– PURDUE MAKES FIRST TRIP TO NEBRASKA FOR KEY BIG TEN WEEKEND SERIES –

No. 16 Purdue baseball continues its most challenging stretch of the Big Ten portion of the season with its first-ever road trip to the state of Nebraska, taking on the Huskers this weekend for a key three-game conference series.

First pitch at Hawks Field at Haymarket Park is set for 7:35 p.m. Friday, 3:05 p.m. Saturday and 1:05 p.m. Sunday (all times ET). The Boilermakers (29-5, 10-2 Big Ten) will make their Big Ten Network season debut Friday evening.

Purdue has not played Nebraska (25-13, 7-5 Big Ten) since 1907 and all eight previous meetings were contested in West Lafayette. The Boilers played Omaha-based Creighton five times in the late 1980s, but all five games were played in Miami. Therefore, this weekend is believed to represent the program's first-ever road trip to the state of Nebraska.

Baseball joins volleyball, wrestling, track and field, and men's tennis as Purdue athletics teams to travel to Lincoln during Nebraska's inaugural season as a Big Ten member.

The Boilermakers and Huskers enter the weekend in first and third place in the Big Ten standings, respectively. The second- and fourth-place teams, Minnesota and Michigan State, also square off this weekend in East Lansing.

Purdue began its challenging month-long stretch against Illinois, Nebraska, Michigan State and UCLA by sweeping the Fighting Illini at Lambert Field last weekend. The Boilermakers have won nine consecutive games, one shy of their season high, posting back-to-back sweeps for the first time since 2010 and consecutive Big Ten sweeps for the first time since 2001 in the process. A win in Friday's series opener at Haymarket Park would give Purdue two 10-game win streaks in the same season for the first time in program history.

The Boilermakers will also look to post their 30th win of the season this weekend. Purdue recorded its 30th victory on May 1 last season, reaching that benchmark by May 1 for sixth time in program history. The Boilers will accomplish the feat in back-to-back seasons for the first time since they did it in three straight years from 1985-87.

Purdue and Nebraska rank one-two in the Big Ten in eight statistical offensive categories. The Huskers scored 22 runs Sunday to sweep a doubleheader at Ohio State and win the series. Nebraska is 15-6 at home this season but had to win games two and three to capture their home series against Illinois and Iowa. Coincidentally, the Boilers are batting .347 in road and neutral-site action (26 games) versus only .243 in their eight home games.

Where Purdue could have the advantage this weekend is on the mound. In the first four weekends of Big Ten play, the Boilers and Huskers have played three of the same opponents – Ohio State, Northwestern and Illinois. Purdue has surrendered 39 runs and compiled a 2.36 team ERA in its first 12 Big Ten games. Nebraska, meanwhile, has surrendered 76 runs and compiled a 4.97 ERA. The Huskers do lead the conference with a .976 fielding percentage.

During the current nine-game win streak, the pitching staff has led the way; the Boilermakers have outscored the opposition 63-14 and trailed only twice during the nine-game run. Purdue's weekend rotation of **Joe Haase**, **Lance Breedlove** and **Connor Podkul** have accounted for six quality starts, pitching 43 2/3 of the 81 innings to account for a good part of the 1.22 team ERA in the last nine games.

Purdue is expecting to encounter a raucous atmosphere at Haymarket Park this weekend. The stadium has a capacity of 8,486 and Nebraska leads the Big Ten in home attendance. One scouting

report relayed to West Lafayette suggested the locals haven't been this excited about Husker baseball since the 2008 NCAA Regional held in Lincoln, which was won by No. 2 seed Cal State Irvine.

Nebraska qualified for the College World Series three times in a five-year span from 2001-05. But the Huskers compiled an 82-80-1 record in their final three seasons as a member of the Big 12. Former head coach Mike Anderson was replaced by Nebraska alum and long-time Big Leaguer Darin Erstad in June.

HEAD COACH DOUG SCHREIBER

Since Doug Schreiber was named Purdue's head baseball coach on May 29, 1998, the Boilermakers have become a major force in the Big Ten Conference and have made big strides on a national level.

Currently in his 14th year as the head coach at Purdue, he now owns program records for overall wins and conference victories. In 2007, Schreiber became the third head coach in Purdue baseball history to surpass the 500-games mark as the Boilermakers' head man. Dave Alexander, whom Schreiber played for from 1983 to 1986, owns the record for most games coached at Purdue with 792 over 14 seasons. Schreiber broke Alexander's all-time wins record (407) April 15, 2012, and is on pace to break the games coached benchmark in 2013.

