BOILERMAKERS LOOK TO KEEP IOWA OUT OF BIG TEN TOURNEY IN 2013 SEASON FINALE

- Having been eliminated from Big Ten Tournament contention with home losses to Indiana and Minnesota last week, Purdue will be looking to play the role of spoiler Saturday in Iowa City. The Hawkeyes entered the week in a three-way tie for seventh place in the Big Ten standings, but come up on the short end of tiebreakers with Illinois and Wisconsin. Iowa needs a win to qualify for the Big Ten Tournament. A draw would also punch the Hawkeyes' ticket if Minnesota defeats Illinois or Northwestern wins at Wisconsin.
- The Boilermakers are looking to finish their season with a .500 record of 9-9-1. It would be the team's best mark since the 2009 team went 12-6-2. Purdue also played lowa in regular-season finales in 2009 and 2010. Five of the last eight Purdue-lowa games have gone to overtime. The Hawkeyes are the only Big Ten team that has not been shut out this season.

WILLIAMS TIES FRESHMAN RECORD WITH 10TH GOAL

- Maddy Williams scored her 10th goal of the season late in the Oct. 27 home loss to Minnesota, tying the Purdue freshman record held by Jessica Okoroafo from 2005. She also officially eclipsed Lauren Sesselmann's freshman points record from 2001.
- Williams is the first Boiler to score 10-plus goals since three players Loredana Riverso (13), Parrissa Eyorokon (12) and Shauna Stapleton (10) did it in 2007. She's only the sixth player in program history to reach the double-figure benchmark in a season.
- Williams is fourth in the Big Ten in goals entering the week and second among freshmen behind Ohio State's Nichelle Prince. She also ranks fifth in points, again ranking only behind Prince among freshmen.

STUART BECOMES JUST THIRD PLAYER WITH 10 ASSISTS

- Hadley Stuart setup Jordan Frick's goal against Indiana, recording her 10th assist. She's only one helper shy of the Purdue single-season record, held by Shauna Stapleton from 2007. Annette Kent (2003) is the only other player in program history to reach the double-figure mark in a season.
- With six goals/10 assists for Stuart and 10 goals/six assists for **Maddy Williams**, both players have impacted 16 goals this season. That's the most since 2007 when four different players each played a role in at least 16 goals.
- Stuart is second in the Big Ten in assists and seventh in points this week.

BURNED BY OPPOSING GOALKEEPERS DURING FINAL HOME WEEK

- Purdue enjoyed significant advantages in shots (42-23) and shots on goal (24-14) over its final two home games, but ended up losing both contests, 2-1. Opposing goalkeepers were a big reason why, accounting for 22 saves. Indiana's Shannon Flower made 10 saves in the Oct. 24 game and Minnesota's Tarah Hobbs finished with 12 saves Oct. 27 to spoil senior day. Meanwhile, the opposition managed to score on four of its 14 shots on goal. Xavier made 11 saves in its win against Purdue back in August.
- This year marked the first time since the 2007 season (five) that at least three opponents had 10-plus saves vs. the Boilers. However, the opposition had not posted double-figure totals in consecutive games against Purdue since 2003 when Indiana State and Ball State also teamed up for 22 saves. The Boiler-makers managed to win the ISU game, 2-0, but lost to BSU, 1-0.

EARLY GOALS AGAINST IN LOSSES TO MICHIGAN STATE & MINNESOTA

• Minnesota scored only 55 seconds after kickoff, accounting for the second goal in the first two minutes that Purdue had given up in the last four games. Michigan State scored only 87 seconds after the opening kickoff Oct. 18 in East Lansing. The Boilermakers essentially trailed the entire game in both losses. Both goals were also the earliest surrendered by Purdue since 2010 when St. Bonaventure scored 35 after kickoff. The Boilermakers went on to win the game vs. SBU but it still stands as the earliest goal Purdue has ever allowed.

