THE SCENE SETTER

▶ The No. 18-ranked Purdue Boilermakers face their stiffest challenge to date when it travels to No. 4-ranked Maryland for the first time in school history on Saturday. The contest will tip off at 4 p.m. ET with **Bob Wischusen** and **Dan Dakich** providing expert commentary on ESPN. On the radio dial, veteran broadcasters **Larry Clisby** and **Rob Blackman** will do the same on the Purdue Radio Network. Live stats will be available on StatBroadcast.com and as always, in-game updates will be provided on the official Purdue Basketball Twitter account (@BoilerBall).

THE BOILERMAKER NOTEBOOK

▶ Purdue is looking for its 20th win of the season. The Boilermakers' basketball program has won at least 20 games in 23 of the last 37 seasons, including in seven of **Matt Painter's** previous 10 seasons.

▶ Purdue hasn't won five "true" road games since the 2011-12 team went 5-5 in road games.

▶ Purdue hasn't beaten a top-5 opponent on the road since March 6, 1994, at No. 3 Michigan.

▶ Purdue's bench has outscored every opponent but one this year (Ohio State). The group is averaging 33.6 points per game, accounting for 42.5 percent of Purdue's scoring.

▶ The Boilermakers have outscored all but two opponents (Florida, Butler) in second-chance points, outscoring opponents 290-150 (12.6 to 6.5) in the category.

▶ Purdue is shooting better from 3-point range away from Mackey Arena (.362) than at Mackey Arena (.360).

▶ Purdue has forced just 9.0 turnovers per game in games away from Mackey Arena.

▶ Purdue has faced just three double-digit deficits this season (Butler, Illinois, Iowa).

▶ Purdue's current scoring margin of +16.4 would smash the current school record of 13.9 points per game set during Purdue's Final Four season of 1968-69.

▶ Purdue's current field goal percentage defense of 38.1 percent would be the lowest since the advent of the shot clock before the 1985-86 season.

▶ Purdue is on pace to force the fewest turnovers per game in school history, currently forcing just 10.6 turnovers per game. The school record is 11.3 per game (2012-13).

▶ Over the last three games, opponents have shot 81-of-168 (.482) from the field with all three teams over 45.0 percent.

▶ Purdue is 21-of-51 (.412) from 3-point range over the last three games.

▶ Over the last five games, Purdue has 88 assists against 56 turnovers (1.57 A:TO ratio).

■ ABOUT THE TERRAPINS

- Maryland enters Saturday's game as one of two teams nationally with 20 wins (through Wednesday night) with a 20-3 overall record and a 9-2 Big Ten mark.
- The Terrapins are ranked No. 3 in the USA Today Coaches Poll and No. 4 in the Associated Press Top 25 poll, released last Monday.
- Maryland has won three games in a row since a 70-67 loss at Michigan. The last three wins have come over Iowa, at Ohio State and at Nebraska.
- Preseason All-American **Melo Trimble** leads Maryland in scoring (14.3 PPG) and assists (5.3). However, all four starters average in double digits for **Mark Turgeon's** squad.

■ SERIES HISTORY

- This marks just the second meeting all-time between the two squads. The two teams have met just once, equaling the fewest meetings for the Boilermakers against a Power-5 school (Oregon State - 1).
- Purdue has made a previous trip to College Park, Maryland, falling to Temple 80-63 in the first round of the 1991 NCAA Tournament. Purdue head coach **Matt Painter** scored four points with two assists in 28 minutes in the contest at Byrd Fieldhouse.

■ PURDUE BASKETBALL HISTORY

- Purdue is in its 118th season of basketball, owning a 1,731-990 (.636) all-time record. The Boilermakers rank 19th all-time in victories (1,731) and their 63.6 winning percentage is 20th all-time.
- Purdue has had just two head coaches, **Gene Keady** and **Matt Painter**, since the start of the 1980-81 season, a span of 35 years.
- Since the **Ray Eddy** era began in 1950, Purdue has had just six head coaches in 66 years and just eight head coaches in the last 99 years.

■ PURDUE OFF TO A HOT START

- Purdue's 19-4 start is its best 23-game start since the 2009-10 team opened the season 20-3 (and eventually 24-3).
- Purdue's 7-3 Big Ten start is its best 10-game league start since the 2010-11 team also started 10-3.
- With a win on Saturday at Maryland, Purdue will improve to 8-3 in league play. The Boilermakers have started 8-3 or better three previous times during the Painter era (2010-11, 2009-10, 2007-08). Those three teams combined for a 43-11 Big Ten record.

