THE NOTES TO KNOW

- Riding a six-game winning streak, the No. 17-ranked Purdue basketball team wraps up its Pacific Northwest road swing with a Saturday afternoon tilt against No. 13-ranked Oregon in Eugene. It will be Purdue's final road game until Feb. 4, as the Boilermakers will return home to host Ohio State, Michigan and Indiana during the next two weeks.
- Despite serving as head coaches for a combined 57 years, head coaches **Matt Painter** and **Dana Altman** have never faced each other or the schools they are facing. This will mark Painter's first game against Oregon, and Altman's first game against Purdue. The duo has combined for 1,256 wins (22.0 wins per game) during their 57 combined seasons.
- Following the win over Washington, Purdue is now 3-1 on the road in the Big Ten Conference, having won three straight games after a league-opening loss at Penn State. Purdue has won all three games by at least 11 points, the first time it has won three straight league games by double-digits since Feb. 2011. During the **Matt Painter** era, Purdue has never won four straight league road games by double-digits.
- Over the last five games, opponent's starting lineup is averaging just 37.2 points per game after the Huskies' starting five scored just 43 points. The opponent starting five is shooting 66-of-164 (.402) from the field and 19-of-66 (.288) from 3-point range.
- Since the start of the 2022-23 season, Purdue owns a 21-2 record in the month of January, having won 11 straight games. The 11-game winning streak in the month is the third longest nationally (Saint Mary's - 25; McNeese State - 12).
- Purdue has just 51 turnovers over the last six games. Purdue averaged 12.3 turnovers per game in the first 12 games of the season. In the last six games, Purdue has 116 assists against 51 turnovers (2.27). It has forced 85 turnovers in that span, a margin of plus-5.67 per game.
- In the last four years, Purdue has defeated teams ranked No. 1 (Arizona), No. 2 (Alabama), No. 4 (Marquette), No. 5 (Villanova), No. 6 (Wisconsin), No. 7 (Tennessee), No. 8 (Duke), No. 9 (Illinois), No. 12 (Illinois), No. 13 (Illinois), No. 16 (Ohio State), No. 17 (Illinois), No. 18 (North Carolina, Gonzaga) and No. 20 (Utah State). Only three of the 17 wins listed above have come in Mackey Arena.
- Since the calendar flipped to January, Purdue ranks fourth nationally in efficiency via BartTorvik.com, behind Houston, Duke and Iowa State.
- Purdue is playing its best basketball of the season, winning the last six games by an average of 20.4 points per game. Purdue is shooting 55-of-143 (.385) from 3-point range, and 127-of-204 (.623) from inside the arc in that span.
- Purdue is now 106-23 since the start of the 2021-22 season, recording the second-most wins in the country (Houston - 110; Connecticut - 104) during that span. The senior class of **Caleb Furst** (only senior) needs four victories to tie the school record for most wins in a four-year career.
- The starting backcourt of **Braden Smith** and **Fletcher Loyer** are 77-15 since their arrival at Purdue, starting every game of their tenure. The 77 wins since their arrival are the third most nationally (Connecticut - 81; Houston - 78).
- Braden Smith** is the only player in America with 250 points, 125 assists and 75 rebounds. Smith is on pace to become the first player since Loyola Marymount's **Terrell Lowery** (1990-91) to average 15.0 points, 9.0 assists, 4.0 rebounds and shoot over 40.0 percent from 3-point range.
- There have been two Purdue games in the last 20 years where a player had at least 15 pts, 5 rebs, 5 asts, 5 stls - **Braden Smith** twice this year.
- Braden Smith** and **Fletcher Loyer** both surpassed 1,000 career points in the last week, becoming the first junior teammates nationally to play at one school and reach the 1,000-point club. **Trey Kaufman-Renn** needs 275 points to join them.
- Trey Kaufman-Renn** is one of two players nationally (South Dakota State's **Oscar Cluff**) to average 17.0 points, 6.0 rebounds, 2.5 assists and shoot at least 60 percent from the field. In Big Ten history, only **Chris Webber**, **Evan Eschmeyer** and **Brad Miller** have done that.

►►► BOILERS FINDING THEIR GROOVE

- With the 69-58 win over Washington on Wednesday, Purdue has now won five straight Big Ten games by double-figures for the first time since Feb to March 1988, with three of the victories coming on the road. Overall, Purdue has won six straight games by 11-plus.
- Since the calendar flipped to the New Year, Purdue ranks fourth nationally behind Houston, Duke and Iowa State in efficiency.

- Over the last six games, opponents are shooting just 27.3 percent (35-of-128) from 3-point range and Purdue is plus-34 in turnover margin (51 to 85 turnovers), forcing 14.2 turnovers per game.
- In the win over Nebraska, Purdue held the league's third-leading scorer, **Brice Williams**, to just nine points and four turnovers on just 2-of-8 shooting.
- In the win over Rutgers, Purdue held two of the league's four leading scorers and likely NBA Lottery picks, **Dylan Harper** and **Ace Bailey**, to 23 combined points on 7-of-24 shooting with five turnovers.
- Purdue held Northwestern to 38.3 percent shooting and its two leading scorers, **Brooks Barnhizer** and **Nick Martinelli**, who entered the game averaging 40.2 points per game between them, to 21 points on 6-of-23 shooting with 10 combined turnovers.