HAIRSTON'S STARTING STREAK ENDS AT 54

- Alex Hairston came off the bench for the first time in her Purdue career Oct. 20 at Michigan, ending her team-long consecutive games started streak at 54. She has played in every game in her three seasons as Boilermaker. Her 57 consecutive games played streak remains the longest active run on the team. Chinyelu Asher has also played in 57 straight games.
- Melissa Casella now owns the longest consecutive games started streak (33). She has started every game dating back to the Aug. 31, 2012, home win against Tennessee-Martin, going the distance in 29 of those 33 games. Casella's streak of 37 consecutive games played is the third longest on the team.

EXTENDED LOSING STREAK VERSUS NATIONALLY-RANKED FOES

- With four of Purdue's Big Ten losses this season being against nationally-ranked opponents, the team is now winless in its last 18 games against ranked foes dating back to 2009. The Boilermakers' last victory vs. a nationally-ranked team was Aug. 28, 2009, at No. 6 Texas A&M. Purdue also played No. 20 Michigan State to a 1-1 draw in West Lafayette in October 2009, making it a 16-game losing streak as well as the 18-game winless drought vs. ranked opponents. The Boilermakers have been outscored 50-12 during the winless skid vs. Top 25 teams.
- Purdue's last home win against a nationally-ranked opponent was in September 2006 vs. No. 12 Utah. The Boilermakers are 0-8-1 in their nine home dates against Top 25 teams since.

SCORING STREAK SNAPPED AT UNLUCKY 13

• Purdue scored a goal in each of the first 13 games this season. The scoring streak was snapped in a 4-0 loss to Nebraska on Oct. 11. The 13 consecutive games with a goal was tied for the third longest singleseason streak in program history and was the Boilers' longest streak 2002-03 since scoring in 15 straight games in 2005. The 2000 (11), 2003 (17) 2003 and 2009 (12) teams also opened their campaigns with lengthy consecutive games with a goal streaks.

 After back-to-back 4-0 losses to Nebraska and Michigan State, Hadley Stuart's goal in the 24th minute Oct. 20 at Michigan ended Purdue's 2009 scoring drought at 237 consecutive minutes dating back to the second 2000 half of the Oct. 6 win against Northwestern. Last season, the Boilers scored in the first 12 games but then endured a scoring drought of 431 consecutive minutes after getting shut out in three straight.

• Entering the weekend of Oct. 11-13, Iowa and Purdue were the only Big Ten teams that had not been shut out. Iowa remains the only side in the Big Ten yet to be shut out this year.

THREE STRAIGHT SHUTOUTS & THREE CONSECUTIVE BIG TEN WINS

• Thanks to 1-0 wins against Ohio State, Illinois and Northwestern (Sept. 29 through Oct. 6), Purdue posted its first three-game win streak in Big Ten play since October 2007. The 2007 team was also the last to record three straight shutout victories, tallying five shutouts in a row while posting a 4-0-1 record from Sept. 23 through Oct. 7. The Boilermakers had not won three consecutive 1-0 games since September 2006.

· Purdue's consecutive scoreless minutes streak of 329 was the program's longest since going 338 minutes without giving up a goal in October 2009. This year's streak ranked as the eighth longest in team history.

PURDUE SWEEPS ILLINOIS-NORTHWESTERN WEEKEND TO EXTEND STREAKS

• Purdue won a pair of 1-0 games to sweep the Illinois-Northwestern weekend, Oct. 4-6. The Boilermakers extended their unbeaten streak at home against the Illini to eight (5-0-3), keeping Illinois winless all-time in West Lafayette (excluding neutral-site Big Ten Tournament results). Indiana (0-7-1) was the only other Big Ten team that had never won at the Boilermaker Soccer Complex, a winless drought the Hoosiers were able to end this year. Purdue shut out the Illini for the first time this season, snapping their 20-game scoring streak that dated back to October 2012.