■ NEAR THE TOPS IN THE COUNTRY

- Through Wednesday's games, Purdue's 19 wins make the Boilermakers 1-of-13 teams nationally with at least 19 victories. Saturday's foe, Maryland, and Xavier lead the country with 20 victories.
- Among top-25 teams, Purdue's four road wins are the seventh most in the country and its four "true" road wins equal the most in the Big Ten. Purdue's next road win would be its fifth of the season, which would equal the most since the 2010-11 team won seven road games (the 2011-12 team also won five road games).
- Purdue's 13 homecourt wins are tied for the fourth most for any program in America. The school record for most wins in Mackey Arena are 16 (2010-11, 2007-08, 2006-07). Purdue has four home games left to try and surpass that mark.

■ RARE TOP-5 ROAD WINS

- Purdue is looking for just its seventh top-5 win on the road in school history. The Boilermakers are 6-37 against top-5 teams on the road. Maryland enters the game ranked No. 4 in the country.
- Purdue has lost 11 straight road games to top-5 teams on the road.

■ INSIDE THE NUMBERS

- Purdue has scored 70 or more points in seven of its last eight games and in 17-of-23 games this year (15-2 record).
- Purdue is now 9-1 on the season when making nine or more 3-pointers. When making eight or fewer, Purdue is 10-3.
- Purdue is 4-1 this year when being outscored in the paint. Last year's team went 0-4.
- In games played on weekends, Purdue is just 7-4. In games played on weekdays, the Boilermakers are 12-0.
- Purdue has trailed by double-digits in just three games this year (Butler, Illinois, Iowa).
- Seventeen of Purdue's 19 wins this year have been decided by at least 11 points (61-55 win over Wisconsin on Dec. 29; 68-64 win over Minnesota on Jan. 27).
- Nineteen of Purdue's 23 games this year have been decided by at least 11 points (Iowa, Butler, Wisconsin, Minnesota).
- Purdue has had zero games decided by a single possession this year.
- Purdue's bench has outscored the opposing bench in 22-of-23 games (Ohio State). Its 12 points against Minnesota were a season low.
- Purdue's sophomore class has scored at least 32 points as a group in seven of the last eight games, accounting for 43.5 percent of the team's scoring.
- Purdue is 9-6 since the start of last year when trailing at halftime. Purdue is 2-1 this year when trailing at halftime (wins over Vanderbilt, Ohio State).
- Purdue is 15-2 this year when leading at halftime. Both losses have come to Iowa.

■ WINNING / LOSING NUMBERS

- Purdue is 13-0 when winning or tied in the "points off turnovers" battle; the Boilermakers are 6-4 when losing the "points off turnovers" battle.
- Purdue is 12-1 when having a run of 10 points or longer (loss to Iowa); the Boilermakers are 7-3 when not having a 10-point run.
- Purdue is 7-0 when the sophomore class combines for at least 40 points, 12-4 when it does not.
- Purdue is 14-0 when the senior class combines for at least 21 points; 5-4 when it scores 20 or fewer points.
- Purdue is 11-0 when it makes between 0-4 3-pointers or 10 or more trifectas.
- Purdue is 12-1 when shooting 35.0 percent or better from 3-point range; just 7-3 when under 34.9 percent.
- Purdue is 12-0 when committing 17 or fewer fouls; but is 7-4 when committing 18 or more personal fouls.
- Purdue is 10-0 when dishing out 18 or more assists; 9-4 when dishing out 17 or fewer assists.
- Purdue is 9-0 when shooting at least 48.0 percent from the field; 10-4 when it shoots under 48.0 percent.
- Purdue is 16-1 when it has 15 or fewer turnovers (loss to Iowa); when it has 16 or more turnovers, Purdue is 3-3.
- Purdue is 15-0 when holding foes to 69 or fewer points; when it allows 70 or more points, Purdue is 4-4.
- Purdue is 10-0 when four or more players score in double-figures; just 8-4 when having three or fewer players in double figures.
- Purdue is 11-0 this year when **Raphael Davis** scores 10 or more points; the Boilermakers are 8-4 when Davis scores nine or fewer points.
- Purdue is 12-0 this year when **Isaac Haas** scores in double-digits; just 7-4 when he doesn't.
- Purdue is 9-0 when **A.J. Hammons** leads the team in scoring; but it

is 9-4 when he doesn't.