Purdue's 37 overall wins in 2011 tied the program's single season record and were the most in the Big Ten. Despite being picked eighth in the preseason coaches' poll, the Boilers finished third in the league with a 14-10 conference record, just one game shy of first, and reached the Big Ten Tournament for the fourth consecutive year and seventh time in the last eight seasons. The four straight tourney appearances represent the longest active streak in the league as well as a program high. The program's 58 Big Ten wins over the last four years are also the most in the league.

Purdue led the Big Ten in numerous statistical categories in 2011, highlighted by runs scored, doubles, slugging percentage, on-base percentage, sacrifice flies, saves and strikeouts. The Boilermakers drew the most walks at the plate and issued the fewest number of free passes on the mound.

Six Boilers were recognized as all-conference performers, matching the second-highest total in program history. Kevin Plawecki and Barrett Serrato were named First Team, Tyler Spillner and Nick Wittgren Second Team and Cameron Perkins and Stephen Talbott Third Team. With Serrato, Spillner and Talbott all honored as outfielders, it marked the first time 1991 that three Purdue outfielders were named all-conference in the same season.

The 2010 season saw the Boilermakers post 33 victories, the program's most since 2000. Purdue navigated a hotly-contested Big Ten race that saw all six league tournament-qualifying teams finish within three games of first place. The Boilermakers reached the Big Ten Tourney for the eighth time under Schreiber, including six of the last seven seasons. Purdue eliminated Northwestern and Indiana from the 2010 tournament before bowing out. The Boilers have won at least one game at the Big Ten Tournament in seven of their eight appearances under Schreiber.

The 2010 Boilermakers posted new school records for hits (636) and runs per game (7.2) at the plate and led the Big Ten in strikeouts (435) and batting average against (.276) on the mound. Purdue went 15-6 at home and 9-2 in midweek action, compiling a 32-18 mark after opening the season 1-6.

Individually, Matt Bischoff was honored as a First Team All-Big Ten starting pitcher. He led the Big Ten with 10 wins and 95 strikeouts and in the process became the first player in program history to be a four-time All-Big Ten honoree. He established new single-season and career strikeout marks in his final season as a Boilermaker. Bischoff and fellow pitcher Kevin Cahill were both selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft.

Schreiber has coached 54 All-Big Ten Conference selections, including 18 who were named to the conference's First Team, and has had players selected in the Major League Baseball First-Year Player Draft on 23 occasions. One of Schreiber's Boilermakers has led the Big Ten in hitting in four out of the last seven years.

Prior to becoming the head coach at Purdue, Schreiber spent four seasons (1995-98) as the top assistant coach and recruiting coordinator under Pat Murphy at Arizona State University. Schreiber helped guide Arizona State to the College World Series and the national championship game in 1998. A year earlier, the Sun Devils finished as regional runners-up to Miami, and were two outs away from going to the College World Series. All four of Schreiber's recruiting classes at ASU were nationally ranked, including the 1995 class which was ranked No. 1 in the country and the 1996 class, which was tabbed the third best in the nation.

Before going to ASU, Schreiber served as an assistant coach for Murphy at the University of Notre Dame in 1994. That season, the Fighting Irish finished 46-16 and ended the season just two wins shy of Omaha, finishing as regional runners-up to Auburn.

Schreiber began his coaching career as a graduate assistant under Pat Quinn at Ball State University for two seasons (1991-92) and spent one year (1993) as an assistant at Butler University.

A native of LaPorte, Ind., Schreiber was a four-year starter (1983-86) at second base for the Boilermakers. During his career, Purdue posted a 120-112-2 mark and established a school-record 37 victories his senior season when he was a Second Team All-Big Ten selection. Schreiber still ranks among Purdue's career leaders in a variety of categories, including top-six ranking in four categories. Schreiber ranks first all-time in walks (132), fourth in runs scored (159), tied for third in games played (220) and tied for sixth in triples (9). He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in communications and has completed some course work towards a master's in education.