►►► TAKING CARE OF IT

- The Boilermakers have won 22 straight games when having fewer turnovers than their opponent, and is 19-1 since the start of last season when having single-digit turnovers (one loss: UConn in the National Championship game).
- Since 2021-22, when Purdue has five or more turnovers than its opponent, Purdue is 20-15 (.571). In all other games, Purdue is 86-8 (.915).
- In Purdue's four losses, Purdue has recorded 67 turnovers (16.8 / game), resulting in 95 points off turnovers (23.8 / game).
- In Purdue's 15 losses since the start of the 2022-23 season, Purdue is plus-83 in turnover margin (+5.5 / game).
- Since the 2021-22 season, Purdue is 54-5 when forcing 10 or more turnovers in a game. When Purdue has single-digit turnovers, Purdue owns a 38-2 record in that span. Purdue has won 40 straight games when forcing between 10 and 15 turnovers in a game.

- Purdue is 8-6 all-time in games played on January 18, including 3-2 under head coach Matt Painter.
- Purdue's 107-57 win over Rutgers in 2016 was the largest road victory in Big Ten Conference history. Purdue set a school record with 1.58 points / possession, and held a 63-23 rebound advantage.

►►► STARTING BIG TEN PLAY ON THE RIGHT FOOT

- With six straight Big Ten victories, Purdue is off to a 6-1 start for just the fifth time (2025, 2023, 2018, 2011, 2008) in the **Matt Painter** era, and just the third time in the last 14 years.
- Purdue's Big Ten titles under Painter have come in 2024 (3-2), 2023 (4-1), 2019 (3-2), 2017 (3-2) and 2010 (2-3). Only once in the five title years did Purdue start 5-1 in its first six Big Ten games.
- A win over Oregon would give Purdue a 7-1 Big Ten start for the (2023, 2018, 2008) for the fourth time under Painter.
- A win over Oregon would also give Purdue a seven-game Big Ten winning streak for the third straight season and for the eighth time under **Matt Painter**.

►►► REACHING THESE LEVELS IS AUTOMATIC

- With the wins over both Minnesota and Northwestern, Purdue has won 64 straight games when shooting at least 50.0 percent from the field, 40.0 percent from 3-point range and 70.0 percent from the free throw line, last losing to on March 3, 2004.

►►► MORE STREAKS OF NOTE / STREAKS OF 10 OR MORE

- Won 10 straight games when opponents make 4 or fewer 3-pointers.
- Won 12 straight games when outrebounding its opponent.
- Won 13 straight games when making 10 or more 3-pointers.
- Won 14 straight home games vs. Big Ten opponents.
- Won 14 straight games on Wednesday.
- Won 22 straight games when having fewer turnovers than opponent.
- Won 22 straight games in games decided by 20 or more points.
- Won 26 straight games when winning rebound & turnover margins.
- Won 26 straight games when scoring 80 or more points.
- Won 30 straight games when holding foes to 59 or fewer points.
- Won 36 straight games when leading at halftime.
- Won 40 straight games when opponent has 10 to 15 turnovers.
- Won 124 straight games when scoring 90 or more points.

►►► INSIDE MORE NUMBERS

- Purdue is 187-13 under Painter when scoring at least 80 points, including 101-3 since the start of the 2017-18 season.

▶▶▶ HEAD COACH MATT PAINTER

▶ **Record at Purdue:** 461-207 (.690) / 20th year | **Career Record:** 486-212 (.696) / 21st year

• With 16 NCAA Tournament berths, seven Sweet 16 appearances, five Big Ten regular-season championships, two Big Ten Tournament titles, two Elite Eight appearances, a trip to the Final Four, an appearance in a National Championship game and an international gold medal on his résumé, 20th-year head coach Matt Painter is widely regarded as one of the brightest young minds in all of college basketball.

• Painter was named the 2019 and 2024 Big Ten Coach of the Year and has led Purdue to nine straight NCAA Tournaments – the fourth-longest active streak in America. Included in that stretch are Sweet 16 appearances (and beyond) in five of the last seven tournaments.

• Painter affirmed his long-term commitment to Purdue in October of 2018, agreeing to a two-year extension that will keep him in West Lafayette through at least the 2023-24 season. The deal features five, one-year extensions that go into effect through the 2028-29 season. Following the 2029 season, Painter will still only be 58 years old.

• Painter will enter the 2024-25 season second on the school's all-time wins list (447) behind legendary mentor **Gene Keady** and ahead of **Ward "Piggy" Lambert**, both of whom have been inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

• Has averaged over 23 wins a season in his 19 years at Purdue. If you don't include the first transitional year (9-19 record), the average balloons to 24.3 wins per year over the last 18 seasons.

• Has won at least 25 games in 12 of his 20 seasons as a collegiate head coach.

• Painter has averaged 11.9 wins per year in conference play, the third-best average in Big Ten Conference history.

• He was voted by his peers as the NABC National Coach of the Year after leading a team that started with a 6-5 record to the 2019 Elite Eight.

• Coach Painter's 16 NCAA Tournaments are the most for a coach nationally under the age of 55 (as of April 1, 2024 – Painter is 53 years old).

• Purdue has finished first, second or third in Big Ten play in 11 of the last 17 years, including in eight of the last 10 years.