■ PAINTER ERA WINNING / LOSING NUMBERS

- Purdue is 92-11 under Painter when shooting at least 48.0 percent; Purdue is 15-54 when opponents shoot at least 48.0 percent (win over Minnesota this year).
- Purdue is 191-30 under Painter when shooting a higher field goal percentage than its opponent; Purdue is 40-99 when opponents shoot better.
- Purdue is 166-32 under Painter when attempting more free throws than its opponent, including 15-0 this year.
- Purdue is 89-8 under Painter when winning both the rebound and turnover battles.
- Purdue is 133-30 under Painter when scoring at least 70 points; Purdue is 32-83 under Painter when allowing 70 or more points.
- Purdue is 114-4 under Painter when holding foes to 59 points or less (losses to Michigan State [2010], Eastern Michigan, Iowa, Nebraska [2013]).

■ HIGH PERCENTAGES IN BIG TEN PLAY

- Purdue shot a Big Ten-high 58.9 percent against Nebraska last Saturday, its highest percentage in Big Ten play since shooting 59.5 percent at Wisconsin on Jan. 27, 2009.
- Purdue also became the 13th team nationally to shoot at least 55.0 percent from the field, 55.0 percent from 3-point range and 85.0 percent from the free throw line.
- It marked just the sixth time in school history, and second time under Painter, that Purdue has shot at least 55.0 / 55.0 / 85.0 in the three metrics.

■ BOILERMAKERS PUTTING POINTS ON THE BOARD

- Purdue is averaging 79.0 points per game through 23 games and is on pace to record its highest scoring average in almost 20 years, and the fifth-highest average in the last 40 years.
- Purdue is on pace (35-game schedule) to score 2,766 points, which would rank as the fourth-highest total in school history.
- Over the last 40 years, the four seasons that have a higher scoring average than this year's current average have produced a combined 111-22 record with two No. 1 seeds, a No. 2 seed and a No. 3 seed.

■ SEEING DOUBLE

- Purdue has already recorded 15 double-doubles through 23 games,

which equals the most of the **Matt Painter** era (2009-10).

■ BOILERMAKERS KEEPING POINTS OFF THE BOARD

- Meanwhile, Purdue is holding foes to just 62.6 points per game, a number that currently ranks eighth in school history.
- Five of the top nine performances (current) have come under head coach **Matt Painter**.

■ CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD

- Purdue has dominated the glass this year, outrebounding all 23 foes this year and ranking second nationally in rebound margin (+12.3). The margin is even larger in Big Ten play (+12.5).

- In Big Ten play only, Purdue leads the league in defensive rebounding percentage (.808) and offensive rebounding percentage (.378).
- The Boilermakers have held eight of their 10 Big Ten opponents to single-digit offensive rebounds (Iowa 11, Ohio State 10). Five of the last seven opponents had five or fewer offensive rebounds (Illinois, Penn State, Rutgers, Iowa, Michigan State).
- The Boilermakers are allowing just 8.9 offensive rebounds per game in all 23 games and just 6.5 offensive rebounds in Big Ten play.
- Purdue is second in the country in total rebounds (984) and is fourth in rebounds per game (42.8). Purdue is third in defensive rebounds per game (30.3; Gonzaga - 30.7; Michigan State - 30.5).
- Purdue's +12.3 rebound margin is almost five rebounds per game more

■ BALANCED ATTACK

- Purdue has five players averaging between 9.2 and 14.3 points, led by **A.J. Hammons** at 14.3 points per game.
- Purdue has four players averaging at least 4.2 rebounds per game.
- Purdue has six players averaging between 2.0 and 2.9 assists per game and three more players averaging at least 1.0 assists per game.
- Purdue has six players with at least 20 3-point field goals for just the second time in school history (2000-01; 6).