PURDUE TRAVELS TO NEBRASKA FOR THE FIRST TIME FOR BIG WEEKEND SERIES

- The Boilermakers enter the weekend having won nine straight and 13 of their last 14. Purdue's .828 winning percentage (29-5 record) entering the week ranked second nationally. The Boilers' five losses were tied for the fewest in the nation (Kentucky is 33-5).
- Purdue has a 2 1/2-game lead in the Big Ten standings at the midpoint of the conference season. However, the Boilers are in the midst of a challenging stretch that could ultimately determine whether or not Purdue can finally break through and claim that elusive regular-season Big Ten title. After sweeping Illinois (18-13), the Boilers have upcoming series against Nebraska (23-12), Michigan State (20-11) and UCLA (22-7). Entering the Illinois series April 13-15, those four opponents had a combined 83-43 record.
- Purdue has swept Northwestern and Illinois the last two weekends, posting back-to-back Big Ten sweeps for the first time since 2001 (at Michigan State and at Northwestern). The Boilermakers also swept back-to-back nonconference series in 2010 (at Ohio and vs. Chicago State). Purdue swept Illinois for the first time since 2000. The Boilers had lost the finale of their first two conference series after taking the first two games. Overall, Purdue has now posted five undefeated weekends this year season and three true series sweep.
- The sweep at Northwestern (April 6-8) was the Boilers' first Big Ten sweep on the road since 2001, a season in which they won 13 straight games from March 24 through April 14.
- The nine-game win streak is one shy of Purdue's season-long run. The Boilermakers won 10 straight games from Feb. 26 through March 16. Never before has the team had two 10-game win streaks in the same season.
- This weekend is believed to represent Purdue's first-ever road trip to the state of Nebraska. The eight all-time meetings with the Huskers were all played in West Lafayette (1899 through 1907). The Boilermakers played Creighton five times in the late 1980s but all five games were played in Miami.

BOILERS' BATS SIXTH IN THE NATION IN TEAM BATTING AVERAGE ENTERING THE WEEK

- The Boilermakers entered the week ranked sixth in the nation with a .324 team batting average. Purdue was also 17th in scoring (7.2 runs per game) and 29th in slugging percentage. Coincidentally, the Boilers are batting .347 in road and neutral-site action (26 games) versus only .243 in their eight home games. But the Purdue pitchers have limited the opposition to a .199 batting average against at Lambert Field.
- The pitching and defense have been performing well overall. The Boilermakers were sixth nationally in double plays turned per game and ranked 11th in total twin killings. Purdue has now turned 39 double plays. The pitching staff, meanwhile, is averaging only 2.32 walks per nine innings, a total which ranks as the eighth best in the country.

SCHREIBER BREAKS PROGRAM WINS RECORD AS PURDUE COMPLETES SWEEP

- Finishing off the series sweep of Illinois not only helped the Boilers in the Big Ten standings but also allowed head coach **Doug Schreiber** to break the program's all-time wins record at home. The 14th-year skipper posted his 408th career win in the nightcap of the April 15 doubleheader with Illinois, overtaking Dave Alexander (1978-91) for the team record. Schreiber was a four-year starter at second base for Alexander from 1983-86. Alexander was also the head coach of the Boilers for 14 years, coaching a school-record 792 games. Schreiber is expected to eclipse the games-coached record early next season.
- Schreiber also won his 400th career game at Lambert Field this season, March 31 vs. Penn State.

STARTING PITCHING LEADING THE WAY DURING NINE GAME-WIN STREAK

- Since giving up a season-high 16 runs in the April 1 blowout loss to Penn State, the Purdue pitching staff has performed at a remarkably high level. Led by the starting staff of **Joe Haase**, **Lance Breedlove**, **Connor Podkul** and **Robert Ramer**, the Boilers have surrendered no more than four runs in a game during the current nine-game win streak. Purdue has outscored the opposition 63-14 during the win streak.
- Purdue has posted two shutout wins (the series openers of the Northwestern and Illinois series) during the win streak. On three other occasions (April 4, 15 and 17), the Boilers took a shutout into the ninth inning. Behind stellar performances from Haase and Breedlove, Purdue kept Northwestern off the scoreboard for the 15 innings of that series and shutout Illinois for the first 17 innings of that series.
- The Boilermakers have trailed only twice during the nine-game win streak: after the first inning of the series finale at Northwestern and after the fourth inning of the midweek game at Ball State.

