

#### PURDUE CLOSES OUT HOMESTAND VERSUS EVANSVILLE

- The Boilermakers' six-game homestand, which began with the Aug. 14 preseason exhibition win vs. Miami (Ohio), comes to an end Friday with a visit from Evansville. The Purple Aces will be making their first trip to West Lafayette since 2012 when Jordan Pawlik's natural hat trick lifted Purdue to a 4-0 win. Including the exhibition win, the Boilers have compiled a 4-1 record during their homestand. They travel to Missoula, Montana (elevation 3,209 feet), next weekend for games against Montana and Seattle at the Montana Cup.
- **Drew Roff's** Illinois State teams were 8-2-1 against Evansville from 2007 to 2014. Roff led ISU to regular-season & MVC Tournament wins against UE in 2011, 2013 and 2014. **Hannah Leinert** scored five of her 27 goals at Illinois State against the Purple Aces, including the game winner in the 2014 MVC Tournament title game.

#### DRAMATIC LATE GOALS HIGHLIGHT FIRST FOUR GAMES

• Over the first four games of the season, Purdue scored five
goals in the final 10 minutes of regulation. Nicole Robertson
(89th minute) and Dagny Olson (85th) accounted for the dra-
matic game winners in victories vs. Xavier and Baylor, respec-
tively. But Andrea Petrina (90th), Maddy Williams (85th) and
Melissa Casella (84th) have also scored in the final 10 min-
utes of a game already.

Boilers have had more than five only one other time (2003).
Scoring is up overall as well. After registering a program-low

19 goals in 2014, including just three during the season-ending 10-game winless drought, Purdue has already racked up 11 goals through its first four games this year. The Boilers have scored multiple goals in each of their first four games for the first time since 2000.

#### CONCEDING QUICK EQUALIZER BURNS BOILERS IN OVERTIME LOSS

• Missouri defeated Purdue in overtime Aug. 30 to deny the home side a share of the Boilermaker Challenge Cup title for the first time since 2009. The Boilermakers led the game twice thanks to goals from **Andrea Petrina** and **Melissa Casella**, but Mizzou equalized only 15 seconds after Casella's go-ahead goal in the 84th minute and went on to hand Purdue its first overtime loss since September 2012 at Michigan State and its first at home since the 2011 Boilermaker Challenge Cup vs. Kansas.

• The 15 seconds between goals in the Missouri loss represented the shortest amount of time between goals for and against in program history. Eight times since 2000, a Purdue

game has featured goals for each side less than a minute apart. The Boilermakers have compiled a 5-2-1 record in those games, both losses coming in contests in which the opposition recorded the quick answer.

#### WILLIAMS' FIVE GOALS OVER FIRST FOUR GAMES RANK SIXTH NATIONALLY

• With a goal in the third minute of the Aug. 28 win vs. Baylor, it didn't take **Maddy Williams** long to record her fifth goal of the year and become the first Boilermaker to score in each of the first three games of a new season. Williams enters Labor Day Weekend second in the Big Ten and sixth nationally with her five goals.

 Williams' August goal-scoring rampage – during which she scored 10, including the five in the two preseason exhibition games – featured four goals during the season-opening weekend. She scored twice in both the wins against Ohio and Xavier, and in the process reached the 20-goal mark for her collegiate career. The junior accomplished a number of feats with her big opening weekend,

most notably becoming the fastest player in program history to reach 20 career goals. She was also the fastest to hit the 15-goal benchmark when she did so in September 2014.

• Williams joined Lauren Sesselmann (2005) as the only players in program history to record multi-goal efforts in consecutive games. Only two other Boilers (Kellie Phillips and Jordan Pawlik) ever accounted for four goals over two games, both posting hat tricks in one of the games. Versus Ohio, Williams became the first player to ever account for both of Purdue's first two goals of a new season and her four goals over the first two games were another program high. Finally, she joined Jessica Okoroafo (2009), Alex Hairston (2012) and Mollie Kuramoto (2013) as the only Boilers to ever score in each of the first two games of a new season.