■ DEFENSE LIVES HERE

- The Boilermakers have held 19 of a possible 22 opponents under their pregame scoring average.
- The Boilermakers are 15th in the country in scoring defense (62.6) and eighth in field goal percentage defense (.381).
- Purdue is ninth in Ken Pomeroy's adjusted defensive efficiency, fifth in effective field goal percentage defense and eighth in 2-point pct. defense (.412).
- Purdue has held 15-of-23 opponents to 69 or fewer points, posting a 15-0 record when doing so.
- Purdue has forced 10 shot clock violations already this year, one year after forcing 19 in 34 games.

■ ON FIRE FROM THE LINE

- Purdue ranks 22nd nationally in free throw percentage, a significant improvement over the last four years where the Boilermakers ranked 275th (2012), 291st (2013), 261st (2014) and 213th (2015).
- Purdue has won 33 straight games when shooting more free throws than its opponent, including 15 times this year.
- Four of Purdue's 10 rotation players are shooting above 80.0 percent from the free throw line.

■ BETTER FROM THE LINE

- After starting the season 38-of-59 (.644) from the free throw line in the first two games, Purdue has turned it around at the charity stripe.
- The Boilermakers are 325-of-425 (.765) from the free throw line during the last 21 games. If you throw out the two Iowa games (17-of-30), Purdue is 308-of-395 (.780) during that span.
- Purdue has had eight games this year where it has made 80.0 percent or better from the free throw line. Last year's team had just four games all season of 80 percent or better.
- The school record for free throw percentage in a season is 78.2 percent during the 1968-69 season. This year's average (.750) ranks fourth.

■ MAY I ASSIST YOU WITH THAT?

- Purdue ranks 10th nationally in assists per game (18.0) despite not having a player in the Big Ten's top 20 in assists per game. **Vince Edwards** leads the team in assists (2.9), ranking 21st in the league.
- The Boilermakers rank in the top 10 nationally thanks to six players averaging between 2.0 and 2.9 assists per game and three more averaging 1.0 assists per game.
- The Boilermakers' assist average of 18.0 per game would rank as the sixth-best average in school history and the best since the 1997-98 team averaged 18.9 assists per game.
- In addition, Purdue ranks ninth nationally in assist rate (A / FGM) at 65.2 percent.
- The Boilermakers have dished out 20 or more assists eight different

times this year, including twice in Big Ten play (Michigan, Nebraska).

■ DIALING LONG DISTANCE

- Purdue has made at least 10 3-pointers in seven games this year, the most since having 10 games of double-digit 3-pointers in the 2011-12 season.
- Purdue's 58.3 percent shooting from long distance against Nebraska was its best percentage since March 20, 2013, vs. Western Illinois (.636; 7-of-11 3Ps).

■ TURNING IT OVER

- Purdue has had an issue with turnovers in its losses coming to Butler, Iowa (twice) and Illinois. If the Boilermakers can solve those issues, a special season could be on the horizon.
- In Purdue's four losses, the Boilermakers have had 65 turnovers, resulting in 91 points. The losses have come by a combined 39 points.
- Purdue had 18 (Butler), 14 (Iowa), 16 (Illinois) and 17 (Iowa) turnovers during its four losses.
- Purdue has been outscored by 43 points in the "points off turnovers" category in those four games, clearly making a huge difference.
- Purdue has won the turnover battle just five times this year (Vermont, IUPUI, Howard, Rutgers, Ohio State).
- When Purdue has 15 or fewer turnovers, the Boilermakers are 16-1, with the lone loss coming to Iowa in the first meeting (14). When 16 or more turnovers, Purdue is 3-3 (wins over Incarnate Word, New Mexico and Wisconsin).

■ NOT WAITING FOR THE WEEKEND

- In games played on Saturday and Sunday this year, Purdue is just 7-3. In games played on weekdays, the Boilermakers are 12-0.

■ SHOW A LITTLE CLASS

- In the classroom, the Boilermakers had an outstanding fall semester, registering a cumulative 3.04 GPA as a team. Eleven players boasted semester GPAs of 3.00 or better during the fall.

■ BOILERMAKERS HOT AT HOME

- Purdue saw its 15-game home winning streak come to an end on Jan. 2, 2016, against Iowa. It marked Purdue's first loss since a 69-60 setback to Maryland on Jan. 10, 2015. The 15-game homecourt winning streak was tied for the sixth-longest streak in Mackey Arena.
- However, Purdue has won 20 of its last 21 games at home, the lone loss being to Iowa (Jan. 2, 2016). Since the start of last year, Purdue is 27-4 at Mackey Arena.
- All 13 of Purdue's wins this year at Mackey Arena have been by at least 11 points.
- Purdue has now won at least 12 home games for 10 straight years.