BIG TEN LEADING BOILERS

- While the offense has generated the majority of the headlines early this season, the Purdue pitching and defense has also carried its fair share of the load to help Purdue earn its national ranking. Entering the weekend, the pitching staff has issued the fewest walks (79) and surrendered the fewest hits (274), extra-base hits (57) and runs (127) in the Big Ten. The Boilermakers 39 double plays turned, including 33 of the ground ball variety induced by the pitchers, are second in the league.
- While leading the league in team batting average (.326) and doubles (74), Purdue is second to Nebraska in many other offensive categories. The Huskers have played four more games than the Boilers entering the weekend. Purdue has struck out the fewest number of times in the league (149).
- Individually, **Kevin Plawecki**, who is the most difficult batter to strikeout in the Big Ten, enters the weekend leading the conference with 15 doubles. He was 14th nationally in doubles per game and seventh in toughest to K entering the week. **Stephen Talbott** is No. 1 in the league with five triples. **Lance Breedlove**, **Joe Haase** and **Blake Mascarello** each have six wins to share the league lead with Minnesota's TJ Oakes. **Nick Wittgren** leads the conference with seven saves.

CHARLES APPROACHING ALL-TIME RUNS RECORD

- Senior **Eric Charles** is the program's active career leader in games played, at-bats, runs, hits, doubles and stolen bases. He scored four times in the April 17 win at Illinois-Chicago, surpassing head coach **Doug Schreiber** (159) on the program's all-time leaderboard. Schreiber graduated in 1986 as the school record holder. With 161 runs, Charles is closing in on the all-time record held by Jose Rossy (168, 1984-87).
- **Kevin Plawecki** (36 HBP) could also eclipse the Purdue all-time record (39) for hit by pitch soon. Coincidentally, even as a cleanup-hitting catcher, Plawecki enters the weekend leading the team in runs scored (36) this year.

MILLER IMPRESSES WITH HIS DEFENSE; PLawecki COMMITS FIRST ERROR

- Senior shortstop **David Miller** has been one of the unsung heroes on the team this season, starting every game while playing 296 of the possible 303 innings at shortstop. While continuing to put together quality at-bats and drive in timely runs as a key member of Purdue's formidable 7-8-9, Miller has improved most drastically defensively. After committing 13 errors and posting a .939 fielding percentage in 2011 during his first year with the program, the St. Louis native has made only four errors and leads Big Ten shortstops with a .975 clip. He improved his arm strength during the offseason thanks to a long-toss program.
- Miller has contributed to 22 of Purdue's 39 double plays this year.

HAASE & BREEDLOVE BOTH RIDING CONSECUTIVE SCORELESS INNINGS STREAKS

- **Joe Haase** and **Lance Breedlove** are currently riding notable consecutive scoreless innings streaks. Haase has pitched 16 consecutive scoreless frames, finishing off a complete-game shutout April 6 at Northwestern and following that up with 7 2/3 shutout innings in his April 13 win against Illinois. Haase has won each of his last five starts, putting together a quality start each time out. Purdue is 9-0 in the games he has started this year.
- Breedlove has pitched 26 consecutive scoreless innings at Lambert Field dating back to his final inning of relief in the May 1, 2011, win against Indiana. The senior pitched a complete-game shutout against Penn State March 31 in his first start of the season at Lambert Field. He followed that up with 7 2/3 shutout innings in game two of the Illinois series (April 15).
- Breedlove has surrendered only two runs over 32 2/3 innings in his first four Big Ten starts. Along with shutting out Penn State and Illinois, he kept Ohio State off the scoreboard until the ninth inning and prevented Northwestern from scoring until the seventh.

PODKUL JOINS WEEKEND ROTATION DURING SWEEP AT NORTHWESTERN

- Starting pitchers **Joe Haase**, **Lance Breedlove** and **Connor Podkul** teamed up for 22 innings of four-run ball, leading the Boilers to a series sweep at Northwestern (April 6-8). It was Purdue's first Big Ten sweep on the road since 2001. The Boilermakers only trailed once all series, going down 1-0 after the first inning of game three.
- Podkul earned his first collegiate win with six innings of three-run ball in the series finale. The freshman struck out a season-high six in his first Big Ten start. He became the first Purdue freshman to start a Big Ten game since Kyle Cook in 2008.
- In his three other starts this year, Podkul has surrendered no more than two hits. He worked 4 1/3 innings of one-run ball March 13 at Missouri State, six innings of no-hit ball (surrendering a run) in the March 27 home opener against Louisville and 6 1/3 innings of two-hit ball in an April 15 no-decision against Illinois.