#### KASER STEPS IN AT CENTER BACK AFTER LASKY'S STARTING STREAK ENDS

• With **Mikayla Lasky** sidelined by a knee ailment during the Boilermaker Challenge Cup (Aug. 28-30), fellow junior **Megan Kaser** was pressed into duty at center back and went the distance in both games. Kaser started 17 games as an underclassman but all as an outside back. Meanwhile, Lasky's consecutive games started streak was snapped at 36. It dated back to September 2013.

#### **BOILERS SWEEP SEASON-OPENING WEEKEND AFTER COMEBACK WIN**

- Before losing in overtime to Missouri, Purdue started its season 3-0 for only the third time in program history. After winning their opener in shutout fashion (3-0 vs. Ohio) for the eighth time in team history, the Boilers had to rally to beat Xavier 4-3 Aug. 23. It marked the fourth time Purdue won a game in which it conceded three goals. Coincidentally, three of those four wins have been in the last three seasons.
- Despite a big edge in the shot count, the Boilers trailed Xavier 3-2 with just over five minutes to go. But goals by Maddy Williams and Nicole Robertson lifted Purdue to the thrilling victory. It marked the first time since the 2013 victory at Miami (Ohio), another 4-3 final, that the Boilers rallied to win 2013: Purdue 4, at Wiami (S to 2013: Purdue 5, Dartmouth 3 after trailing with less than 10 minutes to go.

#### FRESHMAN STARTING ON OPENING NIGHT

· Dannah Williams was in the starting lineup as a true freshman for both games of the opening weekend. The midfielder has gone on to start each of the first four games. She joined Erika Arkans, Holly Gregory, Megan Kaser, Vanessa Korolas, Kim Love and Maddy Williams as active Boilers to start season openers as fresh-

#### ROBERTSON PLAYS THE HERO IN FINAL MINUTES VS. XAVIER

- Nicole Robertson headed in a Kim Love cross in the 89th minute for the deciding goal vs. Xavier Aug. 23, accounting for the seventhlatest game-winning goal in a regulation victory. The Boilers had not won a game in the final two minutes of regulation since Felicia Schroeder's goal beat Northwestern with one minute and 46 seconds remaining on the game clock.
- Robertson's clutch score was her second goal as a Boilermaker. Coincidentally, she also scored in the second game of the 2014 season. She has recorded a goal and an assist in the two games in which she has scored for Purdue

#### LASKY'S CONSECUTIVE MINUTES STREAK SNAPPED IN SEASON OPENER

- Center back Kim Love and goalkeeper Erika Yohn are the only Boilermakers that have played all 372 minutes of the season so far. Defender Mikayla Lasky's impressive consecutive minutes played streak ended at 3,225 when she left the field in the first half of the season opener against Ohio. She had gone the distance ever since the start of the second half of the Sept. 1, 2013, game at Kansas.
- · Love now has the longest active consecutive minutes played streak on the team. It stands at 1,118 minutes entering the weekend and dates back to the final six minutes of the Sept. 26, 2014, game against Minnesota. Love (39) also continues to sport the longest active consecutive games started streak on the team. She has started all 58 games in which she has played for Purdue.
- · Lasky (1,764 minutes), Love (1,734) and Vanessa Korolas (1,675) were all iron women last season. After playing every minute (1,797) of 2012, Love missed the first three games of her sophomore campaign due to injury. She went on to play every minute of the final 16 games, logging 1,472 consecutive minutes. The junior left the field in the 2014 season opener vs. Miami (Ohio) for the first time as a Boilermaker.
- · Korolas was Purdue's most consistent freshman in 2014 and the only one to start all 19 games. She went the distance in 13 of the 19 games and ranked fourth on the team in minutes (1,675).