■ ASSISTING WITH THE BEST

- Purdue has several players boasting impressive assist-to-turnover ratio this year.
- **P.J. Thompson** leads the way with a 66:11 (6.00) assist-to-turnover ratio, a ratio that would smash the school record of 3.12, set by **Mack Gadis** in 1986.
- Thompson's ratio is the best in the country for a player averaging at least 20.0 minutes per game (Stephen F. Austin's **Trey Pinkney**; 68:12 -- 5.67).
- **Dakota Mathias** owns a 3.71 ratio (52:14), a number that would rank second in the single-season assist-to-turnover ratio chart.
- **Ryan Cline** owns a 4.25 (34:8) ratio, a number that would rank first on the Purdue freshman list. Cline likely won't have enough assists (min. 75) to qualify for the single-season chart.
- The three of them have combined for a 152:33 (4.61) ratio between them in 1,256 minutes. The trio averages a turnover every 38.1 minutes.

- Purdue has had 72 runs this year of 7-0 or longer, compared to just 24 for its opponents.
- Purdue has had 21 runs of 10-0 or longer, compared to just two for its opponents (Iowa -- 13-0 run; Illinois -- 10-0 run).

- ▶ Pursuing a graduate degree in Technology and Leadership Innovation.

#3 - P.J. Thompson

- ▶ Has started the last two games (12 games overall), averaging 3.5 PPG, 2.0 RPG and 4.0 APG (1-of-6 FGs).
- ▶ First in the country in offensive rating, according to **Ken Pomeroy** (140.2).
- ▶ Has just one turnover in the last eight games (187 minutes).
- ▶ Ranks first nationally in assist-to-turnover ratio (6.00) among players to average 20.0 minutes.
- ▶ Owns a 6.00 assist-to-turnover ratio (66:11); school record for a season is 3.12 (**Mack Gadis** in 1985-86).
- ▶ Owns a career 3.30 (99:30) assist-to-turnover ratio; the school record is 2.70.
- ▶ Has zero turnovers in 15 of his 23 games played this year.
- ▶ In games coming off the bench (11 games), has 26 assists against one turnover (215 minutes).

#11 - Stephen Toyra

- ▶ Has already graduated from Purdue, earning his management degree in August.
- ▶ Owns his own real estate business called Family Realty Groups and became a licensed real estate agent at the age of 21.
- ▶ Made headlines after the Vanderbilt game when he proposed to his high school girlfriend, **Taylor Vauters**, on the sideline.

#12 - Vince Edwards

- ▶ Saw a five-game double-figure scoring streak end vs. Nebraska; 15.2 PPG, 6.5 RPG last six games.
- ▶ Huge game vs. Minnesota with season-high 24 points, eight rebounds and four assists (8-15 FGs, 4-of-7 3Ps).
- ▶ 28-of-30 (.933) from the free throw line over the last 12 games; 11-of-16 (.688) in first 11 games.
- ▶ Has had 10 or more FGAs in each of the last five games; did so just once in the first 18 games.
- ▶ In games this year he has scored double-figures, Purdue is 10-1; 17-4 when doing so in his career.
- ▶ Has started 52-of-56 career games, Purdue is 38-14 in games that he starts.
- ▶ Shooting 40.6 percent from 3-point range this year; 51.9 percent (14-of-27) in Big Ten play.
- ▶ Spent part of the summer trying out for the USA Under-19 National Team.
- ▶ Became just the sixth freshmen in NCAA Tournament history to reach 14 points, eight rebounds and seven assists in a game (**Derrick Rose**, **Carmelo Anthony**, **Jameer Nelson**, **Kenny Anderson**, **Gene Banks**).