• Purdue won its 10th straight game against Northwestern. The Iongest win streak against any opponent in program history dates back to 2005. The Boilermakers are 7-1 all-time against the Wildcats in West Lafayette, posting five home victories against NU during the current streak.

• After providing the only offense Purdue would need in a pair of 1-0 victories, becoming the first Boiler to score the game-winning goal in consecutive Big Ten games since 2001, Maddy Williams was recognized as the Big Ten Offensive Player and Freshman of the Week Oct. 7.

 Williams is Purdue's first Player of the Week honoree since former goalkeeper Carianne Betts was recognized for consecutive shutouts in September 2010. Sylvia Forbes (Aug. 31, 2009) was the Boilers' last Offensive Player of the Week honoree. Williams joined Alex Hairston (2011), Chinyelu Asher (2011) and Kim Love (2012) as active Purdue players to garner Big Ten Freshman of the Week acclaim.

· Williams became the first Boiler to account for a game-winning goal in consecutive contests since Hairston did so in the first two games of 2012. However, in Big Ten play, a Purdue player had not accomplished the feat since Lauren Sesselmann in 2001. Sesselmann was also a freshman in 2001 and finished her first season with nine goals. Williams tied Sesselmann's freshman record for points (24) Oct 6.

PURDUE SNAPS OSU'S BIG TEN STREAK WITH FIRST WIN IN COLUMBUS SINCE 2007

- The 1-0 win at Ohio State Sept. 29 was the Boilers first shutout victory on the road since the 2011 season opener at Toledo and their first at a Big Ten opponent since September 2008 at Wisconsin. With its first win in Columbus since 2007, Purdue also snapped the Buckeyes' 12-game (10-0-2) unbeaten streak against Big Ten opponents that dated back to September 2012. Ohio State had not lost any games at home since September 2012 as well.
- The Boilermakers posted their first road win in regulation since October 2011 at Minnesota. Purdue's two positive road results since had been overtime victories.

HAIRSTON SETS NEW RECORD FOR CONSECUTIVE GAMES WITH A POINT

- · Alex Hairston recorded a goal or an assist in seven straight games (Sept. 6-29), establishing a new program record for consecutive games with a point. She found the back of the net in four straight games (Sept. 8-22) and five times total during the streak. She had an assist in the two games in which she didn't score. Maddy Williams has recorded a point in six straight games overall and eight straight in which she's played (missing the IPFW win due to injury).
- · Hairston is also a co-owner of the program record for most consecutive games with an assist (four), established from Aug. 31 through Sept. 12 of last season.
- · Hairston became the first Boiler to score in four consecutive games since Kellie Phillips scored in five straight in October 2011 to tie a program record. Loredana Riverso also scored in five consecutive games in November 2007. Hairston is the fourth Boiler to score in at least four straight games.

Jordan Pawlik has scored in eight of the 33 games she has played in, a 24 percent ratio. Excluding freshmen (Williams has scored in seven of her 15 games), Hairston and Pawlik are the team leaders for scoring in the highest percentage of games played.
- · Meanwhile, Hairston also posted multi-assist efforts in the wins against Northern Illinois and Dartmouth this season. With five career multi-assist games, she has established a new Purdue all-time record.

WISCONSIN'S LATE GOALS BURN BOILERS IN BIG TEN OPENER

· No. 24 Wisconsin scored twice in the final seven minutes to break open what was an otherwise tightly contested game throughout, defeating Purdue, 3-1, in the Big Ten Conference opener for both teams Sept. 22. The Badgers scored the go-ahead goal in the 84th minute off a corner kick-style set piece from the left endline. Excluding the team's last four overtime losses dating back to 2011, it marked the latest go-ahead goal the Boilers' had allowed in regulation since Ohio State scored in the 87th minute of an October 2010 game at Boilermaker Soccer Complex.