BOILERS EXPLODE FOR 12-RUN INNING IN MIDWEEK WIN AT BALL STATE

- Purdue scored a season-high 12 times on 11 hits, sending 17 men to the plate, in the sixth inning of the April 11 win at Ball State. It was the Boilers' biggest inning since also scoring 12 times in a March 2008 home win against Western Illinois.
- **Angelo Cianfrocco** and **David Miller** both connected for two-run homers in their second at-bats of the sixth inning. It marked the 15th time this season that the Boilers have scored four or more runs in an inning. Thirteen of those extended rallies have come from the sixth through ninth innings. Meanwhile, Purdue has now posted 12-, nine-, eight- and seven-run rallies in the sixth inning this season.
- Every batter in Purdue's original starting lineup had a hit in the sixth inning. Cianfrocco and **Stephen Talbott** both recorded a pair of hits, Cianfrocco racking up six total bases, and scored twice in the frame.
- The Boilermakers have won 13th straight true midweek games dating back to March 2011.

BIG SCORING EDGE LATE IN GAMES

- Purdue has feasted on relief pitching for much of the season, best demonstrated by a 146-52 scoring edge from the sixth inning through the end of the game. The Boilermakers have scored 58 runs in the sixth inning, their highest total in any inning. In fact, the run totals in the sixth, seventh (34), eighth (33) and ninth (20) innings rank as four of the team's top five most productive innings. Coincidentally, Purdue has only scored 14 runs in the fifth inning.
- The Boilermakers have scored four more runs in an inning 17 times this year. Thirteen of those 17 occurrences have come in the sixth inning or later. Purdue has registered extended sixth-inning rallies featuring run totals of 12 (April 11 at Ball State), nine (Feb. 19 vs. UND), eight (March 10 at Murray), seven (Feb. 26 vs. WCU and March 3 vs. USM) and five (March 15 at WSU).
- On multiple occasions this season, Purdue has been able to score runs against an opposing reliever that entered the day having not surrendered an earned on the year. Wichita's Foster Vielock (3 H, 3 ER), Murray's Will Handlin (7 H, 5 ER), Southern Miss' Cameron Giannini (3 H, 4 ER), and Auburn's Dillon Ortman (H, ER) and Cory Luckie (2 H, 2 ER) all failed to hold down the Purdue offense in close games that the Boilers went on to win.
- In the March 27 walk-off win against Louisville, Purdue scored the game-winning run against the Cardinals' closer, Derek Self. He had surrendered only two earned runs in his first 10 appearances of the season entering the day.

HAASE'S GARNERS PITCHER OF THE WEEK HONORS FOR TWO-HIT SHUTOUT

- A two-hit shutout in the April 6 series-opening win at Northwestern earned **Joe Haase** Big Ten co-Pitcher of the Week honors, making him the fifth Boiler honored by the conference office this season. He was also named to the College Baseball Hall of Fame's weekly National All-Star Lineup.
- The senior did not give up hit after the fourth inning, needing only 99 pitches to finish his second career complete-game shutout. He retired 27 of the 30 batters he faced, including eight in a row twice. The right-hander recorded six 1-2-3 innings.
- Haase was honored by the conference office for the second time in his career. Last year, he was recognized after shutting out Minnesota at Target Field during the conference-opening weekend.
- Lance Breedlove** had been selected as the Big Ten Pitcher of the Week each of the last two weeks. This marks the first time since the Big Ten's weekly awards program began in 1990 that Purdue has had the Pitcher of the Week in three consecutive weeks. **Brad Schreiber** and Haase won back-to-back Pitcher of the Week awards last season.

ANTONELLI DELIVERS BIG HIT AS PURDUE REACHES 20 WINS BEFORE APRIL 1

- Chris Antonelli** delivered the go-ahead single in the seventh inning of a scoreless game and help lead Purdue to a 2-0 win against Penn State March 31. The win was the Boilers' 20th of the season. The team reached the benchmark before April 1 for the first time in program history. Purdue closed the month of March with a 15-3 record.

• Head coach **Doug Schreiber** also his 400th career game March 31. He has now recorded his 100th, 250th, 300th and 400th career wins against Penn State. He received a Gatorade shower from his players during the postgame huddle in left field. The next landmark for the 14th-year head coach is Dave Alexander's all-time wins record (407) at Purdue.

• Antonelli made his first start of the season in the landmark win and after a lengthy at-bat, hit a ground ball through the right side to score **Kevin Plawecki** from third base with two outs in the seventh inning. Plawecki singled to open the frame, breaking up the no-hit bid by Penn State left-hander Joe Kurrasch.