#14 - Ryan Cline

- ▶ Called the best shooter Coach Painter has ever recruited, Cline needs three 3-pointers to move into the seventh on the Purdue freshman 3-pointers made list (has 29; current Green Bay coach **Linc Darner** has 32).
- ▶ Is 8-of-18 (.444) from long distance in his last five games; 2-of-3 vs. Nebraska.
- ▶ Hit a big trifecta in the second half against Ohio State that gave Purdue the lead for good.
- ▶ Owns a 4.25 (34:8) assist-to-turnover ratio; one turnover in the last six games (85 minutes).
- ▶ 1-of-3 players in America with at least 30 assists and 8 turnovers or fewer; only freshman.
- ▶ Won the high school 3-point shooting championship during Final Four weekend.
- ▶ Is in the Basketball Hall of Fame after winning the Elks Free Throw National Championship as a 12-year old.

#20 - A.J. Hammons

- ▶ **All-American candidate.**
- ▶ **Named Big Ten Player of the Week on Dec. 7, Dec. 28 and Feb. 1.**
- ▶ Wooden and Abdul-Jabbar Award candidate.
- ▶ His three Big Ten POW awards are the most in the league this year (**Denzel Valentine** - 2).
- ▶ Averaging 18.5 PPG, 8.3 RPG, 1.5 APG and 2.5 BPG over the last four games.
- ▶ 1-of-2 active players (Austin Peay's **Chris Horton**) with 1,400 points, 800 rebounds and 300 blocks.
- ▶ Purdue is 9-0 this year when he leads the team in scoring.
- ▶ Has scored in double-figures in 15 of last 17 games (Howard, Rutgers).
- ▶ Became first player nationally since 2002 to have at least 32 points, 11 rebounds, 5 assists, 4 blocks in a game, when he reached those marks against Nebraska (14-of-17 FGs, 7 dunks).
- ▶ Dominated in the second half against Pittsburgh in the Big Ten / ACC Challenge, finishing the game with 24 points and 12 rebounds; had 17 points and eight rebounds in the second half.

#21 - Kendall Stephens

- ▶ Missed the last three games due to personal reasons following death of a close friend and HS teammate.
- ▶ Was the first three games of his career that he missed.
- ▶ A streaky shooter, Stephens is 7-of-30 (.233) from long distance in his last seven games, breaking a hot streak of 12-of-26 (.462) from 3-point range in previous four contests.
- ▶ Averaging just 10.0 minutes and 2.7 points per game over his last three contests (2-of-8 3Ps).
- ▶ Has 30 career games (out of 86 games) of three or more 3-pointers (24-6 record).
- ▶ Father, Everette, was one of the Three Amigos in the late 80s at Purdue and played in 38 games in the NBA (Indiana, Milwaukee) from 1988-91.

#23 - Jacquil Taylor

- ▶ After missing most of last year with injuries, Taylor received a medical hardship and is considered a freshman for the 2015-16 season.
- ▶ Recorded his first career double-double with 12 points and 10 rebounds in just 14 minutes vs. Rutgers.
- ▶ Gives the Boilermakers added depth in the frontcourt.
- ▶ Suffered a Lisfranc fracture in the summer of 2013 (junior year), which hampered his recruiting.
- ▶ Brother, Maurice, is a sophomore forward at Niagara.
- ▶ Aspires to be a filmmaker.

#24 - Grady Eifert

- ▶ A walk-on that gives a good effort every time on the floor.
- ▶ Brother of Cincinnati Bengals' tight end Tyler Eifert.
- ▶ Father, Greg, played basketball at Purdue from 1980-84, appearing in 115 games with 56 starts.
- ▶ Spent last season at Don Bosco Prep in Crown Point, Indiana.

#31 - Dakota Mathias

- ▶ Averaging 2.8 points, 1.3 rebounds and 1.8 assists over the last four games (5-of-14 FGs, 1-of-7 3Ps).
- ▶ Has 20 assists against just five turnovers over the last eight games (144 minutes).
- ▶ Owns a 3.71 (52:14) assist-to-turnover ratio this year; 2.48 (99:40) for his career.
- ▶ Has never had a three-turnover game during his career (57 games).
- ▶ Can slide over and play the point guard position.
- ▶ Hit a pair of huge 3-pointers in the final 1:18 of the Big Ten-opening win over Wisconsin after Badgers had cut lead to three and four points.