NEW ATTENDANCE RECORD AT BOILERMAKER SOCCER COMPLEX

· Purdue's Big Ten opener against Wisconsin was played in front of a Boilermaker Soccer Complex-record crowd of 1,318 fans on Greater Lafayette Recreational Soccer Alliance day at the field. The previous attendance record (1,256) dated back to 2004.

MOST GOALS SCORED ENTERING BIG TEN PLAY

- · The Boilermakers have scored multiple goals in seven of their first 14 games. With 31 goals in the first 14 games, Pur- Season due has already exceeded its season total from 2012. The 2013 26 goals going into the Big Ten season was a program high 2007 entering conference play.
- Purdue's 13 goals in the first four games this year represented a program high to begin a new season. The 20 goals in the
- first six games were good for second most in program history.

• The 20 goals over the first six games were the Boilers' most in any six-game stretch since scoring 22 late in the 2007 season. November 2007 also marked the last time the team scored three-plus goals in three consecutive games as well, which Purdue accomplished this year in the games against Akron (5), Xavier (3) and Northern Illinois (4).

FIVE DIFFERENT BOILERS SCORE IN DARTMOUTH WIN

- · Purdue matched its season high with five goals in the Sept. 6 home win against Dartmouth, receiving scores from five different players. It marked the first time since October 2011 and ninth time in program history that five Boilers found the back of the net in the same game.
- · Purdue actually trailed 2-1 in the 58th minute against Dartmouth. But the Boilers scored three times in just over five minutes to take control of the game. Mollie Kuramoto accounted for the equalizer in the 60th minute, Hadley Stuart provided the go-ahead goal in the 64th minute and Chinyelu Asher scored what proved to the game winner early in the 66th minute to cap the wild stretch. Freshmen Maddy Williams and Mikayla Lasky also scored in the victory.

Alex Hairston (2012 vs. Eastern Illinois) has also recorded an overtime game-winner as a Boilermaker.
- · Pawlik was named the Big Ten Player of the Week by CollegeSportsMadness.com and selected to CollegeSoccer360.com's Primetime Performers list. She also helped the Boilers shut out IPFW Sept. 13 while playing outside back. The senior moved up to forward midway through the first half at Miami.
- · Four times this season, Purdue has been part of a game that featured seven-plus goals. In program history, the Boilers have been involved in a game that has featured seven-plus goals 20 times, compiling a 12-8 record. The Xavier game (Aug. 25) marked only the third time in program history the Boilers have scored three goals in a loss. Entering the season, Purdue had only been involved in three games in program history in which both teams scored three-plus goals. It has already happened three times this year.

WILLIAMS' 6 GOALS TIES TEAM HIGH IN FIRST 6 GAMES

- · With six goals over the first three weekends of the season, Maddy Williams matched Jessica Okoroafo (2009) for the most by a Boiler in the first six games of a season. Williams scored in four of the first six games, highlighted by multi-goal efforts in wins against Akron and Northern Illinois. Okoroafo scored in five of the first six games of 2009, including twice in game No. 2 at Butler, and finished her senior season with eight goals.
- · Last season, Jordan Pawlik scored six times in the first five games in which she played. She missed Purdue's fourth and fifth games of the season due to injury and scored her sixth goal in the team's seventh game. Pawlik finished the year with nine goals, the most by a Boiler since 2007.

STUART ASSISTS ON THREE SCORES FOR NEW RECORD

· Hadley Stuart assisted on three of the Boilers' four scores in the Aug. 30 home win against Northern Illinois to establish a new Purdue single-game record. She also scored the team's fourth goal to cap off a five-point night. Stuart enters the weekend leading the Big Ten with seven assists, helping setup seven of the Boilers' 17 goals scored by teammates. With two goals and an assist for the second Friday in a row, Maddy Williams also had five points in the NIU win.

EARLIEST GOAL SCORED TO START A SEASON

· When Chinyelu Asher scored only 68 seconds after the opening kickoff of the season-opening win against Akron it marked the fastest that Purdue had ever scored to begin a new campaign.
