Illinois. If the Boilermakers can solve those issues, a special season could be on the horizon.
- In Purdue's seven losses, the Boilermakers have had 96 turnovers, resulting in 131 points. The losses have come by a combined 59 points.
- Purdue had 18 (Butler), 14 (Iowa), 16 (Illinois), 17 (Iowa), nine (Maryland, Michigan) and 13 (Indiana) turnovers during its seven losses.
- Purdue has been outscored by 70 points in the "points off turnovers" category in those seven games, clearly making a huge difference.
- Purdue has won the turnover battle just five times this year (Vermont, IUPUI, Howard, Rutgers, Ohio State).
- When Purdue has 15 or fewer turnovers, the Boilermakers are 17-4 with the losses coming to Iowa in the first meeting (14), Maryland (9), Michigan (9) and Indiana (13). When 16 or more turnovers, Purdue is 4-3 (wins over Incarnate Word, New Mexico, Wisconsin and Michigan State).

■ ASSISTING WITH THE BEST

- Purdue has several players boasting impressive assist-to-turnover ratio this year.
- **P.J. Thompson** leads the way with a 77:14 (5.50) assist-to-turnover ratio, a ratio that would smash the school record of 3.12, set by **Mack Gadis** in 1986.
- Thompson's ratio is the second best in the country for a player averaging at least 20.0 minutes (Eastern Kentucky's **Isaac McGlone**; 53:9 -- 5.89).
- **Dakota Mathias** owns a 3.63 ratio (58:16), a number that would rank second in the single-season assist-to-turnover ratio chart.
- **Ryan Cline** owns a 3.90 (39:10) ratio, a number that would rank first on the Purdue freshman list. Cline likely won't have enough assists (min. 75) to qualify for the single-season chart.

■ SHOW A LITTLE CLASS

- In the classroom, the Boilermakers had an outstanding fall semester, registering a cumulative 3.04 GPA as a team. Twelve players boasted semester GPAs of 3.00 or better during the fall.

■ LET'S GO FOR A RUN

- Purdue has had 80 runs this year of 7-0 or longer, compared to just 33 for its opponents.
- Purdue has had 23 runs of 10-0 or longer, compared to just six for its opponents.
- In games that Purdue has had a run of 10 points or longer, the Boilermakers are 13-2. In games that opponents have had a run of 10 points or more, the Boilermakers are 1-5 (win over Michigan State).

- ▶ Averaging 18.3 PPG, 8.5 RPG, 3.0 BPG and 1.8 APG over the last six games; 4 double-doubles.
- ▶ 1-of-9 players since 1993-94 season nationally with 1,450 points, 850 rebounds and 325 blocked shots.
- ▶ Purdue is 10-1 this year when he leads the team in scoring.
- ▶ Has scored in double-figures in 20 of last 22 games (Howard, Rutgers).
- ▶ Became first player nationally since 2002 to have at least 32 points, 11 rebounds, 5 assists, 4 blocks in a game, when he reached those marks against Nebraska (14-of-17 FGs, 7 dunks).
- ▶ Has 23 career double-doubles, the most among Big Ten players; 21-of-23 vs. high-major opposition.
- ▶ Ranks 21st in career points (1,478), 4th in career rebounds (866) and 2nd in blocked shots (326).

#21 - Kendall Stephens

- ▶ Missed three games due to personal reasons following death of a close friend and HS teammate.

• With a pair of Sweet 16 appearances, six NCAA Tournament berths, Big Ten regular-season and tournament titles and an international gold medal on his résumé, 11th-year head coach Matt Painter is widely regarded as one of the brightest minds in all of college basketball.

• Painter affirmed his long-term commitment to Purdue in March of 2011, agreeing to a new eight-year contract that will keep him in West Lafayette through at least the 2018-19 season.

• Painter has averaged over 21 wins per season during his tenure at the helm of the Purdue program, including at least 20 victories in six of those seasons.

• Painter's tenure has seen Purdue basketball restore its status among the upper echelon of college basketball programs. The last eight years have seen six 20-win seasons and NCAA Tournament berths, two Sweet 16 appearances, a regular-season Big Ten title and a Big Ten Tournament crown.

• The three winningest classes in program history are the classes of 2011, 2012 and 2010, respectively, and five of the 10 winningest individual players Purdue has ever seen have come from the Painter ranks. Success, however, didn't happen overnight.

• Painter officially became the 18th head men's basketball coach in Purdue history on April 1, 2005, and immediately set about laying the groundwork for a dramatic reversal in the program's fortunes.

• The Boilermakers were at their best during the 2009 postseason run, rattling off double-digit victories over Penn State and Illinois to reach the Big Ten Tournament final, where they dispatched Ohio State, 65-61, to earn the first conference tournament crown in program history.

• Painter has also resurrected Mackey Arena as one of the country's best home-court advantages, piling up a 152-32 (.826) record at home over the last 11 seasons, including a remarkable 82-7 (.921) record against non-conference opponents.

• Painter has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year three times in the last six seasons, earning the consensus award in 2008 and 2011, and winning the coaches' vote in 2010. He is one of only six men to win the award more at least three times since its inception in 1974.

• Painter has seen a total of 21 players earn a combined 40 Academic All-Big Ten honors during his tenure as head coach. Painter has also mentored an Academic All-American, as Moore earned second-team honors during the 2009-10 season.