#### BOILERMAKERS BEGIN NEW SEASON, NEW ERA WITH NEW COACHING STAFF

· New Purdue head coach Drew Roff was hired in December, becoming only the second head coach in program history. He led Illinois State to five NCAA Tournament appearances and six Missouri Valley Conference regularseason titles in his eight seasons (2007-14) as head coach. The Michigan State alum brought his former ISU assistants, Jim Schneiderhahn and Katie Baumgardner, with him to Purdue. Roff and his assistants were named the MVC Coaching Staff of the Year five times during his Illinois State tenure. Schneiderhahn has worked with Roff since 2011 and was part of three MVC Coaching Staff of the Year winners. After her playing career as a goalkeeper at Ohio State (2008-11), Baumgardner joined Roff's ISU staff in 2012 and was part of MVC Coaching Staff of the Year winners in 2013 and 2014 as the Redbirds went a combined 16-0 against MVC rivals and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament both years.

#### PURDUE IMPRESSIVE IN PRESEASON EXHIBITION ACTION; WILLIAMS SCORES FIVE

- · Maddy Williams, Purdue's active goal-scoring leader with 21, accounted for five of the team's six goals as the Boilers won both of their exhibition games in shutout fashion with a combined plus-six goal differential. Williams posted a hat trick in the first 22 minutes of the Aug. 11 win at Milwaukee (4-0) and scored twice in the second half of the Aug. 14 victory vs. Miami University (2-0). Newcomer Dagny Olson also scored on a penalty kick at Milwaukee.
- · Williams' hat trick would have tied a Purdue record for goals in a game if it hadn't come in a preseason exhibition game. There have only been four regular-season hat tricks in program history, the last by Jordan Pawlik in September 2012 vs. Evansville.

#### **BOILERMAKERS POST 3-2 RECORD IN SPRING ACTION**

- · New head coach Drew Roff got his first taste of what his new team could do during the 2015 spring semester. Purdue compiled a 3-2 spring record, recording home wins against Valparaiso (4-0), Loyola (3-2) and Milwaukee (3-0) along with dropping road games at Notre Dame (3-1) and Cincinnati (3-0).
- · Nicole Robertson scored twice and Maddy Williams and Andrea Petrina also accounted for goals in the Valpo win, which was played inside the Mollenkopf Athletic Center. Petrina scored twice in the Loyola win after Megan Kaser accounted for a first-half equalizer. Robertson, Williams and Makaela Nellams scored in the spring finale against Milwaukee.

#### CASELLA, LOVE & WILLIAMS AMONG BIG TEN PLAYERS TO WATCH

- · Together having accounted for 124 games started as Boilermakers, Melissa Casella, Kim Love and Maddy Williams have been highlighted among the Big Ten Players to Watch entering the 2015 season. Casella and Love has been selected as the team's co-captains.
- · Love has started all 54 games in which she has played the last three years, missing only the first three games of her sophomore (2013) campaign. The durable center back has gone the distance in 53 of her 56 games, playing every minute of the 2012 season. She has started 35 consecutive games overall as well as 35 straight Big Ten games, both totals ranking as the longest active streaks on the team.
- · Casella redshirted in 2014 due to injury but was back in the starting lineup at midfielder for both exhibition games this fall. Prior to last season, she had not missed a game as a Boilermaker, starting a team-high 34 straight through the end of the 2013 campaign. She led the team in minutes played as a sophomore after going the distance in 15 of the 19 contests.

#### THREE TRANSFERS WITH STARTING EXPERIENCE

- · The Boilermakers only have five new players on the roster this year, but three are very experienced transfers that were starters at their previous universities. Hannah Leinert and Dagny Olson were not only starters but also all-conference honorees while playing under Drew Roff at Illinois State. Gabby LaMere was a starting defender for Xavier in 2014. She'll face her former team during the season-opening weekend. All three players started both of Purdue's preseason exhibition games.
- · Leinert, whose sister Katie also played for Purdue from 2008-11, scored 27 goals as a two-time First Team All-Missouri Valley Conference honoree at Illinois State, including an MVC-high 16 in 2013. She was the 2013 MVC Freshman of the Year and MVC Tournament MVP after becoming the first player to record a hat trick in the championship game. Leinert and Olson both scored goals in an NCAA Tournament game as well. Olson also converted on the game-winning penalty kick in the 2013 shootout at Louisville that sent ISU to the second round. Olson was a two-time Second Team All-MVC honoree and scored 10 goals as a midfielder for the Redbirds.
- LaMere started 17 games for Xavier in 2014, contributing to three shutouts. The Musketeers surrendered only 23 goals in their 19 games.