BREEDLOVE THE FIRST BOILER TO WIN PITCHER OF THE WEEK THREE TIMES

- Lance Breedlove's complete-game shutout of Penn State in his season debut at Lambert Field (March 31) earned the senior his third Big Ten Pitcher of the Week award of 2012, making the first Boiler in program history to be honored this times in one season.
- Breedlove retired the first 19 batters of the game in order. Both pitchers carried a no-hitter into the seventh inning, as PSU's Joe Kurrasch matched Breedlove for much of the day. But Purdue scored twice with two outs in the seventh and went on to win the game, 2-0.
- Breedlove has won Big Ten Pitcher of the Week in back-to-back wins, working complete-game victories against Ohio State and Penn State. He was the first Boiler to pitch consecutive complete games since Matt Bischoff in April 2009 (also against PSU and OSU).
- Matt Morgan (2007-11) and Bischoff (2007-10) were both three-time Big Ten Pitcher of the Week winners during their careers, but they accumulated those awards over two seasons. Breedlove joins former outfielder Daniel Underwood (2000-03) as the only Purdue players to be recognized by the conference office three times in the same season since the weekly awards program began in 1990. Underwood was a three-time Big Ten Player of the Week in 2003. At the time, Underwood was the first Big Ten baseball player to accomplish the feat.
- Former Ohio State pitcher Alex Wimmers was the last pitcher to be the Big Ten Pitcher of the Week at least three times in the same season. He was honored four times in 2009.
- Breedlove needed only 101 pitches to finish his two-hit shutout of Penn State. It was his fourth start of the season without a walk. He worked seven 1-2-3 innings and retired 27 of the 29 batters he faced, pitching the first complete-game shutout by a Boiler since **Joe Haase** blanked Minnesota on April 2, 2011, at Target Field.

BOILERS NOW OFFICIALLY RANKED IN ALL FOUR NATIONAL POLLS

- After debuting at No. 24 in the March 19 USA Today/ESPN Top 25 coaches' poll, Purdue is now nationally ranked in all four major national polls at the same time for the first time in program history.
- Among the Collegiate Baseball Top 30 for the seventh week in a row, the Boilers stayed at No. 22 this week. Purdue remained ranked in the Baseball America Top 25 and National Collegiate Baseball Writers of Association Top 30 polls for the sixth week in a row. The Boilermakers jumped to No. 16 in Baseball America's poll and moved up to No. 17 in the NCBWA & USA Today rankings.
- The program has earned its first in-season national ranking since February 2001 (Baseball America). The Boilermakers were also nationally ranked in the 2002 NCBWA preseason poll.
- The Boilermakers have been ranked among the Top 30 of Perfect Game USA's national Top 50 all season, staying at No. 15 this week.

TWO-OUT RBI TITANS

• **Barrett Serrato** (27 RBIs, 17 with two outs), **Sean McHugh** (16, 12), **David Miller** (19, 14) and **Andrew Dixon** (8, 5) have supplied the majority of their run production in clutch situations this season. All four players enter the weekend having recorded at least half their RBIs with two outs in an inning. Serrato has led the way, collecting 17 of his 27 RBIs with two outs. On two occasions this year, the opposition (East Carolina and Wichita State) intentionally walked **Kevin Plawecki** with two outs and a runner in scoring position to setup a lefty-lefty matchup with Serrato. He delivered a run-scoring single each time.

• McHugh and Serrato have both connected for three-run homers with two outs in an inning this season. McHugh hit his three-run on the first pitch thrown by new WSU reliever Tobin Mateychick in the sixth inning of game two of the series. Serrato's three-run homer capped the seven-run rally in the comeback win against Southern Miss.

ANOTHER LONG ON-BASE STREAK ENDS FOR PERKINS

• In Big Ten play, **Cameron Perkins** had reached base safely in 46 consecutive contests dating back to 2010 until Penn State finally get him off the base paths in the March 31 pitcher's duel. Including the Big Ten Tournament, he had managed to find his way on base in 53 straight games against conference opponents. He compiled an on-base percentage of .419 during his Big Ten streak thanks to reaching base safely 101 times (76 hits, nine walks, 16 hit by pitch).

• After getting robbed of a potential base hit up the middle on a nice play by the Maryland pitcher on Feb. 25 in what proved to be Perkins' final at-bat of the game, the junior's remarkable streak of reaching base safely in 67 consecutive games was snapped. The streak dated back to 2010. Perkins reached base safely at least one in every game he played as a sophomore.

• Perkins reached base safely 133 times during his streak. He collected 98 hits, 12 walks and was hit by a pitch 23 times, good for an on-base percentage of .421.