#35 - Rapheal Davis

- ▶ **2015 Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year.**
- ▶ **Jay Bilas** called him the best defensive player in the country.
- ▶ Missed four games earlier this year with a knee injury.
- ▶ Averaging 13.5 PPG, 7.0 RPG and 2.0 APG over the last two games (10-of-16 FGs, 4-of-7 3Ps).
- ▶ Connected on 4-of-5 3-point tries in the win over Nebraska; all coming in the second half.
- ▶ In Purdue's four losses, is averaging 3.0 points while shooting 3-of-20 (.150) from the field.
- ▶ Needs 75 points for 1,000 in his career.
- ▶ Averaged 11.2 PPG, 7.5 RPG and 3.3 APG in six February games last year.
- ▶ Named to the NABC Good Works Team in early December and 1-of-30 candidates for Senior Class Award.
- ▶ Has a two-year old daughter, Kyndal.
- ▶ Brother, Richard, is a barber in Indianapolis who cuts both Purdue and Indiana players' hair.

#44 - Isaac Haas

- ▶ Has scored 50 points in 68 minutes over the last six games (18-of-29 FGs).
- ▶ Over last six games, is averaging 29.4 points per 40 minutes.

- ▶ Missed the Minnesota game after twisting an ankle in last Sunday's loss to Iowa.
- ▶ Returned to action against Nebraska, scoring six points with 12 rebounds and five assists.
- ▶ Averaging 9.7 points and 9.7 rebounds while shooting 21-of-49 (.429) from the field in his last six games.
- ▶ Averaging 10.8 rebounds per game over his last four games; 9 games of 10 or more rebounds.
- ▶ Has just six turnovers in 100 minutes in his last four games; had 59 in 479 minutes in first 18 games.
- ▶ 7 double-doubles are tied for the most by a Purdue freshman in school history; 8th among freshmen nationally and tied for the most in the Big Ten by any player.
- ▶ 6th among freshmen nationally in rebounding (**Ben Simmons**, **James Thompson IV**, **Henry Ellenson**, Texas Southern's **Derek Griffin**, **Dedric Lawson**).
- ▶ On pace for 305 rebounds; school record by a Purdue freshman is 206 by **Joe Barry Carroll** (1977).
- ▶ 1-of-3 Purdue freshmen to have a 25-10 game (Butler); first in 35 years (**Russell Cross**, **Walter Jordan**).
- ▶ Purdue's first Indiana Mr. Basketball recruit since **Glenn "Big Dog" Robinson** in 1991.
- ▶ Purdue's first McDonald's All-American recruit since **Mike Robinson** in 1996.

• With a pair of Sweet 16 appearances, six NCAA Tournament berths, Big Ten regular-season and tournament titles and an international gold medal on his résumé, 11th-year head coach Matt Painter is widely regarded as one of the brightest minds in all of college basketball.

• Painter affirmed his long-term commitment to Purdue in March of 2011, agreeing to a new eight-year contract that will keep him in West Lafayette through at least the 2018-19 season.

• Painter has averaged over 21 wins per season during his tenure at the helm of the Purdue program, including at least 20 victories in six of those seasons.

• Painter's tenure has seen Purdue basketball restore its status among the upper echelon of college basketball programs. The last eight years have seen six 20-win seasons and NCAA Tournament berths, two Sweet 16 appearances, a regular-season Big Ten title and a Big Ten Tournament crown.

• The three winningest classes in program history are the classes of 2011, 2012 and 2010, respectively, and five of the 10 winningest individual players Purdue has ever seen have come from the Painter ranks. Success, however, didn't happen overnight.

• Painter officially became the 18th head men's basketball coach in Purdue history on April 1, 2005, and immediately set about laying the groundwork for a dramatic reversal in the program's fortunes.

• The Boilermakers were at their best during the 2009 postseason run, rattling off double-digit victories over Penn State and Illinois to reach the Big Ten Tournament final, where they dispatched Ohio State, 65-61, to earn the first conference tournament crown in program history.

• Painter has also resurrected Mackey Arena as one of the country's best home-court advantages, piling up a 150-32 (.824) record at home over the last 11 seasons, including a remarkable 82-7 (.921) record against non-conference opponents.

• Painter has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year three times in the last six seasons, earning the consensus award in 2008 and 2011, and winning the coaches' vote in 2010. He is one of only six men to win the award more at least three times since its inception in 1974.

• Painter has seen a total of 21 players earn a combined 40 Academic All-Big Ten honors during his tenure as head coach. Painter has also mentored an Academic All-American, as Moore earned second-team honors during the 2009-10 season.