#### EIGHT STARTERS RETURN FOR PURDUE; CAN EXPERIENCE TRANSLATE TO WINS

- The Boilermakers welcomed back a lot of experience from their 2014 team, highlighted by eight returning starters. Vanessa Korolas, Mikayla Lasky, Kim Love and Maddy Williams started all 19 games last year. Erika Arkans, Holly Gregory and Makaela Nellams started at least half of the games in which they played in 2014. And the goalkeeper trio of Erika Yohn (773 minutes), Jordan Ginther (647) and Maddy Olsen (342) is back as well after all three players started multiple games and logged at least 300 minutes last year, counting as one returning starter collectively.
- · Add to that group the healthy return of two-year starting midfielder Melissa Casella and the addition of Division I transfers Hannah Leinert, Dagny Olson and Gabby LaMere, and it gives Purdue more players with full-fledged starting experience than it has spots on the field. Those 12 players have started a combined 321 games during their careers entering 2015. Including the other Boilers that have started regular-season games during their careers, the combined total for starts increases to 361. That makes for an experienced roster that could be poised for a breakout campaign.

#### EXCELLENT DEFENSIVE IMPROVEMENT IN 2014, BUT GOAL SCORING BOTTOMED OUT

- · A vastly improved defense for Purdue in 2014 was not enough to overcome a drastic drop in goal scoring. With 26 goals against, the Boilermakers conceded 17 fewer goals than in 2013. But the 19 goals they scored in 2014 were the least in program history and 15 fewer than a year ago.
- The 17 fewer goals conceded marked the best year-to-year improvement in program history. But the defense had little margin for error after Purdue was shut out nine times to match the 1999 team for its most ever. Six of the 11 losses - including five at home - came in 1-0 fashion, another program high. Only once before (22 goals in 2004) had the Boilers failed to score at least 25 goals in a season, much less 20.

#### WILLIAMS PRIMED FOR BREAKOUT CAMPAIGN?

- While scoring 10 goals in 2013 to tie the Purdue freshman record would certainly qualify as a great season, junior Maddy Williams could be destined to produce even more offensive fireworks this year. A pair of multigoal games, including a hat trick at Milwaukee, in the preseason exhibition games was an impressive start to her campaign even if the five goals unfortunately don't count towards her career total.
- · Playing alongside forward Hannah Leinert, who scored 27 goals in two years at Illinois State, should only help Williams and increase her opportunities. Now it's just a matter of finishing more of her chances. A year ago she established a new Purdue single-season record with 88 shot attempts, putting 34 on goal. For her career, Williams has 16 goals on 72 shots on goal, scoring on 22 percent of her shots on frame. This preseason, she was able to score on five of her six shots on goal. Even scoring on 30 to 40 percent of her shots on goal this year could have her challenging Loredana Riverso's Purdue season record (13 in 2007). Head coach Drew Roff's new possession-based offensive scheme should help as well.

#### **BOILERS LOOKING TO END POST-SEPTEMBER STRUGGLES**

• From 2000 to 2009, Purdue won 10-plus games for 10 consecutive seasons. Part of the reason the Boilers have not won more than eight games since 2009 is their struggles after the calendar flips to October. Since the beginning of the 2012 season, Purdue has won only two games in October or November (both coming in 2013). Furthermore, the Boilers have not won a game after October 7 since 2011. In fact, the 2011 team was responsible for three of Purdue's six October wins over the last five seasons.

· While it is true that the schedule gets tougher as Big Ten play heats up in October, the Boilers have actually held their own in conference play in September. Since 2010, Purdue is 7-10-3 (.425) in September Big Ten games, accounting for more than half of its point-producing results in conference action the last five years (13-39-4 B1G overall, .268). Ultimately, to have a successful season, the Boilers will have to find a way to win games consistently after Sept. 30 at some point.