TALBOTT PLAYS THE HERO IN HOME-OPENING WALK-OFF WIN

• **Stephen Talbott's** walk-off single in the 10th inning punctuated the Boilers' home-opening with an exclamation point. Purdue defeated No. 15 Louisville, 2-1, March 27 in a game that featured two of the nation's top offenses but turned into a pitcher's duel.

• Talbott singled home **Angelo Cianfrocco**, who doubled to open the 10th inning, to join **Sean McHugh** and **Cameron Perkins** as active Boilers with a walk-off hit on their collegiate résumés. McHugh played the hero in Purdue's last extra-inning game, a 12-inning victory against Indiana at Lambert Field on April 29, 2011.

• Starting pitcher **Connor Podkul** did not give up a hit over six innings of one-run ball in his Lambert Field debut. Despite a low pitch count of 59 for Podkul, lefty **Blake Mascarello** took over on the mound to begin the seventh. The Cardinals had three left-handed hitters due up. Mascarello worked four innings of scoreless relief to earn his team-leading fifth win. Head coach **Doug Schreiber** said Podkul is also continuing to build up his pitch count after a heavy work load in the spring and summer of 2011.

RAMER FANS CAREER-HIGH NINE TO LEAD PURDUE TO MIDWEEK WIN

• **Robert Ramer** struck out a career-high nine over eight innings of one-run ball, keeping his team in the game on another slow day for the offense in Purdue's 6-1 win against IPFW March 28.

• Ramer worked four 1-2-3 innings, retiring the final nine batters he faced in order. He recorded five strikeouts his first time through the IPFW lineup and two more in the eighth inning. It was the longest outing of his career.

• Ramer now sports a career record of 11-0. Among the active Boilers with multiple decisions, he remains the program's only undefeated pitcher. Purdue is now 13-1 in games he has started during his career.

• The Boilermakers trailed 1-0 entering the bottom of the seventh but scored three times in the seventh and eighth innings to surge in front. **Cameron Perkins** tied the game with a solo home run to lead off the bottom of the seventh, his team-leading fourth long ball of the season and 20th career.

MASCARELLO STELLAR IN LONG RELIEF ROLE

• Senior left-hander **Blake Mascarello** has been Purdue's most consistent pitcher over the first seven weeks of the season, earning the win in five of his 15 relief appearances. He was the winning pitcher against Connecticut, Auburn, Murray State (game one), Missouri State, Louisville and Illinois (game three). He also closed out the series opener at Ohio State for a save. Mascarello has surrendered a run in six of his 17 appearances and helped the Boilers win the game in all but one of his outings (game four at Wichita State) in which he has taken the mound with Purdue leading.

• While the lefty has been consistently excellent, his work in the Connecticut and Murray State wins stand out. He retired 12 of the 14 batters he faced over four scoreless innings in the season opener against UConn. In the series opener against Murray State, he retired 13 of the 14 batters he faced. In both instances he closed out the victory.

10-GAME WIN STREAK SNAPPED IN WICHITA; 14-1 START BEST IN SCHOOL HISTORY

• Purdue's 10-game win streak was snapped in a doubleheader sweep at the hands of Wichita State March 17 on the final day of the spring break trip. The Boilermakers lost more games on St. Patrick's Day than they had in the first month of the season (one). Purdue had not dropped both games of a doubleheader since May 2010 at Iowa. The 10-game win streak was the program's longest since the 2001 team won 13 in row.

• At 14-1 before the St. Patrick's Day sweep, the Boilers posted the best one-loss start in program history. Previously, the 1959 team had gone 13-1 before suffering its second loss of the year.

• Purdue has posted its 18 wins against 15 team different teams. The Boilermakers played each of their first 10 games of the season against 10 different opponents.

• While the offense grabbed headlines after scoring 40 runs while batting .437 in the series sweep of Murray State (March 9-11), the pitching and defense also performed well in Purdue's first road sweep since taking all three games of a series at Lipscomb the first weekend of March last season. The Boilermakers only surrendered five runs in the series, with Murray State scoring only one run after the first inning. Defensively, Purdue did not commit an error in the series while turning six double plays.

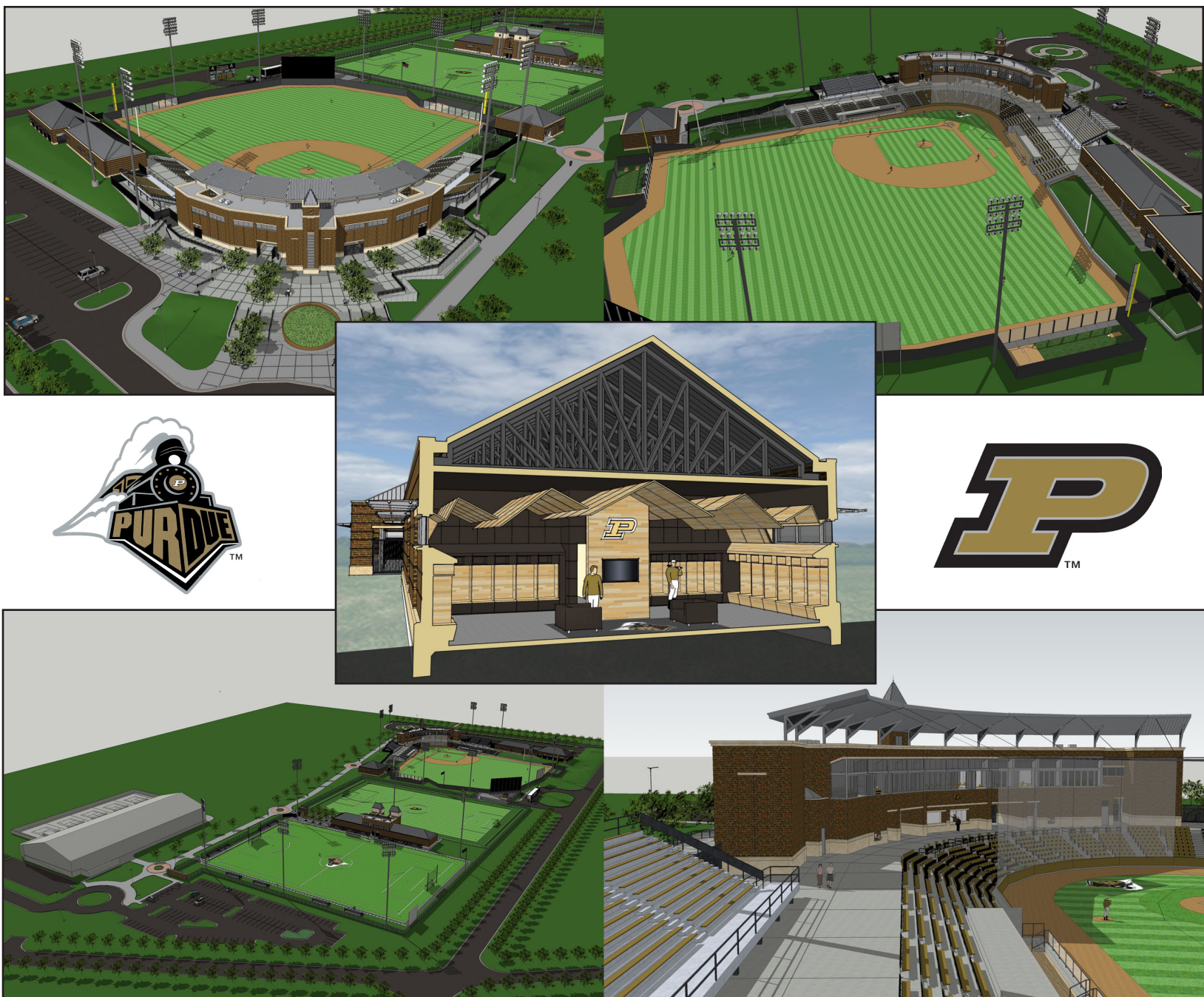

at the Northwest Athletics Complex
Construction Began in Spring of 2011
Stadium to be located near the intersection of
McCormick & Cherry on the northwest side of campus**

Alexander Field will soon be the new home of the Boilermakers. The \$21 million baseball stadium, to be financed with athletics department funds, could eventually seat up to 2,500 spectators in the first phase of improvements to the Northwest Athletics Complex that includes the adjacent soccer facility. The intercollegiate baseball stadium will replace the existing 1,100-seat Lambert Field, which has been the team's home since 1965. The new stadium will be named Alexander Field in honor of the late John and Anna Margaret Ross Alexander. The Alexanders were the parents of Dave Alexander, who is giving the lead gift for the project. David Alexander was Purdue baseball coach from 1978 to 1991 and then an athletics administrator through 1994. All three Alexanders graduated from Purdue, and Dave played on Purdue's baseball team. John Alexander earned a bachelor's degree in 1933, while Anna Margaret Ross Alexander earned a bachelor's degree in 1935. Both received honorary doctorates from Purdue in 1986.
